I had the privilege of attending all six of the football semi-finals and championship games at Home Depot in December and presented several of the plaques. It is an excellent facility that is ideal for our football playoffs. With a capacity of approximately 27,000, ample parking and easy access from all areas in Southern California, it truly is an ideal facility for the Southern Section Football Championships. I heard nothing but compliments from players, coaches and spectators on the facility. I hope that we can continue to use Home Depot Sports Complex and perhaps expand its use to other sports in the future.

One of the responsibilities for all members of the Executive Committee is to serve on panels for hardship eligibility appeals. If there is one area that we continue to hear from the parents it is their lack of knowledge of our rules, especially when it comes to transfers. Over and over again, we hear from parents, who are NOT trying to manipulate the system, but simply doing what they think is best for their child. Many of our high schools do an excellent job in thoroughly counseling the student and parents on the implications of a potential transfer. However, on too many occasions, we hear legitimate concerns from parents regarding their lack of understanding of our rules, but more important, is that administrators from both the new and old schools did not adequately explain the eligibility rules regarding transfer. In some cases, parents were never explained the transfer rules by either school and the student/parents wind up as the victim.

1. ADOPT AGENDA -- It was moved, seconded and passed to adopt the agenda.

SOUTHERN SECTION MARKETING UPDATE

TOYOTA RENEW THROUGH 2007

This past November, the Southern Section's 540 member schools received a million dollar note that Toyota and the 58 Southern California Toyota Dealers Association has agreed to renew for an additional three years as the Title Partner of the CIF Southern Section – TOYOTA Championships. The renewal of a second three year agreement, signed in 2001, means that Toyota will have invested over \$1,000,000 into Southern Section high school sports when the new agreement concludes in July 2007.

A \$1,000,000 reminder: Each of our 540 member schools recently received a new Toyota Championships banner that must be displayed in your gyms during the indoor playoffs as well as at all football playoff games. You can further our relationship and thank Toyota for their incredible contribution by permanently displaying the Toyota banners at all your gymnasium and football games.

STATE WIDE MARKETING UPDATE

As many of our school personnel have become aware, the State office and the ten sections of the CIF have been involved in an on-going review of marketing on behalf of our schools. The issue of coordinated marketing efforts is complicated when eleven different entities need to fit their programs cohesively together.

Following nearly a year of review, the CIF State office hired a third party sports marketing consultant to review the various concepts and provide their thoughts as to a direction that would provide the most opportunity for all the sections and the State office.

That review has arrived and endorsed the concept that both State and section marketing programs can and should move forward cohesively rather than limiting the sections individual efforts.

At the February 2004 State Federated Council meeting a draft of the future CIF Marketing program was discussed and is being prepared for a vote this coming May. While issues like pricing and how to put an agreement together will always be on-going, the general premise that both State and section marketing programs should move equally forward has been endorsed.

So what's next? As we move forward with this new program, some transitioning of existing partners will need to be made. Compromise with our partners, the State office and the various sections will no doubt be required. The good news is that it has become clear that everyone's marketing efforts are critical to funding our sports programs and that it is imperative that everyone work cooperatively to improve our statewide results.

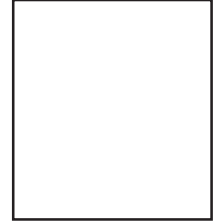
MANDATORY BALL UPDATE

Public/Private
School
Issues
Forum

On November 14th, 2003 CIF Southern Section hosted our first forum devoted to exploring problems related to public and private schools in CIF competition. The purpose of the meeting was to identify issues that may interfere with the goals and mission of CIF resulting from competition between athletes from member public and non-public schools. Fourteen representatives, from all levels of site administration, met in the office to present their concerns and suggest possible answers. Gary Smidderks chaired the meeting.

We began with a review of our current situation. Presently, private schools make up 38% of our membership, 205 schools. These private schools range in size from 1754 to 15. Our public schools make up 62% of the membership, or 336 schools. The largest public school houses 3631 students, the smallest 14.

Historically, private schools have won between 29 and 35% of all of our championships, depending on the time span studied. Between the years 2000-the present private schools have accounted for 35% of the championships won. At first blush, it appears that the number of schools in the private sector is winning just about the right amount one would predict based on their membership in the Section.

Despite these numbers there has been a lingering feeling among a number of our members that private schools are somehow enjoying advantages that public schools do not have. This is disturbing to some who believe that at all levels of play, the rules should be exactly the same.

We called the meeting to consider some of the concerns we have heard.

We were pleased to see that fourteen representatives from all parts of the section gave up their afternoon to contribute. Principals, Athletic Directors and other athletic administrators represented their school

MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

August 16, 2003

The August meeting of the CIF Southern Section Executive Committee was called to order at 8:30 a.m. by President Paul Breit at the Four Points Sheraton Hotel in Santa Monica. All members were present, with the exception of Jeannine Martineau.

1. ADOPT AGENDA – It was moved, seconded and passed to adopt the revised agenda.

2. MINUTES – It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the minutes of the CIF-SS Executive Committee meeting of May 28, 2003. - The minutes of the C.I.F. Council meeting of April 24, 2003 and the State C.I.F. Federated Council meeting of May 9-10, 2003 were distributed for information.

3. ACTION SESSION –

-SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS-

A. NEW MEMBER SCHOOLS – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve the memberships of Crystal Cathedral High School and Lawndale High School for the 2003-2004 school year, on the condition they attend and complete an orientation meeting at the C.I.F. Office. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve the New Harvest Christian School for membership for the 2003-2004 school year, with the following conditions: that they attend and complete an orientation at the C.I.F. Office, they fulfill all of their scheduling commitments and that their membership be reviewed by the Executive Committee in May, 2004.

After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to require all new membership applications be received by the C.I.F. Southern Section Office, on or before May 1, for consideration by the Executive Committee for the following school year.

B. APPOINTMENT OF AT-LARGE MEMBERS TO THE C.I.F. COUNCIL – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve the appointments of Kristine Kulow, Principal, San Dimas High School and Debbie Tate, Principal, Inglewood High School as At-Large members of the C.I.F. Council for two year terms.

4. NEW BUSINESS –

A. Commissioner Jim Staunton led a discussion on the possibility of developing a policy regarding Multi-Campus Schools that subsequently become members of the C.I.F. Southern Section.

B. A discussion was held regarding the State C.I.F. Economic Viability Committee's recommendations regarding the State C.I.F. Marketing Program.

After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to instruct the C.I.F. Southern Section representatives to the State Federated Council to continue to work on ways to compromise on some elements of the State C.I.F. Economic Viability Committee's recommendations and ask the Commissioner to consult with legal counsel on the potential legal ramifications of the C.I.F. Southern Section opting out of the State C.I.F. Marketing Program.

C. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to recommend to the Blue Book Committee support for Commissioner Jim Staunton's recommendation for a change in the Blue Book removing the language referring to special circumstances being necessary for a

school to change their Summer Dead Period.

D. Commissioner Jim Staunton presented a letter from Los Alamitos High School requesting a policy statement be developed by the C.I.F. Southern Section regarding the scheduling of contests on religious holidays. Commissioner Staunton will respond to the request in writing.

5. REPORT SESSION –

A. President's Report – Paul Breit reported on his attendance at the National Federation Summer Meeting and the impact of the "No Child Left Behind" legislation nationwide.

B. Treasurer's Report – Susana Arce reported that the preliminary fieldwork for the yearly audit has been completed, the auditors will be making some adjustments and the final audit will be presented at the November meeting of the Executive Committee. Also, spring sports did very well and the 2002- 2003 school year final report will be presented at the November Executive Committee meeting.

C. Commissioner's Report – Commissioner Jim Staunton presented the following items:

1) The Commissioner's Goals for the 2003-2004 school year.

2) Sanctions and Penalties – Commissioner Staunton reported that he held a very successful in-service on August 12, 2003 with some schools that had rules violations during the 2002-2003 school year and that the Mission Viejo High School football coaching staff has been sanctioned for violating the Association Rule this past spring.

3) His attendance at the NFHS Summer Meeting. Also, he presented information regarding the efforts of the State C.I.F. in getting candidates from California nominated for the NFHS Hall of Fame.

4) A plan to explore the possibility of billing member schools yearly for legal expenses.

5) He will be sending every member school principal and superintendent information on conditions of membership.

D. Assistant Commissioner Reports – Rob Wigod reported on the C.I.F. Officiating With Honor Program that will be implemented this year, the schedule of the August and September in-services planned for various areas in the section and his attendance at the NFHS Summer Meeting.

E. Executive Committee Member Reports –

1. Superintendent Representative – Sue Rainey reported on her selection of a new principal at Martin Luther King High School.

2. Small Schools Representative – Tom Peters reported on a recent hearing he attended regarding the forming of a new league and the possibility of the Small Schools Area pursuing a 2-year reorganizing cycle.

3. Girls' Athletic Director Representative – Sharen Caperton asked about the possibility of putting all sports previews into one mailing for athletic directors.

4. Desert Area Representative – Bob Dreiling reported on his attendance at the NFHS Summer Meeting and the session he attended regarding the impact of the Americans with Disabilities Act on high school athletics.

5. Parochial Area Representative – Sister Cheryl Milner reported that she will begin serving on the State C.I.F. Executive Committee.

6. CAPSO Representative – Gary Smidderks

reported that a Co-President of CAPSO will begin serving with him on the State C.I.F. Federated Council.

7. Foothill Area Representative – Earl Haugen announced that he has accepted a position in the Downey Unified School District Office but will continue to serve on the C.I.F. Southern Section Executive Committee.

8. President-Elect – John Dahlem reported that he served as the announcer at the State C.I.F. Track and Field Championships this year.

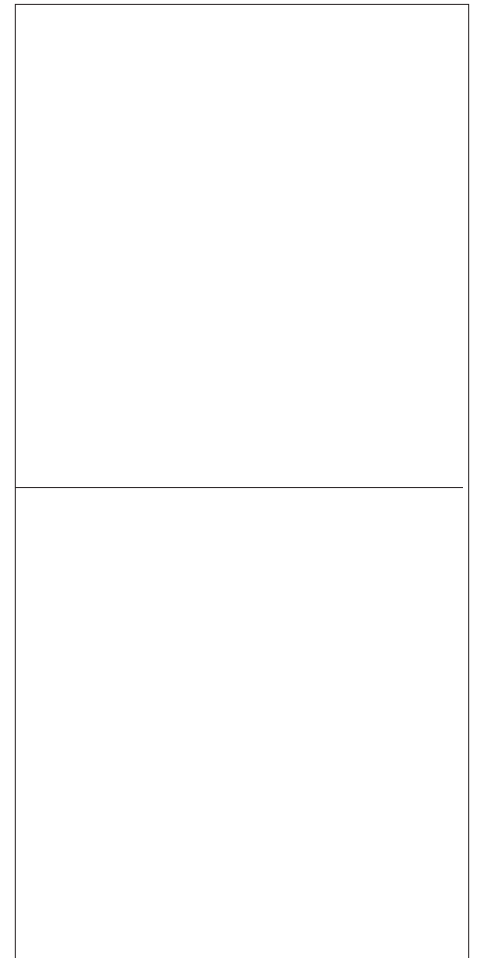

MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

September 24, 2003

The September meeting of the CIF Southern Section Executive Committee was called to order at 1:12 p.m. by President Paul Breit at the C.I.F. Southern Section Office in Los Alamitos. All members were present.

1. ADOPT AGENDA – It was moved, seconded and passed to adopt the agenda.

2. MINUTES – It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the minutes of the CIF-SS Executive Committee meeting of August 16, 2003.

3. ACTION SESSION –

A. ACCEPTANCE OF THE RESIGNATION OF DR. LIZA SCRUGGS – The Executive Committee accepted the resignation of Dr. Liza Scruggs, who has accepted a new position with the Los Angeles Unified School District.

After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to appoint a replacement for the At-Large Representative to the Executive Committee.

After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to appoint Edna Herring, Superintendent of the Rialto Unified School District, as the At-Large Representative to the Executive Committee until her term expires in 2005.

B. STATUS OF NEW LIFE CHRISTIAN ACADEMY – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to continue the membership of New Life Christian Academy High School for the 2003-04 school year. New Life Christian Academy High School will be required to re-apply for membership for the 2004-05 school year.

A. STATE BASKETBALL ADVISORY COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION – A discussion was held regarding a proposal from the State Basketball Advisory Committee recommending the implementation of a "mercy" rule for basketball.

5. OLD BUSINESS –

A. ECONOMIC VIABILITY – Commissioner Jim Staunton led a discussion and presented a timeline of events relating to the proposed State Marketing Plan.

6. NEW BUSINESS –

A. DISCUSSION OF RULE 201 AGE REQUIREMENT (19 YEAR OLD RULE) – A discussion was held regarding the possibility of the C.I.F. Southern Section developing criteria that would allow the Commissioner to waive Rule 201.

B. CHARTER SCHOOLS AND REQUEST FOR MEMBERSHIP – Commissioner Jim Staunton led a discussion regarding this issue.

C. LEGAL FUNDS CHARGED BACK TO SCHOOLS, POSSIBLE FIRST READ AT OCTOBER 16TH C.I.F. COUNCIL MEETING – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to instruct the Commissioner to develop a proposal that would charge member schools for legal expenses as needed. Also, the Commissioner was instructed to consult with an insurance broker regarding the possibility of obtaining insurance for legal matters.

D. FOOTBALL BOWL GAMES PROPOSAL – A discussion was held regarding the proposal from the Sac-Joaquin Section for State Championship Football Bowl Games beginning in 2004.

E. NEW MEMBER SCHOOL CHECKLIST – Commissioner Jim Staunton distributed a new member school evaluation form for Executive Committee members to utilize on their visitations to new member schools.

7. REPORT SESSION –

A. President's Report – Paul Breit reported on his attendance at the Section 7/8 Meeting last week.

B. Treasurer's Report – Susana Arce reported on the following topics:

1. Membership dues will be the same for the 2003-2004 school year and notices will be sent to schools requesting payment through the month of October. Schools will be delinquent if they have not paid by November 1.

2. The audit of the 2002-2003 year has been completed and the auditors will be at the November meeting of the Executive Committee to present their report.

C. Commissioner's Report/Sanctions/Penalties – Commissioner Jim Staunton reported on the following topics...

1. Mission Viejo High School's administration has informed him that all members of their coaching staff have completed the Victory With Honor Training and that all members of their football coaching staff have fulfilled the requirement regarding suspension from practices.

2. He has been working on the interpretation of Blue Book Article 22, Conditions of Membership, in relation to large corporate contributions to member schools.

3. He has invoked Blue Book Rule 229, Falsification of Information, in 2 recent cases.

4. The Section 7/8 Meeting he attended last week.

D. Assistant Commissioner's Reports –

1. Karen Hellyer distributed information and led a discussion regarding Blue Book Rule 217.1, Discipline and Expulsion.

2. Rob Wigod reported on the in-services that have been held for member schools over the past month.

1. Parochial Area Representative – Sister Cheryl Milner reported on an upcoming meeting of Catholic school principals and Parochial Area schools on October 2.

2. Small Schools Representative – Tom Peters reported on the success of the recent in-service held at Sherman Indian High School for small schools.

3. Citrus Belt Area Representative – Rhonda Fouch reported on the recent article about the C.I.F. Southern Section in the Riverside Press-Enterprise, that the Citrus Belt Athletic Directors Association will be holding Leadership 501 and 502 classes on October 27 and on the success of the recent in-service held at Santiago High School/Corona.

4. Orange County Representative – Gene Campbell reported on the upcoming meetings of the Orange County Athletic Directors on October 8 and the Orange County League Representatives on October 10.

KARL DORRELL SPEAKS AT 28TH ANNUAL FOOTBALL PRESS CONFERENCE AND LUNCHEON

LOS ALAMITOS — University of California at Los Angeles Head Football Coach Karl Dorrell was the keynote speaker at the 28th Annual CIF Southern Section-Toyota Football Championship Press Conference and Luncheon held on December 8, 2003 at the Grand in Long Beach.

Dorrell, in his first year at the helm of the Bruins, was named UCLA's head football coach on Dec. 18, 2002. The 39-year-old

Dorrell has 15 years of NFL and college experience, with 12 of that on the collegiate level. He led UCLA to 6-7 record in his first season and took the Bruins to the Silicon Valley Football Classic vs. Fresno State in San Jose.

Coach Dorrell talked about the importance of enjoying the moment of their involvement in the championship game. He also spoke about what a "big-time" atmosphere came along with playing in a CIF-SS championship game.

He encouraged the student-athletes to continue on their academic path with the same commitment they gave to football.

The luncheon was attended by the 26 11-Man Football finalists as well as the two 8-Man Football Championship teams.

A. President's Report – President Paul Breit thanked the C.I.F. Southern Section staff for their hard work during the recent wildfires emergency.

B. Treasurer's Report – Susana Arce reported that 90 schools have not paid their membership dues as of November 13, 2003 and that all of those schools have received second notices requesting payment immediately.

C. Commissioner's Report/Sanctions/Penalties - Commissioner Jim Staunton reported on the following topics...

1) The San Gabriel Valley League has

informed him that a student from Dominguez High School's football program has been declared ineligible by that league.

2) Masada High School has informed him they may be closing their school soon and he has asked them to inform him of the status of their students for the rest of the 2003-2004 school year.

3) The intention to convene a special meeting of the Executive Committee on January 22, 2004, after the C.I.F. Southern Section Council meeting.

4) Difficulties that some schools had with their entries into the Girls Golf Freelance Tournament.

D. Executive Committee Member Reports –

1. President-Elect – Dr. John Dahlem reported on the State Health Committee meeting he attended recently and a possible proposal being prepared for the State C.I.F. regarding a reduction of practice hours for football and a requirement that students who are removed from football games due to a head injury cannot return to practice or play for at least one week.

2. Citrus Belt Area Representative – Rhonda Fouch reported that the football schedules of almost all of the leagues in her area have been revised so that all games will be played.

3. Girls Athletic Director Representative – Sharen Caperton inquired about the possibility of improving the updates on the C.I.F. Southern Section website.

4. Activities Director Representative – Terry Speir reported that she will prepare a letter to all Activities Directors informing them of the change in student ticket prices for football playoff games.

5. Superintendent Representative – Susan Rainey reported on the difficulties faced in her area during the wildfires emergency and that she recently attended the grand opening of the California School for the Deaf Middle School in Riverside.

There being no further business to come before the Executive Committee, the meeting was adjourned at 4:47 p.m.

IF ART IMITATES LIFE

With the latest flap about decency on television, sagging moral values and short-cuts to success it is no surprise that movies and books have turned to the image of the football coach to teach important lessons. Two recent movies and one best selling book tell us a lot about the importance of the man we call "coach".

"Remember the Titans" and "Radio" both enjoyed wide theatrical release. Both movies dealt with important social issues in the context of high school athletics. "Titans" places a young black head coach, played by Denzel Washington, in a southern school at a time of intense social turmoil. The coach, his players and the community must come to grips with social change, the loss of a popular and talented player and a coach who exercises iron discipline. Players and parents alike learn important lessons in integration, tolerance and integrity.

In "Radio", a coach forces his players to deal with a young disabled man who becomes the school's unofficial "coach". Despite intense pressure from his community to give up on the young man and concentrate on football, the coach refuses to compromise and teaches his players that there is more to football than winning games. In a climactic scene, Ed Harris tells an impromptu town meeting that the issue the community has to deal with is not what his team has taught Radio but what Radio has taught them.

"Bleachers", by John Grisham brings high school players back to a small Southern town to say a final farewell to their football coach. This coach is complicated fictional character and difficult to like. He is intensely private, completely focused and

devoted to the game. His players are completely loyal and respectful, not loving. His career is marred by one mistake that costs him his job. In his declining years, he watches his team play their games from atop a hill, alone on Friday night.

The influence of a coach resonates with all of us. It doesn't matter what sport. Parents are willing to give their children to these people for hours at a time every day without a second thought. Why? We cherish the memory of accomplishment and adore that person who can demand so much focus and attention. Our athletes run till they are exhausted, practice long hours, sacrifice their social calendars and work till it hurts to gain the approval of a coach. Coaches mold teams to function as units. Adolescents gain personal power from the approval of their peers.

A good coach will affect thousands of athletes during his or her career. If a coach cuts corners, plays loosely with the rules of the game and compromises integrity to get a win, then every one of his or her athletes will have learned just those lessons. If our coach stands tall, refuses to compromise and teaches the best of behavior, then his charges will be better people. By teaching respect for the game and its rules our coach helps our kids become better citizens.

This is why it is imperative to hold our coaches accountable to the highest standards of behavior. In many respects it is sad that there aren't more movies about the everyday heroes in our classrooms, those teachers who shape so many students.

RULE REVIEW

Rule Changes

Rule changes are a fact of life every year in sports.

Rarely are they so significant as to actually change the look of the game. This year is different.

This year the National Federation of High Schools (NFHS) Softball Rules Committee made a big change in the softball playing rules starting in the 2004 season. This year the designated hitter rule has been replaced with the DP/FLEX rule. Rule 3, Section 3, Article 6 reads, "A team may use the DP/FLEX option provided it is made known prior to the start of the game.

This rule allows the option of going from a 10-player lineup to a nine-player lineup and back again. This rule also gives the head coach the option to not use the DP/FLEX rule at all.

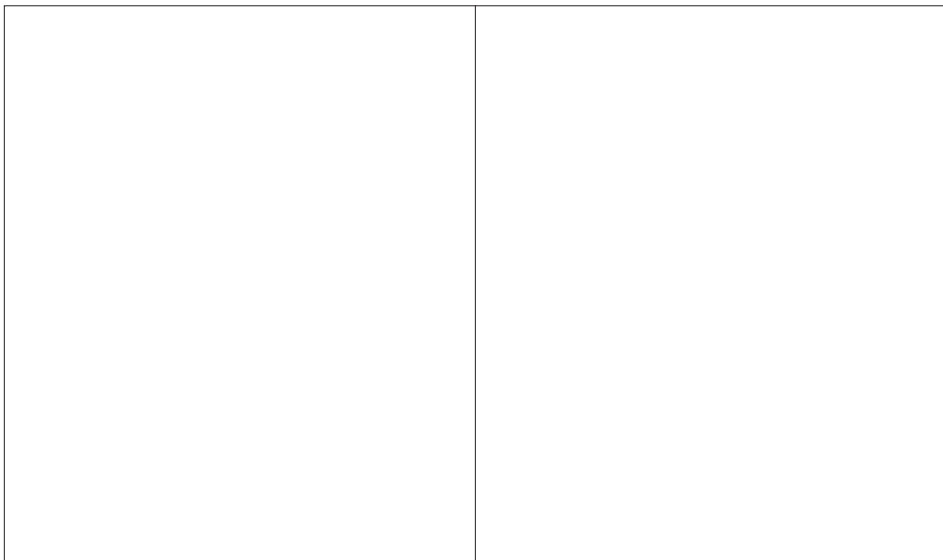
The flex player (the defensive player for whom the DP is batting) is always listed in the ten spot of the lineup. Offensively, the DP may be replaced by a pinch-runner, pinch-hitter or the FLEX player. In all cases, the DP may be replaced only once. When the FLEX player replaces the DP, the lineup consists of nine players instead of the original 10.

Defensively, the DP may replace the FLEX in the field. Again, the lineup consists of nine players instead of 10. Also, the DP may play defense at any position, replacing another player other than the FLEX. The replaced player will still bat and has not left the game.

The FLEX may not go into one of the first nine hitting positions for someone other than the DP. This would be an illegal substitution.

It is very important for every softball coach to have a clear understanding of this rule. I urge all athletic directors to make sure that coaches understand the intricacies of the rule. As always, should you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call.

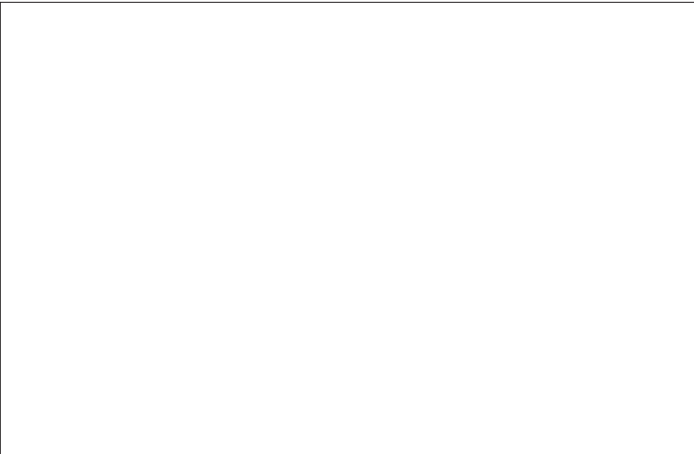

so) to consider the following suggestions: (1) If you have a "new student routing form", include a question regarding student's participation in athletics at their previous school; (2) designate a specific administrator to meet with every student/parent who indicates that they participated in athletics at their previous school; (3) If a student indicates that he/she are leaving your school, that information should be given to the designated administrator immediately. The administrator should meet with the student and parents BEFORE they checkout of the school and thoroughly explain the implications of the transfer if the administrator determines a concern on the potential eligibility of the student at their new school; (4) Develop a procedure on assessing the eligibility of every student athlete prior to their being allowed to practice; (5) Contact the CIF office if you have any question regarding the eligibility of a student.

If every high school that does not have a procedure for processing student athletes in place would follow the above suggestions, we could drastically reduce the number of appeals, but most important, give our parents accurate information and allow them to make informed decisions. We will always have those few parents who will try and circumvent our rules. However, by providing accurate information to our parents, we allow the CIF office and the hearing panels to focus on the deserving hardship appeals.

On behalf of the CIF office and the Executive Committee, I want to thank you for your time and effort and the outstanding job you're doing. You continue to provide quality programs for your students and provide them with life long experiences. . Please take every opportunity to compliment your athletes, coaches and parents for their time and effort in continuing to make high school athletics "the best game in town".

interests.

It didn't take long for the issues to surface. Here they are, in no particular order:

- Lack of attendance boundaries for private schools
- "Advertising for students in private schools; public schools can't market like private schools
- Marketing for students has caused problems with the perception that private schools are violating CIF rules.
- In public schools, the kids are there "by default"
- Travel ball and other youth programs are targeting private schools to feed kids into.
- There is a perception "blue chippers" get a free ride in private schools
- It is unfair to have private and public schools in the same league
- Releaguings has helped somewhat to alleviate the public/private problem
- Geographic boundaries for private schools is an issue
- Pre-enrollment contact by school supporters is the main source of problems, not necessarily actions by the private schools

As the participants got deeper into the discussion it became apparent that many of these concerns were more of perception than reality. Private school representatives clarified their policies on "scholarships" which are designed to provide students with support regardless of their athletic ability. Marketing schools is an important component of keeping the doors open at virtually all private schools. Small drops in enrollment can spell disaster for a private school's budget. Every private school representative assured the group that following CIF rules was very important to maintaining the integrity and reputation of their school.

While there is not a disproportionate number of private schools that win championships, they tend to cluster in certain divisions based on enrollment. That causes the public schools in those divisions to feel that they are playing against unfair competition.

The issues began to focus on what could be done to lessen tension between private and public schools. Many of the participants agreed that a solution to competitive equity was proper leaguings so private schools wouldn't completely dominate championship competition. If public and private schools are to be leagued together, be sure to follow specific criteria based on strength of athletic program, population of the school and geography. There are successful examples of public and private schools leaguings together; we should study those examples to find the factors that make them work.

There was strong agreement that if a school wants to be the best, its athletes must play the best. Encouraging strong competition between our public and private schools makes our athletes better and gives them strong competitive experience.
