The meet drew a record number of entries
and competitors. Five hundred and fifty boys
entered. The number of entries was over seven
hundred.

When the boys got into the plunge they pro-
ceeded to establish twelve new records in the
twenty swimming events.

Wednesday, March 16 at the preliminaries it
took over six hours to swim the seventy trial
heats (another new record) and allow the forty

divers five trial dives each.

Our procedure in the preliminaries is due for
an overhaul before we have our Invitational Meet

in 1950. It looks as if two preliminary meets
will be a possible solution.
