

MEETING OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA INTERSCHOLASTIC FEDERATION

April 16, 1917.

A meeting of the Southern California Interscholastic Federation was held at Los Angeles High School, 4 P.M. April 16, 1917, with the following members present:

Delbert Brunton, Orange County
E.W. Oliver, State Representative
E.H. Whitely, Los Angeles City

Principal Jerome O. Cross of Pasadena High School, speaking of the case of Andrew Silvas, stated that he had found proof to the effect that Silvas is now 23 years of age, as shown by church records. He assured the council that the boy had been entered in meets during the present semester with information from the Northern Section and from his parents which seemed to be indisputable. Now that positive information is to the contrary, Pasadena hereby withdraws any point which he may have won in track athletic.

A motion was passed that Andrew Silvas be declared ineligible, and that points won by him fall to competitors in order. The determination of who these competitors might be was left in the hands of Delbert Brunton.

Upon motion the council recommends that the Manual Arts Relay Team and Lincoln Hall be allowed to compete in the State Meet. All other applications for special entries in the State Meet were denied.

After reading of the report of the Track Manager, which showed a balance of \$402.00, a motion was passed placing the report on file, and a vote of thanks extended to Seth F. Van Patten for the splendid management of the meet.

The Secretary of the Council was instructed to inform the principal and vice-principal of Manual Arts High School that pupils of other schools have been approached and encouraged by financial offers to enter Manual Arts High School.

A motion was passed allowing Fouche of Pasadena to substitute for Mitchell in the State Meet, if Pasadena so desired.

Upon motion the council, without establishing a precedent, will pay \$5.00 toward the expenses of each athlete who represents Southern California in the State Meet to be held in Berkeley on April 28, 1917.

A bill of \$33.98 was allowed the secretary to cover postage, etc., and printing of re-instatement cards and withdrawal notices.

The council voted to make application to the A. A. U. for membership in that body, and the president, secretary, and E. W. Oliver were appointed delegates.

A motion was passed allowing members of the council carfare when in attendance at meetings of the council or other official meetings to which they may be delegated.

It was unanimously recommended that the state representatives ask the state board to consider amending or reconstructing the constitution in such a way that the interpretation of the word equivalent, as applied to a semester of residence, be construed as follows:

A. That the equivalent of a semester must mean the completion of at least nine units of new work.

B. That the minimum time as regards attendance required for residence in order to make the pupil eligible the following semester shall not be less than 10 weeks.

Upon motion a committee consisting of H. J. More, H. P. Reynolds, and Frank Reid was appointed to meet with Los Angeles County High School Athletic League to confer on the question of re-sectioning in Los Angeles County.

The president reported Collier Caldwell reinstated.
