# MINUTES OF 1927-1928 CALIFORNIA INTERSCHOLASTIC FEDERATION Southern Section

## SIXTH MEETING

April 28, 1928

The Council of the California Interscholastic Federation, Southern Section, met in adjourned meeting on the morning of April 28, 1928, at 9:30 A. M., at Manual Arts High School, Los Angeles.

The Secretary stated that he owed an apology to Mr. O'Mara and Pasadena. He stated that after the meet Saturday he had gone home and with his office force he had hunted everywhere for the four point records of protested schools and could find none except Pasadena's which had been received so early that the girls had filed it with the first semester four point records.

1. It was moved by Monroe and seconded by Jones that the leagues arrange for an exchange of officials to check on the measurements of height and weight of the boys during the first two weeks of each semester: that is, each school must have a faculty member from another school of the league to check and certify to the weight and height when the records are taken during the first two weeks and that these certified records be sent to the Secretary by Registered Letter, asking for a return receipt. Carried.

2. It was moved by O'Mara and seconded by Woodruff that Rule 15 on page 20—"Only the men who compete in the preliminary relay are eligible to compete in the finals"—be enforced. Carried unanimously.

3. It was moved by Green, seconded by Collins, that the President inform the Managers of all sports to record the names of all contestants in each preliminary event and heat, including the names of the men in the relay team. Carried unanimously.

4. Moved by Moore, seconded by Westcott, that the C. I. F. cooperate with the C. T. A. in the employment of a Secretary and clerk, one half of the expense of salary and rent to be paid by the C. I. F. Final action to be taken at May meeting.

5. It was moved by Moore and seconded by Blee that "net" in the semi-finals and finals for all Southern California championships be divided 1-3—1-3—1-3 between the C. I. F., and the two contesting schools. Carried.

6. It was moved by Moore and seconded by Collins that a flat membership be charged ranging from five dollars for the

smallest school up to fifty dollars for the largest school—the scale to be submitted at the May meeting, based on enrollment of Regular Day pupils on A. D. A. for year 1927-1928. Final action at May meeting.

7. It was moved by Blee and seconded by Moore that the present Committee on Part-time Secretary be instructed to meet with the C. T. A. and submit names that will be acceptable to the C. I. F. for Part-time Secretary. Carried.

8. The Council then adjourned.

### 9. MORE PROTESTS.

After the Finals April 28, 1928, the Secretary compared the Printed Program with the Pink Sheets and Four Point Records and he finds:

ELMONT had neither Pink Sheet or Four Point. These were sent in 5-3-28 after a letter from the Secretary.

CARPENTERIA had been protested the week before for not having Four Point Record.

CORONA—Peeler entered in low hurdles. On Class A pink sheet. No Class C sheet. No Four Point Record.

The Secretary will protest these men at May meeting and demand that the medals be returned.

### NOTICE TO PRINCIPALS

#### I. BASEBALL SEMI-FINALS:

Each school entering the Baseball semi-finals MUST send "Pink" sheet to the Secretary.

#### II. TENNIS SEMI-FINALS:

Each school entering boys' singles or doubles and girls' singles or doubles MUST send "Pink" sheet to the Secretary.

#### III. SWIMMING:

Class "C"—"Four Point" record should NOW be in the hands of the Secretary. Give birthday, not age; April 17, 1812, not 112 years, 3 months.

"Pink" "C" sheet MUST be filed with Secretary THREE days before the meet.

#### IV. CLASS "A" SWIMMING:

Each school entering a team MUST send "Pink" sheet to the Secretary.

V. If this is not done the Secretary will protest even though the neglect of Principal and Coach works a hardship on your boy.
