FOURTH MEETING—APRIL 23, 1927 **CALLED MEETING** **6—THE STARTER**

The Council of the California Interscholastic Federation, Southern Section, met in Called Meeting at the Manual Arts High School, Los Angeles, California, at 9:30 A. M., April 23, 1927.

The Secretary called the meeting to order and called the roll.

1—INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE JUDGE IN THE HIGH JUMP

It was moved by O'Mara and seconded by Barnes and CARRIED:

- a. It is a legal jump if both feet of the jumper cross the bar before his head, regardless of the position of the rest of the body.
- b. It shall not be considered a dive if the jumper's head crosses the bar first and if when his buttocks cross the bar his head is not lower than his buttocks.
- c. It is a dive when the head of the jumper crosses the bar before one or both of his feet and is lower than his buttocks when his buttocks cross the bar.

2—CLASS C PRELIMINARIES

It was shown that all of the schools had not been notified through the league representative that the Class "C" Preliminaries were to be held in the morning. It was moved by Oliver, seconded by Swan, and CARRIED, that Mr. Reinhard make arrangements so that all schools not officially notified of the preliminaries coming in the morning, shall have in the afternoon an opportunity to place for the finals.

3—EXTRA MAN (See Page 2 of Insert)

It was moved by Moore and seconded by Fisher that a Relay team be given the same privilege as allowed an extra man according to interpretation of Rule 1, on Page 2, of insert in the Rule Book. The motion CARRIED.

4—EXTRA RELAY TEAMS IN THIS MEET

It was moved by Moore, seconded by Barnes, and CARRIED, that the Hollywood-Los Angeles-San Pedro teams be allowed to enter the preliminary relay heats and that any other school may take advantage of this rule. Hollywood and Los Angeles have agreed to offer a mid-week relay competition to any school who feels that it was not given sufficient notice to compete in this preliminary.

5—PLACE OF STARTING THE RELAYS

It was moved by Fisher, and seconded by Malcom, and CARRIED, that the place of start and number of teams in the relay heats be left to the judgment of the Track Manager.

It was moved by Moore, and seconded by O'Mara, that the starter in all track meets be instructed to allow an appreciable length of time between "getting set" and the starter's gun; and that the rules in regard to penalties for jumping the gun be rigidly observed. "Getting set" shall be interpreted as coming to a "dead" stop.

The Secretary (the President and the Vice-President being absent) instructed H. J. Moore to act as a committee of one to inform Mr. Reinhard and the Starter of our action.

7—THE TIMERS

It was moved by Collins, and seconded by Fisher, that certain watches be designated as timers and certain others as checkers and the A. A. U. rule of time allowed be followed. Motion CARRIED.

Mr. Moore was appointed a committee of one to see that the Timers were informed of our action.

8—STATE MEET

It was moved by Oliver, and seconded by Fisher, that we pay the railroad fare for all entrants to the State Meet from the Southern Section and also full expenses of Manager Reinhard, who should go in charge of the team. Entrants to submit to Mr. Reinhard a statement of railroad expenses. The motion CARRIED.

9—REPORT OF BASKETBALL MANAGER (See Other Side)

10—QUESTIONS OF ELIGIBILITY

A. Boy moves to Town X from another state, say Ohio, without his parents, but is eligible in all other respects. Is he eligible?—Answer YES.

B. Boy lives in Town A; when he is in the Seventh grade, family moves to Town B. Boy attends 8th, 9th, 10th, and 11th grades in Town A. During 12th grade boy enters school in Town B. Is he eligible?—Answer YES.

C. Boy obtains release from parents and so becomes a "Released Minor," and transfers from Town X where he was a "Letter Man" to Town Y. Is he eligible?

Secretary had ruled that while the courts might recognize the minor as a "free agent," We, the C. I. F., could not recognize "Released Minors" for if we did a "crop" would spring up all over the South.

The Secretary was sustained.

There being no further business we adjourned to the cafeteria.
