Dr. Gary Smidderks will represent the Private Area #2 in place of Gerald Harer. His first teaching assignment was at Pacific Christian High School where later he also served as Vice Principal. In July of 1963, he joined the staff of Los Angeles Baptist High School as Director of Guidance where in addition to his administrative responsibilities, he taught classes in physical education, math, music and religion. In addition, he coached baseball, football, golf, and basketball. He is presently Principal of L.A. Baptist High School.

The CIF-SS Executive Committee is the administrative body of the Southern Section. Responsibilities of the Executive Committee include enforcing all rules and regulations approved by the council of the CIF Southern Section, and the consideration of all questions related to a violation of such rules and regulations.

Dr. Gary Smidderks has been a mainstay in the development of the CIF-SS. In 1986 he became a member of the Executive Committee and assumed the Presidency of that group in 1992. During his tenure as President he had to deal with difficult situations involving the removal of the Commissioner and Orange County attempting to leave the CIF-SS. Gary has shown an incredible ability to build consensus and do what is right for the shareholders of the CIF-SS. During the critical times when the CIF-SS was at odds with the State CIF, Dr. Smidderks advocated for mutual respect and understanding of both entities which led to improved working relationships. He was a member of the State CIF Federated Council serving on the Executive Committee representing the California Association of Private School Organizations (CAPSO). <u>Gary was the longest</u> <u>serving CIF-SS Executive Committee member in the history of the CIF-SS.</u>

During any Executive Committee meeting when Gary spoke everyone listened and he was a valued mentor to all the Presidents of the committee. He retired from the Committee in 2013. He still is active with the CIF-SS serving on the Private/Public



Committee and the Commissioner's Private School Advisory Committee. Dr. Smidderks is a strong proponent for the private schools in the CIF-SS and has taken a proactive approach for both private and public schools in a better understanding of how each of those types of school operate. Gary was articulate and famous for his high level vocabulary, i.e., two of his more famous and eloquent words were <u>"bifurcation"</u> (his favorite) and <u>"malfeasance."</u> Gary said he and his wife would pick a word out of the dictionary and try to use it each day.




