

MEETING OF THE CALIFORNIA INTERSCHOLASTIC FEDERATION,
SOUTHERN SECTION, February 16, 1918.

A meeting of the C. I. F. Council was held at the Los Angeles Y. M. C. A. On February, 16, 1918, with the following members present:

Minutes of the meeting held December 8 were read and approved.

After a full discussion, sectioning of leagues for the school year 1918-19 were suggested as follows, for the various schools:

Central League:

South Pasadena, Monrovia, Citrus, Covina, Glendale, Alhambra, Franklin.

San Fernando Valley:

Van Nuys, Lankershim, Marion, San Fernando, Burbank Lancaster.

Citrus League - Two Sections:-

Section I: Riverside, San Bernardino, Redlands, Chaffee, Corona, Colton.
Section II: Beaumont, Hemet, San Jacinto, Banning, Perris.

Orange League:

Santa Ana, Pomona, San Diego, Fullerton, Anaheim, Orange, Huntington Beach, Whittier.

Bay League:

San Pedro, Gardena, Huntington Park, Compton, Santa Monica, Redondo, Venice, Inglewood.

Southern League - Two Sections:

Section I: Army and Navy, Escondido, Coronado, National City, San Diego second.
Section II: Calexico, El Centro, Imperial, Brawley, Holtville.

Valley League:

Bonita, Claremont, El Monte, Excelsior, Norwalk, Montebello.

Northern League:

Schools of Ventura and Santa Barbara Counties.

City League:

Manual Arts, Los Angeles, Polytechnic, Pasadena, Long Beach, Hollywood, Jefferson, Lincoln.

This apportionment is suggested at this time in order that careful consideration may be given to it by every school and that their wishes may be made known to the C. I. F. representative of their league, in order that the matter may be finally adjusted at a later date.

A motion was passed that the ninth grade residence of high school standing in intermediate schools must be counted in totaling the semesters of attendance in high schools.

An amendment to eligibility rules to Article V, Section E. of the eligibility clause of the constitution was presented, to amend section E to read as follows:

" No pupil shall compete in any game with another school who is not making a passing grade in nine units of new work or who did not make passing grades the previous semester in nine units of work according to University of California entrance credit. By new work is meant studies for which pupils have not previously enrolled. Pupils failing to make nine units in any semester are ineligible to compete the hole of the following semester."

A motion was passed that beginning with the school year 1918-19, there will be no more reinstatements of athletes.

A motion was passed that after this date all games shall officially end ten minutes after sunset. Attached to these minutes you will find the official time as published by the Weather Bureau of Los Angeles.

The Secretary was instructed to draw an order upon the Treasurer for \$14.74, to cover expenses from April 1917 to February 1918.

The Council adjourned to meet April 5, 1918 at 4 P. M. at the Los Angeles Y. M. C. A. The first order of business shall be the election of a State representative to succeed E. W. Oliver, resigned to enter War Work in the Y. M. C. A. Service.
