Basket Ball Manager's Report

(1) It was agreed that a placque be awarded for winners of 90# schedule of semi-finals.

(2) It was moved, seconded and carried that the San Diego 130# schedule of 6 games be accepted and San Diego be allowed to enter semi-finals if she wins all of the six games.

(3) It was agreed that the Manager place schools in semi-finals according to date of finishing League Schedule.

Note-The Secretary was instructed to remind the Principals that any boy played in the semi-final weight teams must have been "weighed-in" during the first two weeks of the second half of the year.

(4) It was moved, seconded and carried that the manager's recommendation that the Base Ball semi-finals begin May 26 and close June 15 be accepted.

#### Report of Track Manager

(6) It was moved, seconded and carried that the Track Manager be authorized to change an admission fee of 15¢ to pupils and 25¢ to the public to see the preliminary heats to the Southern California.

(7) It was moved, seconded and carried that the Leagues beyond the 50 mile limit must enter the preliminary meet if they expect to enter more than one man per League in any event for which preliminaries are held.

(8) It was moved, seconded and carried that Mr. Oliver, as chairman, Mr. H. J. Moore, Mr. Hamilton, Mr. Van Patton, the Secretary and the President be appointed a committee to consult the proper persons concerning the use of the Stadium by the High Schools of Southern California.

(9) It was moved, seconded and carried that the Imperial Valley League be granted permission to play the Fort Yuma Indian Reservation of Yuma, Arizona.

(10) It was moved, seconded and carried that the Secretary be paid \$100.00 and expenses annually.

(11) It was moved, seconded and carried that schools be advised that requests for rulings and information be made through the League Representative and not directly to the C. I. F. officials.

(12) It was moved, seconded and carried that the Paso Robles League be permitted to enter the Southern California Track Meet

under the same conditions and regulations affecting leagues over 50 miles, and that the League be invited to send a representative to the next meeting of the Southern Section of the C. I. F.

(13) It was moved, and seconded that a play off game be arranged by Imperial League between Brawley and Imperial to be played at El Centro at date set by Imperial League.

(14) It was moved, seconded and carried that the check of \$10.00 be returned to Brawley.

(15) It was moved, seconded and carried that the representative of the various leagues determine the classification of the pupils of the league according to the point system proposed by Mr. Moore; the data to be recorded on blanks furnished by the Secretary and sent to Mr. Moore for presentation at next meeting.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA INTERSCHOLASTIC WATER POLO  
1923 RULINGS.

1. Schedule to begin March 1, 1923 (Thursday) and to be played on scheduled dates in the afternoon unless otherwise agreed upon by both competing schools.
2. N. B. It is understood that we will endeavor to assist the home school as much as possible in case they have an opportunity to make money on the game.
3. The home team shall provide the official after agreeing with the visiting team, and shall pay said official. (It is suggested that officials be paid five dollars (\$5.00) and expenses. Officials must be secured who have no official connection with either team.
4. Where admission is charged the home team shall pay expenses of the visiting team at the rate of one cent (1¢) per mile for eleven men.
5. Playing rules shall be those of the A. A. U. except and in addition as follows:
  - A. If the score is tied at the end of playing time, an extra period of three minutes shall be played after a two minute rest, and as many such extra periods as are necessary to determine the winner of the match. All extra periods to be construed as continuations of the second half and goals to remain unchanged. Two minutes rest shall be allowed between all extra periods.
  - B. When ducking an opponent, a player must not use his feet.
  - C. A "sprint" may push off from the goal keeper only when the opponents are using the end to push off from.
  - D. Caps shall be worn in Southern California Interscholastic water polo games.
  - E. Time outs shall not be allowed. In case of cramps being suffered a substitution may be made as soon as possible.
  - F. All substitutions shall be made by the referee, after the substitute reports, and at a time when the ball is dead.  
The substitute must enter the water at his own goal line.
  - G. Only one resubstitution will be permitted. That is, a player may be taken out and put back in only once.
