It was moved by Collins and seconded by Smith that the 9th Grade track meet be eliminated for this year. Vote—Yes 10 No—4.

(6) It was moved by Mr. Moore and seconded by Mr. Blee that the City League be allowed to hold such a meet and invite other schools to enter if the City League wished to hold such a meet. Carried.

(D) Question came up. Boy played on team outside of school without the consent of either Principal or Coach. Are you going to punish the whole team and school?

(7) It was moved by Mr. Smith and seconded by Mr. Blee that the Book of Constitution and Rulings just published be adopted as printed and that said constitutions and rulings be put in effect at once; that the Committee be complimented for the splendid work which it has done.

(8) It was moved by Blee and seconded by Green that when it is necessary to postpone a regularly scheduled league semi-final, or final game, the eligibility lists shall be exchanged between the opposing schools, in person or by mail on the scheduled date and players used on the date of the play-off shall be taken from this list. The motion was lost 10 to 4.

Mr. Perkins of San Diego was then allowed the floor to clear up several matters connected with Athletic Relations.

(9) It was moved, seconded and carried that Mr. Squire be requested to draw up the schedule for the Basketball semi-finals and finals.

Basketball semi-finals will be at U. S. C. pavilion March, 14, and 21.

(10) It was moved, seconded and carried that Mr. Van Patten use his own judgment as to the desirability of having the A. A. U. Manager furnish things necessary to be done at all meets such as ticket selling, getting out programs, furnishing guards, etc.
