FEBRUARY 1935 BULLETIN

The second meeting of the year for the Council was held in the Cafeteria at Los Angeles High School on Saturday, February 9, 1935.

The meeting was called to order by President Blee of Bishop at 9:30 A.M. A roll called showed the Leagues represented as follows:

1. Moved by Mr. Means, seconded by Mr. Fischer that the Minutes for the October meeting be approved as printed. Carried.

2. The Treasurer's report as printed on the following page was presented by our Treasurer Mr. Oliver. Moved by Mr. Oliver, seconded by Mr. Moore that the report be accepted and printed in the minutes. Carried.

3. The Reorganization Committee's report was presented by the Chairman, Mr. Eugene Wolfe. (The report in full was sent to each High School in the special C.I.F. Bulletin of January 14, 1935). Moved by Mr. Wolfe, seconded by Mr. Means that the report be adopted. The report was discussed at length by Mr. Fischer, Mr. Means, Mr. Monroe, Mr. Moore, Mr. Hamilton, Mr. Thompson, Mr. Alman and Mr. Wolfe. It was quite evident from the discussion that the report of the Committee

was not acceptable to a large number of those who discussed it. Moved by Mr. Means, seconded by Mr. Wolfe that the report of the Reorganization Committee be laid on the table. Mr. Means explained that he made this motion in order to clear the way for another motion which he said Mr. Moore had indicated he was ready to make. Motion to table the Committee's report carried unanimously.

4. Moved by Mr. Moore, seconded by Mr. Wolfe that we request the State Council of the C.I.F. to authorize the division of the State Council of the C.I.F., Southern Section into two sections of the State C.I.F. That one section be composed of schools of the Los Angeles City High School District. That the rest of the High Schools of Southern California be organized as the second section. That we recommend that the section composed of the Los Angeles City Schools be allowed one representative on the State Council and that the rest of the Southern California High Schools be allowed two representatives on the State Council. The President ordered a roll call on the motion which resulted as follows:

No—6
Not voting—4

The President ruled the motion carried.

5. Dr. Frederick W. Cozens of U.C.L.A. appeared before the Council and explained at length results which had been tabulated from studies on classification of boys for athletic competition. The studies were made by Dr. Cozens, Mr. Martin Trieb of the Los Angeles City Schools and Mr. N. P. Nielsen, formerly State Supervisor of Health and Physical Education. Moved by Mr. Thompson, seconded by Mr. Veenker that the Chair appoint a Committee of three to confer with Dr. Cozens to bring in a report at the next meeting of the Council relative to the substitution of Mr. Cozen's plan of classification in place of our present four-point system. Carried.

6. Moved by Mr. Alman, seconded by Mr. Veenker that the Brawley Union High School be awarded the Southern Minor Football Championship and that a C.I.F. Plaque be presented. (The other schools in the Southern Minor Football Play-off all withdrew). Motion carried.

7. President Blee during the football season, on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Athletics, had appointed a Committee to make recommendations to the Council relative to the various athletic officials' organizations that now serve the schools of our organization. The Committee was composed of Mr. John R. Hunt, Assistant County Superintendent of Schools of Los Angeles County, Chairman, Mr. M. G. Blair, Mr. Arthur Badenoch, Dr. Fred Cozens, Mr. Wm. G. Lopez and the Commissioner of Athletics. Mr. Hunt reporting for the Committee made the following recommendations:

1. Recognition of—
 - Southern California Football Association and affiliated organizations
 - Southern California Basketball Association
 - Southern California Baseball Association

2. Commissioners to take only active and satisfactory members of these groups.
3. Lists to Commissioners must come from and with the approval of High School Principal.
4. Commissioners meet at the call of the C.I.F. Commissioner for initial arrangements as to the appointment of officials.

Moved by Mr. Blair, seconded by Mr. Wolfe that Mr. Hunt's recommendations be adopted. Carried.

8. Moved by Mr. Venker, seconded by Mr. McIntosh that the Chair appoint a Committee to study the question of uniform fees for all Leagues for athletic officials. Carried.

9. Moved by Mr. Berlin, seconded by Mr. Wolfe that the discuss throw be made a regular event in the Southern California Track Meet for this year. Roll call asked for. The motion was lost 11 to 5. Six schools not voting.

10. Mr. Dudley C. Shumway, Director of Competitive Sports for the Los Angeles City Playgrounds, appeared before the Council and stated that there was a good deal of uncertainty in the minds of many boys and many coaches relative to rulings in the State Constitution regarding boys playing on any other team than their high school team. Mr. Shumway asked for a clarification of the rules appearing on page 5 of the State Constitution of 1934. Moved by Mr. Thompson, seconded by Mr. House that this matter be referred to Mr. Moore and Mr. Oliver, the State Representatives for action. Carried.

11. Moved by Mr. Means, seconded by Mr. Hamilton that we urge the Los Angeles City Schools to take part in the Southern California Track Meet and that all details regarding the Southern California Track Meet be left to the Executive Committee and the Commissioner of Athletics with power to act. Carried.

12. Moved by Mr. Berlin, seconded by Mr. Wolfe that the Chair appoint a Committee of three to make a study of re-leaguing of schools outside of Los Angeles City. That the Committee be ready to make recommendations at the next meeting of the Council. Carried.

13. Moved by Mr. Thompson, seconded by Mr. McIntosh that the time and place of the next meeting of the Council be left to the Executive Committee with authority to act. It being understood that the Executive Committee would in all probability call another meeting prior to the annual meeting on the third Saturday in May. Carried.

14. The Point Loma High School had raised the question as to where the transfer point from Junior to Senior High School is in a six year High School and the following answer to the question was informally agreed upon. "A boy shall be considered in a Senior High School as soon as he takes any ninth grade work after having completed four semesters following his enrollment in the seventh grade of the Junior High School. Such a boy shall be eligible for eight semesters of competition in a Senior High School."

At 3:30 P.M. there being no further business President Blee declared the meeting adjourned.

Enclosure—Track Coaches are again reminded that this track season we are to follow the N.C.A.A. rules rather than the A.A.U. rules as in the past. The bulletin enclosed sets forth the chief differences between these two sets of track rules. This bulletin should go to the Track Coach.

Moving Picture Films—Two 16 millimeter moving picture films of C.I.F. Championships are available for the use of any school wishing them. We have 250 feet of film of the Southern California Track Meet held at the Coliseum May 19, 1934. We have 350 feet of film showing the Chaffey vs. Long Beach Championship football game played in the Coliseum December 22, 1934.

These films are now ready for booking and will be sent to High Schools applying, on the following conditions:

If shown to students where no charge is made the only expense to the school will be for postage.

If used for a pay assembly we will ask the school to remit 10% of the gate. The two films take about 25 minutes to run and we think will make an entirely worthwhile 5c entertainment.
