January 18, 1923

The Council of the California Inter-scholastic Federation Southern Section met in the Y. M. C. A. of L. A. at 3:30 P. M. January 18, 1923. The meeting was called to order by President Franklin who asked for a roll call.

Football report--The manager reported that his report was not ready owing to the slowness of the schools in reporting the semi-finals. It was pointed out that schools were not living up to the rules in reference to the semi-finals.

(1) It was moved, seconded and carried that a meeting of the several managers be called by the President of the Council for the purpose of preparing blanks that will assist in expediting the business of the managers.

Basketball-Manager Squires requested the Council Members to write to him at once and state when League schedule would end.

Also if the league would have Unlimited, #130, #110, #90 teams in the semi-finals.

Remember all men must be "weighed in" some time during the first two weeks of the semester and the Principal must certify to the weight of each man.

(A) Question--Can a school in a League refuse to play in the League Schedule and yet continue to play games in that sport?

(A) Ruling--A team may refuse to enter a league schedule and may play games, but any team so doing may not enter any other series of regularly scheduled games or be permitted to enter the semi-finals.

(2) It was moved, seconded and carried that the ruling of the Chair be sustained.

(3) Vote was then taken on question "that in computing the standing of any team a tie game shall count as one-half game won and one-half game lost"---

(4) Vote was then taken on question "That letter men moving from one school to another within one section must be in the second school one year before they are eligible unless their parents make a bona fide change of residence"

(5) Vote was then taken on question of Mr. Van Pattons recommendation that school be allowed to enter eight men.

(6) Vote was then taken on Mr. Van Patton's recommendation that all heats be run on Wednesday preceding meet and schools more than 50 miles from Los Angeles be excused from heats.

(7) It was moved that any school may enter one extra man in addition to the men placing in the League Meet. This rule not to change rule on page 12, second paragraph of duties of track manager.

(8) It was moved, seconded and carried that the following schools be declared football champions for 1922-23
Unlimited - San Diego
130# - Pasadena
110# - Long Beach

(9) It was moved, seconded and carried that the design for uniform placque submitted by T. V. Allen and approved by the committee be adopted.

(10) It was moved, seconded and carried that Mr. Van Patton's agreement with Santa Ana be accepted and filed.

(11) It was moved, seconded and carried that the rules adopted for the Track Meet at Santa Ana, one year ago, be the rules governing the meet this year.

(12) It was moved, seconded and carried that San Diego be placed in the City Meet and five men place and that Harvard and the Army and Navy must place in the San Fernando Meet.

(13) It was moved, seconded and carried that the place for hold-preliminary heats for track events be left to the judgment of Track Manager Van Patten.

(14) It was moved, seconded and carried that Dr. Schulz weight chart be a special order of business for our next meeting.

The meeting then adjourned.
