JANUARY 1931 BULLETIN

1. Minutes of Meeting of the Council, December 19, 1930. (Second meeting of year.) The meeting was called to order by President Cline at 9:30 A. M. in Classroom B of the Bible Institute in Los Angeles.

3. Minutes of meeting of October 4, 1930, approved with minor typographical corrections.

4. The Executive Committee presented the following report:

Dec. 12, 1930.

"The Executive Committee has conferred over the telephone on numerous occasions since the October meeting. A number of questions on eligibility have been answered. Practically all the eligibility questions were ones which ought to have been first passed upon by the League concerned. The Committee was willing in all cases to give an opinion for the guidance of the schools concerned and we are glad to report that the opinions rendered have been accepted as final, in all cases so far as we have been informed.

"The Committee granted the request of the San Diego High School that its Class B football team be allowed to enter the play-off even though it had played no League schedule. The Coast League was unable to give San Diego Class B football team a schedule of games but a team had been maintained and was ready for the play-off.

"The Committee met December 10 at the South Pasadena High School and spent an hour and a quarter discussing proposed changes in Article XI, page 16 of the Constitution. It was moved by Oliver and seconded by Alman that we recommend that no change be made in the Article. Carried unanimously.

"The Committee feels that the present provisions of the Constitution are fundamentally sound. They are based on the different school systems as now organized.

"The number of instances where boys will be kept back in a Junior High to star in athletics will be almost negligible.

"If an attempt is made to check semesters of attendance and competition in Junior High Schools a great burden of clerical work will be added to that now done by many High Schools.

"The Executive Committee recommends that the C.I.F.S.S. makes no attempt to establish a wrestling championship. There are no objections to leagues and schools having wrestling programs but the Committee doubts the advisability of trying to establish a championship."

5. Moved by Means and seconded by Johnson that we amend the Constitution as follows: To Article XI, Section 2 of By-Laws, add:

"However, no boy shall be eligible for INTER-LEAGUE competition if his scholastic record and semesters of competition would have made him ineligible had all of his school work been taken in a four-year High School.

"Add same to Section 3."

A very full, free, and frank discussion of the proposed amendment took place. Practically every member of the Council participated. Roll call asked for by Means, which resulted as follows:

6. Moved by O'Mara, seconded by Westcott, that report of Executive Committee be approved.

MOTION CARRIED

7. Moved by McIntosh and seconded by Means that we reverse the ruling of the Executive Committee in the case of the Calexico boy (Alfred Bojorquez) who transferred from the El Centro High School as he did not have legal change of residence. Carried.

8. Moved by McIntosh, seconded by Westcott, that the C.I.F.S.S. recommend that the various leagues of the Southern Section adopt all rules and regulations of the Council for all sports recognized by the C.I.F. Carried.

9. Moved by Johnson, seconded by O'Mara, that a member school of the C.I.F.S.S. shall not participate in any activity not under the direction of a league unless that activity has been sanctioned by the Commissioner of Athletics. Carried.

10. Moved by O'Mara, seconded by Westcott, that the Emblem Committee be given authority to make selection of Emblem for Council members. Carried.

Case 1931

11. Moved by Thompson, seconded by Means, that we amend Rule 5, page 23 of the Constitution by adding at the end of the first sentence, "Every time that the stakes and line are moved forward shall count a first down." Carried.

12. Moved by Westcott, seconded by House, that St. Augustine School of San Diego be permitted to schedule games with the San Diego City League schools and the Southern League schools, provided St. Augustine exchange certified eligibility lists for all games and file a list of such games played with the Commissioner of Athletics. Carried.

13. Van Patten reported that Colonel Davis of the Army and Navy Academy of San Diego had discussed with him the possibility of that school joining the San Diego City League. The President ruled that if the Academy applied to the League for admission for the rest of the year it was a question for the League to settle. If the Academy is not admitted to the San Diego City League then the ruling above in regard to St. Augustine is to apply in regard to the Academy for the rest of this year.

14. Van Patten recommended that a Standard Record Card for track meets be furnished to all schools along with the other supplies sent out by the C.I.F.S.S. office. General approval being manifest, the President ruled that the recommendation be carried out.

15. Recommended by Van Patten that the Treasurer be asked for a report, including returns on present football season to be printed in these minutes. There being no objections the President approved the recommendation.

16. Van Patten reported a fine spirit of cooperation on the part of all schools taking part in the play-off games in football. He reported also fine cooperation from the members of the Southern California Football Officials Association. He recommended that the Council of the C.I.F.S.S. express to the Football Officials Association its commendation for the splendid work being done in preparing officials for the very important task of handling our football games.

Moved by O'Mara, seconded by Monroe, that the recommendation be approved and that Van Patten be instructed to send a suitable communication to the Association. Carried.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned by the President at 12:15 P. M.
