It was moved, seconded and carried that the report be accepted with thanks.

City League

A letter was received and read from the principals and vice-principals of the high and intermediate schools of the Los Angeles City stating that their meeting had passed the following resolution:

"It is moved that we ask our vice-principals who represent us in the C. I. F. to insist that our athletic league for next year be limited to six city high schools and five contests, to avoid multiplication of events. Also that we cannot to advantage arrange any schedule with a school in an outside city."

The reasons given were

1. Distractions
2. Expense
3. Chaperonage

After a general discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried that the Secretary be instructed to answer the letter, and to state that the schedule of leagues had been decided upon after an all day session in which twelve men representing 94 high schools had taken part; and that in the judgement of the Council of the C. I. F. S. S., the principals and vice-principals of the high schools and intermediate schools of Los Angeles City should accept the leagues as they now stand or else take all of the high schools of Los Angeles City under their control.

(Note by secretary--There are 14 city high schools now in four leagues; which six are they referring to and to which outside cities?)

League Records for State

A letter was read from the State Office asking for all school records. It was moved, seconded and carried that the Secretary of each league be requested to send to the State Office the athletic records made by the league.

Five Places in Track

It was moved, seconded and carried that in the Southern California Track Meet five places be awarded and the value of each place be decided by the revision committee.

Mr. Green suggested that in view of the fact of his being out of the state during July, the revision committee proceed with the printing of the constitution.

The Chair appointed H. J. Moore to act as chairman of the committee during Mr. Green's absence.

It was agreed that when we meet in October, the meeting be an all day meeting and that representatives of the press be asked to meet with us.

It was agreed that if the principals and vice-principals of Los Angeles City decided to have all of the city schools in a City League, Burbank, Pasadena, and Long Beach would be taken care of at a special meeting.

There being no further business, the Council adjourned.

To the Principals of Southern California.

Dear Friend:

G. M. Green, C. B. Moore and H. J. Moore have been appointed a committee to compile and print a new edition of the Constitution and rulings of the C. I. F. Southern Section.

Any help you can give which will make our little book of more value to you will be gladly received.

We, the Principals, are supposed to supply three days before a contest, a certified list of pupils who are eligible to represent us in that contest.

This list will be made up of two classes of pupils.

- A. Transferred pupils from other schools.
- B. Our pupils who have been in no other school.

A. Transferred pupils.

1. Is he under twenty-one?
2. Is he a graduate from a High School?
3. Is he an amateur?
4. How many semesters has he been in other High Schools?
5. Was he in school the semester just before transfer?
6. Did he pass in three units of work the semester just before transfer?
7. Is he changing schools with or without a change of residence of his parents?
(When we transfer a pupil to another school we ought to send the above information to the new Principal.)

B. Pupils who have been in no other High School.

1. Is he under twenty-one?
2. Is he an amateur?
3. Was he in school the semester immediately preceding the semester of the game?
4. Did he pass in three units of work the semester immediately preceding the semester of the game?
5. How many semesters has he been in school?

Eligibility Rules

- A. Age No pupil shall contest in any game or meet with another school who is twenty-one years old or over.
- B. Amateur The A. A. U. rule for a professional is the rule of this Federation.
- C. No pupil shall compete in athletic contests with another school after the first eight semesters in any secondary school.
Ten weeks or over shall count as a semester's residence. Participation in one or more athletic contests between terms of different schools or organizations shall count as a semester's residence.
Practice games shall count the same as league games.
- D. Post-graduates shall be ineligible to compete.
- E. No person shall take part in any game held under the auspices of this Federation who has not been a member of his school for the semester, or its equivalent, immediately preceding, except students entering from a grade school or except

because of change of residence of legal parent or guardian.

F. Students who are compelled to change from one school to another must have been a member of the first school for the semester, or its equivalent, immediately preceding the change of schools.

G. No pupil shall compete in any game with another school who has not made a passing grade in 3 out of 16; 9 out of 48; or 30 out of 160 units of new work (according to the University of California entrance credits) for the semester immediately preceding the semester in which the game is played.

Further, no pupil shall compete in any game with another school who is not making a passing grade in the above number of units of new work for the current semester up to the time he was certified for the contest (A passing grade in new work shall be construed to mean that the pupil must have a passing grade in each of the subjects, for all work completed by the class during the semester to date of certification.) By new work is meant studies in which pupils have not previously made a passing grade. Pupils are not allowed to count 3 units in one subject, for example, Agriculture 9, 10, and 11; nor credits earned in Physical Education.

H. The principal of each school shall be held responsible for the amateur standing and eligibility of his teams under these rules and shall certify to each member in a line-up to be exchanged with, and in the hands of, the Principal of the opposing team at least twenty-four hours before a practice game. For league games, semi-finals, and finals, such line-ups shall be exchanged not less than three days before the meet or game.

I. In the event that a member of a team is shown to be ineligible for any championship game in which he has participated, the entire school shall become liable to suspension from interschool athletics for the remainder of the year, or for the succeeding semester if the violation occurs during the Spring semester.

J. No visiting team shall be recognized by the captain of the home team or by the Principal of the school, unless accompanied by a faculty representative who shall be responsible for the conduct and line-up of his team and it shall be the duty of the respective faculty representative in charge of the two teams, to exchange lists of the players that go out on the field, and in football a list of all men sent in as substitutes, and these lists shall be filed with the respective principals.

K. No school under the jurisdiction of the C. I. F. Southern Section shall play ineligible men at any time even in practice games whether such games are played with schools under the jurisdiction of the C. I. F. or not, and any school violating this rule shall be suspended from participation in such sport for the succeeding season.

- I. Any school under the jurisdiction of the C. I. F.-S-S. must finish the league schedule and any school entitled to enter semi-finals, or finals must complete the schedule until eliminated and any school which refuses to complete the schedule, shall at once disband its team for that sport for the season or be suspended from the C. I. F. Southern Section for one year. This rule to apply to all schools and teams under the jurisdiction of the C. I. F. Southern Section.
- II. No school under the jurisdiction of the C. I. F. Southern Section shall compete with schools outside the State of California without receiving the consent of the Council.
- III. No student may play on any team other than his High School team during the school season of that particular sport. (State)
- IV. No school team which is a member of the C. I. F. shall play other than practice games with high schools outside of the C. I. F., and in such practice games both teams shall conform to the eligibility rules of the C. I. F.; and further more, that no sectional champion shall play any California High School outside of the C. I. F. In case a school disregards any provision of this rule, the school shall be debarred from participation in that sport in the C. I. F. during the next season. (State)
