ELECTION OF OFFICERS

According to the C. I. F., S. S. Constitution, the President and Vice-President of the Council shall be representatives from the various leagues selected in the order of their alphabetical arrangement. In accordance with this Mr. Badenoch moved that the Representative of the Citrus Belt League be President of the Council for the school year 1948-1949. Mr. Gunn seconded the motion and it carried.

Mr. Badenoch moved that the Vice-President be the representative of the Coast League. Mr. Berlin seconded the motion and it carried.

Mr. Badenoch moved that Mr. Seth F. Van Patten be retained as Commissioner of Athletics. Mr. Gunn seconded the motion and it carried.

Mr. Harry Moore moved that Mr. S. Chester McIntosh serve another year as Treasurer of the C. I. F., S. S., Mr. Bowers seconded the motion and it carried.

Mr. McIntosh moved that Mr. Moore who is the President of the State Council, serve another term of two years as the Southern Section Representative. Mr. Badenoch seconded the motion, and it was carried.

The selection of the Executive Committee was next. Mr. Ernest W. Fischer declined nomination. A fine tribute was paid Mr. Fischer upon his retirement.

Mr. Laurenson nominated Mr. Floyd Johnson of Hoover SD.

Mr. Badenoch nominated Mr. Ewing Konold of Santa Monica.

Mr. Moore nominated Mr. Kinter Hamilton of Harvard.

Mr. Hamilton nominated Mr. Bergstrom of El Monte.

Mr. Ed Laurenson nominated Mr. Sidney Davidson of Newport Beach.

Mr. Lawson nominated Mr. Harvey Holt of Santa Barbara.

Mr. Berlin nominated Mr. Clarence Burrell of Arroyo Grande.

Mr. Laurenson moved that the nominations be closed. Mr. Berlin seconded the motion. Carried.

A ballot vote was taken to fill the five positions. Mr. E. W. Fischer and Mr. Bill Cole tallied the votes. The following men were elected to serve as Executive Committeemen for a term of one year:

Mr. Van Patten introduced Mr. Glenn Vaniman, Principal of Citrus High School (Azusa) as the new Tri-County League Representative. Mr. Earl Thompson of Claremont is retiring after serving 21 years on the Council and was highly commended upon his service.

N. I. F. FOOTBALL RULES

Mr. S. Chester McIntosh made a report on the joint football code for high school and college football. He said that it was officially adopted by the National Interscholastic Federation and would be ready for use in the fall of 1948. The outstanding principals of the game were taken and the whole code has been reworded. It is the hope that there will be no conflict between high school and college football. A lengthy discussion of the matter took place in which Mr. Jach Mashim of Grossmont, Mr. McIntosh, Mr. Badenoch and Mr. Clarence Schutte of Santa Barbara took part. Mr. Schutte explained that both the high school and the college rule books will be exactly the same, except for the book cover itself.

Mr. Badenoch moved that the C.I.F., Southern Section officially adopt the National Interscholastic Federation Football Rules. Mr. Berlin seconded the motion. There were no dissenting votes.

TRACK RULES

Mr. Berlin moved that the C. I. F., Southern Section adopt the National Federation Edition of Track and Field Rules. Mr. Vaniman seconded the motion.

Mr. Laurenson requested that the matter be discussed by the Track Committee before the Council should act on it. Mr. Austin moved that the motion for adoption be tabled until the fall meeting of the Council. Mr. Lawson seconded the motion and it carried.

Mr. Berlin moved that the C. I. F., Southern Section purchase enough of the 1948 NATIONAL FEDERATION TRACK AND FIELD RULES to supply one copy to each of our member schools. Mr. Gunn seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

The Track Committee is expected to form some recommendations to present to the Council at their fall meeting.

AWARDS

A lengthy discussion took place in regards to awards to individuals and schools at all meets and tournaments approved by the C. I. F., Southern Section.

It was moved by Mr. Kinter Hamilton and seconded by Mr. Arthur Badenoch that the C. I. F., Southern Section recommend that its State Representatives urge the State Council at its meeting on May 29 to limit awards and trophies that are given in C. I. F. activities and sanctioned meets or tournaments, to ribbons and medals for individuals and to plaques, cups and trophies to schools.

It was unanimously agreed that small baseballs, basketballs, football, track shoes, and small emblems indicative of the sport be classed as medals.

Passed unanimously.

BASKETBALL FEES

Mr. Peters moved that the maximum fee for a double header basketball game be set at \$12.00. It was seconded by Mr. Badenoch and carried unanimously.

GOLF TOURNAMENT

Moved by Mr. Gunn that the Golf Tournament be moved up to June 4. Mr. Lawson seconded the motion and it carried.

POMONA FOOTBALL OFFICIALS

Mr. Berlin moved that the Commissioner of Athletics encourage the establishment of an Officials' Association in the Pomona District, preferably as a Branch of the Southern California Officials' Association, but if this organization will not agree, then as an independent association. Mr. Badenoch seconded the motion and it carried.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP PASS

Moved by Mr. Hamilton that the Council present to Mr. Earl Thompson and Mr. E. W. Fischer for their long and untiring services to the C. I. F., Southern Section, Gold Life Membership Certificates which would admit them to any C. I. F., Southern Section function. Mr. Gunn seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

FOOTHILL LEAGUE COMPETITORS

Mr. Gunn moved that the Foothill League Competitors be allowed to compete if there were any vacancies in the track and field meet. Mr. Bowers seconded the motion. After considerable discussion the motion and second was withdrawn.

BASEBALL PLAY-OFF

The possibility of beginning the baseball play-off as late as May 15 for 1949 will be placed on the agenda of the next meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:10 P. M.

THE STATE TRACK AND FIELD MEET

The State Track and Field Meet was won by the Jordan High School of Los Angeles with a score of 22 points. Jefferson High School of L. A. scored 20 5/6 and Compton took third with eighteen points.

Bob Mathias of Tulare was high point man of the meet. He scored 12 points. He won both hurdle races and a fourth in the shot put. He is a good Olympic prospect in the decathlon.
