SMALL SCHOOLS AND LARGE SCHOOLS PROBLEMS

Mr. William McDonald of Hobover High
School in Glendale reporting for the committee
appointed February 5, 1949 to study this question
stated that the committee had prepared no for-
mal recommendation. He stated that Mr. Van
Patten prepared an outline on the matter and
asked that it be presented to the council at this
time.

Mr. Van Patten handed out typed copies of
the recommendation which follows:

SANTA BARBARA—The Executive Committee

The outline was discussed at length and a num-
ber of questions as to its workability were asked
and answered.

It was moved by Mr. Badenoch and seconded
by Mr. McDonald that the plan be approved for
the year 1949-1950 except in reference to base-
ball and track and field. Carried

Moved by Mr. Badenoch and seconded by Mr.
Hamilton that the plan for baseball and track
and field be referred to the league for report
at the December 1949 meeting. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Hamilton seconded by Mr.
Scharer that the winner of the football champion-
ship in the Central Group be known as the C. I. F.,
SOUTHERN SECTION CHAMPION. Car-
ried.

Moved by Mr. Konold and seconded by Mr.
McIntosh that any free lance school wishing to
enter a play-off among leagues must be approved
by the Executive Committee. Carried.

SANCTIONED EVENTS

Mr. Bergstrom presented a lengthy report on
the subject of Sanctioned Events.

Moved by Mr. Scharer and seconded by Mr.
Holt that the report be approved in essence and
that it be referred to the Executive Committee
for refinement as to form, expression and rules
for its enforcement. Carried.

CERTIFICATE OF APPRECIATION

The Certificate of Appreciation as prepared
by Mr. Konold was approved by the Council.

RIFLE FIRING

Mr. Holt reported on the action taken by a
meeting in regard to rifle firing under sponsori-
ship of the C. I. F., Southern Section. The
minutes of the meeting are printed in this bulletin.

This meeting decided to make a study of the
question of rifle firing for a period of one year
and ask each organization represented to appoint
two members to the committee.

It was agreed by our Council to leave the ap-
pointment of our two delegates to our incoming
president. Mr. Laurenson appointed Mr. A.
Ewing Konold and Mr. Walter Bell as the C. I. F.,
Southern Section delegates.

TREASURER

Mr. McIntosh, our Treasurer, called attention
to the fact that the working relation existing be-
tween our Executive Committee and our treasurer
is not well defined. He suggested that measures
be taken to clarify the situation.

Moved by Mr. Hamilton, seconded by Mr.
Bowers that our Treasurer be made a member of
our Executive Committee. Carried.

FOOTBALL PRACTICE STARTS

A request was received from the Coronado
High School for approval of a game of football
on September 16 with Saint Augustine. The
President ruled the request not allowable since
the opening date for football practice had been
set at the February meeting for September 5 for
schools who are not already in session.

LOST BOY

In the San Diego semi-final meet a boy, ac-
cording to his coach and his friends, was ap-
parently overlooked by the judges and not re-
ported for a place in the finals. The case was
discussed at length. Mr. Hamilton, our top
track and field authority gave it as his opinion
that when judges in a track meet render a decision
the Council can not change the finding.

No motion was made and no action was taken.

MR. BADENOCH TO RETIRE

Mr. Harry J. Moore called attention to the
fact that Mr. Arthur Hill Badenoch, the Bay
League Representative on the C. I. F., Southern
Section Council was retiring from school work
at the end of this semester.

Mr. Moore pointed out that Mr. Badenoch
has been Director of Athletics at the Inglewood
High School for the past thirty five years. During
all of those years Mr. Badenoch has been a
friend of all amateur athletics. He has been a
staunch supporter of the program of the C. I. F.

Mr. Badenoch was given a real ovation at the
close of Mr. Moore's remarks. The Council
stood and applauded in appreciation of a fine
type of American manhood.

Moved by Mr. Holt and seconded by Mr.
Moore that Mr. Badenoch be presented with the
first of the Certificates of Appreciation. Carried.

ADJURNMENT

At 12:30 the meeting apjourned. The first
regular meeting of the 1949-1950 Council will be
on Saturday, December 10, 1949, the day of the
Central Football Championship Game.

RELATIONS WITH SAN DIEGO STATE COLLEGE

Difficulty was experienced by the C. I. F., Southern Section representatives in getting the track and field at the San Diego State College in shape for the C. I. F., Southern Section meets held on May 7 and May 14, 1949.

Moved by Mr. Konold, seconded by Mr. Holt that a letter be written to Dr. Walter P. Hepner, President of San Diego State College calling attention to the situation, and to the needs of the high schools in our southern counties for a fine track and field for our championship track and field meets. Carried.

CALIFORNIA JUNIOR REPUBLIC'S REQUEST

Mr. Larry Sullivan, Field Executive for the California Junior Republic at Chino, requested that the Junior Republic be allowed to schedule a game of football with the Boy's Town team during the 1949 season.

It was pointed out to Mr. Sullivan that this request would have to be approved by our State Council. It was brought out also that our State Council would not approve unless the request had the sanction of the section of the C. I. F. in which the contest would be held.

It was moved by Mr. Konold and seconded by Mr. Holt that we refer the matter to our Council with a recommendation for favorable consideration. Motion carried.

The question was referred to our Council at its meeting later in the day. The Council by motion refused to approve the request.

Mr. Harvey J. Holt acted as Chairman and Mr. Seth F. Van Patten as Secretary.

A long general discussion took place in regard to rifle shooting as practiced by the California Cadet Corps, the R. O. T. C., the National Rifle Association Schools of the C. I. F. Los Angeles City Section, and schools of the C. I. F., Southern Section.

Mr. Traynor moved and Col. Haycock seconded that a committee consisting of two members from each of the organizations named above be set up to observe and study rifle shooting as practiced in Southern California and to make recommendations in regard to its administration by the C. I. F., Los Angeles City Section and the C. I. F., Southern Section. Carried.

It was moved, seconded and carried that representatives from four of the groups named above should constitute a quorum.

Mr. Van Patten was asked to contact Mr. Lopez and Col. Montgomery of the Los Angeles Section and give them an idea of what took place at today's meeting.

Mr. Konold offered the following statement as to the purpose of the organization.

"It shall be the purpose of this organization to work on the encouragement of inter-school rifle competition and to prepare and recommend a program that will be acceptable for C. I. F. competition." This was approved by all present.
