BUSIEST YEAR IN CIF-SS HISTORY CONCLUDED WITH ELEVEN SPORTS IN MAY AND JUNE

MUIR TAKES 4A, MASTERS, AND STATE TRACK TITLES

San Bernardino, La Canada Win 3A and 2A Meets

Muir HS of Pasadena made it a clean sweep for the 1974 Track & Field season as it powered to team and individual championships in the CIF-SS 4A and Masters Track Meets and culminated an outstanding year by winning the California State Title in Bakersfield on June 1.

Led by Fred Shaw, state champion in both hurdle events, and by its outstanding (3:13.8) first place mile relay team of Wayne Herron, Allan Sheats, Shaw, and Jim Austin, Coach Walter Opp's Mustangs easily outscored runners-up Long Beach Poly HS 37-27 in the 4A Finals at Cerritos College on May 17, L.B. Poly and Victor Valley HS 35-10 in the Masters Meet at the same site on May 24, and Wilson HS of San Francisco 23-14 at the State Meet.

The 3A Finals, held in conjunction with the 4A meet, were won handily by San Bernardino HS, coached by Joe Page, while Coach Pat Logan's La Canada squad took the 2A trophy at Bradford Stadium in Placentia on May 18 with a narrow 25-22 victory over runner-up Santa Clara.

PALOS VERDES, HARVARD, AND BISHOP DIEGO TAKE TEAM TENNIS TITLES

Led by Billy Martin, the nation's top junior player, Palos Verdes HS survived two extremely close contests with Foothill HS and Newport Harbor HS in the 16-team tournament to capture the 1974 1st Place Trophy for Team Tennis in the CIF-SS 4A Division. The finals, held at Palos Verdes Tennis Club on May 29, produced a narrow 14½-13½ margin over runner-up Newport Harbor.

Team and/or individual championships were decided in eleven sports for boys and girls at the close of the 1973-74 athletic year, the busiest in the history of the Southern Section. Playoffs were conducted in boy's baseball, golf, gymnastics, tennis, track & field, and volleyball during the end of May and the beginning of June. Similar championship competition during this period was held for the girls in badminton, gymnastics, softball, swimming & diving, and track & field. A total of 22 sport seasons (13 for boys, 9 for girls) were administrated for member schools in the CIF-SS during the past school year with the level of support and participation at an alltime high.

N. TORRANCE, LOMPOC, HEMET, CARPINTERIA CROWNED 1974 BASEBALL CHAMPS

In an unprecidented second title game North Torrance HS earned the 1974 CIF-SS 4A Baseball Championship with a close 1-0 victory over previously undefeated Lakewood HS at USC's Dedeaux Field on June 8. The first game, held at Anaheim Stadium on June 4, had been halted by the Southern Section's curfew rule after 11 scoreless innings.

Hero of the two-game "series" was 4A Baseball "Player of the Year," Tim O'Neill of N. Torrance who pitched all 18 scoreless innings against the Lancers and drove in the only run. The Saxons captured their second 4A title under Coach Jim O'Brien (1st in 1971) and finished the season with a 26-6 record. Coach John Herbold's Lakewood squad failed to make history with a perfect season by the barest of margins but completed its schedule with a superlative 26-1 mark.

Lompoc HS also picked up a second championship (1st in 1970) for its Coach, Dan Bodary, by defeating Nogales HS 4-3 in the 3A opening game of the Anaheim double-header that included the first 4A title game. The victory went to the Braves' Ted Grafton,, All-CIF 3A Pitcher who remained undefeated (9-0) for the season. Two of the Nobles' runs came on a 362-foot home run by All-CIF 3A Outfielder Lew Johnson.


LAKEWOOD AND TAYLOR (L.B. POLY) REPEAT IN **GYMNASTIC FINALS**

The Mission Vieio HS Golf Team left no doubt as to the identity of the top interscholastic golf team in Southtern California as it achieved 9 and 7 stroke victory margins in the CIF-SS and CIF-SCGA Golf Team Tournaments, respectively. Coach Bob Minier's Diablos totaled 398 strokes to runner-up Ventura's 407 in the Southern Section Team Tournament June 3 at Quail Lake Country Club. Then, one week later, in competition with the top teams from the Los Angeles, San Diego, and Central Sections at the Southern California Golf Association Tournament at Los Angeles Country Club, Mission Viejo scored a team aggregate of 412 to runners-up Palisades HS (L.A.) and Poway HS (S.D.) who tallied 419.

Individually, Matt Ellison of Ventura HS took low medal honors in the CIF-SS with a 72 while in the CIF-SCGA Larry Collins of Estancia and Tom Martin of Mission Viejo made the best showing for Southern Section golfers with 36 hole totals of 149, two strokes behind Champion Rich Friedman of Monte Vista HS (S.D.).

PAM CURRAN (LA REINA HS) WINS CIF-SS GIRLS' TRACK CHAMPIONSHIP

Jill Caldwell Sets National Mile Marks

Pam Curran, a one-woman track and field team from La Reina HS in Thousand Oaks, took two firsts and a second to accumulate 13 points and personally outscore all other schools in the CIF-SS Girls Track and Field Champonships held in conjunction wth the Masters Meet at Cerritos College on May 24. Pam, a junior and the sole member of her team, won the 220 yard dash, the long jump, and finished a very close second in the 100 yard dash. Runner-up schools were Muir with 11 points and Royal with 10.

Jill Caldwell, a freshman at Westminster HS, broke the National DGWS record for the mile at the Masters Meet and then promptly lowered it again one week later at the State Meet in Bakersfield. Her times were 5:05.1 and 5:02.2, respectively, as she captured first place in both meets.

This year's format permitted only the champion in each event from each section to advance to the State Track Meet. Because of the quality of competition at that level, both relay teams from the Southern Section and six of its girls achieved best-ever marks in the meet at Bakersfield. Joyce Anderson of Morningside HS and Royal High School's 880 yard medley relay team, although placing second and third, respectively, ran times below the former national DGWS records.

By blanking Wilson HS of Hacienda Heights 3-0 in the first CIF-SS championship softball game June 6 at Hart Park in Orange, El Segundo HS wrapped up a perfect 15-0 season. The title contest was the seventh shutout of the year by Coach Sandi Behrmann's players who had held their opponents to an average of less than one run per game during the season while scoring an average of eight. The inaugural gymnastic championship meet for girls in the Southern Section, conducted May 28 at Westminster High School, was highlighted by the outstanding achievement of 14vear-old Laurie Donaldson, a freshman at Mira Costa High School in Manhattan Beach, who won five gold medals. Because Miss Donaldson was judged the best of all participants in Side Horse Vault, Balance Beam, Uneven Bars, and Floor Exercise, she automatically earned first place, also, in the All-Around Event.
