A motion was passed thanking Dr. Gowan for his appearance before the council and the presentation of his interpretations of the rules of eligibility.

After a lengthy discussion of the difficulties that have arisen in the central league, the following motion was passed: That the schools of the Central League be notified that all games in which ineligible players of Covina High School have competed are forfeited and that the Council deems that the interpretations given the rules of eligibility were unfortunate.

After reading a letter concerning the action of the Council in reinstating Louis Winters the following motion was passed: That it has been the policy of the Council to accept an application of a principal of a high school for the reinstatement of a pupil as prima facie evidence of his recommendation. If principals know that reinstatements should not be made, application thereof should not be made.

Upon motion the principal of Venice High School will appoint a Manager of Swimming for the Season 1917.

Long Beach, Cal., Jan. 25, 1917.

It is hereby agreed between Howard G. Cleveland, for the Chamber of Commerce of Long Beach, and J. F. Van Fatten, Manager, for the Southern California Interscholastic Track and Field Meet, that the Southern California Interscholastic Track and Field Meet shall be held on the grounds of the Polytechnic High School at Long Beach, Cal., on March 31st, 1917; that the entire receipts from admissions, auto parking, and concessions shall belong to the Chamber of Commerce of Long Beach.

In consideration for which, the Chamber of Commerce of Long Beach agrees to pay to J. F. Van Fatten, Manager for the Southern California Interscholastic Track and Field Meet, the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), for which a certified check shall be deposited with the Security Trust and Savings Bank, Equitable Branch, Los Angeles, payable to Charles Benson, Treasurer of the California Interscholastic Federation, Southern Section, by Tuesday, March 27, 1917, said check not to be cashed prior to April 2, 1917. The Long Beach Chamber of Commerce agrees to place the track and field in satisfactory condition and to provide suitable dressing room facilities.

It is further agreed that if rain should fall in sufficient quantity in the judgment of Howard G. Cleveland and J. F. Van Fatten, to prevent holding the Track and Field Meet, the Chamber of Commerce of Long Beach shall be released from the agreement to pay Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), the check to Charles Benson shall be returned by the Security Trust and Savings Bank, Equitable Branch, to the Long Beach Chamber of Commerce, and the receipts from the meet shall be the property of J. F. Van Fatten, Manager.
