Palmer, Siefert, Giebler Honored at Cage Play-Offs

Three outstanding Southland basketball coaches who between them have served the coaching fraternity for more than 60 years were honored at halftime of the "AA" Division championship basketball game at the Long Beach Sports Arena on Saturday night, March 9.

Mel Siefert, former basketball mentor at Redondo Beach High; Richard "Toolie" Palmer, athletic director and former cage coach at Fillmore High, and Harold Giebler, boys' physical education coach at Eliot Junior High in Pasadena were chosen by fellow members of the Southern California Inter-scholastic Basketball Coaches' Association as 1968 recipients of SCIBCA merit awards.

Siefert, whose Redondo five captured the 1943 CIF, SS, championship with a 38-27 victory over Pasadena, is credited with the innovation of a four-man defensive zone with one man stationed under the offensive basket, a system he used a great deal during his 21 years at the Redondo helm.

Palmer, whose Fillmore fives won five Frontier League championships and were fourth in CIF, SS, play-offs on two occasions, is a firm believer in the three-official system, a system with which he experimented several years ago and still recommends.

Giebler, the third member of the group presented with the annual SCIBCA awards this year, has coached football, basketball and track at Eliot Junior High since 1943. His teams have won 15 championships during that period and individuals coached by Giebler include Dick Williams, manager of the Boston Red Sox; Bill Sweek, UCLA basketballer; George Tersian, Westmont star, and Bill Olin of Pasadena CC.

All three were feted by the SCIBCA at the CIF, SS, finals at the Long Beach Sports Arena and were presented with scrolls saluting them for their service to high school athletics in the Southland.

S.B. Pacific Annexes Second Straight CIF Wrestling Crown

Nailing down three individual championships, Pacific High of San Bernardino annexed its second straight CIF, SS, wrestling team title by topping Kennedy of Buena Park, 49-36.

Paced by the standout individual performances of 98-pound Eddie Oquendo, 115-pound Felix Vargus and 130-pound John Abad, coach Al Liles' crew captured the third grappling title for the Pirates and the second straight.

Kennedy, with two individual winners, Jim Lingle and Bob Leininger, finished second in the 1968 Championships, held at California State College at Fullerton.

Oquendo was the only repeat champion from 1967 as he again captured the 98-pound title with an 11-2 decision over Kennedy's Vince Amor.

Third place in the tournament went to Lowell, which nipped Dominguez by a point in the final team standings.

Several individuals were singled out during the day-long tournament for standout performances. Besides Oquendo, top performers included Yucaipa's Frank Oakes, and Long Beach Jordan's Lee Fair.

Oakes was named the outstanding wrestler of the tournament for his accomplishments en route to the 168-pound championship. The personable youth scored 11-1, 13-5 and 19-1 decisions in his preliminary matches before dropping runner-up Jim Bishop of Lowell in 1:45 of the second period for the title.

Fair was singled out as the first-ever Moore League CIF, SS, wrestling champion. The loop, well-established in other sports, has just begun wrestling and Fair's victory in the heavy-weight division, with a pin of Ross

Snyder of Beverly Hills in 1:30 of the final period, was the league's first grappling championship.

Thirty-one leagues were represented in the championship meet, with more than 200 wrestlers gaining a berth in the finals.

Qualifying meets were held at four locations—Arcadia HS, Fountain Valley HS, Mira Costa HS and Cal Poly, Pomona—with each meet sending four men into the finals.

COMMISSIONER'S CORNER

Deadlines Are Essential To Efficient Operation

The smooth, efficient operation of any interscholastic athletic program depends on adherence to deadlines, particularly as they pertain to entry into individual play-off programs in swimming, track, tennis and golf.

It is essential that coaches and athletic directors make sure that they are aware of deadline dates for entry into these individual tournaments, since it isn't the school which suffers if the deadline is missed, it is the athletes themselves.

Approximately six schools were denied entry into this year's CIF, SS, Swim Relays because coaches were not aware that the filing deadline had passed. Although they were aware the event was being held, they did not take the time to find out why they had not received entry blanks and waited until the last minute to call the Commissioner's office to inquire about the meet.

Entires for all individual sports should be received by the coach or athletic director at least one month prior to the event. All play-off dates are listed inside the back cover of the "Blue Book".

Coaches are advised that, if they have not received an entry blank at least two weeks prior to the event, they should call the CIF Office and request an entry blank. Information is mailed according to listings in the current CIF, SS, Directory of Member Schools. If no coach is listed for a particular

Changes Due in Film Library System

Due to the overwhelming demand placed on films in the CIF, SS, film library, a new system of booking and accounting is being initiated by the CIF office.

In the past, several complaints have been received because films scheduled for showing have been held by the school which had booked the film just prior to its scheduled showing, and the film has not arrived.

To eliminate unnecessary delay in film transit, a new system will be initiated immediately and future use of any CIF, SS, film will be limited to three days.

When a film is scheduled, a post card will be sent to the school requesting the film, confirming the booking date and listing the school from which the film will be sent.

Another post card will be sent to the school currently using the film, listing the next school scheduled for use of the film and the date the film is scheduled.

Any school which unnecessarily delays a film and causes scheduling difficulties because of a lack of cooperation will be denied the use of further films from the CIF, SS, library until the film requested has been used by all interested member schools during the season of the sport in question.

Therefore, if a school cannot cooperate and make certain the film is kept for no longer than three days after receipt, no films will be sent until every other member school in the Southern Section has had an opportunity to use them.
