MINUTES OF 1928-1929

FOURTH MEETING

MAY 11, 1929

1. The Council of the California Interscholastic Federation, Southern Section, met at 9:30 A. M., in room 245, Manual Arts High School, Los Angeles, California, on May 11, 1929.

2. President George I. Green called the business meeting to order and requested the Secretary to call the roll.

May 11, 1929.

1. Minutes of April 20 approved as printed except date in first half of Mr. Moore's chart which should have been dated September 15, 1929.

2. Moved by Van Patten, seconded by H. J. Moore that we express the thanks of the organization to the City Major and City Liner leagues for the medals furnished for the Class B Track Meet. Carried.

3. Moved by H. J. Moore, seconded by Hamilton that Class "B" be made a regular part of the track program in the future. Carried.

4. Moved by Van Patten, seconded by Thompson that committee of three be appointed to recommend events for Class "B" Track. Carried.

Hamilton, Alman, and McEuen appointed. President referred the question of substituting 660 yard run for 220 yard run in Class "C" to the same committee.

5. Van Patten stated that the L. A. Coliseum will probably not be available for track next year. President directed that this fact be published in minutes so schools wishing to act as track host may make the fact known.

6. Moved by Van Patten, seconded by McEuen that new Inglewood High School to open February, 1930, be considered part of the present Inglewood High School for semester of February-June, 1930. Carried.

7. Ruled by President that boy of Santa Maria High School, who has been wrongly recorded as to semesters attendance be allowed to compete under correct record when Principal of Santa Maria has filed correct record with the Secretary of the C. I. F. S. S.

8. Moved by Moore, seconded by Alman that work of the Managers be placed in charge of the Secretary's office. Carried.

9. Moved by Keeley, seconded by Hamilton that we restore championships in football, baseball and basketball. Roll call asked for. Carried 10 to 1.

10. Moved by Thompson, seconded by Fosdick that a committee be appointed to recommend methods of determining championships. Carried. Thompson, Means and Alman appointed. Secretary to act ex-officio and to be responsible for a report at meeting on May 18.

11. Westcott, Chairman of committee on rewriting the Constitution, made an oral report. He indicated that the present Constitution, and numerous rulings may be much simplified and shortened and that the committee was working individually and as a whole with that end in view. Suggestions were asked from any school in the C. I. F. S. S. that has definite changes it would like to see made.

12. Mr. Moore, Chairman of committee for Releagu-ing, made a report of the work done by his committee. He read a number of letters on the subject.

13. Moved by Means, seconded by Collins that Fullerton be placed temporarily in new Foothills League.

SUBSTITUTE

Moved by Keeley, seconded by Thompson to substitute that the Foothills League, San Gabriel League, Coast League and Orange League stand as written on board by Mr. Moore. Chair ruled amendment out of order. Collins appealed from decision of chair. Chair sustained 7 to 3. Original motion carried 6 to 2.

14. Moved by Means, seconded by Collins that Woodrow Wilson and Covina be placed temporarily in Coast League. President ruled to vote separately on the two schools. Carried for Woodrow Wilson. Lost for Covina.

15. Moved by Alman, seconded by Means that only Principals be authorized to speak for their school at Annual Meeting on the question of releagu-ing. Carried.
