A The enacting motion was made by Green and seconded by Malcom and carried with one vote against the motion.

STANDING OF JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

The committee on the standing of the boy in 9th grade of Junior High Schools reported that there were so many angles to the question that the committee reported two suggestions:

FIRST—That the 9th grade boy no matter where he attended school should have the same rules of eligibility.

SECOND—That all 9th grade boys should be allowed to play under C. I. F. supervision or else that none be allowed to play.

B It was moved by Smith and seconded by Oliver that the matter of the playing of 9th grade boys be left to the several Leagues for their own decision. Carried.

CHANGE IN RULE E, PAGE 6

C Moved by Collins and seconded by Aldrich that Rule E, Page 6, be changed so that the last sentence shall read as follows: This rule does not apply to pupils entering from an eighth grade nor to pupils passing in three units of ninth grade work in a Junior High School during the preceding semester. Carried.

TRACK NEXT YEAR

D It was moved by Moore and seconded by Oliver that next year our Preliminary Meet be held April 24th and the final Southern California track meet be held May 1st. Carried.

Mr. Van Patten was requested to see that no other organization combine with us.

"C" TRACK NEXT YEAR

E It was moved by Wadsworth and seconded by Green that the preliminary meet for "C" class be held on the morning of April 24th and that the finals be run in conjunction with the Southern California meet on the afternoon of May 1st. Carried.

NUMBER OF EVENTS REFERRED TO LEAGUES

F It was moved by Oliver and seconded by Hague that one boy be allowed to compete in only one of the following events: 440 yard; half mile, and mile.

G Upon motion of Malcom seconded by Smith this question was referred to the new Leagues for instructions.

NUMBER OF EVENTS IN CLASS "C"
 H It was moved by Oliver and seconded by Wadsworth that in the class "C" meet one boy be allowed to enter but two events and relay and that points shall count 5, 3, 2, 1, 1/2. Carried.

FINALS IN FOOTBALL

State President Moore reported that the State Council had agreed that the three northern sections would play and the winner meet the South in final game for State Championship in football.

LOS ANGELES CITY JUNIOR LEAGUE

I Upon motion of Mr. Oliver seconded by Mr. Wadsworth

the Los Angeles City Junior League consisting of Belmont, Fairfax, Fremont, Roosevelt, and Warren G. Harding be accepted as a duly constituted league. Carried. Mr. Thos. Hughes, Vice Principal of Roosevelt, was introduced as the league representative and welcomed to the Council once more.

A. A. U. RELAYS

J On account of the early season it was moved by Moore and seconded by Hague that the High Schools of the C. I. F. withdraw from the A. A. U. competition. Carried.

K Track manager was instructed to start 440 on straightaway, at start of 220, and finish on further side of track.

P Mr. Van Patten and Mr. Green were appointed a committee to see that proper badges were provided for managers and members of the Council.

QUESTIONS OF ELIGIBILITY

Q A boy is ineligible for High School baseball because of studies for the first game of the season. He is suspended from school and that week plays a game of Sunday baseball

while suspended from school and also before he took any part in the League baseball season but after his team had taken part. Is he eligible for baseball during the remainder of the season after his suspension is removed and he is passing in his studies? Does the fact that he was not connected with the school during his week of suspension have any bearing on the fact that he played a game with a team other than his high school team during the league schedule?

Answer—Boy is ineligible.

Last year a senior was expelled from school about six weeks before the end of the first semester. He returned to school this year at approximately the same time he left off last year and continued his work satisfactorily through the balance of the first semester (six weeks) and for the second semester, and he will graduate in June. Was he in school long enough during the first semester of this year to make him eligible for the second semester sports? Also has he been in school more than eight semesters and thus subject to to question on another point?

Answer—Boy is ineligible.
