FIFTH MEETING

MAY 2, 1925

The Council of the C. I. F., S. S., met at the Y. M. C. A., in Los Angeles at 9:30 A. M., May 2, 1925.

- A protest from Paso Robles High School in reference to the action of the San Luis Obispo League was received with check for ten dollars.

A report from a committee consisting of Mr. Westcott, Mr. Owen and Mr. Frederickson, appointed to investigate the matter, reported as follows:

"It is the opinion of the committee that the schools of the League, excepting Paso Robles, did not consider themselves members of the C. I. F. until they voted to affiliate September 27, 1924. The committee feels that the best thing for this league is to forget the past with its misunderstandings and start a clean slate.

"The committee feels that a controversy cannot do any good to sport in the San Luis Obispo League, and recommends that the Council ask Paso Robles to withdraw the protest."

It was moved by Malcom and seconded by Green that the report of the committee be adopted. Carried.

It was moved by Monroe, seconded by Green, and carried, that the Council feels that San Luis Obispo High School should have been familiar with C. I. F. rules and that it is expected in the future that perfect co-operation with the rules will be observed to the end that no further misunderstanding occur.

RE-LEAGUING

The question of dividing the South into Leagues will be a special order of business at our next meeting which will be held at the Y. M. C. A., at 9:30 A. M., May 16, 1925.

The following suggestions were made in order that we might have something to consider:

- (1) That Glendale take the place of Whittier in the Coast League and that Whittier take the place of Glendale in the Central.
- (2) That Victorville, Barstow, Needles, and Blythe constitute a new league.
- (3) That Bonita (San Dimas) be added to the Tri-County League.

"C" TRACK

It was moved by Moore and seconded by Malcom that at the "C" track meet, May 16, 1925, at Los Angeles High School, that advance sale to students be 15c and gate 25c. Carried.

STANDING OF JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS

It was moved by Smith and seconded by Hague that a committee be appointed to investigate the Junior High School situation and report at the next Annual Meeting. Carried.

Chair appointed Mr. Smith of Redlands, Mr. Hague of Jefferson and Mr. Malcom of San Juan Capistrano on its committee.

PROTEST OF RAMONA

Protest to Secretary from Ramona in reference to expense money for game in Semi-final Basketball was referred to a committee consisting of Manager Squires, Mr. Malcom and Mr. Barnes with request to report back to the next meeting.

NUMBER OF EVENTS

The question came up that Patton of Riverside had entered and placed in three field events during the preliminary meet, April 25. It was moved by Malcom and seconded by Moore that Patton be allowed to choose two of the three events. Carried. (See Rule 17, Page 20.)

PRESS REPORT

The question was raised that the newspapers had reported that the 5th man in the slowest heat of the 100 had been placed in the meet, and that men who had not qualified had been placed in the high jump.

It was moved by Moore and seconded by Smith that the 5th place man in the 100 yard dash be not allowed to run in the Southern California meet. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. Monroe and seconded that the decision of the judges in the track and field events held April 25 be final and that men failing to qualify at that time shall not be allowed to compete in the Southern California Meet. Carried.
