A meeting of the Council was held May 21, 1917 at the Los Angeles High School with the following members present:-

A motion was passed to the effect that the Southern Section pay for the tennis balls used in the State Meet.

An appeal concerning the action of the Citrus Belt League in the case of George Studebaker of Chaffee Union High School was made by Pomona High School. After a lengthy discussion a motion was passed sustaining the action of the Citrus Belt League in regard thereto.

A motion was passed to the following:

That, Athletes who compete on High School Baseball Teams may not play on any organized baseball team than their own school team after March 1, of each year.

Leslie Manney as Manager of Basketball filed a detailed report including a financial statement of receipts of \$52.59.

The Secretary was instructed to write all officials of the Citrus Belt League concurring the action on the appeal of Pomona High School.

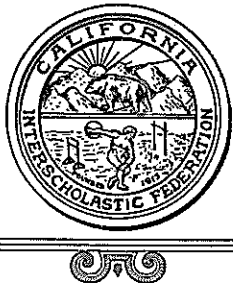

Mr. Tibbets and I are of the opinion that it would be wise to turn the balance this year into the treasury of the C. I. F. instead of rebating. We feel that the latter procedure is more or less unsatisfactory anyhow, and especially so this year when the representation at the Meet was not as rigidly controlled in some sections as in others. Furthermore, no promises of rebate were made to any schools this year. In addition the treasury of the Federated Council was quite heavily drawn on by the expenses of the last meeting and now contains only \$191.00. This matter must be decided, however, by vote of the whole Council and I am, therefore, requesting that each member write me his opinion in the matter so that I can present the vote to President Simons who can then announce the decision agreed upon.
