Vice President Ely in the chair.  
Minutes of April 23, 1927, approved as printed.

The Secretary called attention to the following case. Teams X and Y were playing baseball. Team X (the home team) at bat. Boy hits ball into deep field and on bounce ball goes over the fence. Man out on road picks up ball and throws it over the fence and center fielder throws ball to third and touches runner. Umpire calls him out. When his attention is called to the facts he stated that he saw the ball hit the ground and then turned his attention to bases and did not know the ball went over fence. Team Y would not admit ball went over the fence.

It was agreed that this was not before the body legally and should be referred to the League but that the meeting felt that this was a question of fact and not judgment.

1. It was moved by Collins, and seconded by Wood, that the Southern Section should not enter the State Playoff in any sport except Track.

After discussion this motion was withdrawn with consent of second and chair.

2. It was moved by Collins, and seconded by Fischer, of Chaffey, that so far as the Southern Section was concerned, all State Championship Contests be eliminated.

General discussion.

FOR—Season too long—hard on boys—disrupted the school work.

AGAINST—Same school did not often repeat—would kill the State C. I. F.

3. It was moved by Barnes, seconded by Westcott, that the question of doing away with further competition in State Interscholastic meets be referred back to the several Leagues for action.

This motion carried.

4. It was moved by Collins, and seconded by Green, that:

"Whereas: At the Southern California Track Meet held on May 1, 1926, the three official watches caught the true time of Wehner in the 100-yard dash at 9.8, 9.9, and a split between 9.9 and 10 flat, and

"Whereas, the A. A. U. rule covering such cases provides that 'if all watches disagree, the time marked by the watch giving the middle time shall be the official time.'

"Therefore, be it resolved, that our records be corrected to show that Mr. Wehner established a record of 9.9 in the 100-yard dash on May 1, 1926."

Motion carried.

5. It was moved by Oliver, and seconded by Wadsworth, that in all future So. Cal. meets, such as Track and Swimming,

timing forms giving time of each timer for each race be used and made the official record of the C. I. F., S. S.

This motion carried.

6. The President then stated that the question of Re-Leagu-ing was before the house.

It was moved by Green, and seconded by Hayden, that the Leagues as now organized stand for one year more. This motion was carried.

7. It was moved by Collins, and seconded by Barnes, that Elythe be made a "Free Lance" school. Carried.

8. It was moved by Barnes, and seconded by Fischer, that Needles, Barstow, and Victorville be placed in a new league to be called the Desert League. Carried.

9. It was moved by Moore, and seconded by Lewis, that John Muir be placed in San Gabriel Valley and Norwalk placed in the Orange League. Carried.

10. It was moved by Wadsworth, and seconded by Oliver, that Beverly Hills, Eagle Rock and Lankershim be placed in the San Fernando Valley League and that George Washington and Jacob Riis be added to the Marine League. Carried.

11. It was moved by Collins, and seconded by O'Mara, that if Coachella desires to be made a free lance she be given that privilege. Carried.

12. It was moved by O'Mara, and seconded by Wadsworth, that Villa Nova be added to the Ventura League. Carried.

13. It was moved by Barnes, and seconded by Fischer, that Harvard Military Cathedral School California Preparation of Covina Webb School of Pomona

be made a league to be called the Private School League. Carried.

14. It was moved by Wadsworth, and seconded by Wood, that Lancaster be made a "Free Lance" school. Carried.

16. Fred Johnson reported that the So. Cal. Swimming meet would be held Saturday, May 27, at Inglewood.

17. A. H. Badenoch, Baseball Manager, reported that the play-off had started.

18. James Reinhard, Track Manager, made a partial report. It was moved by Moore, and seconded by Oliver that a vote of thanks be given to Mr. J. C. Reinhard, Track Manager, his starter, Kinder Hamilton, and his two clerks, F. D. Erchbauer and H. B. Dalton for the success of the track meets. Carried.

19. Basketball Manager Squire was called upon and urged Free Lance Schools to file schedule early for approval.

20. It was moved by Green, and seconded by Wadsworth, that all free lance schools must furnish their schedules two weeks before the time of the first semi-final for each sport. Carried.

21. Football Manager H. J. Moore had many suggestions to make and as a result the following motion was made: It was moved by Oliver, and seconded by Collins, that the Managers, the President, and the Secretary, prepare a report on the question of large schools competing against small schools in semi-finals; also on question of districting So. Cal. into play-off sections and thus cut down number of semi-finals. Carried.

22. It seems that San Fernando entered boy in Class "C," So. Cal., who had placed in Class "A." San Fernando had forfeited places so won and Mr. Reinhard was readjusting winners in this event. It was moved by O'Mara, and seconded by Moore, that Mr. Reinhard and Mr. Hughes be commended for action in San Fernando track "C" forfeit and that the medals be collected and given to the proper schools. Carried.

23. PAY OF MANAGERS. One year ago a committee consisting of Oliver, Wadsworth, and Adams, had been appointed to consider compensation of Managers and Secretary. (See the minutes of April 24, 1926.) Chair asked if the committee was ready to report.

Mr. Oliver stated that the committee had had several meetings and wished to recommend that all managers be given a 50% increase for next year. The recommendation was adopted.

Football Manager—\$150 and expenses.

Baseball Manager—\$75 and expenses.

Basketball Manager—\$75 and expenses.

Track Manager—\$75 and expenses.

Swimming Manager—\$75 and expenses.

Tennis Manager—\$50 and expenses.

24. It was moved by Oliver, and seconded that the Secretary and Managers of all sports submit a report to the A. A. U., and that such reports be made part of the minutes of this body. Carried.

25. It was moved that Mr. Oliver be re-elected State Representative.

26. It was moved by Fisher and seconded by Oliver, that George M. Green be re-elected Secretary at the same salary as

before—\$100 per year.

27. It was agreed that James Reinhard and Kinder Hamilton be appointed a committee to draft a letter to the Athletic Clubs informing them of our stand on the question of High School boys as members of Athletic Club teams.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
