MAY 1932 BULLETIN

Meeting was called to order at 9:40 A.M. by President O'Mara. Roll call showed a quorum present and business was taken up. The following members of the Council were present all or part of the time. Mr. Hamilton was excused to referee and start the preliminary races in the Track Meet.

1. Moved by Mr. Monroe, seconded by Mr. Skinner, that the Minutes for meeting of April 2, 1932, be approved as printed. Carried.

2. Moved by Mr. Alman, seconded by Mr. Cline, that the report on Crosscountry Running printed in Minutes of April 2, 1932, be adopted with the word "minimum" in paragraph 2 changed to "maximum." Carried.

3. Mr. Van Patten submitted, verbally, the following report regarding the printing an Annual Report.

Contents—

A foreword by State Superintendent Kersey.
A foreword by Supervisor of Physical Education Nielson.

A brief statement from State President of the C.I.F.—Moore.

Copy of the State C.I.F. Constitution with changes to date.

Copy of the C.I.F., Southern Section, Constitution and Rules with changes and additions made since the 1930 edition was published.

Review of the work of the year 1931-1932.

Probable Cost—

No bids for the work had been asked but a reliable printer had estimated the probable cost of printing 1000 copies of a booklet containing the above enumerated materials as between \$150.00 and \$200.00.

Moved by Mr. Cline, seconded by Mr. Teach, that Mr. Van Patten prepare and have published such an Annual Report and have it ready for distribution by the beginning of the new school year in September. Carried.

4. The question of the net profit on play-off football games the past season in which Covina High School took part was discussed at considerable length. Mr. Verne Ross.

7. Moved by Mr. Alman, seconded by a whole chorus, that Mr. Moore be elected to succeed himself as State Representative. Carried unanimously.

Vice-Principal of Covina High School, and Mr. Ted Gorrell, Coach at Covina High School, explained Covina's attitude. Mr. Ross proposed that the money either be left in possession of the Covina High School or be turned over to the Community Chest of Covina.

Several members of the Council spoke at length on the subject.

Moved by Mr. Means, seconded by Mr. Teach, that the moneys (\$1616.60) accruing to Covina from play-off games in football during the season of 1931 be forfeited to the C.I.F., S.S., for future disposal. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Thompson, seconded by Mr. Polski, that Covina High School be given until January, 1933, to return money received from play-off games in football to the C.I.F., S.S., but that they declare their intention by September 15, 1932, of turning over such funds. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Thompson, seconded by Mr. Means, that (3rd) and (4th) of 12 and 13 in Minutes of April 2, 1932, be adopted as amended above. Carried.

5. Moved by Mr. Monroe, seconded by Mr. Thompson, to amend Article VIII by striking out the words, "Unless he comes from outside the state," and adding at the close the following interpretation, "A boy lives in District A with his parents or legal guardian. The parents or legal guardian move to District B. The boy is eligible to compete in District A, District B or District adjacent to District B providing legal authorities of District B approve the boy's transfer to adjacent District. If the boy remains in school in District A after the beginning of the next school year and then transfers, he loses the right to compete for a semester or for a year if a letter man." The motion was stated verbally and Mr. Van Patten made responsible for its wording. Carried.

6. Mr. Alman, Chairman of the Committee on Releguing, reported that the committee had put in a good deal of time and thought on the subject since the meeting of the Council on April 2. He said it was very evident from the information at the disposal of the committee that there was a good deal of agitation for changes and some real serious dissatisfaction. He stated that there were no changes asked that could be made without creating new sources of dissatisfaction. He expressed the opinion that the uncertainty due to the financial depression made this an unwise time to make changes in our league organization.

Moved by Mr. Alman, seconded by Mr. Quicksall, that the organization of our leagues remain in status quo except that Loyola High School be placed in the Western League.

Moved by Mr. Whedon, seconded by Mr. Murray, to amend the report by placing Loyola in the Preparatory League. Amendment carried.

Moved by Mr. Thompson, seconded by Mr. McIntosh, to amend further by placing Brea-Olinda in the Tri-County League provided such transfer is desired by Brea-Olinda. Amendment carried.

Moved by Mr. Polski, seconded by Mr. Johnson, to amend further to the effect that the Ventura Minor League remain as it is and the "League organization for the year 1931-1932" printed list be corrected to eliminate Ventura from the Ventura Minor League. Amendment carried.

Moved by Mr. Alman, seconded by Mr. Monroe, to amend further to make Santa Barbara, now a member of the Ventura Major League, a free lance in football, if either Santa Barbara or the League so desired. Amendment carried.

Original motion with amendments was then put to a vote and carried.

Minutes of meeting of the Council held May 14, 1932, in Room 247 at Los Angeles High School.

May 1932

8. Moved by Mr. Quicksall, seconded by several, that Mr. Van Patten be elected Commissioner of Athletics for another year. Carried.

9. Moved by Mr. Alman, seconded by Mr. Quicksall, that the salary of Mr. Van Patten and his clerk remain the same for the year 1931-1932. Carried.

10. Moved by Mr. Teach, seconded by Mr. Johnson, that it be recommended that school men be used as far as possible in all school contests. Carried.

11. Moved by Mr. Means, seconded by Mr. Johnson, that the recommended maximum pay for an official in any high school contest be not over ten dollars (\$10.00). Carried.

12. Moved by Mr. McIntosh, seconded by Mr. Cline, that observance of new "thigh guard" rule in football be obligatory in new suits used in high school football games but be optional in suits now owned by high schools. Carried.

13. Moved by Mr. Thompson, seconded by Mr. Cline, that the Riverside Indian School be made a passive member of the C.I.F., S.S., and be asked to work with the Commissioner of Athletics on schedules and other details until he recommends their assignment to some of our leagues. Carried.

14. Mr. Teach reported on studies he has been making regarding accident insurance for injured athletes. His report showed the number of injured players to be rather large and the need of insurance very imperative. With the approval of the Council, the Chair asked Mr. Teach to continue his investigations and, if possible, recommend a plan

that may be undertaken by the C.I.F., S.S. Carried.

15. The Central Junior High School, though not a member of the C.I.F., S.S., has, through its Principal, Mr. James C. Reinhard, and several members of his faculty, given much valuable help and cooperation to the work of the C.I.F., S.S., during the year.

Moved by Mr. Alman, seconded by several, that we express to Mr. Reinhard and his school as a whole, and to Mr. Jack Abbott, Mr. H. B. Dolton and Mr. George Wall in particular, our sincere appreciation of their attitude and helpfulness. Moved further that Mr. Reinhard's necessary expenses to the State Track Meet be paid. Carried.

15. Moved by Mr. Thompson, seconded by Mr. Means, that the Foothill League Representative be elected President for next year. Carried.

Mr. Alman, of the Foothill League, expressed his pleasure at the opportunity to serve the organization and promised to carry forward the work of the C.I.F., S.S., to the very best of his ability.

17. Mr. O'Mara, the retiring President, expressed his appreciation of the cooperation he had received in the conduct of the affairs of the organization during the year and wished Mr. Alman good fortune.

18. At 12:30 P.M., there being no further business, the meeting adjourned and the Council repaired to lunch in the Los Angeles High School cafeteria and then to the Finals of the Track Meet.
