## MAY 1935 BULLETIN

The fourth meeting of the Council for the year was held in Room 418, Students Union Building, U.S.C., Saturday, May 18, 1935.

The meeting was called to order by President Blee of Bishop at 9:30 A.M. A roll call showed the Leagues represented as follows:

1. There being no suggested corrections to the Minutes of the Council Meeting of April 27, 1935 the President ruled them approved as printed.

2. Mr. Van Patten reported upon a conference he had had with Deputy Superintendent Arthur Gould of Los Angeles City relative to boys of the Los Angeles City High Schools entering the State Meet at Fresno on May 25 at 7:30 P.M. Mr. Van Patten stated that Mr. Gould had pointed out that night competition and overnight journeys for high school boys were contrary to the rules of the Los Angeles City Board of Education that the Los Angeles school authorities would not waive these rules on this occasion, and that the Los Angeles City School Administration felt that the C.I.F. should not authorize unattached competition in the State Meet.

Moved by Mr. Moore, seconded by Mr. Berlin that the request of the Los Angeles City School Administration in this matter be complied with and that Mr. Van Patten be instructed to certify only athletes from outside Los Angeles City for the State Meet. Carried.

3. A ruling was asked by Mr. Van Patten regarding a request of the Muir Tech. High School to have its Class "A" relay team permitted to enter the Southern California Meet even though it had not qualified at the Chaffey Divisional

Meet because of having completed one baton pass outside the passing zone. Hoover High School, which was duly qualified, had offered to withdraw its team in favor of Muir Tech.

Moved by Mr. Veenker, seconded by Mr. Berlin that only those competitors duly certified from Divisional Meets be allowed to compete today.

Roll call called for.

Bay—Citrus—Imperial—Marine—Metropolitan—Ventura, voting yes.

Coast—Foothill—Inyo—Orange—San Gabriel—Tri-County, voting no.

Tie vote. President Blee ruled motion lost.

Moved by Mr. Means, seconded by Mr. Moore that competitors qualifying in a Divisional Meet be allowed to withdraw in favor of another competitor in the same meet who failed to qualify.

Roll call asked for.

Bay—Coast—Foothill—Inyo—Marine—Orange—San Gabriel—Tri-County, voted yes.

Imperial—Metropolitan—Ventura, voted no.

Citrus League not voting. Carried 8 to 3.

4 Moved by Mr. Berlin, seconded by Mr. Means that the above ruling apply today. Carried.

5. Mr. A. S. Wolfe, President of the Brawley Board of Education, appeared before the Council to state Brawley's side of the Imperial League football controversy. See No. 14—Minutes of April 27)

The following facts were brought out in the discussion and admitted by Mr. Wolfe.

(a) Brawley had played an ineligible player in football games during the season of 1934.

(b) Contest and trophies won had not been forfeited to the other schools concerned.

(c) Brawley High School had refused to send a representative to an Imperial League Meeting where the questions involved were to be considered.

Moved by Mr. Fischer, seconded by Mr. Means that Brawley High School be suspended from football during the 1935 football season. Carried.

6. Elections of officers for the school year 1935-1936 resulted as follows:

President—Mr. Means.

Vice-President—Mr. Hamilton.

Treasurer—Mr. Alman

Executive Committee—Mr. Alman—Mr. Fischer—Mr. Hamilton—Mr. S. Chester McIntosh—Mr. Moore.

7. Moved by Mr. Donald McIntosh, seconded by Mr. Berlin that Mr. Van Patten and the newly elected Executive Committee prepare a temporary revision of the Constitution and By-Laws and that mimeographed copies be furnished all schools by September 1, 1935. Carried.

8. Mr. Alman, Chairman of the Releaguin Committee, reported at length on the efforts of the Committee to solve the question of leagues for next year to the satisfaction of the various schools and leagues.

A long discussion followed dealing principally with the makeup of the Bay, Coast, and Foothill Leagues.

The David Starr Jordan High School of Long Beach requested to be placed in the San Gabriel League.

Moved by Mr. Moore, seconded by Mr. Vegner that the request be granted. Carried.

Moved by Mr. S. Chester McIntosh, seconded by Mr. Moore that Glendale High School be placed in the Foothill League.

Roll call was asked for.

Bay—Coast—Imperial—Inyo—Metropolitan—San Gabriel Orange—Tri-County, voted yes.

Foothill voted no.

Citrus—Marine—Ventura, did not vote. Carried 8 to 1.

9. Since the Coast League is left with only four schools it was agreed without motion that the Bay, Foothill and Orange League should invite representatives from the Coast Leagues to attend meetings when schedules were being arranged so as to help in completing satisfactory Coast League schedules.

10. It was informally agreed that in case the four schools of the Coast League are unable to complete a satisfactory football schedule that the Executive Committee be authorized to apply to the State Council of the C.I.F. for permission to have one game scheduled for each school with border schools in Arizona and Nevada.

11. Moved by Mr. Means, seconded by Mr. Moore that Santa Barbara be allowed to free lance and that only one free lance candidate be allowed in the football play-off. Carried.

12. Moved by Mr. Means, seconded by Mr. Moore that Mr. James C. Reinhard who is in charge of the Coliseum today for the C.I.F., Southern Section have his expenses to the State Meet at Fresno taken care of if he wishes to go. Carried.

Meeting adjourned at 1:15 P.M. with all members of the Council anxious to get to the finals of the Track Meet scheduled to start at 1:30 P.M.
