The Minutes of an Intersectional Meeting of the Athletic Committee of the Los Angeles City Section of the C. I. F. and the Executive Committee of the C. I. F. Southern Section held at the University Club, 614 South Hope Street, Los Angeles, on Thursday, April 17, 1947 at 6:30 P. M.

A turkey dinner was served at 6:30 P. M.

At 7:30 P. M. Mr. Hamilton called the meeting to order. He stated the purpose of the meeting as a conference of the two groups to discuss athletic relations between the L. A. City Section of the C. I. F. and the Southern Section of the C. I. F. The particular item of business for this meeting was to plan for an intersectional game of football between representative teams from the two sections of the C. I. F.

It was pointed out by Mr. Lopez that the only date the Los Angeles Coliseum could be had for such a game was Saturday, December 13, 1947. It was generally agreed that December 13 was the latest date upon which the proposed game could be played.

Mr. Van Patten stated that it was probable that the C. I. F. play-off games in football could not be finished in time to have the winner play the L. A. City team.

It was moved by Mr. Sloane and seconded by Mr. Hayhurst that the intersectional game be set for the L. A. Coliseum on December 13, 1947 and that all details of the game and the methods of choosing the teams be left to Mr. Lopez and Mr. Van Patten to plan and present to a later meeting. Mr. Hamilton called for a roll call vote. The motion was carried unanimously.

It was moved by Mr. Hayhurst and seconded by Mr. Houston that Mr. Lopez and Mr. Van Patten be authorized to sign a contract for the L. A. Coliseum for December 13, 1947 for the game. Carried.

Spring Sports

Mr. Lopez announced that the intersectional gymnastics meet would be held at the Hollywood High School Aud on Friday, May 9, and that the intersectional swimming meet would be held on June 14 for which the L. A. Swimming Stadium will be available. Mr. Lopez will manage these two activities.

Mr. Van Patten stated that the baseball plans were only tentative at this time and no announcements were ready yet.

The price of admission to the gymnastics, swimming, and baseball were discussed at some length. It was moved by Mr. Reeves and seconded by Mr. Houston that the price of admission be set at 90 cents for adults and 30 cents for pupils, tax included, that the tickets be divided 50-50 between the two sections of the C. I. F. and that the sale of student tickets end with the lunch period the day of the contest or on Friday before the contest if held on Saturday. Carried.

It was informally agreed that Mr. Lopez and Mr. Van Patten could ask for another meeting of the two committees when in their judgment one was necessary.

The joint meeting adjourned at 8:45 P. M.

American Legion Baseball

The question of boys who expect to play American Legion baseball was brought to the Executive Committee by the Santa Monica High School. Mr. Hamilton stated it as his opinion that boys on a high school squad should not participate in practice or in games with the American Legion squad until the high school season is ended. Every member of the Executive Committee approved this opinion.

County Playground Track and Field Meet

Mr. Van Patten reported that a number of high school Principals and coaches had called the C. I. F. Office and expressed disapproval of allowing high school boys to compete in playground meets as unattached athletes. It seemed to be the opinion of school men that the high school boys stole the show and the publicity from the playground boys and thus defeated the purpose of the meet. It also seems to be the opinion of the school men that the high school boys had all the training and competition they needed on the high school squad.

There being no objection, the Chairman directed the Commissioner of Athletics to draw up a resolution disapproving of high school boys entering such meets. When the resolution is approved, it will be sent to the Los Angeles City high schools for approval before being sent to the playground authorities for their information.

Cathedral - Loyola Baseball Game

The officiating at a Cathedral-Loyola baseball game on April 8 was in dispute. The Catholic League asked the Executive Committee to pass

upon the questions at issue. The Executive Committee refused to review the matter. It was the opinion of all members of the Committee that assuming league functions was not a good precedent to establish.

John Muir Baseball Tournament

The John Muir Junior College Lower Division had asked to be allowed to stage a baseball tournament late in the season probably after May 15. It was the opinion of Mr. Ed Laurenson that a tournament at the end of the season might furnish a lot of boys with an interesting event when most activities are finished. The Executive Committee approved the idea of a tournament at that time and directed the Commissioner of Athletics to work with Mr. Laurenson in arranging details.

Santa Barbara in Divisional Meet

Mr. Van Patten reported that Santa Barbara and Mark Keppel high schools were to have a dual track meet on Saturday, April 19, and that Santa Barbara wished to use this meet as a qualification for the divisional meet. Mr. Badenoch reported that he expected to be in Santa Barbara on April 19 and would be glad to do what he could to help Santa Barbara. Mr. Van Patten offered to go to Santa Barbara that day and take a timer with him and get the records on what Santa Barbara boys could do.

It was moved by Mr. Bergstrom and seconded by Mr. Hayhurst that the qualification of Santa Barbara boys be left with Mr. Badenoch and Mr. Van Patten with power to act after their visit to Santa Barbara on April 19. Carried.

Starting Blocks

Mr. Van Patten was directed to communicate with the manager of the State Meet at Visalia and offer to try to secure a set of the Arnett Starting Blocks for use at the State Meet.

Schools in Divisional Meets

Mr. Van Patten recommended that the C.I.F. Southern Section schools be divided as follows among the five divisional meets:

At San Diego—All Schools in San Diego and Imperial Counties.

At Woodrow Wilson High School — The Orange League, the Sunset League, the Pacific League (except El Monte), the Pasadena Jr. High League and Inglewood High School.

At Riverside High School—Tri-County League, Citrus Belt League, Desert-Inyo League, Riverside League, Monrovia High School, Covina High School, El Monte High School and Montebello High School.

At Compton — Catholic League, Compton, Pasadena, John Muir, Burbank, Glendale, Hoover (G), South Pasadena, and all Bay League schools except Inglewood.

At Santa Barbara—The San Luis Obispo League, the Ventura League, the Tri Valley League, the Prep League, and Santa Barbara.
It was moved by Mr. Hayhurst and seconded by Mr. Bergstrom that the recommendation be approved. Carried.

Council members are supposed to be able to speak for their leagues on these three questions.

PLAY-OFF MATCHES

Baseball

"(1) Leagues must be ready for the play-off in baseball by the second Saturday (May 10th this year) in May." Rule (1), page 34, 1945 Blue Book.

Team Tennis

"(7) League winners must be ready to enter the play-off in team tennis by the first Saturday in May." (Rule 7, page 36, 1945 Blue Book). It is the responsibility of the League Representative on the Council to notify the C. I. F. Southern Section office who his league winner is and if the league is to take part in the play-off.

Singles and Doubles Tennis Championship

The singles and doubles championship in tennis will be held on the Mark Keppel High School courts on the fourth Saturday in May. (See rule (1), page 35, 1945 Blue Book.) The League Representative is responsible for notifying the C. I. F. Southern Section office who will represent his league. This notice must reach the C. I. F. Office by Thursday, May 22.

Divisional Meet at Santa Barbara

The Santa Barbara High School has agreed to stage the divisional meet that was slated for Carpinteria. Mr. Greenough, Principal at Carpinteria, due to lack of help was going to find the staging of the meet a heavy burden. The Santa Barbara High School will run the meet in the Playa Del Mar Stadium at the University field.

Entries for the Divisional Meets

Entry cards for the divisional meets have been mailed to each League Representative on the C. I. F. Southern Section Council. The League Representative is responsible for getting these cards to the C. I. F. Office. They are due without fail on Monday morning, May 5. They should be accompanied by the necessary eligibility blanks.

The entry fee which is 25 cents per boy, per event, should also accompany the entry cards where possible.

Starting Time of Divisional Meets

At all five divisional meets the field events will start at 1:00 P. M. The Class A events will be run first and the Class B and Class C in order as fast as the equipment and officials make it possible. The Class C 50 yard race, the first track event on the program will be run at 1:45 P. M. The other races will follow as rapidly as the officials can handle them.

No Trial Heats

No trial heats will be required in any of the divisional meets. If there are more entries in any race than there are lanes on the field, the race will be run in two heats and four boys timed in each heat. The boys making the best time will be given the trophies.
