SPECIAL NOTICE

STATE BY-LAW 306 RESCINDED

The State Federated Council, at its meeting of May 2-3, 1986, **RESCINDED** its previous position which called for a change in State and Southern Section By-Law 306 as it pertains to **PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS** for student participants.

Various representatives from different medical associations appeared to provide testimony to the State Federated Council on the by-law which was scheduled to go into effect July 1, 1986. These included State Nurses Practitioners Association, Chiropractors, etc.

Following this input and upon recommendation of CIF State Attorney, Andrew Patterson, and CIF State Medical Advisory, Dr. Robert Loveland, the Federated Council **RESCINDED** its previous position.

Thus, the current By-Law and wording as reflected in the Blue Book under Rule 306 will remain in place effective with the

1986-87 school term:

"An annual physical examination, or a statement by a medical practitioner, certifying that the student is physically fit to participate in athletics is required before a student may try out, practice or participate in interscholastic athletic competition. A student will be excused from this physical examination provided there is compliance with the Education Code provisions concerning Parent's Refusal to Consent"

It should be pointed out the State has also been instructed to develop research in order to provide Sections and schools with a proper interpretation for the term "medical practitioner."

Please pass the above information along to your respective athletic administrators, athletic directors and all coaches.

MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING February 20, 1986

A meeting of the CIF Southern Section Executive Committee was held on Thursday, February 20, 1986 at the CIF Southern Section Office. President Moe Chavez called the meeting to order at 1:20 p.m. All members of the Committee were present with the exceptions of Dr. Robert Packer, Gerald Harer and Andy Patterson.

1. **PRESIDENT'S UPDATE** - Mr. Moe Chavez reviewed with the Committee the official notice from Commissioner Ray Plutko to leave his post in mid-July for a position as Commissioner of the Colorado High School Activities Association, and the recently-litigated Ocean View case.

2. **COMMISSIONER'S UPDATE** - Commissioner Plutko reviewed with the Committee the winter playoff activities, the on-going work of the Officials' Fees Committee, and the recent position of the California School Board Association with reference to representation. Additionally, Commissioner Plutko updated the Committee on his recent appointment as Commissioner of the Colorado High School Activities Association and expressed his deepest regret in leaving the CIF Southern Section.

3. **BOYS' ATHLETIC DIRECTORS' REPORT** - Mr. Mike Moropoulos expressed concern relative to walk-on coaches; legislation and the difficulties many schools and school districts face in complying with this recently passed legislation.

4. **GIRLS' ATHLETIC DIRECTORS' REPORT** - Ms. Sheila Burrud reported on the positive experiences of students having the opportunity of participating in playoff activities.

5. **SUPERINTENDENTS' UPDATE** - Ms. Cynthia Grennan apprised the Committee the State Legislature will be conducting hearings in the near future on Senate Bill 1533 (formerly S.B. 19). Additionally she reviewed legislation dealing with academic eligibility standards, the recently passed AB75 dealing with early release of students for extra-curricular activities, and the upcoming program for the Superintendents and Board Members Symposium set for April 15 at the Industry Hills Convention Center.

6. **TREASURER'S UPDATE** - Mr. Bruce Keuning updated the Committee on the current 1985-86 working budget. Additionally, he reviewed a proposal relative to the 1986-87 budget. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to recommend approval to the CIF-SS Council.

7. **NATIONAL FEDERATION WINTER MEETING UPDATE** - Mr. Tony Balsamo provided an overview of the National Federation winter meeting as it relates to the new football rule changes; newly proposed national conference for coaches and officials; and a new National Federation resolution which affects state membership on rules committees.

8. **STATE REPORT** -
(A) State By-Law 306: Sheila Burrud

reported that the proposed amendment to State By-Law 306 pertaining to physical examinations passed at the State Federated Council meeting held on January 31, 1986, and will become effective July 1, 1986.

(B) Proposed 1986-87 State Budget: Mr. Tony Balsamo reviewed with the Committee the proposed 1986-87 State budget. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to recommend approval to the CIF-SS Council.

(C) State Playoff Division Entries: Mr. Pat Mauch reviewed a proposal which would increase the number of playoff divisions at the State level in the sports of girls' volleyball and boys' and girls' basketball from the current three divisions to five divisions. This proposal will NOT affect the number of teams the CIF-SS currently enters. The proposed format would separate some of our champions and would be more consistent with the format currently in place within the CIF Southern Section. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to direct the CIF-SS delegates to the State Federated Council to support this procedural change.

(D) Legislative Update: Ms. Cynthia Grennan reviewed current bills under consideration in Sacramento.

9. **LEGAL UPDATE** - Commissioner

Plutko reviewed with the Committee the opinion rendered by Judge Harmon G. Scoville in the Ocean View case. Additionally, Commissioner Plutko reviewed a recent case of Steffes vs CIF in which the California Court of Appeals determined that the ability to play extra-curricular sports is a privilege and not a right.

10. **NEW SCHOOL MEMBERSHIP** - It was moved, seconded and passed to approve membership of Apple Valley Christian School (Apple Valley); Canyon Springs High School (Sunnymead); and Palm Desert High School (Palm Desert), effective with the 1986-87 school term. It was further moved, seconded and passed to table an application from Bethel Baptist High School (Santa Ana).

11. **PREP LEAGUE 8-MAN FOOTBALL REQUEST** - Mr. Bill Clark, Administrator, reviewed a proposal from the Prep League with reference to terminating 8-man football games when there is a point differential of 45 points. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to deny the request in that the current National Federation playing rules provide procedures for early termination of contests.

12. **MT. SAC RELEAGUING** - Mr. Pat Mauch, Executive Committee member, and

MINUTES OF THE CIF-SS COUNCIL MEETING March 20, 1986

A meeting of the CIF Southern Section Council was called to order by President Moe Chavez at 9:30 a.m. on Thursday, March 20, 1986 at the Ramada Inn in Norwalk. All leagues were present with the exception of the Angelus, Heritage, and Junior High School Representative.

1. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES** - It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the minutes of the CIF Southern Section Council meeting of January 23, 1986 as mailed to the Council.

2. **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE** - Moe Chavez, President of the CIF Southern Section Council, commended those teams that participated in the CIF Southern Section winter playoff activities. Additionally, the Council was updated on the official notice from Commissioner Ray Plutko to leave his post in mid-July for a position as Commissioner of the Colorado High School Activities

Association, and the recently litigated Ocean View case.

3. **COMMISSIONER'S UPDATE** - Commissioner Ray Plutko provided an update on the CIF-SS teams participating in the Southern Regionals and State finals in basketball; proposed State Board of Education coaching certification requirements for all coaches; pending legal cases; recent trends in hardship appeals; current legal cases and the academic athlete award program. Additionally, Commissioner Plutko updated the Council on his recent appointment as Commissioner of the Colorado High School Activities Association and expressed his deepest regret in leaving the CIF Southern Section.

4. **SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE** - Ms. Cynthia Grennan commended the Council for its efforts in contributing to the strength of the organization. Additionally, she reviewed the renewal of SB 1533

(SB19), academic standards, tobacco issues and chemical abuse; AB 75 dealing with early release of students for extra curricular activities; and the upcoming CIF-SS program for the superintendents and board members symposium set for April 15 at the Industry Hills Convention Center.

5. **TREASURER'S REPORT** - Mr. Bruce Keuning, Treasurer, reviewed background information and the proposed budget for the 1986-87 school year. This is a non-action item and will be voted upon at the May 8, 1986 meeting of the CIF-SS Council.

6. **STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL UPDATE** -

A) **PROPOSED STATE BUDGET**: Mr. Pat Mauch, President-elect of the CIF-SS Council, reviewed with the Council the proposed State Federated Council budget for the 1986-87 school term. Follow-

ing discussion, a motion to approve the proposal failed to carry the necessary majority by a 3-55 vote. Further, the Commissioner was instructed to communicate with the State as to its concerns and recommendations for further State budgets.

(B) PHYSICAL EXAMS UPDATE: Mr. Pat Mauch, President-elect of the Council, provided background information on the recently passed State and Southern Section By-Law 306 as it pertains to physicals. Member schools are cautioned that the new by-law does in fact require a physical examination every 12 months for conditioning, tryouts or participation and further specifies the exam may only be conducted by a practitioner holding a valid physician's and surgeon's certificate. It is noted that administrators should conduct a thorough review of all participants effective with the fall of 1986. If a physical examination was given the previous 12 months by anyone other than a practitioner holding a valid physician's and surgeon's certificate, the physical examination would be **INVALID** effective July 1, 1986.

7. NOMINATING COMMITTEE REPORT - Mr. Jim Douglas, Chairman of the CIF Southern Section Nominating Committee, reviewed the recommendations for representatives on the Executive Committee for the positions of President-elect; treasurer; Girls' Athletic Director Representative; Citrus Belt Area Representative; Private Area #2 Representative; and the Desert Area Representative. MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING April 17, 1986

The April meeting of the California Interscholastic Federation Southern Section was called to order by Chairman Moe Chavez at 10:15 a.m. in the Conference Room at Anaheim Stadium on Thursday, April 17, 1986. All members were present.

1. PRESIDENT'S UPDATE - President Moe Chavez commended the CIF Southern Section Office Staff and Executive Committee Member Cynthia Grennan for the successful Superintendent and Board Member Symposium. He also commented on the positive comments received throughout the Section on the Academic Awards Program. Additionally, Mr. Chavez announced his retirement from education, effective June 30, 1986.

2. COMMISSIONER'S UPDATE - Commissioner Plutko reviewed with the Committee the new Hall of Fame Recognition Award Recipients; concerns relative to the increasing number and format (lack of background information) of eligibility appeals; and the increase in the number of Forms 214 processed by the Office this past year. Additionally, Commissioner Plutko advised the Committee that as of this date, there is only one legal action pending before the Section.

3. BOYS' ATHLETIC DIRECTORS' UPDATE - Mr. Mike Moropoulos, Boys' Athletic Director representative, expressed concern relative to the inconsistent enforcement of the new basketball rule 10-5 which requires coaches to be seated during the contest. He also expressed concerns on the part of many athletic directors relative to the scholastic eligibility legislation currently being reviewed in the State Legislature and a proposal by which all credentialed coaches must still be certificated to coach.

4. GIRLS' ATHLETIC DIRECTORS' UPDATE - Ms. Sheila Burrud, Girls' Athletic Directors representative, reported on the favorable response relative to the Superintendent and Board Member Symposium and the positive experiences achieved through athletics by both students and faculty members.

5. SUPERINTENDENTS' UPDATE - Ms. Cynthia Grennan, Superintendent representative, expressed her concerns relative to the implementation

of the provisions of Senate Bill 1533 (previously Senate Bill 19) by school districts in the Southern Section. Additionally she reviewed current legislation dealing with walk-on coaches and academic eligibility standards.

6. TREASURER'S REPORT - Bruce Keuning, treasurer, updated the Committee on the current 1985-86 working budget and reviewed background information relative to the 1986-87 budget which will be voted on by the Council at the May CIF-SS Council meeting.

7. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL -

(A) Commissioner Ray Plutko updated the Committee on the current status of insurance and legal defense billing from the State CIF.

(B) Mr. Tony Balsamo provided an overview of the proposed State budget and alternatives should the State budget proposal fail at the State Federated Council meeting set for May 2-3, 1986.

(C) Mr. Balsamo reviewed with the Committee the format for nomination

of State officers.

8. NEW SCHOOL MEMBERSHIP - It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the membership of Bethel Baptist, Santa Ana, effective with the 1986-87 school term.

9. TROY HIGH SCHOOL SOCCER REVIEW - Principal John Seeland and Ron Sipple, Athletic Director, appeared before the Committee to review corrective action taken as it pertains to a soccer incident in which the coach removed his team from the field prior to the end of a contest. Following discussion, the Commissioner was directed to close the case along with suggestions to the school to prevent a re-occurrence.

10. CALENDAR FOR 1986-87 - The CIF-SS calendar meeting dates for the 1986-87 school year were approved as submitted.

In keeping with procedures adopted by the CIF Southern Section Executive Committee, the items below require review and approval, then becoming part of the official minutes for accountability to the member schools.

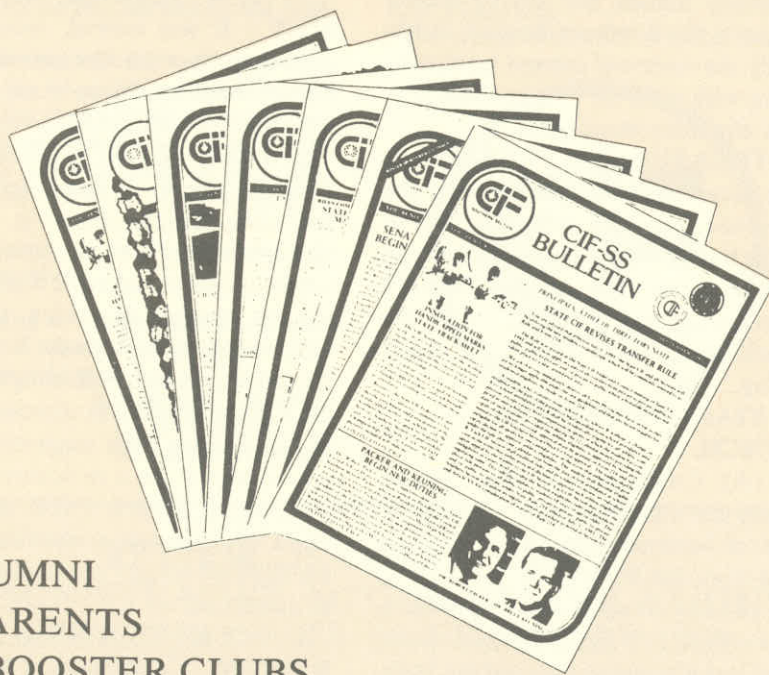
Situations, #24 and #25

12. SOCCER RECOMMENDATION

- Ms. Karen Hellyer, Administrator, reviewed a proposal to delay the implementation of Rule 2701.1, (limiting the number of players in the sport of soccer on an outside team), due to the large number of outside soccer organizations which have off-season programs currently in progress and are not scheduled to conclude until the beginning of the CIF Southern Section winter season. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to recommend to the CIF Southern Section Council to delay the effective implementation date of Rule 2701.1 to December 1 of the 1986-87 school year, should Rule 2701.1 pass.

13. FOOTBALL OFFICIALS' FLYER

- Administrator Bill Clark reviewed with the Committee a flyer from the Southern California Football Officials Assn. dealing with the CIF Southern Section and CIF L.A. City Section fee proposal.

14. FREEWAY LEAGUE REQUEST -

Dean Crowley, Administrator, reviewed a request by the Freeway League to use the National Federation experimental 3-point goal for league contests only in the sport of boys' basketball during the 1986-87 season. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve the request.

15. COMMISSIONER'S PROJECTED GOALS AND OBJECTIVES -

Commissioner Plutko reviewed with the Executive Committee his perceptions and recommendations as they pertain to future projects and issues the organization should address. These will be shared with the Council representatives at their meeting of May 8, 1986.

16. COMMISSIONER'S SEARCH UP-DATE -

Mr. Tony Balsamo, Chairperson of the Search Committee, reported on the list of applicants and procedures utilized in developing a list of nine candidates, each of whom will be interviewed by the Administrative Committee on April 21, 1986. From this group of candidates, the finalists will be reviewed by the full Executive Committee on May 6, 1986 for a final decision.
