

MEETING OF THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA-INTERSCHOLASTIC FEDERATION

November 18, 1918.

At a meeting of the California Interscholastic Federation, Southern Section, held November 18, 1918, at Los Angeles, California, the representatives of the various leagues were as follows:

F. J. Moore	Bay League
W. L. Richer	City League

At the election of officers E. S. Milliken was elected president and D. P. McAlpine vice-president for the year 1918-19.

The report of Harry Fowe, as manager of baseball for 1917-18, was read and accepted and a check for \$37.49 was forwarded to the treasurer, being twenty per cent of the net receipts of the semi-final and championship games.

After a reading of the revised constitution, together with approved rulings, a motion was passed that final action thereon be taken at the next meeting, to be held at 4 P.M., December 12, 1918.

Upon motion the Council suggested that the various leagues begin their football season after January first, closing February fifteenth, and that the semi-finals in football begin February twenty-first, 1919.

Messrs. Richer, Milliken and Moore were appointed representatives from the Council to the A.A.U. Council.

Upon motion the throwing of the hand grenade shall be substituted for the javelin throw and the rules covering the same shall be those adopted by the Western Intercollegiate Conference Athletic Association, with the exception that it shall be an individual instead of a team event. Standard rules and grenades may be secured from A. G. Spalding Co.

Upon motion the Council ruled that any student absent from school for military service shall not be counted as absent from school in considering athletic eligibility.

The meeting adjourned to meet at 4 P.M., December 12, 1918.
