First Meeting

October 1, 1921

The annual October meeting of the C. I. F., Southern Section was called to order by State Representative Oliver who asked for the roll call.

In as much as the "C" League and Imperial League had failed to send representatives to the meeting it was agreed that the position of President for the year should go to Orange League. Mr. J. S. Malcolm took the chair.

The Secretary stated that Van Nuys had entered protest that San Diego had not divided the "Gate" of their semi-final football game according to rule and that Van Nuys was out some \$150.00 on the game. By Motion, the President and Secretary were constituted a committee to investigate.

The Secretary stated that a protest had been made that San Diego had played Cleveland Tech. baseball contrary to our rules. The Secretary raised the point that San Diego was in no league and so no league could investigate the protest. It was ruled that the Council had jurisdiction. It was moved, seconded and carried the President, and Secretary be a committee to investigate the protest.

The report of the Tennis Manager was received approved and ordered filed.

It was moved, seconded and carried that a vote of thanks be extended the committee which printed the book of Constitution and Rulings.

It was agreed that the Secretary send to each school 50 eligibility lists and have printed others if necessary (Please send Secretary the exact number you will need for year).

It was agreed to have the Secretary print 500 cards showing the members of the Council, their residence, school and telephone and the Managers of Sports with residence, school and telephone (Please send information).

It was agreed to call attention to the fact that the daylight rule on page 12 applied to all sports.

It was agreed that the A. A. U. dues be paid and that the delegates from the City League and Mr. Oliver be our representative on the A. A. U. Board.

Mr. Green called for a ruling on questions which had been put to him two weeks ago secretary, by Mr. Fischer, representative of the Citrus Belt League regarding the students who did not finish 3 credits at end of spring semester. The ruling was made as follows:

1. The C. I. F. has always held and still holds that credits must be completed during the semester for which they are allowed.

2. For crediting purposes, the semester is understood to close with the last day of school in the given semester.

Mr. Fischer asked for ruling regarding the 8th grade graduates who did not attend any school for a year or more after graduation. A previous ruling was reaffirmed, that he is not barred from athletics.

It was agreed to call the attention of schools to the "date for beginning each sport" Page 10-12-14.

It was agreed to call the attention of schools to the fact that the rule on page 11 concerning "Gate" applied to all semi-finals and finals, except track and tennis.

It was agreed to issue passes to the members of the football association.

It was agreed to issue four passes to each City Daily, provided the paper would designate the persons to whom they wished the passes issued.

It was agreed that Mr. Malcolm, Mr. Oliver and Mr. H. J. Moore be a committee to arrange an evening meeting between the Council and the representatives of the Press.

The Secretary was authorized to have printed the necessary stationery for his work and the work of the managers.

It was agreed that Santa Barbara could be placed in the Santa Barbara League by vote of the League.

Garden Grove was added to the Orange League.

There being no further business, we adjourned.
