FIRST MEETING—ANNUAL MEETING OCTOBER 3, 1925

The Council of the California Inter-Scholastic Federation, Southern Section, met in annual meeting at the Y. M. C. A., in Los Angeles, California, at 9:30 A. M., October 3, 1925

The representative of the Southern League being absent, Mr. Blee of the San Gabriel Valley League was called to the chair. He ordered roll call.

The printed minutes for the year 1924-25 were approved.

1. The following case came before the Council for consideration:

M. M. made all of his grades in 1922-23. The year 1923-24 was spent in Central America with his father and he has now entered a California High School. Was not in school last semester. It was moved by Mr. Owen and seconded by Mr. Sniffen that in view of the fact that the boy was out of the U. S. A. last semester that he be allowed to play. After general discussion a roll call was demanded. Vote was as follows:

Chair declared the motion lost and announced that the boy was ineligible.

2. It was moved and seconded and carried that the Secretary call attention to Rule 9 on Page 13 of the Constitution and Rules, and state that the C. I. F., S. S., will enforce this rule.

3. Secretary was instructed to demand Age, Weight, Height, and Semesters, not exponents. (Total of exponents only.) The proper blanks for Four Point Record have been sent to every Principal in Southern California.

4. Since one month will change exponent for age, it was moved, seconded, and carried that hereafter age in years and months must be tabulated on September 15th for the first semester and on February 15th for second semester.

5. Each boy is checked by semesters and not by grades. Examples:

- John Jones has been in school 6 semesters but has only 10A standing. His exponent is 14.
- Bill Jones has been in school 6 semesters but has 14 credits or 12B standing. His exponent is 14.

7. The Secretary was instructed to inform schools that after these minutes are sent out mistakes in classification will disqualify teams.

8. The "Four Point Records" of all teams entering the Semi-Finals in Class B, Class C, and Class D, Football, Basketball, and Track, will be rechecked by the Secretary.

9. The Secretary was requested to call your attention to the standing of Junior High Schools voted at May meeting, as follows:

It was moved by Smith and seconded by Oliver that the matter of playing 9th grade boys on teams be left to the several Leagues for their own decision.

10. The Secretary was also requested to call your attention to the fact that Rule E, Page 6, was also changed at that meeting as follows:

Moved by Collins and seconded by Aldrich that Rule E, Page 6, be changed so that the first sentence shall read as follows: "This rule does not apply to pupils entering from an eighth grade nor to pupils passing in three units of ninth grade work in a Junior High School during the preceding semester."

11. The Secretary was also requested to call the attention of the League to a question that was referred to the League at the May meeting. "Hereafter one boy be allowed to compete in only one of the following events, 440—half mile—and mile." Please take action on this and instruct your representative, for this will be a special order of business at the next meeting.

12. It was moved by Westcott and seconded by Moore that Article II, on Page 6, of Constitution and Articles stand as published in the book. (This would nullify the action taken in May and referred to in No. 10, above.)

13. Mr. Jantzen of Colton then requested the floor and stated that he was petitioning to have Colton placed back in the Tri-County League for the following reasons:

1st—The Tri-County League had not requested Colton's exclusion.

2nd—Colton was outclassed in the Citrus League, Colton having but 300 pupils, while the smallest number in any of the other schools was 750 and the largest number, 1500 pupils.

It was moved by Barnes and seconded by Fischer that Colton be placed back in the Tri-County League.

14. It was moved by Maicom and seconded by Barnes that La Brea be taken out of the Tri-County League and placed in the Orange County League. Carried unanimously.

15. Questions of Eligibility:

- A. Boy is forced to change schools on account of a change in guardianship. Boy ruled eligible.
- B. Boy graduates from Junior High School in January, 1925, remains out of school and enters Senior High School in September. Boy ruled ineligible.
- C. Boy sent to Whittier reform school enters a Senior High School. Now is he eligible?

YES—if he was in Whittier last semester. Change of guardian.

NO—if he was not in Whittier last semester.

D. Boy comes to Senior High School with enough credits to enter 10B. He comes from another high school having taken one and a half years to cover the ninth grade work. Last semester he passed in but two solids. He would not be eligible had he remained in the former high school. Our eligibility committee claims that he is eligible in entering the first class of the Senior High School.

The boy is ineligible. He did not pass in three credits last semester.

16. Request of San Diego to play Phoenix, Arizona, was granted, provided, San Diego files eligibility list of players for the game with the Secretary of the C. I. F., S. S.

17. Request of Schools of Inyo County to play games with Tonopah, Nevada, was granted, provided, the Inyo County Schools file eligibility list of players with the Secretary of the C. I. F., S. S.

It was moved and seconded and carried that the C. I. F. pay an expense of a delegate from the Inyo County League to our two annual meetings in October and May.

18. The standing of 9th grade boys seems to be misunderstood.

The 9th grade boys may play on teams of Senior High Schools even though attending Junior High School, provided, the League votes to allow this. See (B) of minutes of May 16, 1925. See (9) of these minutes.

19. All 10B boys must be eligible in every respect whether attending a Senior High School or being promoted in a four year High School. See (C) of minutes of May 16, 1925. See (10) of these minutes.
