COMMISSIONER WILLIAM RUSSELL GIVEN AWARD FOR TRACK SERVICE

Commissioner William W. Russell, of the California Interscholastic Federation, was presented a special award for service to the sport of track and field at a luncheon, July 4, on the occasion of the 60th Annual Meeting of the National Federation of State High School Associations in Cambridge, Mass.

National Federation President, Herman L. Scott, of Alabama, made the presentation, acknowledging Mr. Russell's 26 years as a member of the Federation's Track and Field Rules Committee, including 22 years as committee chairman.

The Federation, which is headquartered in Kansas City, Missouri, consists of a high school association in each state and the District of Colum-



bia. Those members serve, regulate and provide programs for 20,400 schools nationwide. Associations of eight Canadian provinces, the Philippines and Okinawa are also affiliated.

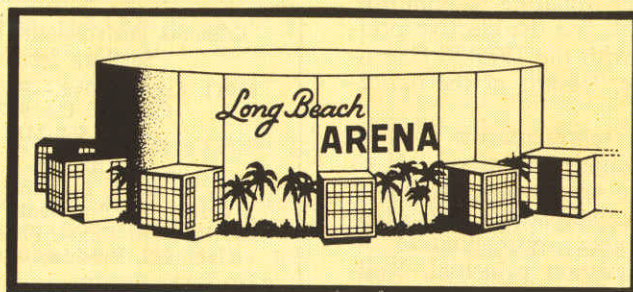
The Awards Luncheon featured a presentation by 1980 Olympic Men's Basketball Coach, Dave Gavitt, current athletic director at Providence College. More than 700 people were in attendance.

Mr. Russell, who has announced his retirement from the State C.I.F. effective June 1980, served as the second CIF-SS Commissioner from 1950 to 1954. He has been the Commissioner of the California Interscholastic Federation as well as the Executive Secretary of the CIF Protection Fund, the

MINUTES OF THE CIF-SS COUNCIL MEETING MAY 3, 1979

The May Council meeting of the Southern Section of the California Interscholastic Federation was called to order by Chairman Tony Balsamo at 9:35 a.m. Thursday, May 3, 1979 at the Saddleback Inn, Norwalk. All leagues were represented with the exception of the Academy, Angelus, Christian, Moore, Omega and Whitmont.

1. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES:** It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the minutes of the Council meeting of March 15, 1979 as published in the March-April issue of the Monthly Bulletin; and the Executive Committee minutes of April 25, 1979 as distributed to the Council.

2. **GARDEN GROVE LEAGUE BADMINTON REPORT:** The Garden Grove League filed its report of a pilot program conducted over the 1978-79 school year in the area of co-ed badminton. It was further recommended that co-ed badminton be adopted for CIF-Southern Section competition in the 1979-80 school year as presented. (This will be an action item at the September, 1979 meeting).

3. **SOUTH COAST LEAGUE WRESTLING PROPOSAL:** It was recommended that CIF-Southern Section institute team playoffs in wrestling effective the 1979-80 school year following the general format as presented. (This will be an action item at the September, 1979 meeting).

4. **MOORE LEAGUE WATER POLO PROPOSAL:** It was recommended that the allowable number of contests be increased from 16 to 18 in water polo, effective the 1979-80 school year. (This will be an action item at the September, 1979 meeting).

5. **NOMINATING COMMITTEE REPORT:** Mr. Gene Snyder, chairman of the Nominating Committee, presented ballots for the elective positions effective with the 1979-80 Executive Committee. Results of the balloting were:

Northern area representative — Bob Paisola, principal, Lompoc High School; Eastern area representative — Joe Deal, principal, South Hills High School; Bay area representative — Don Hagen, assistant principal, Rolling Hills H. S.; Girls' Athletic Director representative — Barbara Wilson, assistant principal, Beverly Hills High School; Superintendent's representative — Dr. Maury Ross, superintendent, Tustin Unified School District.

6. **BUDGET REPORT:** Dr. Hanford Rants, president-elect, reviewed with the Council the input received from the three geographical area budg-

et hearings and the final recommendation for the 1979-80 budget of the CIF Southern Section. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to adopt the 1979-80 budget for the CIF Southern Section as presented, reflecting an increase of 16¢ per student dues and one-half split of the net gate effective with the first round in the sports of football and basketball.

7. **STATE GIRLS' VOLLEYBALL PROPOSAL:** It was moved and seconded that the CIF-Southern Section deny the invitation for participation in the 1979-80 State Girls' Volleyball Tournament.

8. **STATE BOYS' AND GIRLS' BASKETBALL PROPOSAL:** The proposal to support the formation of a State Boys' and Girls' basketball tournament effective the 1979-80 school year died for lack of a motion. Further, a proposal for participation by the Southern Section in said tournament, should it pass at the State level, died for lack of a motion.

9. **SEA VIEW LEAGUE PROPOSAL:** Discussion was held relative to a proposal by the Sea View League requesting deletion of Section XLIX 12 (b) (1) of the Blue Book relative to the number of students who may compete on an outside team outside the season of sport in volleyball. Following discussion, a motion for deletion of the rule failed to carry the required majority.

10. **PLAYOFF GROUPINGS:** It was moved, seconded and passed to adopt the playoff groupings for 1979-80 as presented by the Playoff Groupings Committee. (An appeal by the Northern League failed to carry the required majority in the area of Girls' basketball and softball).

MINUTES OF THE CIF-SS EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING JUNE 25, 1979

The Executive Committee meeting of the Southern Section of the California Interscholastic Federation was called to order by Chairman Tony Balsamo at 10 a.m., Monday, June 25, 1979 in Palm Springs. All members were present with exceptions of Gene Hartley and Steve Miletich.

1. **MINUTES:** It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the Executive Committee minutes of April 25, 1979 as published in the June issue of the "Monthly Bulletin".

2. **BOYS' ATHLETIC DIRECTOR UPDATE:** Mr. Clyde Francisco, representative to the Executive Committee, highlighted areas concerning Boys' athletics with a major focus on the area Athletic Directors Associations being involved in the formation and presentation of student athlete awards.

3. **SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE:** Dr. Maury Ross, representative to the Executive Committee, highlighted areas involving suggestions for possible Board Member candidates from various districts to serve on a C.S.B.A. panel and possible presentation from State CIF President Dale Lacky.

4. **TREASURER'S REPORT:** Dr. Hanford Rants, past treasurer, presented an update and review on the adopted 1979-80 budget.

5. **GIRLS' ATHLETIC DIRECTOR UPDATE:** Mrs. Barbara Wilson, representative to the Executive Committee, highlighted areas concerning Girls' athletics with a major focus on officials and the need for a pay assessment study during the next school year and the All-CIF awards presentations at Magic Mountain.

6. **MEETING DATES:** It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the calendar meeting dates as amended for the 1979-80 school year.

7. **AREA REPRESENTATION:** It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the Executive Committee Area Representation for the 1979-80 school year with Don Hagen as the Bay Area Representative; Gene Knott as the Citrus Belt Area Representative; Don Conde as the Desert Area Representative; Joe Deal as the Eastern Area Representative; Bob Paisola as the Northern Area Representative; Dr. Robert Packer as the Orange County Area Representative; Bruce Keuning as the Private School Area Represent-

tative and Moe Chavez as the Southeastern Area Representative.

8. **LEAGUE PLACEMENT:** It was moved, seconded and passed that the Mater Dei Boys' tennis program be placed in the Garden Grove League for the 1979-80 school year. Further, a request for the Alemany wrestling program to be placed in the Frontier League for the 1979-80 school year was denied with a recommendation that Alemany continue to operate on a free lance basis for the upcoming school year.

9. **MORENO VALLEY WATER POLO:** It was moved, seconded and passed to accept the Moreno Valley High School report relative to the status of its water polo program for the 1979-80 school year.

10. **AWARDS LIMITATION:** It was moved, seconded and passed to recommend to the Council that the Southern Section increase its awards limitation to \$20 for an individual award and \$50 for a CIF-SS championship team award so as to conform with the State CIF Constitution.

11. **DEL REY LEAGUE TRACK:** It was moved and seconded to deny the request of the Del Rey League to move to the 2A placement in track in that the league had not followed the specific outline for placement. It was also pointed out the need to have a specific number of leagues for each grouping due to the number of lanes and heats which are currently part of the Southern Section formula.

12. **FINANCIAL INITIATIVES:** Commissioner Thomas E. Byrnes reported to the Committee on the status of the various financial initiatives being pursued.

13. **MILEAGE ALLOWANCE:** It was moved, seconded and passed to increase the mileage allowance for the 1979-80 school year to 18¢ per mile.

14. **COMMUNICATION:** The Commissioner urged all Committee members to impress upon their respective area schools the need to communicate with the CIF-SS Office on initial inquiries so as to expedite and enable the Section to communicate with schools on a more efficient basis.

15. **PARKWAY LEAGUE REQUEST:** It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the annual request for the Parkway League relative to its junior high school seasons of sport.

16. **VENTURA COUNTY ALL-STAR VIOLATION:** Information was heard relative to a Basketball All Star violation with the staging of a Boys' and Girls' contest during the school year, which included the assistance of school personnel. It was moved, seconded and passed that the principals of the schools involved be apprised of the situation and the need to counsel their respective staffs of the intent of the rule and to take whatever steps are necessary to insure compliance with the All-Star regulation in the future.

17. **MORNINGSIDE ALL-STAR VIOLATION:** It was moved, seconded and passed that the principal, athletic director and Boys' basketball coach from Morningside High School appear before the CIF Southern Section Executive Committee for presentation of a possible violation and involvement with the All-Star rule.

18. **NEWPORT HARBOR APPEAL:** It was moved, seconded and passed to deny the request for a waiver of the residency rule. Article XI, Section 12 of the CIF-SS By-Laws for student, Tom McGraw.

19. **SPRING FOOTBALL TRAINING AND PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT:** It was moved, seconded and passed that the Chairman appoint a committee to study the feasibility for the continuance of spring football practice and that further, an inquiry be made as to the number of injury claims submitted to the State CIF insurance office and the Southern Section schools be surveyed as to the number of injuries incurred in the just concluded spring practice.

20. **MEMBERSHIP:** It was moved and seconded to grant full membership, effective the 1979-80 school year, to Los Pinos High School and its placement in the Pinon League. It was moved and seconded to deny the request for membership from Whitney School of Artesia.

21. **PLAYOFF CONCERNS:** It was moved, seconded and passed that the principals, athletic directors and baseball coaches from El Segundo and Hueneme high schools be asked to appear before the CIF Southern Section Executive Committee for a review of the protocol during the awards ceremony at the CIF Southern Section 4A Baseball Championships held at Anaheim Stadium, May 25, 1979.

SOFTBALL CROWNS FOR 1979 TO MARINA, RIGHETTI, MAYFAIR, CHARTER OAK AND SAN JACINTO

Kim Nutter, Marina High School pitching ace, led Coach Betsy Ward's Vikings to the 4A Division Softball title with a 5-1 effort against North Torrance before an estimated crowd of 1,000 spectators at Golden West Softball Field. Nutter led a team which shut out 13 opponents during the season, two of these during the playoffs.

In the 3A game, Righetti dropped Lompoc 3 to 2 in nine innings. Both Northern League teams, Righetti posted a 17-4 season while Lompoc was 23-3-1.

In the afternoon session at Golden West, 2A Division Mayfair edged Capistrano Valley 3-2. Mayfair's win established Coach Jan Smith's team as the first in the school's history to win a CIF-SS Championship.

The Hacienda League proved once again their ball playing reputation as Charter Oak outplayed the Bonita Bearcats 8-3 for the 1A Division Championship.

EL SEGUNDO, LOMPOC, COVINA, LA SIERRA, MONTCLAIR PREP NUMBER ONE IN BASEBALL FOR '79



4A — EL SEGUNDO

El Segundo and undefeated pitcher, George De Maria, are tops in 4A Division baseball. El Segundo's Eagles, in winning their fifth CIF-SS title, relied upon the 6' 4", 185 pound senior righthander who pitched a two-hitter in the final game against Hueneme. The win was a 5-0 shutout at Anaheim Stadium.

In the 3A finale, Lompoc, champions of the Northern League, dispatched La Quinta 9-2. The Braves were led by Carlos Garcia, Player of the Year in 3A Division baseball, along with undefeated pitcher, Jeff Bettendorf and shortstop Casey Canale.

Covina defeated Northview for the 2A Division crown, 12-7, setting several new CIF-SS records as a team. The Colts scored a season total 307 runs, while bombing the opposition with 336 hits. Mike O'Hara was the winning pitcher in the title game. Bill Moore, Coach John Bachman's record breaking pitcher-outfielder, was named the top performer in 2A Division baseball for 1979. Moore set new CIF-SS records for home runs (11), hits (49), and RBI's (42).

La Sierra battled to a 5-3 victory over Fillmore to capture the 1A title. Paul Bradley, a three year starter, performed flawlessly behind the plate for La Sierra, batting .456 with 26 RBI's. He allowed but one passed ball all season.

In Small School play, Montclair Prep won the Division crown 4-3 over

Avalon. Montclair Prep was led by John McKirahan who was 11-2 for the Mounties with a 1.38 ERA and 120 strikeouts in 90 innings of play.

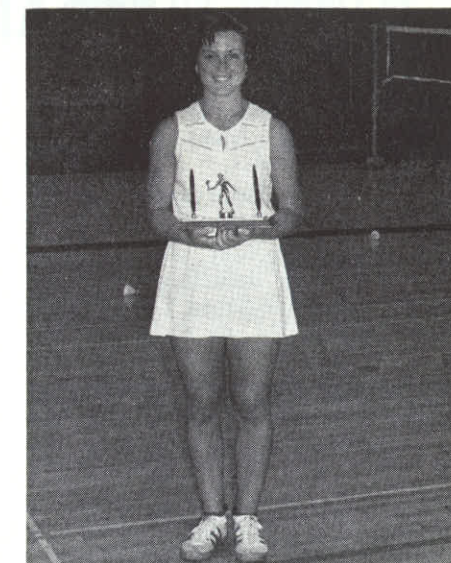

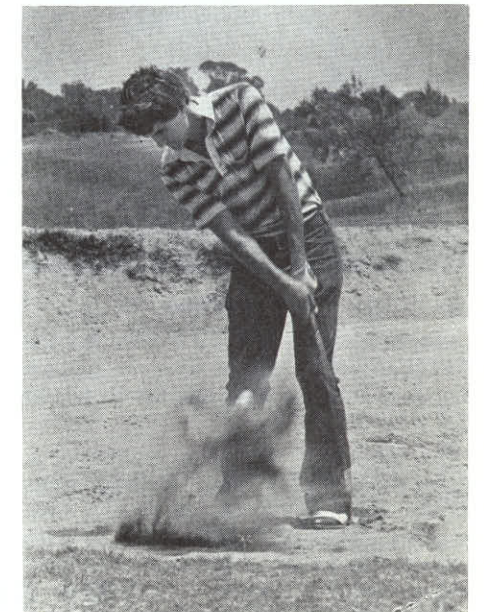
