Principal's Please Note:

TRANSFER ELIGIBILITY RULE CHANGE

An important change in the State CIF which also applies to Southern Section By-Laws has been effected relating to residence eligibility.

Effective the 1980-81 school year, the following will apply to Article XI (Residence Eligibility), Section 11:

"A student who transfers from one high school to another in violation of the CIF Southern Section residence rules will be ineligible in the second school for a period of one year from the date of transfer."

Please note, the aspect of 20 school weeks no longer applies and the interpretation is that a student is ineligible in the second school — regardless of having participated or not having participated in the previous school — for a period of one year from the date of transfer.

Additionally, Section 11A, as it relates to public to private or private to public, will now read:

"A student transferring from a public to private or from a private to a public school without a change of residence on the part of the parents which necessitates a change of schools will be ineligible for a period of one year from the date of transfer to the second school."

Following, Section 11B — with respect to Form 99 — will now read:

"A student transferring under the conditions outlined in 11A would be permitted to participate in *other than varsity* competition for the period of one year following the transfer to the second school, provided a CIF-SS Form 99 is completed (this does not apply on a public to public or private to private transfer), and the following requirements are met:

- (1) The principals of both schools approve the transfer,
- (2) The student has not been expelled from one of the schools, and
- (3) The student's residence is included in both the public and private schools' attendance area.

We urge that you pass this information on immediately to your staff, particularly the assistant principal in charge of athletics and both the Boys' and Girls' athletic director.

Thompson, one of the CIF Southern Section's most dominant basketball players currently holds several records in that sport, including most points in a season (864), most career points (2,574) and most rebounds in a career (1,634). She led Gahr in a 36 game win streak as well as being named as Player of the Year in Basketball and Volleyball during her high school career.

Coles, a four sport letterman, was cited for his performances in Baseball (All-CIF and All-American), Football (All-CIF and All-American), Basketball and Track. An honor roll student for three years, Coles was honored by the Rialto N.A.A.C.P. as their 1980 Young Man of the Year.

MATER DEI RALLIES FOR CIF-SS 4A BASEBALL TITLE

The Monarchs capped a comeback season with another comeback win upsetting defending champion El Segundo 7-6 in the CIF-SS 4A Divisional Championships at Anaheim Stadium before 9,462 people. Mater Dei played the role of the spoiler throughout the playoffs, defeating both top-seeded St. Paul and number two El Segundo enroute to its first baseball championship.

South Torrance, in beating Anaheim 5 to 1, won their first CIF-SS championship in a major sport since the school opened in 1958. The Spartan's pitcher Martin Montano was never threatened after the first inning as he gained his 14th win in 16 outings. Anaheim's only run came in the first inning. The Colonists saw a 10-game winning streak snapped with their loss to South Torrance.

For a while, Santa Fe High School's baseball team looked like it was down for the count at the Big A, but the Chiefs bounced back to win the CIF-SS 2A finals over Leuzinger, 7-4.

Rio Mesa climaxed an undefeated season by beating Norte Vista 3-0 to win the Southern Section 1A baseball championship. Rio Mesa came into the game with the reputation as a hard-hitting ballclub, having established CIF-SS records for team honors (41) and most homers in a game (8). Rio Mesa became the first undefeated team from Ventura County since Santa Clara in 1960.

In the Small Schools Division, Paraclete won its first CIF-SS title since the division was established, beating Orange Lutheran handily, 6-0.

The CIF-SS softball finals featured an impressive array of pitching and last inning dramatics as titles in four divisions were decided at Mayfair Park in Lakewood.

Righetti High School finally broke a scoreless deadlock with an unearned run in the ninth to nip Cypress, 2-0 in the 4A game and a sacrifice fly by St. Joseph in the bottom of the seventh broke a 1-1 deadlock to give St. Joseph a 2-1 win over Troy in the 3A divisional finals.

Azusa was the only champion that didn't need the last-inning heroics, defeating host Mayfair, 5-2, in the 2A match-up. Azusa had the longest road to the finals needing a wild-card game win over Schurr to qualify for the first round.

La Reina waited patiently until the 11th inning to hand Hemet a 4-0 defeat in the 1A game. In this final La Reina pitcher, Kat Slaton, pitched the 11 inning game to a no-hitter allowing only three walks while striking out 23.

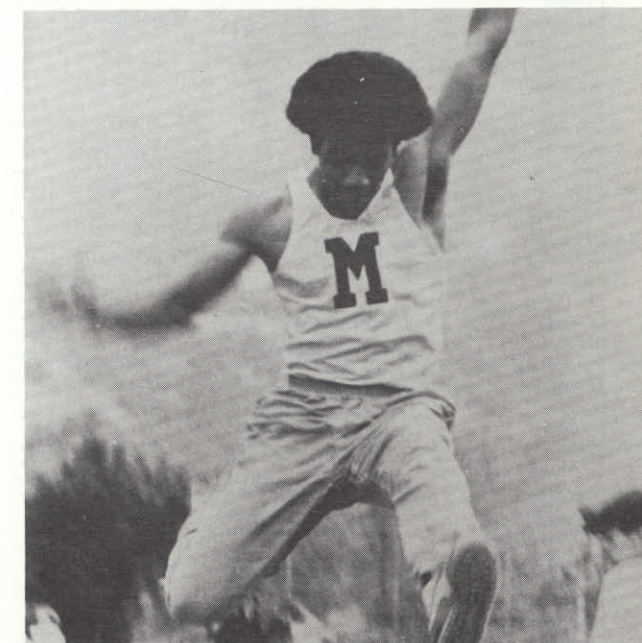

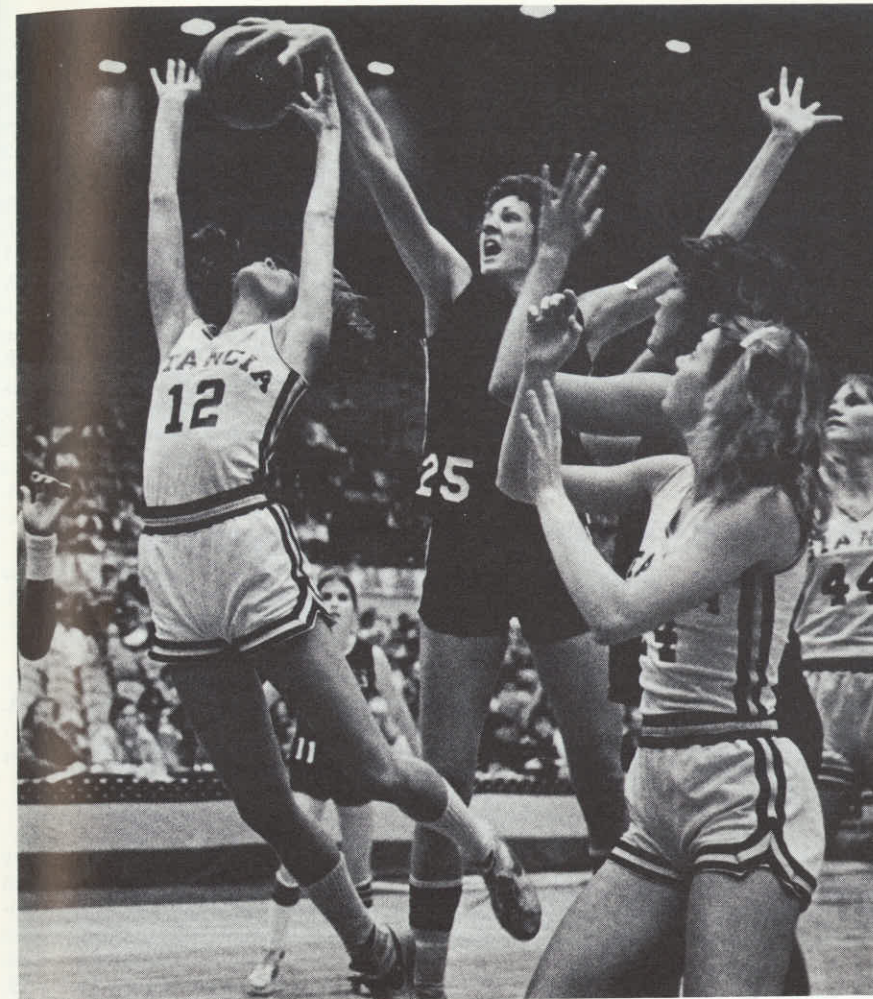

Sub Murphy Sparks Riverside Poly To CIF-SS Girls' 4A Basketball Crown

The fact that Riverside Poly High School's girls' basketball team won the CIF Class 4A championship at the Long Beach Arena last night might not be shocking news. But, oh, how the Bears won.

Riverside had to scramble off the deck in an unbelievable fourth quarter — with All-American center Cheryl Miller sitting dejectedly on the bench with five fouls — to stun Long Beach Poly 62-48.

It was Riverside Poly's second straight CIF title, following on the heels of a 3A crown in 1979.

But no titles will be more special than this achievement, as 2,881 fans looked on in disbelief.

Barb Murphy, a 6-foot junior who serves as Miller's back-up, keyed Riverside's fourth-period surge that not only erased Long Beach's 40-37 third-quarter lead, but turned it into a Riverside rout.

Murphy, who averaged 4.4 points per game this year, scored all 12 of her points in that frenzied fourth quarter, teaming with Renee Overton, Sara Lewis and Meg Gallagher to trigger a 27-8 Riverside explosion.

In other action, Janet Davis, MVP of the tourney, and freshman Shelda Arceneaux led Alta Loma to the 3A title, ambushing highly touted Estancia 66-52 in the final game. Davis led Alta Loma with 27 points and 12 rebounds.

Esperanza, coached by former Lionette, Cec Ponce, and Dan Dessecker, ripped Mayfair in the 2A finals, 60-45; while Ontario Christian blitzed rival Valley Christian, 21-11 in the third quarter to win the CIF-SS 1A girls' title 57-49 over the Crusaders. Valley Christian, which split two earlier games with Ontario Christian, had a 22-20 lead before the Knights pulled away.

Before a packed house in Tehachapi, the Warriors toppled Marshall Fundamental, 48-37, to clinch the small schools title.

INGLEWOOD CAPS PERFECT SEASON IN BOYS' BASKETBALL

Long Beach — About once every ten years a great high school basketball team like Inglewood comes along.

The Sentinels won the CIF-SS 4A championship by beating Long Beach Poly 52-46 before 10,644 at the Long Beach Arena. It was the largest crowd to watch a CIF-SS title game since 1971. Inglewood, which won its 29th game against no losses became the first team in 11 years to go undefeated in the CIF-SS.

In 3A action, La Quinta's 6'8" John Rodgers proved too much to overcome as he and his Aztec teammates throttled Corona del Mar 63-52 to win the CIF-SS 3A title.

Moreno Valley High School guard Vince Cason made two free throws with two seconds remaining to play to give the Vikings a 49-48 win over Mission Viejo in the CIF 2A Championship game. The win snapped Mission Viejo's 13-game winning streak and marked the second time it has lost a title game in the past five years.

Veteran Coach Lou Cvijanovich and his Santa Clara Saints won their sixth CIF basketball championship — but their first in 16 years, defeating Notre Dame of Riverside, 59-55 in the 1A final. Cvijanovich took over as head coach at Santa Clara in 1959 and won 1A championships in five of the next six years, missing only in 1962 when he lost in the finals to Laguna Beach. This year's win tied Cvijanovich for most basketball titles in CIF history with Bill Armstrong, who won championships at Compton in 1958, 1961, 1963, 1968 and 1969 and at Palm Springs in 1973.

Sophomore guard Roy Ledesma scored 20 points and had five assists to lead top-seeded Chadwick High to the CIF small schools basketball title with a 71-50 victory over Rio Hondo Prep. Ledesma, a 5'10" guard, made 9 of 12 field goals and 2 of 3 free throws to lead Chadwick (28-1) to its 28th consecutive victory. Chadwick, the Prep League champ, was the 1979 Small Schools runner-up.

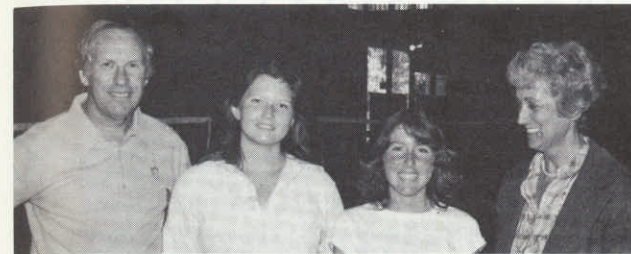

1. 2. KNBC TELEVISION EDITORIAL — Commissioner Thomas E. Byrnes reviewed with the Council, the background relative to the recent KNBC television editorial and its inference to recruiting by CIF Southern Section member schools and their coaching staffs. The Commissioner also presented the specific plans of the Office to pursue a response from KNBC as it pertains to communication from the CIF Southern Section Office.

3. NOMINATING COMMITTEE REPORT — Mr. Eugene Snyder, chairman of the Nominating Committee, presented the slate of candidates to be voted upon at the May meeting for the Executive Committee:

Those nominated for President-Elect are Dr. Robert Packer (Costa Mesa HS) and Mrs. Barbara Wilson (Beverly Hills HS).

Those nominated for Superintendent's Representative are Dr. Maury Ross (Tustin Unified School District) and Dr. Jack Rankin (Palos Verdes Unified School District).

Those nominated for the Desert Area Representative are Mr. Don Conde (Victor Valley HS) and Mr. Blinn Tenney (Central Union HS).

There being no nominations from the floor, the slate was approved as presented.

4. SMALL SCHOOLS CONCERN — Mr. Walter Retzlaff, representative from the Tri-County League, and Mr. Dick Cate of Coast Union High School, presented background information relative to the Small Schools request for assistance in an added financial split from CIF Southern Section playoffs in hopes of providing the necessary funds to meet all game costs so as not to incur a deficit by the participating schools involved.

5. PRESENTATION OF BUDGET — Mr. James Faul, treasurer, presented an overview of the proposed budget for the CIF Southern Section on the 1980-81 school year. This will become an action item at the May meeting.

6. STATE REPORT — Mr. Tony Balsamo, president, presented background information relative to items being discussed at the State Federated Council level with particular emphasis on the area of voting representation. A further update will be presented at the May meeting.

7. It was further moved, seconded and passed that a study be made of ways of reducing overall officials' costs and possible number of contests in non-revenue sports.

MUROC UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT APPEAL — Mr. Richard Lynch, superintendent of the Muroc Unified School District; Mr. Joe Maruca, principal of Mammoth High School and Mr. Blinn Tenney, principal of Central Union High School, appeared before the Executive Committee relative to the Desert Area Releaguings Proposal for the 1981-82 school year. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed that the meeting of March 27, 1980 did not meet the releguing procedures with respect to a majority of those voting and that all schools are to be contacted immediately for a vote on the Desert Area Proposal for the 1981-82 school year by way of the CIF-SS Office.

12. KNBC UPDATE — The Commissioner reviewed with the Executive Committee the final disposition of the Office's communication with KNBC as it related to the alleged editorial on high school recruiting.

13. WHITMONT LEAGUE REQUEST — It was moved and seconded to deny the request of the Whitmont League to conduct Girls' water polo in the winter season.

14. SOCCER LEAGUING — It was moved, seconded and passed that El Monte and Keppel high schools be recognized as official members of the Rio Hondo League for the 1980-81 soccer season as per the official league schedule.

15. FOOTHILL LEAGUE APPEAL — It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the appeal of the Foothill League

with reference to its placement from 4A to 3A track as per the official enrollment figures and that the Century League move from 3A to 4A as per the official enrollment figures on the 1980-81 school year.

16. TEMPLE CHRISTIAN HIGH SCHOOL (VENTURA) REQUEST — It was moved, seconded and passed that Temple Christian High School of Ventura be permitted to field soccer in the fall season due to no sport being offered at that time but with the understanding that the team will not qualify for the playoffs during the regular winter season.

17. CSDR REQUEST — It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the request of CSDR to play a Girls' volleyball game as part of a doubleheader schedule trip with its football team for the 1980 season only.

18. REQUEST FOR MEMBERSHIP — It was moved, seconded and passed to approve regular membership, effective the 1980-81 school year, for Arrowhead Christian Academy of San Bernardino.

19. CHRISTIAN LEAGUE CONCERN — Mr. Bruce Keuning, representative to the Private School Area, reviewed with the Committee concerns relative to the Christian League and its use of certified officials for interscholastic athletics. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to instruct the Christian League that its members must conform to all rules and regulations by September 1, 1980 as a condition of continuing membership within the CIF Southern Section.

There being no further business to come before the Executive Committee, the meeting was adjourned at 4 p.m.
