## FOCUS ON HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

That's the theme to a bonanza two-week period of October 18-30 when the CIF Southern Section spearheads the most comprehensive and unified public relations campaign it has ever undertaken.

Thanks to the combined corporate efforts of the Los Angeles Dodgers and Adohr Farms, the project may well be one of the most exhaustive ever attempted in interscholastic circles and never has the need been more acute.

The need to create a unified public awareness and provide an accountability of the high school activity programs will be the focal point of the two-week spectacle.

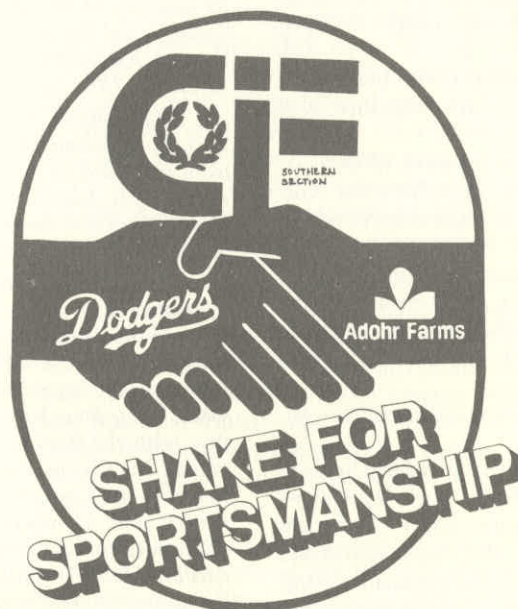
Virtually \$15,000 in donated materials and expertise have provided the base for the two-week program, complete with posters, school and press packets, 62 sportsmanship trophies and eight specific programs to be staged during the two-week span.

"With the continued strain on the public educational dollar, we must maintain an aggressive posture in order to raise an awareness of the values and needs for our high school activity programs," says Commissioner Ray Plutko.

"Once accomplished, support for what many of us refer to as 'The Other Half of Education' will hardly be lacking," he adds.

The Dodgers are assisting with the designing and printing of a logo and poster, as well as providing the services of star outfielder Dusty Baker, who will act as the official spokesman during the two weeks.

Promotion of the event through DODGER BLUE, the official Dodger publication and radio and television are also part of the agreement.

Adohr Farms will be underwriting the cost of supplying each of the 62 leagues within the Southern Section a sportsmanship plaque. The plaque will be presented to one school in each league based upon its leadership in sportsmanship for the entire year.

## COMMISSIONER'S CORNER



"A GREAT COOPERATIVE EFFORT"

"Why is it that the Southern Section of the CIF is so successful, while some of us are finding these difficult times for interscholastic athletics?"

The question was one posed to me while in attendance this past summer at the annual meeting of the National Federation of State High School Associations.

Although somewhat taken back with the query initially, my response was easy . . .

... "A great cooperative effort."

The above aptly describes the CIF Southern Section, an organization which involves the ideal blend of expertise from numerous individuals and groups.

In essence, there's no alternative. The challenges facing the organization are too monumental for any one individual or any single group.

How then, does this cooperative venture unfold?

The key entity is the Southern Section Council. Here rests the legislative authority of the organization — a forum comprised of elected representatives from each of the 62 recognized leagues.

It's this assemblage which is charged with the cooperative responsibility for the maintenance and passage of standards in the Constitution and By-Laws. The results are so noted in the official publication, referred to as the CIF-SS "Blue Book."

However, one can hardly overlook the athletic administrators of our 500 member schools, acting in concert to insure quality programs while representing different philosophies, geographical areas and not to mention, a competitive atmosphere in interscholastic athletics.

This is accomplished in the league structure where the cooperative bond is the greatest, yet an arena which spawns the most detailed debate on issues and proposals to be submitted to the CIF-SS Council.

Thus, it's easy to see that the member schools, the leagues and the Southern Section Council are the CIF-SS in all aspects.

There is also an administrative wing of the organization, the CIF-SS Executive Committee.

These 16 officers — elected directly by the member schools — serve that function with yeoman duty.

## MINUTES OF THE CIF SOUTHERN SECTION COUNCIL MEETING May 6, 1982

The May meeting of the California Interscholastic Federation, Southern Section was called to order by Chairman Dr. Robert Packer at 9:30 a.m. on Thursday, May 6, 1982 at the Saddleback Inn. All leagues were represented with the exceptions of the Liberty, Pinon, Prep, Tri-County and Westside.

1. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES:** It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the minutes of the CIF Southern Section Council meeting of March 18 as mailed to the Council, and the minutes of the CIF Southern Section Executive Committee meeting of April 15, 1982 as mailed to the Council.

2. **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:** Dr. Robert Packer, president of the CIF Southern Section, provided an update on the actions of the CIF-SS Administrative and Executive Committees and thanked the Council for the work that it has done this past year.

3. **COMMISSIONER'S UPDATE:** Commissioner Ray Plutko reviewed with the Council the success of the 214 Transfer Rule being used by the Office; the Athletic Administrators' Symposium set for October; work being done by the CIF-SS in conjunction with the National Athletic Health Institute. In looking ahead, the Commissioner apprised the Council of the new Blue Book format and the upcoming Office effort in relation to sportsmanship, eligibility posters and Blue Book in-service days. In addition, the announcement was made in reference to the sponsorship of varsity team trophies that will be furnished to all leagues by the W. R. Moody Trophy Company beginning in 1983-84.

4. **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:** Mr. Lon Hargrave, chairman of the Life Pass Committee, presented CIF-SS Life Passes to the following persons in recognition of their long standing service to the CIF-SS: Wynola Kerry, Robert Schilling and Margaret Davis.

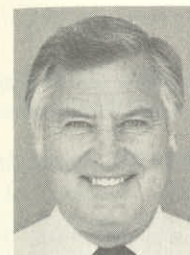
In addition, a special award was presented to Commissioner Ray Plutko from the Citrus Belt League Athletic Directors Assn. in recognition of his accomplishments as Commissioner of the CIF Southern Section.

5. **TRI-VALLEY LEAGUE FROSH FOOTBALL PROPOSAL:** Mr. Mike Michael, representative from the Tri-Valley League, presented a proposal recommending a change in the current Blue Book as it relates to the time of quarters in freshman football contests (Article XLI, Section 15). The proposal would change the time of the current frosh football quarters from 10 minutes to 12 minutes. This proposal will be voted upon at the September meeting of the Council, and if approved, will be implemented with the 1983-84 football season.

6. **BLUE BOOK COMMITTEE BASEBALL/SOFTBALL PROPOSAL:** Mr. Clyde Francisco, member of the Blue Book Committee, reviewed with the Council a recommendation of the Executive Committee as it relates to the outside practice regulation in the sports of baseball and softball. This proposal will be voted upon at the September meeting of the CIF-SS Council and if approved, will bring the sports of baseball and softball in line with all other sports and would become effective with the 1982-83 season.

7. **FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME TIE-BREAKER:** Mr. Pat Mauch, member of the CIF-SS Executive Committee, presented background information as it relates to the status of declaring a champion in the football finals only. The CIF-SS Council will make the final decision in its next meeting as to maintaining the present rule or adopting the policy of declaring co-champions in the event of a tie in the championship contest.

## NEW EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEMBERS

We are pleased to introduce the four school administrators who are the new additions to the roster of the CIF-SS Executive Committee.

H. L. Looney will represent the Orange County area on the Executive Committee. Looney has had extensive experience with the CIF-SS, coaching football as well as with the administration of the athletic program at Corona High School from 1951-56 and continuing the same duties at the opening of Buena Park High School from 1956-64.

In 1964, Looney was named assistant principal at Troy High School and served as principal at that site for the past 11 years. Looney has been a member of various CIF-SS Committees including the Academic Eligibility Committee and is presently chairman of the Officials Fees Committee. In addition, he has served as the Freeway League Representative to the CIF-SS Council since 1974. Looney is married, has two children and two grandchildren.

Reverend Charles Edwin Hill, a native Californian, will replace Bruce Keuning and represent Private Area #1. Hill, ordained a Roman Catholic Priest in 1964, is currently principal of Pius X High School in Downey. He began his private school teaching experience in 1970. His administrative career began as a vice principal in 1972 in various Southern California Catholic High Schools.

In 1976, Hill was named principal at Bishop Montgomery High School and served as the chief administrator of Bishop Amat High School until last year. Since 1976, Hill has also served as the Angelus League Representative to the Council. In addition to his many duties, he has been a member of the National Ski Patrol for the past 11 years serving as Ski Patrol

Leader and Administrative Assistant of the Regional Patrol for testing and training.

Mr. Leon "Lon" Hardgrave replaces Gene Knott and will represent the Citrus Belt Area. Hardgrave is no stranger to the CIF Southern Section. He has served as Assistant Principal at La Sierra High School since 1970 as well as Director of Athletics and Activities. Hardgrave served as the San Andreas League Representative to the CIF-SS Council from 1975-79 and was also President of the Citrus Belt Area Athletic Association from 1980-81. Hardgrave is married and has one son who teaches in Riverside.

Gerald W. Harer will represent the newly established Private Area #2. Harer is a graduate and post-graduate of Cal State University, Los Angeles with a degree in Physical Education. Harer brings 19 years experience as an administrator and 15 years as the CIF Prep League Representative to his new position. Harer, as a member of the California Carvers Guild, finds time to spend on his hobby, wood carving with an emphasis on "song birds". Harer is married and has three children.

Other changes on the Executive Committee include the election of Moe Chavez as the 1982-85 President-Elect and the appointment of Bruce Keuning to fill the Treasurer's position, recently vacated by the retiring Jim Faul.

The CIF-SS Executive Committee is the administrative body of the Southern Section. Responsibilities of the Executive Committee include enforcing all rules and regulations approved by the council of the CIF Southern Section, and the consideration of all questions related to a violation of such rules and regulations.

## CIF-SS SANCTIONED EVENTS

The State CIF Office has adopted the following procedure for sanctioning of athletic events when other CIF Sections are invited to participate. This policy establishes time lines for the application to be received by the CIF-Southern Section Office for those events involving California schools outside the Southern Section.

1. **FALL SPORTS** — No application will be approved for Fall Sports if not received before June 1.

2. **WINTER SPORTS** — No application will be approved for Winter Sports if not received before October 1.

3. **SPRING SPORTS** — No application will be approved for Spring Sports if not received before December 1.

**IMPORTANT — THIS CHANGE WILL BE EFFECTIVE FOR ANY SANCTIONED EVENTS DURING THE 1982-83 SCHOOL YEAR.**

Applications received after the above established time lines may be approved for schools within the Southern Section but **WILL NOT BE APPROVED INsofar AS SCHOOLS FROM OUTSIDE THE SECTION ARE CONCERNED.**

This policy does not affect the current sanctioning process for schools outside California and the United States.

**ATTENTION: ATHLETIC DIRECTORS — IT WILL BE YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO INFORM ALL COACHES OF THE ABOVE PROCEDURE.**



## BLUE BOOK CHANGES

The following is a synopsis of changes which have been designed as part of the new blue book format for the benefit and convenience of athletic administrators and coaches. This is a capsule summary of the State CIF and CIF Southern Section Constitution and By-Law changes enacted during the 1981-82 school year.

The changes are listed by topic. The first parenthesis indicates the article and/or Section Rule as it appeared last year. The second parenthesis keys the change in the 1982-83 edition for easy reference.

**Appeals Procedure (CIF By-law 515):** Amendment clarifying that a hearing panel which has no discretion but to declare a student ineligible due to a rule violation, may find an appeal to be without merit and deny a hearing. (CIF By-law 1100a)

**Appeals Procedure (CIF By-law 516a):** Amendment clarifying individuals eligible to serve on hearing panels and requirements for same. (CIF By-law 1101a)

**Appeals Procedure (CIF By-law 516d3):** Amendment specifying that proceedings of a hearing shall be tape recorded. (CIF By-law 1101d3)

**Appeals Procedure (CIF By-law 516c2):** Amendment specifying that the decision of a hearing panel shall be prepared in writing by the State CIF Office in lieu of signatures of two members of the hearing panel. (CIF By-law 1101c2)

**Incomplete Grades (CIF By-law 205):** Amendment distinguishing the status of an incomplete grade. (CIF By-law 205. Please note: the Southern Section is more restrictive in this amended change.)

**Defining of Private and Parochial Attendance Area (CIF By-law 215):** The entire By-law 215 was deleted and is replaced by Residence Transfer Rule #214 with regard to restricted and unrestricted eligibility. (CIF By-law 214)

**Interstate Sanctioned Event Application (CIF By-law 703b):** Amends the rule to provide for 60 days filing time in lieu of the previously required six months filing time. (CIF By-law 703b)

**International Sanctioned Event Application (CIF By-law 1000):** Amends the rule to provide for 75 days filing time in lieu of the previously required three months filing time. (CIF By-law 1000)

**Number of Track Events (CIF By-law 1400):** By-law deleted in that it is covered in the National Federation playing rules. (Deleted)

**Dual Competition in Track or Cross Country (CIF By-law 1401):** By-law deleted in that it is covered under CIF By-law 604. (Deleted)

**Outside Competition in Swimming (CIF By-law 1500):** By-law deleted in that it is covered under CIF By-law 604. (Deleted)

**Outside Competition in Wrestling (CIF By-law 1602):** By-law deleted in that it is covered under CIF By-law 604. (Deleted)

**Basketball Playing Rules (CIF By-law 1700):** Retains only the first sentence of the By-law with reference to use of the 30 second clock

in Girls' basketball. The two following sentences are covered under National Federation playing rules. (CIF By-law 1700)

**Commercial Advertising (CIF By-law 804):** By-law deleted in that it is no longer applicable. (Deleted)

**Season of Sport for Football (CIF By-law 1307):** By-law deleted in that it is no longer applicable. (Deleted)

**Unattached Competition (CIF By-law 606):** By-law amended to provide clarification of unattached competition. (CIF By-law 606)

**Unattached Competition (New By-law):** By-law addition further clarifying unattached competition. (CIF By-law 607)

**Outside Competition in Swimming (CIF By-law 604):** By-law amended to approve outside competition in the United States Junior or Senior National Championship Meet. (CIF By-law 604)

**Residence Transfer (CIF By-law 214):** By-law amended to further clarify that a student who transfers from one school to another, are schools located in the United States, a United States territory and/or United States military base. (CIF By-law 244)

**All-Star Practice (CIF By-law 905):** By-law amended to further clarify the first date permissible on which a student may practice or tryout for an All-Star basketball or football game and/or teams. (CIF By-law 905)

**Minimum Days of Practice in Swimming and Diving (CIF-SS By-law Article XLVI, Section 4):** By-law deleted relative to the minimum days of practice required before participating in interscholastic competition. (Deleted)

**Minimum Days of Practice in Track (CIF-SS By-law Article XLVIII, Section 5):** By-law deleted relative to the minimum days of practice required before participating in interscholastic competition. (Deleted)

**Ten Day Tryout Period All Sports (CIF-SS By-laws All Sport Sections):** By-law amended in each sport section clarifying that ten day tryouts are for those students who have not previously played on a high school team at any level the previous season in the school in which they are enrolled. (CIF-SS By-laws All Sport Sections)

**College Association Rule (CIF-SS By-law Article XIII, Section 2):** By-law deleted relative to students practicing or working out on a college campus or facility. (Deleted)

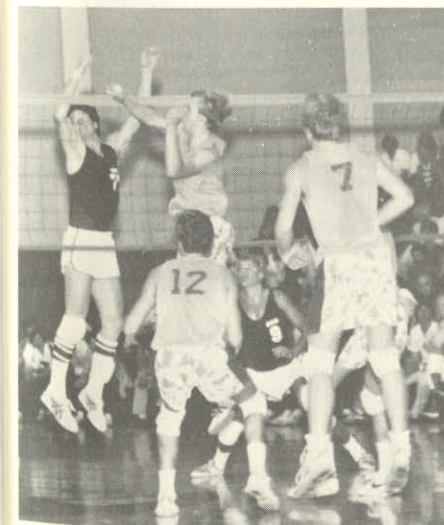

In addition to being the administrative body, they are called upon to perform judicial functions when violations of standards take place and to provide the leadership in the formulating of recommended guidelines for consideration by the Council.

As for the every-day administration of the organization, the Executive Committee employs a Commissioner of Athletics and office staff to handle the myriad of duties and concerns.

The Commissioner is empowered to give interpretations of the rules and regulations and to make recommendations to the Executive Committee. But his authority is limited in that any appeals to the Executive Committee are final by that body.

But there are others who are viable parts of this cooperative effort.

The Coaches Advisory Committees, representing each of the 23 recognized Boys' and Girls' sports, provides input as to the playing rules, research topics and provides an on-going critique of the respective playoffs.

If one were to sit in on any of the above meetings, evidence of the concert among member schools and professional educators would indeed be apparent.

These committees, by way of one of its members, provides direct input from the numerous coaches associations. Further, the newly formed Officials Committee duplicates that effort for the 12,000 individuals who assist the growth of our programs in yet another avenue.

The challenges of the organization are indeed too monumental for any one individual or any single group, but the alternative of a cooperative effort has made the CIF Southern Section a model throughout the United States.

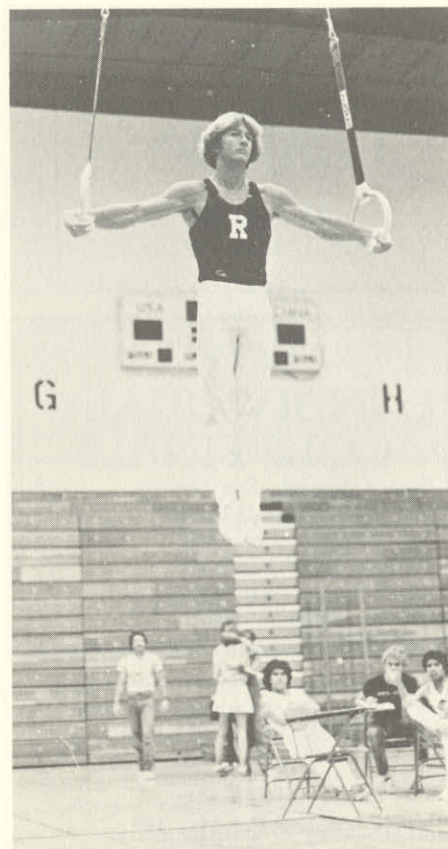
#### SPORT CLASSIFICATIONS -

The OSAA Board of Control took final action that places schools in a classification for four years effective with the 1982-83 school year.

The only time a school might possibly move from one classification to another during the four-year time block would be in case of an extreme emergency — such as in a smaller town where a mill or a plant would close and the school in that town would lose many of its students because of families leaving the area.

3. **COMMISSIONER'S UPDATE:** Mr. Ray Plutko, Commissioner reviewed with the Committee the upcoming National Federation meeting and the dates for the 1982-83 Executive Committee Meetings. In addition, the Commissioner apprised the Committee relative to the current office plans for the 1982-83 year.
