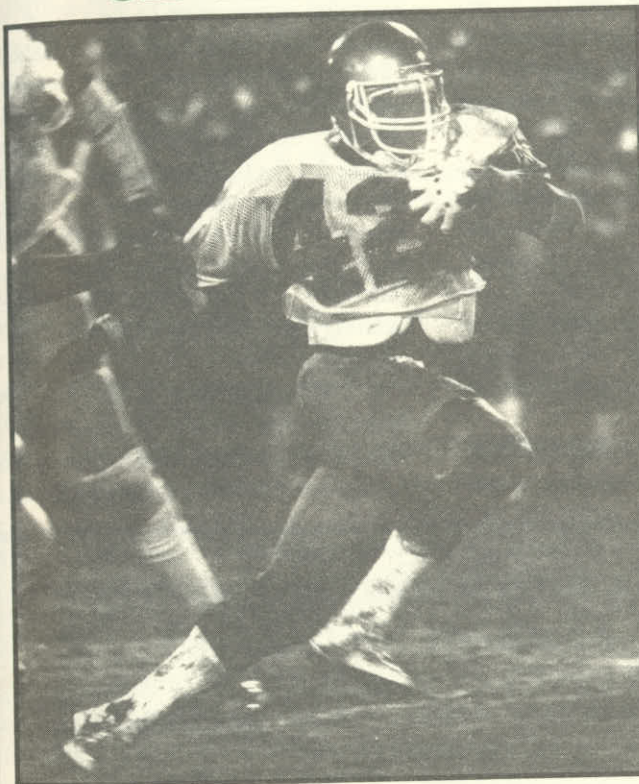

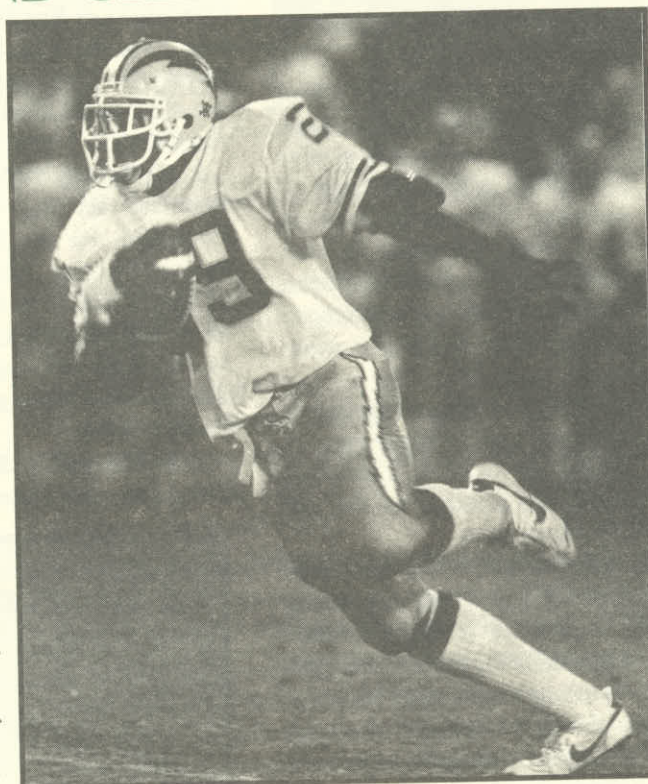

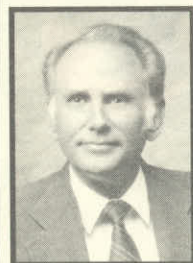

The June meeting of the California Interscholastic Federation, Southern Section Executive Committee was called to order by Chairperson Moe Chavez at 9:20 a.m., Saturday June 28, 1986 with all members present.

1. PRESIDENT'S UPDATE - President Moe Chavez extended his appreciation to the Executive Committee for its support during his tenure as President of the CIF Southern Section. Additionally, he expressed the Committee's best wishes to Commissioner Ray Plutko upon his departure from the CIF Southern Section to assume the position of Commissioner for the Colorado High School Activities Association.

2. COMMISSIONER'S UPDATE: - Commissioner Ray Plutko updated the Committee on the National Federation Summer Meeting. Additionally, he extended special thanks to the Executive Committee and the entire CIF Southern Section for its kindnesses, support and courtesies afforded him during his six years as Commissioner.

3. BOYS' ATHLETIC DIRECTOR UPDATE: - Mr. Mike Moropoulos, Boys'

athletic director representative, reported on concerns dealing with officials, current legislation including trainers and certification of coaches. Further, he reviewed the recent trend of athletic directors computerizing their programs as well as drug testing at the secondary level.

4. GIRLS' ATHLETIC DIRECTOR UPDATE: - Ms. Sheila Burrud, Girls' athletic director representative, reported on the very successful spring playoff activities conducted by the CIF Southern Section and extended appreciation to the Office staff.

5. SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE: - Ms. Cynthia Grennan, superintendent's representative, commended the CIF Southern Section staff and Commissioner Plutko for the fulfillment of the Goals and Objectives presented for the 1985-86 school term and the positive method utilized in dealing with school violations. Additionally, she updated the Committee on pending legislation and drug testing in the secondary schools.

6. TREASURER'S UPDATE: - Mr. Bruce Keuning, treasurer, provided an update of the 1985-86 working budget and

SYNOPSIS OF 1986-87 BLUE BOOK CHANGES

The following synopsis is designed for the benefit and convenience of athletic administrators and coaches in an effort to provide a capsule summary of the changes in the State CIF Southern Section Constitution and By-laws. These changes have been enacted by the State CIF Federated Council and/or the Southern Section Council throughout the course of the 1985-86 school term.

The changes are listed initially by topic and follow in parenthesis by the Article and/or Section rule as it appeared in the 1985-86 publication. A synopsis of the change is then noted and followed by the Article and/or Section number as it appears in the current 1986-87 publication for easy reference. For example, CIF-SS 1200.1 means CIF-SS Article 12, Rule #1200, Point 1.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR SERVICE (CIF CONSTITUTION): By-laws amended to include the phrase "consistent with the Education Code, and the deletion of unnecessary language. (ARTICLE 3, SECTION 31; ARTICLE 2, SECTION 20; AND ARTICLE 8, SECTION 80).

TERM OF SERVICE (CIF CONSTITUTION): By-laws amended changing the terms of service of officers to a two-year term; changing the office of vice-president to the office of president-elect; one vote each to the president and president-elect at Federated Council Meetings (ARTICLE 3, SECTION 30; ARTICLE 5, SECTION 53(a); ARTICLE 8, SECTION 80; AND ARTICLE 1, SECTION 103).

SCHOOL REPRESENTATION (CIF BY-LAW 200): By-law amended defining status of students in private and public CIF member schools with regard to participation in CIF activities.

CONTINUING SCHOLASTIC ELIGIBILITY (CIF-SS BY-LAW 205.31): A student must receive an incomplete and be accompanied by a passing grade of A, B, C, D, or pass in order to retain continuing eligibility. A grade of just incomplete with no letter grade is to be considered an "F" grade with regard to scholastic eligibility and the student would be ineligible throughout the entire next grading period.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE PROGRAMS (CIF BY-LAW 212(c)): Approved the American International Youth Student Exchange Program for inclusion in the approved foreign exchange programs.

LEGAL GUARDIAN (CIF-SS BY-LAW 221): By-Law amended to provide greater consistency and uniform application of the rule, in addition to strengthening the rule as to the spirit and intent. (CIF-SS BY-LAW 221, 221.1, 221.2, 221.3).

HARDSHIP FORM (CIF-SS BY-LAW 224.1): New By-law provides for a specific form to be used by member schools when requesting a hardship waiver.

STUDENT AWARDS (CIF BY-LAW 802): By-law rewritten

to increase from \$20.00 to \$25.00 the value of an award to a student athlete for CIF high school competition. (BY-LAW 802 and 803).

OFFICIALS FEES (CIF-SS BY-LAW 1218): By-law amended delineating officials fees for 1986-87 school year.

DISCUS (CIF-SS BY-LAW 1515): By-law amended to add the discus as a scoring event in the CIF-SS Divisional Prelims and Finals in Track and Field.

WRESTLING — WEIGHT CLASS (CIF BY-LAW 1702 (a)): By-law amended to establish a "maximum" two weight classes above a student's official minimum weight for competition.

WATER POLO — OUTSIDE COMPETITION (CIF-SS BY-LAW 2011): By-law amended to become consistent with other team sports - outside the season of sport during the school year, a non-school sponsored water polo team may not have on its roster more than three members of that high school's water polo team who have remaining eligibility and who participated on a school team, at any level, in the most recent season.

SOCCER — OUTSIDE COMPETITION (CIF-SS BY-LAW 2712): By-law amended to become consistent with other team sports - outside the season of sport during the school year, a non-school sponsored soccer team may not have on its roster more than five members of that school's soccer team who have remaining eligibility and who participated on a school team, at any level, in the most recent season (effective December 1, 1986).

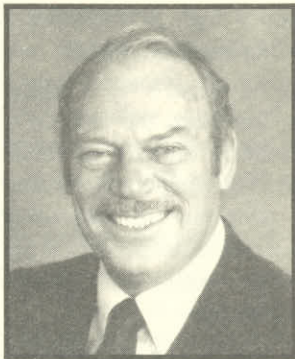
SOCCER — SPECIAL RULES (CIF-SS BY-LAW 2716): By-law amended to add special rules in the sport of soccer dealing with Red Card Rule, Yellow Card Rule and Line-Up Cards. (CIF-SS BY-LAW 2716.2, 2716.3, 2716.4).

R & R WEEK GUIDELINES (CIF-SS BY-LAW ARTICLE 14 THRU 28): All sport by-laws amended delineating specific guidelines for R & R weeks during the school year (CIF-SS CALENDAR).

8. TROY HS MAGNET PROGRAM: - Dr. Tom Jacobson reviewed with the Committee the recently adopted Magnet Program at Troy High School and its appeal for waiver of current eligibility rules and regulations. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to table the request pending further input until the August 23, 1986 meeting of the Committee.

9. NEW MEMBERSHIP: - It was moved, seconded and passed to approve membership for Ambassador Baptist High School (Fontana), effective with the 1986-87 school term. It was further moved, seconded and passed to table an application from Artesian Well Christian High School (Long Beach) to allow for further study.

10. OFFICIALS REVIEW: - Commis-

sioner Plutko reviewed with the Committee, correspondence from the Baseball, Basketball and Football Officials Associations relative to concerns with the fee structure and doubleheader contests. BLUE BOOK CHANGE

ATTENTION: ATHLETIC DIRECTORS, SOCCER AND WATER POLO COACHES

At the May 8, 1986 CIF-SS Council Meeting, the following Blue Book change was made in the sports of soccer and water polo.

Outside Individual's Season of Sport During School Year

SOCCER

Blue Book Rule 2711.1 - A member of a soccer team with remaining eligibility **AND** who participated on a school team, at any level, in the most recent season, may compete as an individual on a non-school sponsored soccer team outside his or her high school season of sport during the school year. However, the non-school sponsored soccer team may not have on its roster more than **five (5)** members of that high school's soccer team who have remaining eligibility **AND** who participated on a school team, at any level, in the most recent season.

WATER POLO

Blue Book Rule 2011.1 - A member of a water polo team, with remaining eligibility **AND** who participated on a school team, at any level, in the most recent season, may compete as an individual on a non-school sponsored water polo team outside his or her high school season of sport during the school year. However, the non-school sponsored water polo team may not have on its roster more than **three (3)** members of that high school's water polo team who have remaining eligibility **AND** who participated on a school team, at any level, in the most recent season.

The effective date for Blue Book Rules 2711.1 and 2011.1 will be December 1, 1986. Please inform all athletes and staff involved in your school's soccer and/or water polo programs.

"R & R WEEK" SPORT CALENDAR TO TAKE EFFECT IN 1986-87 SCHOOL YEAR

As voted on by the CIF Southern Section Council at its March 1985 meeting, CIF-SS member schools will experience a new scheduling innovation in the coming school year, known as "R and R Week". The label reflects a "rest and recreation week" to follow each of the fall, winter and spring seasons of sport.

The concept has been initiated to encourage student-athletes, with the exception of those involved in post-season playoffs, to leave campus for an entire week immediately following their last class of the afternoon.

The new rule will give students a chance to take care of personal and academic needs, as well as enjoy a deserved rest—both mentally and physically—from the pressures of interscholastic athletics. Coaches and administrators will also enjoy a respite during these periods, in addition to families in regards to transportation and meal preparation.

Further, it is believed the modified calendar will encourage students to take

part in more than one sport activity, enhance family life, improve the academic atmosphere and create sufficient time for counseling where needed.

During specified "R and R" weeks, no after school activity will be permitted on the high school campus or other facility, with the exception of those schools still competing in playoffs. This would be in-

terpreted as the varsity level team in that specific sport only.

The new sport calendar in no way will affect the number of contests and/or available playing dates for any season of sport.

In keeping with the spirit and intent of the new rule, schools are strongly urged to shut down facilities, with the exception of those being utilized for post-season playoff activities. Students should be asked to leave campus following the close of classes to promulgate the academic, as well as the mental and physical rest intended by the rule.

RULE 2209

R & R WEEK GUIDELINES

During the specified "R and R Week" (Rest and Recreation) periods, no after school activity is permitted on the high school campus or other facility with the exception of those schools still entered in the post-season playoffs for the just concluded season of sport. This would be interpreted as the varsity level team in that specific sport only.

This is to include all activities such as conditioning, ten-day tryout period, weightlifting, chalk talks and/or films, "open gyms" and the opening of practice for any season of sport.
