2. Mr. Van Patten stated that because Mr. Shelton, attorney for Covina High School, on October 1 had questioned whether or not we had followed strictly the letter of our constitution in suspending Covina that the meeting had been called to consider a formal protest from the South Pasadena High School, approved by the Foothill League, also one from the San Luis Obispo High School approved by the San Luis Obispo League asking that Covina High School be suspended for playing an ineligible player in football during the season of 1931.

He also reported that the Covina High School had filed suit with the Superior Court of Los Angeles County to compel the C.I.F., Southern Section, to reinstate Covina High School to good standing in our organization.

He further reported that he had retained the services of Mr. Cyril S. Tipton as legal adviser in the matter.

Mr. Tipton advised that since Covina High School had filed suit for reinstatement that action on the protests by South Pasadena and San Luis Obispo might well be postponed awaiting the outcome of said suit.

Moved by Mr. Moore, seconded by Mr. Thompson, that the protests of South Pasadena and San Luis Obispo be referred to the Executive Committee with power to act. Carried.

3. Mr. Tipton read the answer he had filed in court to the complaint filed by the Covina High School. He reviewed the complaint and the reply at length and gave it as his opinion that if the court did not dismiss the complaint that the C.I.F., Southern Section, stood an excellent chance of winning if the case came to trial.

About one hour was spent in a general discussion of the case and in a review of Covina High School's relation to the schools of the C.I.F., Southern Section.

Moved by Mr. Thompson, seconded by Mr. Cline, that all matters connected with the complaint now in court be left to the Executive Committee with full power to act. Carried.

There being no further business the President adjourned the meeting at 11:30 a.m.
