CIF-SS COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES January 22, 2009

1. OPENING BUSINESS

- A. Call to order by Sr. Cheryl Milner, President of the Council
- B. Pledge of Allegiance
- C. Roll Call
- D. Adopt Agenda – Action - It was moved, seconded and approved to adopt the agenda.
- E. Approval of Minutes
 - 1. Council – Minutes of the October 23, 2008 Meeting – Action - It was moved, seconded and approved to adopt the minutes.

2. PUBLIC HEARING SESSIONS

- A. Recognition of anyone wishing to address the Council. Speakers must limit their remarks to three minutes.

3. ACTION SESSION

- A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL - There are no State Federated Action items at this time.
- B. SOUTHERN SECTION
 - 1. Proposal to Article 240, Rule 2417 Special Rules for Soccer to be presented by John Marmelstein – Action - Language contained in the proposal was clarified with concerns regarding soft red cards being included. A motion was made,

seconded and passed for the proposal to go back to the soccer advisory committee where soft reds will be taken out of the proposal. This will be an action item for April's council.

2. Proposals from Public/Private Open Forum Committee

a. Proposal to Article 50, Rule 528: Financial Aid/Grants/ Scholarships – Action - It was moved, seconded and approved to revise the language in SS322 to read “financial aid, grants or scholarships given to students based on athletic prowess is prohibited”.

It was moved, seconded and passed to support SS322 as revised.

b. Proposal to Article 50, Rule 507: Coaching Compensation – Action - It was moved, seconded and passed to revise the language in SS324 to read, “All member schools will, upon request, submit to the Southern Section office their financial pay structure for coaches’ stipends adopted by the governing board”.

It was moved, seconded and passed to support SS324 as revised.

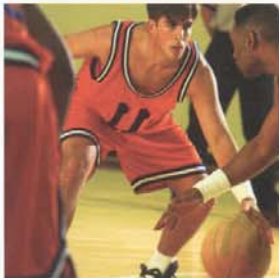

TEACH

- Let players know that their character counts, that enduring happiness depends on who you are, not on what you have or can do.
- Show that people of character know the difference between right and wrong because ethical values guide them.
- When explaining character, use the Six Pillars, personal stories, history and the news.



E

ENFORCE

- Reward good behavior and impose fair, consistent consequences that prove you are serious about character.
- Demonstrate courage and firmness of will by enforcing core values when it is difficult to do so.
- Discourage all instances of bad behavior.

ADVOCATE

- Continually encourage others to live up to the Six Pillars.
- Be an advocate for character.
- Don't be neutral about the importance of character or casual about improper conduct.
- Be clear and uncompromising that you expect young athletes to demonstrate the Six Pillars.

MODEL

- Set a good example in what you say and do.
- Honor the Six Pillars at all times.
- Be sure your actions reinforce your lessons about doing the right thing even when it is hard to do so.

MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

January 17, 2009

This meeting of the CIF Southern Section Executive Committee was called to order at 8:30 a.m. by President Sr. Cheryl Milner. All members were present with the exception of Wendy Doty. Also present were Dr. Gunn Marie Hansen, Assistant Superintendent, Compton Unified School District, the parents of student, Christopher Collins, Chino Hills High School, Mr. Cameron Smart, Vice Principal, Silver Valley High School and the principals and athletic directors of the Marmonte League.

1. OPENING BUSINESS

E. Adopt Agenda – It was moved, seconded and approved with the following adjustments: it was moved to move item 5A and 5C to follow item 2, seconded and approved. It was moved to have Silver Valley's request for Area Placement added to the agenda. Jim stated in order to approve this request as emergency action to add it to the agenda, it must be approved by ¾ vote. It was seconded and approved. This item was added after item 5D and also follow item 2.

F. Approval of Minutes – It was moved and seconded to approved the minutes of the November 5, 2008 Executive Committee meeting. The motion was approved.

2. PUBLIC HEARING SESSION

Present to talk to the Executive Committee were Mr. and Mrs. Ted Collins. Mr. Collins discussed the Hardship Appeal submitted to the Southern Section. This appeal had been denied by the Southern Section and the parents submitted a request for an appeal. On October 22, 2008, a State Appeal Hearing was heard and denied. Currently their son, Christopher, a student at Chino Hills High School, has restricted eligibility in the sport of basketball. Mr. Collins addressed his feelings about the treatment he received by the Section and State personnel, the Executive Committee and the Hearing Panel.

5. NEW BUSINESS

E. Silver Valley High School Emergency Request for Area Placement – Cameron Smart, Assistant Principal, spoke for the school and Larry Satterfield addressed the dynamics of the Desert Area. Larry stated there are three leagues in the area based on school size and geography and they rarely change. Silver Valley's former principal asked to move to the Agape League and CIF thought they wanted to move to the Small School Area. Silver Valley's athletic department knew nothing about this change. The Releaguings Committee approved this request to move to the small schools area but the school would not have been accepted into the Agape League because of their dynamics.

Jim Staunton stated the staff understands the Desert Area is very different from the others. There is not much room to maneuver and if they stay in the Desert Area it will not have any effect on the other members of the league. Jim spoke with the Mark Edgemon who is the Small Schools Area Releaguings Chair and he had no problem with Silver Valley returning to the Desert Area.

Mr. Smart stated their enrollment fluctuates because 70% of their athletes are from military families. It was the distance of the small school area that would have been difficult because

Silver Valley is north of Barstow in Yermo. His school had never relegated before and would like to go back to the Desert Area.

It was moved to place Silver Valley High School back into the Desert Area. The motion was seconded and approved. After the vote, it was suggested the office better communicate the process of Area Placement and Releaguings to the schools.

A. Appeal on Area Placement from Marmonte League – Each principal and athletic director of the league introduced him or herself. Binders were distributed to enforce the league's petition. Kirk Miyashiro, Principal of Moorpark High School, addressed the committee on behalf of the league. He addressed their concerns of geography, enrollment and competitive equity and based on this data, the league feels the Foothill Area will be a better fit. Also, they stated they intend to stay intact as a league.

Earl Haugen stated he surveyed all of the schools in the Foothill Area. The area stretches from Long Beach to the Antelope Valley. The schools in the south were more opinionated than those in the northern part. He also stated we need to look at the area and possibly change it. It is difficult for all schools to attend area meetings. The principals did not want change and felt it would cause too many disruptions and there was the concern of the geography. Many schools do not want to cross through the Los Angeles area.

Jim Monico stated they must vote according to the guidelines in the Blue Book; whether the process has been implemented properly. Susie Arce and Larry Satterfield stated proper procedure was followed in voting down the request for the Marmonte League to move to a new area. The Foothill League and the Northern Area were polled. The vote was two votes in favor of the Marmonte League moving and six did not agree.

It was moved to deny the appeal of the Marmonte League and seconded. The vote was 15 ayes, 1 nay and 2 abstained. The motion was approved to deny the appeal.

C. Compton Unified School District – Jim Staunton addressed the issues he has had with Compton Unified School District. Last September, Dominguez High School was sanctioned because of their lack of dues payment and administrative duties. Dr. Hansen, Assistant Superintendent of Compton Unified School District, has been tasked with the athletic responsibilities of the district. In working with her, Dr. Staunton has tried to impart the importance of paperwork issues and dealing with schools and CIF. Things were happening but the Compton Unified School District attorney's letter has put a stop to the progress. Everyday CIF staff communicates with schools via telephone. The district attorney stated in his letter that CIF Southern Section staff can only deal with Dr. Hansen. We should not stop communications, we should facilitate it. Some of Compton's schools do not have an athletic director. If we cannot make progress, then consideration must be taken for sanctions. He suggested they continue as member schools but move to probationary status if progress is not made. Dr. Hansen does respond to every call and email. Their district needs people who know our rules

and the process of certifying residential eligibility has to be managed. The school police are not athletic directors.

Dr. Hansen stated her district is focusing on improving their knowledge of the rules of CIF. They have systems and structures in place but the situation is very difficult. There is no athletic director at Dominguez High School. The principal and assistant principal are trying to do the best job they can. The former basketball coach is on administrative leave. The district simply needs time. The superintendent has informed the athletic directors if there is no change in athletics, they will be required to re-apply for their jobs. On a positive note, some of the progress is that all Fall and Winter coaches were certified and they are starting with the Spring coaches. They have hired an outside consultant, Paul Castillo, former CIF Assistant Commissioner, who knows CIF rules. The district is conducting an investigation on Dominguez and the superintendent will accept what is found. The results of that investigation will be shared with CIF and will continue with Centennial and Compton. Paul will work 6 – 8 hours per week to put structure in place. They are starting from the beginning and they are taking it very seriously; they do not want the students to be hurt. She stated all new students enrolling in the district have to go through a new school orientation for proper placement and their athletic directors must accompany school police to homes to check for residency. The letter from the attorney was very strong. It was taken negatively but the superintendent needs time to show progress. They have systemic academic concerns and it may take up to two years.

In response to Reggie Thompkins asking for more detailed information from Compton, Dr. Hansen stated Compton Unified School District has had issues with adults. This is the new administration's first year and changes cannot be made in two months. By next year they will have a plan in place. However, they do not want what happens this year to impact their students. They will clean up their issues with paperwork by next year. They are working on student services and revising academic policies. They will show proof of their changes, they just ask for a little more time to do so. The Executive Committee hopes the district will support the recommendations of Paul Castillo.

3. ACTION ITEMS

A. State Federated Council Action Items

1. State Basketball Advisory Committee Proposals

a. Expand from 8-Team to 16-Team Brackets – It was moved to support this proposal. After discussion, it was unanimously voted to support.

b. Add an Open Division – This item is being pulled from the Federated Council agenda.

2. Penalties: Failure to Comply with Article 22.B – It was moved to support this proposal with revisions and seconded. After discussion, it was voted to support with 2 nays and 1 abstention.

B. Southern Section Action Items

1. Proposal from Sea View League to Article 220, Bylaw 2206.3 – Tournaments – It was moved and seconded to support this

proposal. After discussion, it was voted to support.

4. NON-ACTION ITEMS

B. Southern Section Non-Action Items

1. Nominees to the Southern Section Executive Committee, 2009-2010 – The position of Coast Area Representative, which Carter Paysinger was appointed to in 2008, is the only position on the ballot for this year. Carter Paysinger will be on the ballot and nominations will be taken from the floor.

2. Proposal from Boys Volleyball Advisory Committee on Article 2907, Tournaments – After discussion it was moved and seconded to support. It was voted to support.

3. Proposal from Mission League on Sports Camps – It was moved and seconded to take no position on this proposal. It was voted to take no position on this proposal with 1 nay.

4. Southern Section Proposed Budget, 2009-2010 – It was moved to support the budget as proposed for 2009-2010 and seconded. It was voted to support the budget.

After further discussion, it was moved and seconded to change membership dues from a per pupil and sport fee charge to a straight sport fee. It was voted to support this proposal with 1 nay.

5. NEW BUSINESS (Items A, C and E discussed prior to Action Items.)

B. Report on Governance – Gary Smidderks reported he is chairing a State Governance committee on how the state is structured versus purpose of providing athletic opportunities to students. This committee has two representatives from each Section. The representatives from the Southern Section will be Sue Kuwabara and Ray Johnson, Principal, Banning High School.

D. Modification of Transfer Eligibility Form to include Bona Fide Change of Address – There has been discussion at the State level to make this a statewide form. Kristine will make a draft form.

6. REPORT SESSION

A. President's Report – Sr. Cheryl attended the Northeast Football Final and enjoyed it very much.

B. Treasurer's Report – Jim Monico stated the 2007-2008 Audit was approved. Membership for this year is 97% paid. T-shirt sales are down \$5,000, water polo was up \$8,000 and football is up \$20,000 with 20 outstanding games. \$535,000 has gone back to schools on playoff splits.

C. Commissioner's Report – Jim Staunton complemented the staff for an outstanding job during the fall season and playoffs. He stated the Southern Section website will be changing in a few weeks to make it more user friendly. He also stated the number appeal hearings this year has increased over last year.

D. Member Reports –

Ray Moore – He encouraged the office to re-define the basketball playoff issue and define what is the playoffs. Commented on the \$25 added sport fee and stated this is not a good time for it.

Larry Satterfield – Thanked Dr. Staunton for his help with the Desert Area Relegating. He

attended the Western Division Football Final and enjoyed it.

Scott Raftery – Stated he received a thank you card from a student whose hardship was approved and was very appreciative. He also had an \$11,000 gate from a volleyball game held at Santa Barbara.

Thom Simmons – He has been working with Dr. Staunton and Dr. Dahlem on a new format for the Hall of Fame Dinner. They want to do this to thank people for the work they have done for CIF. They will have the old Hall of Famers present the awards to the new Hall of Famers.

Rob Wigod – Thanked the committee for their support and help, especially during football games. The schools appreciated the presence of the Executive Committee members at their games.

Reggie Thompkins – Appealed to the staff to change anything that may be negative in their interactions.

Barrett Luketic – Thanked Dr. Staunton for his dealings and sensitivity with the Compton district. Village Christian has a new athletic director and he appreciates the promptness of returned calls to his school.

Steve Miller – The CAA have met in regards to relegating and it is going well.

Jerry Halpin – Stated his school was closed for five days because of fires. The Orange County Area is gearing up for relegating on February 4th.

Sue Kuwabara – Supported Dr. Staunton in his interactions with parents.

Guy Roubian – Stated there may be another new school in his area applying for membership. Edgewood High School will be opening in the West Covina Unified School District.

Susie Arce – She is trying to get Title IX in the individual schools. The OCR representative stated they are trying to expand programs rather than reduce them. She also suggested a parent ombudsman to assist parents before hearings.

Bill Dabbs – Complemented Dr. Staunton in his interactions with parents. He also enjoyed going to Oaks Christian High School for the Football finals.

Earl Haugen – Stated he enjoyed all of the football playoff games. From the State level, Championship New Events is still trying to get a calendar. There is a new issue from Sports Medicine involving practice times for all sports. The NCAA has instituted this and it will work its way down to the high school level. It will give timelines for practice every day. He also commended staff for their work.

Carter Paysinger – Commended Jim on his professionalism and work with parents.

There being no further items for discussion, the meeting adjourned at 3:04 p.m.

c. Proposal to Article 3, Rule 32.6: Criteria for Addressing Cases of Competitive Equity – Action - Questions arose regarding CIF Championships and if those were considered in the definition of an anomaly. The criteria from the north (which is where this concept originated with the De La Salle football team) did not include CIF Championships, only league championships. After discussion it was determined that the respective leagues would determine whether a school is a competitive anomaly. If a team is declared a competitive anomaly, there is no provision for escaping that designation. The North's language was read and there was a consensus that there are multiple issues to address within this proposal.

It was moved, seconded and approved to not support SS326.

2. Proposal to Article 30, Rule 30.1: Southern Section Council – Limit Scope of Sport Committee to be presented by Jim Staunton – Action - It was moved, seconded and approved to support SS327

3. Proposal from Sea View League to Article 220, Bylaw 2206.3 – Tournaments to be presented by Vince Brown – Action - It was moved, seconded and approved to support SS327.

4. NON-ACTION SESSION

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL

1. State Basketball Advisory Committee Proposals

a. Expand from 8-Team to 16-Team Brackets – Discuss - Discussion included concern for the financial impact this would have on a school in the current fiscal climate. In addition the potential for lengthy travel could mean more time out of school.

b. Add an Open Division – Discuss - This item was pulled from the agenda as the current language is being reworked.

2. Penalties: Failure to Comply with Article 22.B – Discuss - Concerns were raised regarding the penalties for non-compliance with Article 22.b. The State Executive Committee shares in those sentiments. There is a legislative mandate to get all high school coaches certified.

B. SOUTHERN SECTION

1. Nominees to the Southern Section Executive Committee, 2009-2010 – Discuss - Sr. Cheryl Milner - The opportunity to nominate another Coast Area Representative was given. No nominations were given. Carter Paysinger will be on the ballot unopposed.

2. Proposal from Boys Volleyball Advisory Committee on Article 2907, Tournaments to be presented by Brian Boone - Discuss

3. Proposal from Mission League on Sports Camps to be presented by Terry Elledge - Discuss

4. Southern Section Proposed Budget, 2009-2010 – Discuss - All schools offering a sport (regardless of the number of participants, freelance included) would be subject to the sport fee (per sport).

5. REPORT SESSION

A. President's Report - Sr. Cheryl Milner - Area placement has been an ongoing concern for various regions. Releaguings has been a large task for everyone.

B. Commissioner's Report - Jim Staunton - The Mission League's proposal was mentioned with encouragement to seek resolve to those issues that seem important within the section. Leagues are invited to contact the office for suggestions to help evolve language in the Blue Book to fit the current needs of member schools. The Josephson Institute will be giving a one day clinic addressing issues within the sport of soccer.

C. Treasurer's Report - Jim Monico - There are still outstanding dues to be collected. Individual fall sport reports were given. Over \$576,000 has been given back to schools in revenue share this fall (volleyball and football).

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:20 a.m.

Officiating**

Rating/Ranking of officials equal to level of game play

Many Officials groups use rating/evaluation of contests as well as evaluating individual officials. The goal of such evaluation is to match the level of play with the level of officiating.

Technology has played a part in this, as web based assignment programs have the capability to rank by assessed ability the level of play an official can be assigned to. This is far from a perfect system and incorporates processes such as evaluations and standards developed by the local officials group.

In an ideal world, when a high level of play matched with a high level of officiating ability, contests will be better for all-spectators, players, coaches and officials.

Key items in evaluating officials have traditionally included the following:

- Experience
- Appearance
- Test Score/Attendance
- Communication skills

Key items in the assignment of officials have traditionally been:

- Availability
- Ability
- Rating Level

Merging the evaluation and assigning functions is a constant challenge to all officials groups.

The input of schools through coaches and administration is a key component of all officials programs. Often only negative issues are noted. Of greater benefit is recognizing positive actions of officials and communicating those good works back to the Units and Section. This would reinforce positive behavior and give recognition to those who make our games better.

WINNERS OF THE 2008-09 CIF SOUTHERN SECTION ACADEMIC AWARDS

The winners of the annual CIF Southern Section-Toyota Academic Awards program were announced at CIF-SS headquarters today.

The team awards, based on a cumulative grade point average, are awarded in 22 sports.

To be considered, teams must have a minimum 3.0 GPA average (4.0 scale) in college-prep courses in the first semester of the 2008-09 school year. The highest team GPA in each sport determines the winner. Schools are divided into two enrollment categories, 1500 and above and 1499 and below. The team with

the highest GPA in each enrollment category for each sport receives the award. The first place teams receive a banner to commemorate their achievement. All teams who participate receive Academic Award certificates for their student athletes.

Each CIF-SS member school is entitled to name a male and a female "Student-Athlete-of-the-Year" as well. Recipients of the individual awards must be seniors that have maintained a minimum of a 3.5 GPA (4.0 scale) in college-prep courses over the past three years, in addition to earning a letter in at least one

This was the fifth year the tournament was held at Bakersfield's Rabobank Arena after being held at The Spanos Center on the campus of the University of the Pacific since 1988 (15 years).
