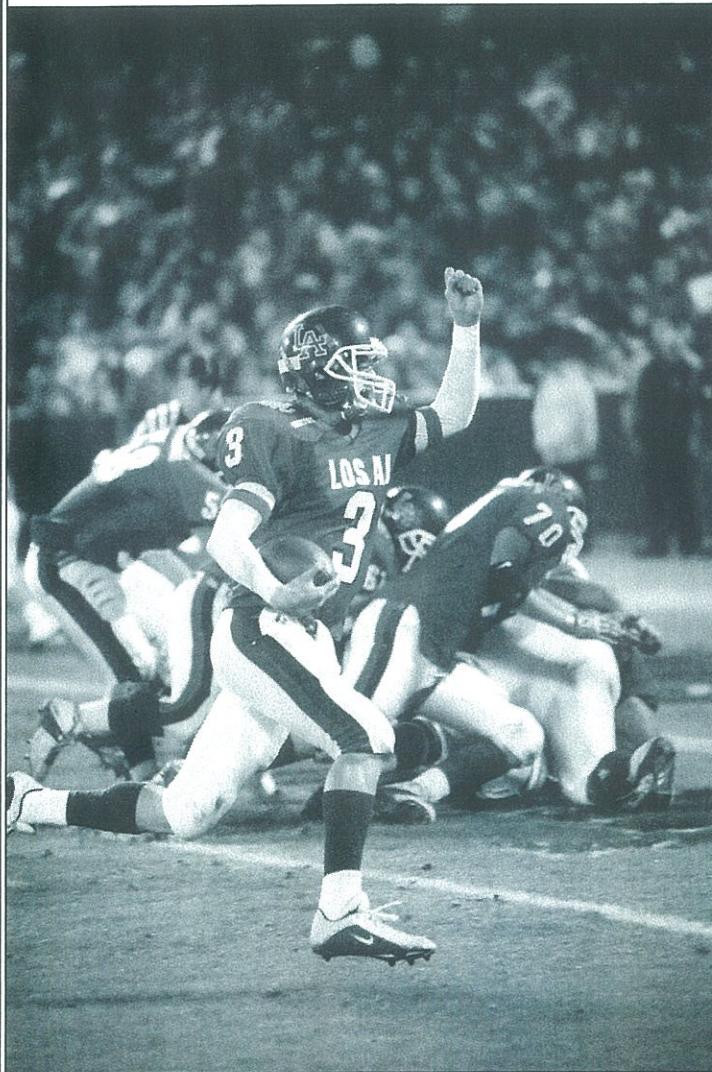

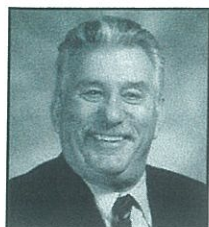

On behalf of the Executive Committee, I would like to congratulate the CIF-SS fall sport champions for a job well done. I would also like to thank Karen Hellyer, Rob Wigod and Paul Castillo for their outstanding efforts in making our fall playoffs very successful and extremely well run. It was exciting to have had the opportunity to attend these championship events and truly see Victory With Honor in action.

As we are well into the winter sports season, we are all aware that the financial outlook for our school districts is very bleak. It certainly appears that many of our schools are going to have to "cinch up our belts" and continue to operate their athletic program with less funding. Administrators and Coaches have been very successful in the past in looking at innovative ways to maintain their athletic programs at a very high level. I would suggest that if cuts become necessary, that you work collaboratively with your league schools to maximize available dollars.

The CIF-SS is faced with many strategic hurdles over the next five to ten years. While our organization is fiscally strong and our governance and operational policies, we continue to struggle in our role with the CIF State organization. The CIF-SS complexities, diverse geographics, size of our section, and several unique SS governance issues continue to be constant sources of conflict. One of these sources is the "Elimination of the Association Rule" (Blue Book Rule #311 pg. 84) which is an action item for the SS-Council meeting on March 13th. I am not taking a position on this issue; however, I would like to remind principals and athletic administrators that if we continue with this rule, the State CIF has made it very "perfectly clear" that all legal costs will be the responsibility of the Southern Section. As your leagues discuss the association rule please include in your discussion the potential significant litigation costs that could be associated with the retention of

CIF-SS COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES October 17, 2002

The October meeting of the CIF-S Council was called to order by Paul Breit, President, at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, October 17, 2002, at The Grand in Long Beach. All leagues were present with the exception of Harbor, High Desert, Omega, Westside, At-Large Dr. Mendoza and At-Large Barbara Willibrand.

1. ADOPT AGENDA – It was moved, seconded and passed to adopt agenda as revised.

2. MINUTES – It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the minutes of the CIF-SS Council meeting of April 25, 2002. Additionally, minutes of the CIF-SS Executive Committee meeting of June 5, 2002 and September 25, 2002, were submitted as informational items.

3. SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS – Paul Breit, President, introduced Hall of Fame recipient Lou Panizzon, Carpinteria High School

4. MONTVIEW PROPOSAL – Tim Godley, Athletic Director, Duarte High School, reviewed a proposal to modify CIF Rule 311 "Association Rule". Following discussion, a motion to approve the proposal was defeated.

5. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE PROPOSAL – Jim Staunton, Commissioner, reviewed a proposal to change By-Laws 1110.1 and 1110.3 – Southern Section Appeals Procedure. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve the proposal.

6. GOLF COMMITTEE PROPOSAL – Jim Staunton, Commissioner, and Dennis McReynolds, Golf Committee member, presented a proposal to revise Rule 2007 "Maximum Team Contest". This will be

an action item at the January 23, 2003, meeting of the Council.

7. FOOTBALL ADVISORY COMMITTEE PROPOSAL – Rob Wigod, Assistant Commissioner, presented a proposal to modify the 1996 Council action which would allow schools to schedule zero week football games without a week one bye date. This will be an action item at the January 23, 2003, meeting of the Council.

8. PRESIDENT'S REPORT – Paul Breit, President of the Council, reviewed Council action on open enrollment, hearing officers and the shortage of sport officials.

9. COMMISSIONER'S REPORT – Jim Staunton, Commissioner, reviewed the CIF-SS Office move to new building, noisemakers and fees for hardship appeals.

10. TREASURER'S REPORT – Susana Arce, Treasurer, reported on the completed 2001-2002 audit and announced membership dues requests have been sent out to all schools.

There being no further business to come before the Council, the meeting was adjourned at 10:46 a.m.

SOUTHERN SECTION MARKETING UPDATE

SPONSORSHIPS SAVE
SCHOOLS MONEY (X3)

The support of sponsors, our "business partners", has long been critical source of revenue to operate the high school sports programs of the Southern Section. More than ever before given our state's current financial crisis, the income from sponsorships allows the Southern Section to continue operating the finest championships possible.

We sometimes hear from coaches and athletic directors, "but we don't get any of this sponsorship money so why should we care?" The answer is a simple but often overlooked one: If we didn't have sponsorships, you'd have to make up the difference.

Sponsorships currently generate over \$430,000 per year in Southern Section operating support. That figure represents 20% of the operating revenue of the Southern Section. That is almost **3-times** the amount generated from school dues. Amongst our sponsorships, the four ball contracts (Spalding, Rawlings, Baden and Wilson Racquet) generate **as much annual revenue as** all the school dues generated annually.

It has long been our goal to tastefully gather support from business partners that produce quality product and provide a positive image for the Southern Section.

We greatly appreciate the support of our schools by positively corresponding and patronizing our business partners. Likewise, your assistance displaying banners, reading the required public address announcements and including our sponsor sheet in your game programs are valuable assets that enable us to maintain this area of support.

It is through your support of all these relationships that we are able to offer the finest athletic administrative and championship support possible without having to impact our schools during this difficult financial period.

Next time you or someone you are speaking with questions the importance of a sponsorship or all the sponsorship support required when hosting a playoff game, remind them what the cost to them would be if we didn't have our business partners. Then remind the x2 and then x3.

Like we say to our business partners, thanks for supporting tomorrow's stars today.

Tough
Times
Ahead

I often hear school administrators say, "I wouldn't want your job!" Sometimes I would agree. Now, however, I feel a great deal of sympathy for our principals and athletic directors who must make very difficult decisions this next year. School districts face the most significant budget cuts in recent memory. They are deep and they will last for several years. How tough to have to take away programs and money that have been in place for years.

There has been talk about school districts cutting athletic programs. In its purest sense, the high school experience is about academic achievement. But we all know that it is about so much more than that. School administrators agree that successful athletic programs breed successful schools. September is a critical month for any campus. Why? Because a positive start with some athletic success sets the tone for the rest of the year.

Athletes provide the power and drive to keep schools going from year to year. In his remarks to the Citrus Belt Athletic Directors Association, upon his retirement long time Athletic Director Roger Rupert, told his listeners, "We're here for the kids, and with no disrespect to our hard working academic teachers. We must work to keep our athletic programs intact." In four years as Commissioner, I fought with Roger about a number of things. But on this one I agree.

What can we do? Of course our office is ready to supply data to districts to help decision makers understand the benefits of athletic programs. Statewide, the CIF office is working to help legislators see the benefits of athletics.

On March 12, the Section will sponsor a daylong seminar on coaching education and sportsmanship programs. Our goal is to bring the best practices in the Section to athletic administrators responsible for training and support of coaches and students. We hope this day will be one in which

MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING August 17, 2002

The August meeting of the CIF Southern Section Executive Committee was called to order at 8:30 a.m. by President Paul Breit at the Marriott Laguna Cliffs Resort in Dana Point. All members were present, with the exception of Susana Arce and Jeannine Martineau.

1. ADOPT AGENDA – It was moved, seconded and passed to adopt the revised agenda.

2. MINUTES – It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the minutes of the CIF-SS Executive Committee meeting of June 5, 2002.

-PRESENTATION ON HEARING PROCEDURES-
Bill McLaughlin, Assistant Commissioner in the San Diego Section of the C.I.F., conducted a workshop on Due Process and Hearing Procedures for the Executive Committee.

3. ACTION SESSION –

A. CERTIFICATION OF NEW ELIGIBILITY HEARING OFFICERS – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve the list of hearing officers for eligibility appeals submitted by Commissioner Jim Staunton, provided they complete a training session at the C.I.F. Office.

B. SELECTION OF SUPERINTENDENT REPRESENTATIVE TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE – After accepting the letter of resignation from the Executive Committee by Dr. James Harris, Superintendent of the Inglewood Unified School District, and after discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve the appointment of Sue Rainey, Superintendent of the Riverside Unified School District, as Superintendent Representative to the Executive Committee.

C. NEW MEMBER SCHOOLS – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve the memberships of Calvary Chapel, Anaheim High School and Temecula Preparatory High School for the 2002-2003 school year, on the condition they attend and complete an orientation meeting in the C.I.F. Office.

D. NINETEEN YEAR OLD RULE (201) CRITERIA – Commissioner Jim Staunton led a discussion on the possibility of adopting criteria regarding the eligibility of nineteen year-olds. The discussion concluded with no action taken.

E. SUCCESSION TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE; APPOINTMENT TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE – Commissioner Jim Staunton led a discussion, and presented language for the Executive Committee Handbook, regarding the replacement of Executive Committee members who leave before their terms expire.

F. ADOPTION OF "AMERICAN CHARACTER WEEK" – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to support American Character Week, September 6-17, 2002, sponsored by the Leadership Council of the Character Counts Organization.

4. NON-ACTION SESSION –

A. REPORTS AND DISCUSSION FROM STAFF
– 1) Commissioner Jim Staunton presented information on the large number of schools that requested Summer Dead Period adjustments this year.

2) Assistant Commissioner Karen Hellyer reported on the Soccer Summit held at the C.I.F. Office on June 20, 2002 and presented the minutes from that meeting, along with the information on an upcoming meeting to be held with school administrators on August 20, 2002.

3) Commissioner Jim Staunton led a discussion on possible opportunities and ideas for future championship events.

5. CLOSED SESSION –

The Executive Committee went into closed session at 2:18 p.m. to discuss personnel issues. At 3:05 p.m. the closed session ended with the following actions taken:

1) The Commissioner's Salary Proposal was received.

2) The Administrative Committee of the Executive Committee will examine the Commissioner's

Salary Proposal and report back to the Executive Committee at the September 25, 2002 meeting.

3) The Administrative Committee of the Executive Committee will examine the health and benefit packages for the Assistant Commissioners and the CIF Office Staff.

4) The Executive Committee wished to commend the outstanding job done by the Commissioner, the Assistant Commissioners and the entire CIF Southern Section Staff.

6. REPORT SESSION –

A. President's Report – Paul Breit reported on his attendance at the National Federation Summer Meeting, urged the members of the Executive Committee to participate in the awards presentations at football championships this year, asked for any updated information to be included on the Executive Committee contact list, requested that Executive Committee members sign up to serve on appeals panels for eligibility hearings in 2002-2003 and reported that a visitation to the new C.I.F. Southern Section Office will be scheduled in conjunction with the September 25, 2002 meeting.

B. Treasurer's Report – Jim Staunton reported that some spring sports did very well and that the 2001- 2002 year ended with a budget surplus, which will be adjusted after the yearly audit is completed.

C. Commissioner's Report – Commissioner Jim Staunton presented new logo ideas for CIF Southern Section letterhead, gave an update on the new office building, reported on his attendance at the National Federation Summer Meeting and presented information on sports participation by disabled athletes.

D. Assistant Commissioner Reports – Karen Hellyer reported on her goal of improving sites for the soccer championships this year, Paul Castillo reported on his efforts to control expenses at the track and field championships in 2003 and Rob Wigod reported on the increased number of football games being scheduled for Edison Field this season and the upcoming Athletic Administrator/Athletic Director Orientation on September 24, 2002 at The Grand in Long Beach.

E. Executive Committee Member Reports –
1. Northern Area Representative – Donn Clickard asked about the possibility of student pre-sale and student tickets at the game site being sold at the same price for C.I.F. playoff events and requested information from other Area Representatives in an effort to compile a job description for those positions on the Executive Committee.

2. At-Large Representative – Dr. Liza Scruggs reported on the No Child Left Behind legislation and its effect on all public schools in California, not just the ones that receive Title I funds.

3. Past President – Clark Stephens reported on his new job consulting with Christian school administrators, his attendance at the National Federation Summer Meeting and his completion of the training to become a certified volleyball official in the Orange County Volleyball Officials Association.

4. President-Elect – Dr. John Dahlem reported on his visit to the new C.I.F. State Office in Oakland and a meeting he attended there regarding participation in the State Wrestling Championships.

There being no further business to come before the Executive Committee, the meeting was adjourned at 4:22 p.m.

STATE CIF OFFERS WINTER SCHOLASTIC AWARDS

Once again the CIF State is offering winter scholastic awards programs for deserving student-athletes and teams.

The Scholastic State Champions program honors varsity teams demonstrating the highest collective grade point averages (non-weighted/4.0 scale) in their respective sport. A first, second, and third place award will be presented. The team with the highest collective GPA will be declared the Scholastic State Champion for that sport and will receive a pennant suitable for display at their school. The first, second and third place team winners will receive certificates and will be featured in the *CIF News*.

The program applies to state sponsored championships only, which includes girl's/boy's cross-country, girl's volleyball, wrestling, girl's/boy's basketball, and girl's/boy's track and field.

Competition in these sports is all that is required to qualify, not advancement to the state championships. For example, a team that might have a non-winning record could be a scholastic state champion as long as they compete in the sports listed above. For the winter, this program applies to wrestling and girl's/boy's basketball.

Individual student-athletes maintaining a minimum 3.5 GPA (non-weighted/4.0 scale) during their varsity season of sport competition will be honored as Scholastic ALL-CIF award winners. Winners will receive certificates. This portion of the program includes all sports. Like the team competition, athletes need not advance to the state championships to qualify.

The State CIF is also offering their 2003 CIF Scholar-Athlete of the Year program, as well. This program will award two \$2,000.00 scholarships to a deserving female and male student athlete.

Qualifications for this award are that potential honorees be college-bound high school seniors whose academic and athletic careers have been truly exemplary and whose personal standards (i.e., integrity, honesty, etc.) and accomplishments are a positive model for others.

These students must possess no less than an unweighted cumulative (grades 9-12) grade point average of 3.70. They must have demonstrated superior athletic ability in at least two years of varsity play within California (must be participating in athletics as a senior. And they must have portrayed themselves as athletes of character displaying trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and citizenship.

Any and all qualified teams and athletes may inquire about these programs directly through the State CIF Office by calling, (510) 639-4445. Applications must be received no later than March 24, 2003.

At the conclusion of the hearing, the Executive Committee voted to uphold the decision of the Commissioner ruling Kyle Weatherspoon ineligible at Lynwood High School for the 2002-2003 school year.

B. **TRONA HIGH SCHOOL** – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to place Trona High School on probation for one year for violating football contracts during the 2002 season, with a recommendation that Trona High School consider 8-Man football in the future.

C. **BORON HIGH SCHOOL** – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to place Boron High School on probation for one year for violating football contracts during the 2002 season.

D. **GOLF COMMITTEE PROPOSAL** – Commissioner Jim Staunton presented a proposal from the Golf Advisory Committee regarding maximum team contests and the end of competition. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to send the proposal back to the Golf Advisory

Committee for clarification.

E. **MONTVIEW LEAGUE PROPOSAL** – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to not recommend support for the Montview League proposal to modify the Association Rule.

F. **PROPOSAL FOR ADMINISTRATIVE FEE FOR HARDSHIP APPEALS** – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to recommend support of the Commissioner's proposal to charge an administrative fee for hardship appeal hearings.

4. **NON-ACTION SESSION** –

A. **ALMONT LEAGUE PROPOSAL** – Commissioner Jim Staunton led a discussion on the upcoming proposal by the Almont League to eliminate the Association Rule.

5. **CLOSED SESSION** –

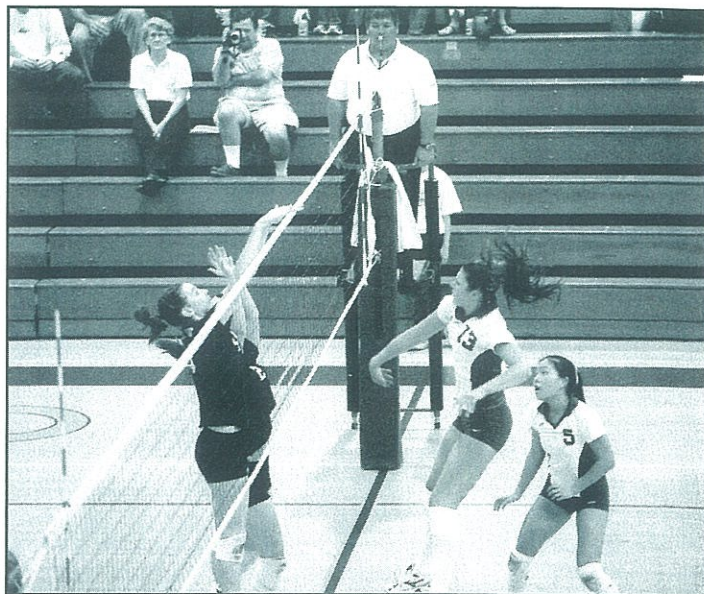

COACH PETE CARROLL HOSTS THE 2002 FOOTBALL PRESS CONFERENCE

University of Southern California Head Football Coach Pete Carroll served as the keynote speaker at the 27th Annual CIF Southern Section-Toyota Football Championship Press Conference and Luncheon held December 9th at The Grand in Long Beach.

Carroll, in his second year at the helm of the Trojans was named USC's head football coach on Dec. 15, 2000 (he signed a 5-year contract). The 50-year-old Carroll has 27 years of NFL and college experience, with 11 of that on the collegiate level. He was 6-6 in his first season at USC. In 2002, Carroll led the Trojans to a first-place tie in the Pac-10 Conference and a 38-17 victory over (then) No. 3 Iowa in the Orange Bowl. USC finished No. 4 in both the AP and the ESPN/USA Today final football polls.

Coach Carroll talked to the Divisional Finalists represented at the luncheon about the importance of their accomplishments in just making the finals. He also told the coaches and players that their winning attitudes should carry over into their schoolwork and their citizenship.

Carroll was the head coach of the NFL's New England Patriots for 3 seasons (1997-99) and New York Jets for 1 year (1994). He guided the Patriots into the playoffs in his first 2 seasons, winning the AFC Eastern Division title at 10-6 in 1997 and advancing to the second round of the playoffs, then posting a 9-7 regular season mark in 1998. His overall record in New England was 27-21 in the regular season (including 8-8 in 1999) and 1-2 in the playoffs. He owns the franchise's second-best winning percentage (54.9%). After serving as the Jets' defensive coordinator for 4 seasons (1990-93), he became the team's head coach the following season. His 1994 Jets went 6-10. Only 3 other Jets head coaches won more games in their rookie campaign.

He spent the next 2 years (1995-96) as the defensive coordinator with the San Francisco 49ers, who won the NFC Western Division title both seasons. The 49ers

were 11-5 in the 1995 regular season when they had the NFL's top-ranked defense and then went 12-4 in 1996.

Carroll began his coaching career at the college level, serving as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Pacific, for 3 years (1974-76), working with the wide receivers and secondary. He then spent a season each as an assistant in charge of the secondary at Arkansas (1977) under Lou Holtz as the Razorbacks won the 1978 Orange Bowl, at Iowa State (1978) under Earle Bruce (the Cyclones played in the 1978 Hall of Fame Bowl) and at Ohio State (1979) under Bruce. That Buckeye squad lost to USC in the 1980 Rose Bowl. He next spent 3 seasons (1980-82) as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at North Carolina State, then returned to Pacific in 1983 as the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. He entered the NFL in 1984 as the defensive backs coach of the Buffalo Bills, then held a similar position with the Minnesota Vikings for 5 seasons (1985-89). The Vikings advanced to the playoffs his last 3 years there, getting to the NFC Championship game in 1987. The 1988 team was 11-5 in the regular season and the 1989 squad won the NFC Central Division crown with a 10-6 mark. His secondary averaged 25 interceptions a season and led the NFL in passing defense in 1989. Carroll spent the 2000 season as a consultant for pro and college teams, doing charitable work for the NFL and writing a column about pro football for CNN.com. Carroll was a 2-time (1971-72) All-Pacific Coast Conference free safety at Pacific and earned his bachelor's degree in 1973 in business administration. He received his secondary teaching credential and a master's degree in physical education from Pacific in 1976. He was a 3-sport (football, basketball and baseball) standout at Redwood High in Larkspur, Calif., earning the school's Athlete of the Year award as a senior. He played quarterback, wide receiver and defensive back. He then played football at Marin Junior College in Kentfield, Calif., in 1970. He was born on Sept. 15, 1951 in San Francisco.

It seems that most all agree that one of the main areas in the sometimes disintegrating world of sportsmanship is parental behavior at sporting events.

One piece of literature that I find most compelling appears as an open letter from an athlete to his/her parents. It speaks volumes about the way things are and the way things should be. With thanks from the Michigan High School Athletic Association, here is an open letter to "My Parents" ...

Dear Mom and Dad,

Thank you for spending so much of your time, love and money in your efforts to make a caring, responsible adult out of me. I really appreciate that. You have taught me so many things - love, responsibility, kindness, respect for other's opinions, beliefs, property and feelings. You have taught me the value of good manners. And all through this you have been excellent role models - almost.

Why don't the rules seem to apply when you come to watch me play sports? The same people who taught me all of these wonderful things yell at the team for making mistakes, and worse yet, yell out the names or the numbers of the people who made them. They scream at the refs, pound on the bench, shriek at the coach, and crush me with remarks like, "Get your head in the game!"

My head is in the game folks. I want to win more than you want me to. I want you to be proud of me and I want to be proud of you. Why can't you encourage me with remarks like, "That's okay! Good try! You'll get 'em next time!"

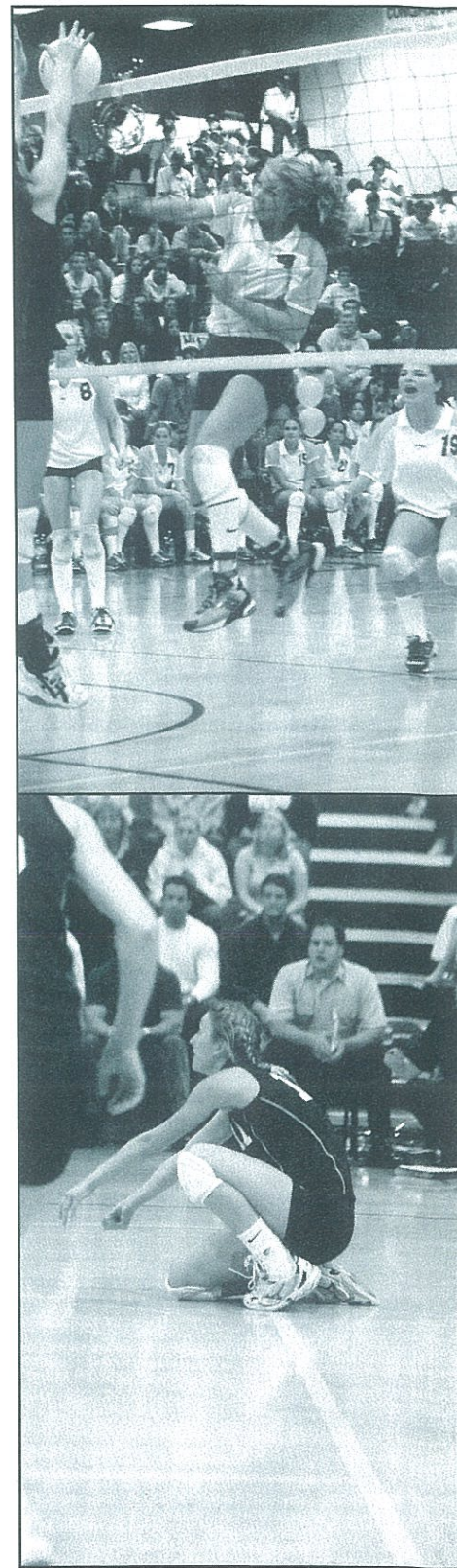

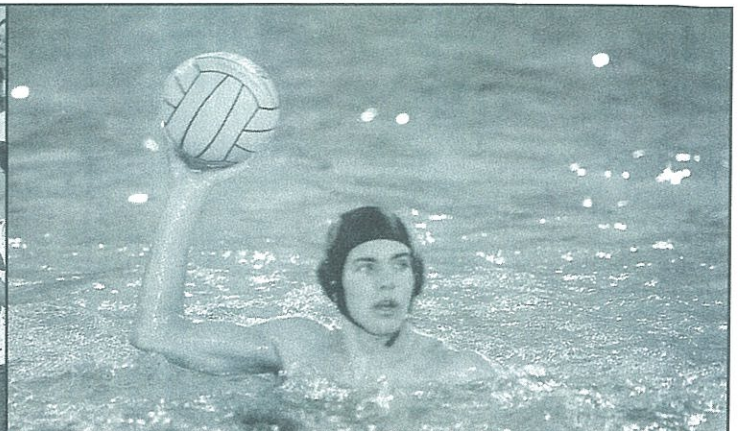

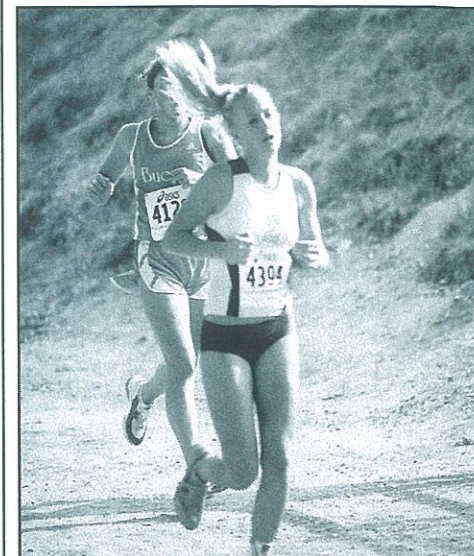
