## CIF-SS COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES October 13, 2005

The Council meeting of the CIF-SS Council was called to order by John Dahlem, President, at 9:03 a.m. on Thursday, October 13, 2005. All leagues were present with the exception of the Agape, Arrowhead, Coast Valley, Freedom, Harbor, Horizon, International, Liberty, Mulholland, Omega and Valley.

**1. ADOPT AGENDA** – It was moved, seconded and passed to adopt agenda as revised.

**2. MINUTES** – It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the minutes of the CIF-SS Council meeting of April 28, 2005. Additionally, minutes of the CIF-SS Executive Committee meeting of August 19 and September 28, 2005, were submitted as informational items.

**3. SPECIAL PRESENTATION** – Jim Staunton, Commissioner, introduced Distinguished Service Award recipient David Zirkle, Orange Unified School District and Murrieta Valley Unified School District.

**4. STATE WRESTLING ADVISORY COMMITTEE PROPOSAL** – John Dahlem, President, presented a proposal which would sanction State CIF Girls Regional Open Wrestling Championships. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve the proposal.

**5. 2006-2010 RELEAGUING** – John Dahlem, President, presented the respective proposals for the 2006-2010 releaguings cycle. Following discussion, area releaguings proposals for Citrus Belt, Coast, Desert, Foothill, Mt. SAC,

Northern, and Parochial were approved.

In the Orange County Area the original proposal was approved. An appeal from Tom Waszak, Principal of J. Serra High School in reference to J. Serra's placement in the Serra League for football was heard by the CIF-SS Council. Speaking in opposition to the proposal and in support of the area proposal was Patrick Lee, Principal of St. John Bosco; Susana Arce, Releaguings Chairperson; Gene Campbell, Executive Committee Orange County Representative; Greg Pinick, Principal, Orange Lutheran High School; Mark Cunningham, Athletic Director, University High School; and Dan Burch, Orange County Releaguings Chairperson. Following discussion, a motion to approve the appeal was denied.

In the Small Schools Area, Thom Doney, Principal of Liberty Christian High School, Rod Markum, League Representative for the Western Athletic Conference, and Bryan Speer, President, Western Athletic Conference, spoke in reference to placement in the Western Athletic Conference. Following discussion, a motion to hear and appeal was denied.

**6. ALMONT LEAGUE PROPOSAL** – Tim Murphy, Almont League Coordinator, reviewed a proposal which would change playoff groupings for girls volleyball and boys/girls basketball from enrollment based to groupings by competitive equity. Following discussion it

# CIF-SS RENEWS BALL PARTNERSHIPS; SWITCHES TO MIKASA IN WATER POLO

The CIF Southern Section is pleased to announce new and continuing official ball partnerships with Spalding, Rawlings, Mikasa, Wilson Tennis, and DeBeer.

**SPALDING:** Continues as official ball of the CIF Southern Section-Toyota Championships in the sports of football, basketball, soccer and volleyball.

**RAWLINGS:** Continues as official ball of the CIF Southern Section-Toyota Baseball Championships.

**MIKASA:** The official ball of FINA, the NCAA and the Olympics, will become the official ball of the CIF Southern Section-Toyota Boys/Girls Water Polo Championships effective July.

**DEBEER:** DeBeer, a subsidiary of Rawlings, becomes the official ball of the CIF-SS latest sport, Lacrosse. The section currently counts 47 teams as participants of the "fastest game on two feet".

**WILSON TENNIS:** Remains the official tennis ball of the CIF Southern Section-Toyota Boys/Girls Tennis Championships through 2009.

All agreements (except Wilson Tennis) run from July 1, 2006 through the 2011 school year.

In exchange, the CIF-SS will receive financial compensation that will offset costs of championship events, venues and fund the valuable awards programs.

"On behalf of our member schools, the CIF Southern Section is pleased and proud to continue our current partnerships and to add new friends," said CIF-SS Commissioner of Athletics Dr. Jim Staunton. "This agreement, in conjunction with our other business partners, allows the section to provide our first class championships as well as helping to keep the promise of low costs to our schools."

The CIF-SS generates over 20% of an annual \$2.5 million operating budget through corporate partnerships. These partnerships save the schools 60 cents per child each school year that would otherwise have to be assessed through member dues and sport fees. This corporate support has enabled the CIF-SS to operate without a dues increase to member schools for over 20 years.

"The support and responsiveness provided by both Spalding and Rawlings the last five years has been gratifying," added Staunton. "The mandatory playoff ball has given our schools a standardized quality ball in all playoff rounds. The most beneficial part of the program is that we are able to save each school student body nearly \$1,700 through these agreements. This is money they can use for on-campus programs."

The official ball program, adopted by the CIF-SS in 2001, now generates over \$190,000 per year in financial support to the section that would otherwise have to be passed on in fees to the 560 member schools. While requiring schools to provide the correct designated balls for all playoff games, the CIF-SS has arranged with Sports Chalet, the Official Sporting Goods of the CIF-SS, an ability to ship overnight to any school the balls when necessary.

## COMMISSIONER'S CORNER

Why We Do  
What We Do

At the 2002 National Federation Meeting, Bob Kanaby delivered a wonderful address that examined high school sports governance. He traced the history of high school sports management and gave his listeners a chance to understand why we do what we do.

It is time to remind us of our purpose and why our rules (as complicated as they are) exist.

In the early 1900's high schools (with four grade levels) appeared all over the country. Adolescents were assigned to ever-larger schools to prepare for life. As soon as neighboring communities built schools, competition became inevitable.

In the spirit of fairness the very first rule that governed high school sports required any student who represented a school to actually be a student at that school! That isn't as funny as it may sound. Our very first commissioner and founder, Seth Van Patten, once pitched in a high school baseball game: while in office!

Soon other rules were created in an attempt to "keep the playing field level". Students couldn't compete if they were over the age of 21. A student who transferred into a school had to "sit out" a year and couldn't compete at all. There were more rules to follow.

The core value reflected in the creation of all of these rules is simple: that communities of young adults have the opportunity to compete for their schools as part of their educational experience. A win against a neighboring community is a cause of great pride. Historically, competition was not just confined to traditional sports. I once read a stirring newspaper account of a typewriting competition that took place in 1921.

To be sure our rules have changed; evolved if you will over the years, but I believe that



## OFFICIALS' WHISTLE



Fan  
Behavior

In recent weeks the issue of fan behavior has impacted high school athletic contests throughout the nation. The Southern Section is not exempt from this negative behavior exhibited by fans. Recent incidents include:

- Attacks on officials
- Fan on Fan violence
- Fans being ejected from gymnasiums and fields
- Abuse toward school administration
- Local newspaper prep columns in recent weeks have referenced incidents of poor fan behavior

Officials groups have noted the dramatic increase in verbal abuse towards them. More than one officials group has made this issue a point of emphasis for this year. A result has been an attempt on the part of officials to adopt a policy and procedure regarding fan expulsion. Each officials Unit operates as a group of independent contractors. Policies and procedures that these Units implement directly impact member schools. For this and many other reasons, it is important that a positive relation exist between schools and officials groups.

Likewise, many schools have begun programs directed at the goal of improving fan behavior. "Yellow Card" warnings, where fans acting in an inappropriate manner are handed rules of behavior, are a positive action plan to make fans aware of improper actions. There is a need for officials and schools to speak with one voice on this matter. In doing so, it will show solidarity in rule interpretation and administration of remedy. For their part, the C.I.F. Southern Section Office is actively involved in presenting the Pursuing Victory With Honor One-Day Coaches Training, in an effort to increase awareness of proper behavior and sportsmanship.

While it may be a sad commentary on one phase of high school athletics, it is important to note that 99.9% of our contests

## MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING - August 19, 2005

The August meeting of the CIF Southern Section Executive Committee was called to order at 1:05 p.m. by President John Dahlem at the CIF Southern Section office, Los Alamitos, California. All members were present with the exception of Paul Breit and Susan Rainey. Dr. Dahlem informed the members that Earl Haugen had retired from his position of Director of Pupil Services with Downey Unified School District and is now the Director on Assignment. Susana Arce has retired from her position of Assistant Principal of Nordhoff High School and is now Assistant Principal/Consultant with Nordhoff High School. Dr. Dahlem introduced the guests attending the meeting; Tom Grady, Principal of Eastside High School, Jerry Kriss, Athletic Director of Eastside High School, Tom Waszak, Principal of JSerra High School and Ralph Grajeda, Athletic Director of JSerra High School.

**1. ADOPT AGENDA** – It was moved, seconded and passed to adopt the agenda.

**2. MINUTES** – It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the minutes of the CIF Southern Section Executive Committee Meeting of May 25, 2005.

### **3. ACTION SESSION**

#### **A. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS**

1. Action items included in the agenda were for the purpose of review with no action taken.

#### **4. OLDBUSINESS**

A. Consideration of Membership Status for the 2005-2006 School Year - After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve probationary membership for the following schools:

1. Nia Educational Charter School
2. Pacifica Christian High School

B. Recommendations for At-Large Members to Council - Jim Staunton asked for recommendations for four female at-large representatives to the Council. He asked committee members to review the people in their area as possible representatives. Areas needed are Citrus Belt, Northern and Orange County, however, all names will be considered.

#### **5. NEWBUSINESS**

A. Hearing on the League Placement for JSerra High School – Jim Staunton presented a background of the placement and a rationale for this appeal. He read from a timeline outlining JSerra's appeal and stated JSerra is arguing the opportunity to present their proposal along with Orange County's to Council.

Tom Waszak, Principal, JSerra High School, distributed a statement and stated they are at this meeting to appeal the decision made by the Orange County Releaguement Committee. After reading from his prepared statement, Mr. Waszak stated they would like to forward an alternative proposal. Dr. Dahlem clarified that JSerra would like the Executive Committee to back their proposal. Dr. Dahlem asked for questions from the committee.

Sr. Cheryl Milner asked Mr. Waszak if he had received a copy of the letter from Mr. Ray Dunne. He replied yes. She stated the Serra League members agreeing to his proposal does not follow with the contents of the letter. The second to last paragraph states that "our first choice was that JSerra be placed in the "Serra"

League starting in 2006 as was established by the recent releaguement process and they should get all their programs ready for that eventuality." It sounded as though they were debating back and forth the compromise about letting football out as JSerra proposed but in the end it sounded as though they preferred not to allow this amendment.

Mr. Waszak replied the meeting included all principals and athletic directors. At the releaguement committee meeting in March, the only people present were principals except for Ralph Grajeda and the athletic director from St. John Bosco. When he talks about the table discussions, there were no athletic directors present who were there during meeting one, two, three or four who heard the discussions that took place and listened to his table discussion on that day. This meeting was with athletic directors who had different points of view than their principals. Secondly, Pat Murphy got up in front of the entire releaguement committee and supported JSerra stating they were not ready for Serra League competition. Thirdly, they did sign off.

Dr. Staunton stated the letter from Mr. Dunne came out of a discussion that he had with the president of the Serra League because Mr. Waszak went before the releaguement committee and said this was a simple matter; two leagues were very much in agreement. It was based on a telephone conversation Dr. Staunton had with the athletic director from St. John Bosco, who did not represent to him that he or other athletic directors were pleased with this proposal. This prompted the telephone conversation with the president of the Serra League who said that on May 18, JSerra represented to them that CIF Southern Section approved of this configuration. Dr. Staunton's letter of April 5 does not represent that. Dr. Staunton was concerned about the misrepresentation and feels that was what Ray Dunne was expressing in his letter. Also, the principals felt a little under the gun because if JSerra had withdrawn completely from the Serra League, they were concerned about the girls programs. They therefore felt the need to approve. That was the tenor of the conversation and why he asked for the letter to represent how it happened. So while it was approved by the Serra league it was under duress.

Mr. Waszak stated that at the time they thought they were working on a track that was appropriate. That was where the comment that we had been in communication with CIF and they were aware of what we were doing came from. We learned subsequent to this meeting that we did not have that option.

Dr. Dahlem asked if Mr. Waszak remembered in the first appeal that was brought to the Executive Committee that he tried to explain the potentiality of having to play in the Serra League. You received the decision you asked for.

Mr. Waszak stated the majority of the proposal did not have JSerra in the Serra League even up to the final proposal.

Mr. Ford stated he took an opposite tack to this appeal in January. He made the point that geographically they were located in Orange

Dr. Dahlem introduced the guest attending the meeting: Joyce Alex, Principal, Agape Christian School.

**1. ADOPT AGENDA** – It was moved, seconded and passed to adopt the agenda with the deletion of items 3B1 and 6A.

**2. MINUTES** – It was moved, seconded and passed with one abstention to approve the minutes of the CIF Southern Section Executive Committee Meeting of August 19, 2005.

Sr. Cheryl Milner reported on the decisions made at the State Federated Committee Meeting.

### 3. ACTION SESSION

#### A. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS

1. Action items included in the agenda were for the purpose of review with no action taken.

### 4. NON-ACTION SESSION

#### B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposal by Southwestern League to change Playoff Groupings Cycle Rule 3219.1 – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed with 2 opposing votes.

### 5. OLDBUSINESS

A. Web Site Change – Thom Simmons presented a visual presentation on the changes made to the Southern Section web site.

B. Mortgage Payment Recommendation – After a thorough review, Jim Staunton stated that the Section would not accelerate a mortgage payment. Bank of America recommended saving for several years and make one large payment. It will be reviewed every August if an amount can be set aside.

C. Report on Eastside High School Visitation/Membership by Jim Monico – Mr. Monico reported on his telephone conversation with the school. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve full membership.

D. At-Large Members for Council – The following people were recommended by Dr. Staunton for the At-Large position on Council: Lisa Busch, Athletic Director, Lakewood High School, Kristine Kulow, Principal, San Dimas High School, Christina Rivera, Principal, Redlands High School, Deatra Lee, Athletic Director, Banning High School.

After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve the nominees for at-large representation on the Council.

E. RELEAGUING APPEALS – All relegating appeals at the Council must be based on the relegating process only as described in item 5, page 46 of the 2005-2006 Blue Book.

### 6. NEWBUSINESS

B. Appeal Hearing on the Request for Membership from Agape Christian Academy – Dr. Staunton reviewed the events and actions for denial of membership to Agape Christian Academy for the 2005-2006 school year. Joyce Alex, Principal, Agape Christian Academy, spoke on behalf of the school, explaining the reasons for the school's actions. After discussion, it

was moved, seconded and passed that the membership for Agape Christian Academy be denied until the 2006-2007 school year in order for the principal and athletic director to attend the mandatory training on August 21, 2006.

C. Champions for Character Awards, October 13, 2005 – Dr. Staunton presented an overview of the arrangements for the luncheon to date. He asked all Executive Committee members to advise the office of their attendance in order to assign duties.

D. Approval of Hardship Appeal Hearing Panel Officers Jerry Dutton, Merlin Driggs and Allan Layne. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed to approve those named as Appeal Hearing officers.

E. Wrestling Weight Management Report – Rob Wigod explained the details of this report. All students will be required to take this exam. It is mandatory but is not binding for this year. Athletes may be reassessed. November 1, 2005 through January 15, 2006 is the assessment period.

F. Penalties associated with Falsification of Bona Fide Change of Residence Form – After discussion, no recommendations were made to change penalties for falsification of information on residence.

### 7. REPORT SESSION

A. Presidents Reports – President John Dahlem passed out information on the important issues discussed at the Section 7/8 meeting. Past-President Paul Breit asked for a review of the amount of money paid by the Section for mileage. Mr. Breit also asked for the office to send a mailing out to schools advising them of our policies on steroid use. He also reported that the Chino High School stadium has been renamed John Monger Stadium and Walnut High School stadium has been renamed the Ken Gunn Stadium.

B. Treasurer's Report – Susana Arce reported that the auditors have completed their work and will present their report at the November 9 Executive Committee Meeting. Also, the annual dues mailing will be done during the month of October.

C. Commissioner's Report – Jim Staunton reported the following: Dr. Robert Maxson, President of the California State University Long Beach, will be the keynote speaker for the Champions for Character Luncheon; there may be a small school relegating appeal at the October 13 Council meeting; Hurricane Katrina has forced approximately a dozen students to our schools; at the Section 7/8 meeting the issue of Los Angeles City School Charter Schools was discussed. Charter schools do not have boundaries, are publicly funded and an agency of Los Angeles Unified School District.

D. Executive Committee Member Reports

1. Orange County Area Representative, Gene Campbell – Attended the Section 7/8 meeting and was impressed by it.

2. Northern Area Representative, Bill Dabbs – Appreciates the work on the web site and will link his school to it.

## RULE REVIEW

to  
Do

There are a few changes and things to be aware of as we slowly fade out of 2005-06 and head into Spring.

All need to be highlighted so that you can rest this summer in the knowledge that you are ready for another new sports year.

1. It's very important to use written contracts for scheduling contests. Review By-Law 150 in the Bluebook.

2. When hiring coaches make sure you review the Association Rule (By-Law 312) with all potential applicants prior to hiring.

3. Check the CIF-SS website frequently for announcements, in-service dates, rule updates and other information.

4. Check current National Federation rule books for equipment or uniform rule changes for 2006-07.

5. Review summertime rules with your coaching staff. Specific language is located under each particular sports section in the Bluebook.

6. The Summer Dead Period will be July 30 to August 20, 2006 (except for those schools that request, in writing, an alternate period).

7. Make sure all sport schedules are submitted to your Area Liaison and sport unit assignors by the specific due dates. This is extremely important in helping your school to be adequately covered by officials for each sport.

8. Fall Packets will be available for pick-up at the CF-SS Office in mid-August.

9. Make sure to read your new Bluebook (when you pick it up) with all new rule language. Pay specific attention to new rules and wording regarding mileage and athletic contracts.

These are just some of the items to keep in mind as we head into the Spring. Should you need a more detailed explanation of these or any other areas of interest it is important that you contact the office for clarification from one of the administrators.

H. 2004-2005 Auditors Report – The firm of Carmody and Meach, represented by Mr. Roger Carmody, presented the 2004-2005 Auditors Report. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and approved to accept the 2004-2005 Auditors Report.

I. Appeal of Sanction against Santa Barbara High School Tennis Team – Dr. Dahlem and Dr. Staunton met with the representatives of Santa Barbara High School and announced that an agreement had been reached on a disciplinary action against the coach of Santa Barbara High School.

**2. MINUTES** – It was moved, seconded and passed to approve the minutes of the CIF Southern Section Executive Committee Meeting of September 28, 2005.

### **3. ACTION SESSION**

#### **A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS**

1. CIF Boys and Girls State Golf Championships – Dr. Staunton reported that the State and Federated Council is pleased with these championships and will recommend both state championships continue.

Dr. Staunton stated the Girls Golf Committee will propose to Council to extend the girls' golf season by four days in order to allow for individual regional competition. After discussion, a motion to support this was seconded and approved.

2. Revision to CIF Bylaw 22.B.23: Conditions of Membership – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and approved to support.

3. Revision of CIF Bylaw 524: Steroid Prohibition – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and approved to support.

#### **B. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS**

1. Proposal from Bay League on Water Polo Rule 3008 Maximum Team Contests – This item was pulled and recommended that staff address this issue to bring an interpretation of what the rule states back to the Executive Committee at the next meeting.

2. Proposal from Southwestern League on Rule 3219.1 Playoff Groupings – This item was previously approved on September 28, 2005.

3. Proposal from CIF Southern Section Swimming Advisory Committee to establish a Masters Meet – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and approved to support.

### **4. NON-ACTION SESSION**

#### **B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION ITEMS**

Rob Wigod reported that state wrestling for girls was approved.

1. Proposal from Sunset League on Field Hockey Rule 1816 Color of Uniform tops and Rule 1807 Extend Non-League Games one week – Karen Hellyer stated the

color of shirts would not be an issue. Extending non-league games one week – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and approved to support.

### **5. OLDBUSINESS**

A. Appeal of sanction against Santa Barbara High School tennis team – Moved to item 11.

### **6. NEWBUSINESS**

A. Appeal of View Park Preparatory School's membership suspension for the balance of the 2005-2006 school year – Dr. Dahlem reported that after meeting with the school administration, parents and staff, it was decided to lift their suspension for the winter and spring seasons. As a condition of this, View Park Preparatory must pay their dues, follow CIF rules and be accessible.

B. Consideration of membership status for the 2006-2007 school year –

1. Calvary Baptist Christian School – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and approved to postpone this membership until further information is received from the school.

Discussion surrounded a previously approved motion mandating new schools must field at least one boys and girls team per season of sport.

2. Hope Center Academy – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and approved to deny membership.

Discussion of membership applications – Dr. Staunton and Dr. Smidderks will meet to create procedures and guidelines for membership applications.

C. Charter School Boundaries – Bona Fide Change of Residence – Discussion surrounded creating a Blue Book Section to address this matter and the effects on eligibility for transfer students from charter schools.

D. Conference Formation – Paul Castillo presented new criteria for athletic conferences to follow. It was suggested it be brought before the Blue Book Committee to be added to the Blue Book. It was also suggested to have a representative of all conferences come before the Executive Committee to hear suggestions.

E. Policy on Unrestricted Status for Schools – These schools have membership based on the season of sport and gender equity. Paul Castillo was asked to prepare a list of schools who have unrestricted status.

F. Playoff Groupings Timelines/Calendar – On January 6, 2006, information will be mailed to all league representatives. In February/March, schools will receive the break down of all sports. Appeals will be held on March 30 and on April 6, playoff groupings will be mailed out. Appeals will be heard in April.

### **7. REPORT SESSION**

A. Presidents Reports – President John Dahlem passed out information from the State meeting.

President-Elect Earl Haugen – At the State Federated meeting, two items were discussed: playoff games on Sunday and the length of the seasons of sport with state playoffs going into June. There have been no decisions yet.

B. Treasurer's Report – Susie Arce stated the delinquent dues list was distributed.

Letters were sent to principals on November 2 asking for payment. She asked all members to make phone calls to the schools in the members' areas.

C. Commissioner's Report – Jim Staunton reported the following: The Financial Committee met. They had a mileage reimbursement review and suggested the Handbook be revised to add when gas prices reach \$2.75/gallon, reimbursement will be increased by 10% and when it reaches \$3.00/gallon, reimbursement will again be increased by 10%; Sanctions – Lakewood High School and Redlands High School will have an away game due to ball violations; Gahr High School – After the relegating cycle was completed and deadlines passed, they asked for an appeal to participate in football as a freelance team. No appeal was granted; JSerra High School – They are appealing the Council decision on their relegating request to State CIF; Tesoro High School – Two high school football players, suspended by their school, thought they received permission to participate in football while under suspension through the temporary restraining order they received. However, under Rule 228, if student is suspended from high school, the student is ineligible during the period of suspension. They did not play during the last game and the coach will not allow them to play for the next game; Future Planning for the Southern Section – Dr. Staunton distributed a draft memo on his topics for discussion. He asked for members to volunteer to chair one of these areas. He asked for contributions to this memo be submitted at the next Executive Committee Meeting; Bloomington High School – Their football game the previous week reflected a score that many found troublesome. Suggestions were made to direct correspondence to the board of education and superintendent to encourage them to handle this issue with the values of Pursuing Victory with Honor in mind.

#### **D. Executive Committee Member Reports**

1. Activities Director Representative Terry Speir – Poly's sister school, Lee Vining High School was coming to school for a visit. Poly had many activities planned for the staff and students. She also stated that members of the activities directors committee have asked to become more involved in the Champions for Character Awards by helping athletic directors get more nominations. They also expressed concerns about girls volleyball playoffs always falling on Veteran's Day weekend. They also discussed and support having gate tickets the same as pre-sale prices for students.

2. Desert Area Representative John Mendoza – Relayed the pride and thanks of a Champion for Character awardee.

3. Small Schools Area Representative Tom Peters – Stated his boys cross country team is ranked as #1 in the state.

4. Assistant Commissioner Rob Wigod – Asked all committee members who wish to present awards at football playoff games to advise him.

5. Orange County Area Representative Gene Campbell – Gave recognition and praise to the Champions for Character Luncheon.

our principals would support our core value: athletics is a support to academics.

Over the years some rules have softened. A transfer student now faces "restricted" eligibility instead of no eligibility. We have adopted "hardship" criteria that allow a transfer student to gain immediate eligibility if circumstances beyond his/her control force the transfer. Foreign students, under the proper program, can gain varsity eligibility.

There is talk now of a possible change to the transfer rule, Rule 214. There are some who believe that the press of litigation and the actions of aggrieved parents are too much to bear. Our legal costs are rising. The demands of some litigants are a drain on time and resources. As a consequence, some leaders in our organization would allow eligibility after thirty days of restriction to any student who transfers from one school to another. We will discuss this idea at the Commissioner's meeting in March.

What does our Section believe about the transfer rule? I need your opinion and input. If you have thoughts on the matter, email me at [jims@cifss.org](mailto:jims@cifss.org). I would like to know what our athletic leadership thinks about a change in the rule. Please understand that there is no imminent change and that any proposal must go through our system of governance.

I would like to hear from you though. Take a few minutes to email your opinion. I want to know if we agree on why we do what we do.

County. They requested to be in this area and they were a member in good standing in CIF. At that time, he saw no reason that their request to be in Orange County should not be approved. JSerra should now accept the fact that they have to go through the relegating process. They have the ability to come before Council in October and present an alternate proposal. They have a significant number of days between now and then that will give them the opportunity to talk to the people involved and present a clear address. He felt that even though he is not a league rep who would vote on this proposal, if a group of schools came to Council and said that they absolutely would want this to happen, he would support them. But as a member of the Executive Committee, he did not feel he had enough information to support this proposal.

Sr. Cheryl Milner clarified what was before them. What had to be addressed was procedure. The explanation was given. She did not want to go back over what was said at a former meeting. She stated they need to act in the parameter of their decision making and then let it be. It seemed there had been a substantive dialogue. Protocol had been followed and it did not seem apparent to her that the Serra League and the Orange County League were in support of this proposal. She, therefore, did not feel she should recommend an appeal to the Council.

Dr. Staunton stated the Executive Committee could accept this appeal or deny it and it could still move forward. What Council would be asked to do is to look at what the principals of Orange County had said and then put it to a vote. Every area will vote on their leaguings. JSerra would then come forward and ask Council if an alternative proposal could be placed before them in effect to overrule the Orange County decision. That is the responsibility of Council.

Mr. Haugen clarified that there was no appeal before the Executive Committee and Dr. Dahlem stated that Council will vote on this appeal.

Mr. Peters asked if after the relegating is over, could the two leagues get together and vote to cross league for football. Dr. Staunton replied they could not cross league for football but the Serra League could release JSerra into a league that would receive them.

Mr. Waszak asked if they could present an option to Council that would let them compete in Serra League competition except for football and if they were not allowed to cross league with Orange Coast League, would they be able to freelance. Dr. Dahlem stated that would not be allowed. Dr. Staunton stated freelance was one of the things JSerra protested against. They were put into freelance and they did not want to freelance. The option is to request this hybrid situation or to be voted into the Serra League for all sports. Dr. Dahlem stated they cannot freelance in a sport and league with the other sports.

Mrs. Arce, Releaguings Chairperson, stated the relegating committee felt that placing JSerra in the Orange County area was too great a jump and the recommendation was that they freelance. JSerra appealed to the Executive Committee in January and they were allowed to go into the Orange County area. At the last relegating committee, it was questioned as to whether proper protocol was followed by Orange County area in establishing their league. The committee found there was no impropriety in the protocol. Orange County followed the proper protocol. That was the primary responsibility of the Releaguings Committee at the last meeting to determine if JSerra was denied because of some flaw in the relegating process; there was none.

Dr. Dahlem stated they had an appeal by JSerra for the Executive Committee to approve and forward to CIF Council their alternate proposal as an amendment to the initial relegating process.

Mr. Ford moved to deny the motion. It was seconded. There was a unanimous vote to deny JSerra's request to have the Executive Committee approve their appeal.

Mr. Waszak asked if they still have the opportunity to present their proposal to the entire Council. Dr. Dahlem stated they do. Area relegating is done by the area; this proposal will be voted on by the Council.

B. Hearing on the Request for Late Consideration of Membership by Eastside High School – After discussion, it was moved, seconded and approved for membership on a probationary basis. Jim Monico will revisit the school next April to review the school for full unrestricted membership.
