2015 CIF SOUTHERN SECTION-FORD FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS, ON TAP FRIDAY AND SATURDAY; 13 DIVISIONAL TITLES TO BE AWARDED

LOS ALAMITOS — Thirteen divisional winners will be crowned champions this weekend in the 2015 CIF Southern Section-Ford Football Championships, scheduled for sites spanning from the desert to the sea. Championship football competition among CIF-SS member schools dates back to 1914. This will be the 102nd edition.

The 13 divisional finals are sponsored by The Southern California Ford Dealers Association; Spaulding; Sports Authority; Fox Sports West and Prep Zone; Jack-in-the-Box; Flame Broiler; Subway; Gold's Gym, California Classified School Employees Association; The United States Marine Corp; Gatorade; Russel Sportswear; Rawlings; Maxpreps.com; Southern California PGA; J&L Custom Jackets and Patches; KAP-7 Water Polo Balls; California Correctional Peace Officers Association; TLC Sportswear; The United States Tennis Association, Woman's Southern California Golf Association, Wilson Tennis, H&L Corporation, LA84 Foundation.

CENTRAL DIVISION - San Marino vs. Charter Oak, Saturday, December 5, 7:00 p.m.

Two of the division's top teams will battle for the Central Division Championship.

San Marino enters at 13-0 and the champions of the Rio Hondo league. Coach Mike Hobbie's team has scored more than 670 points while allowing less than 140. The Titans are led on offense by QB Carson Glazier with over 43 TDs and RB Michael Chan with 19 TDs while Mark Uriarte with 9.5 sacks leads the team on defense. The Titans advanced after holding down Summit in the final moments of the semi-final. San Marino looks to cap off its recent run of playoff appearances with a championship. This would be the Titans first CIF-SS championship.

Coach Lou Farrar's Charter Oak Chargers return to the CIF-SS finals for the first time since 2009. The Chargers are the top team in the bracket and the Hacienda League and are 12-1. The Chargers offense is led by QB Kamden Brown with nearly 2300 yards passing while RB Zion Echols has rushed for 35 TDs leading the Chargers to nearly 560 points while giving up less than 200 points in a defense led by Dillion Ontiveros' 119 tackles. The Chargers have dedicated this season to the memory of former Assistant Coach Charles "Bud" Reich and look to give Coach Farrar his 6th CIF-SS title.

EASTERN DIVISION – Serrano vs. Oak Hills, Friday, December 4, 7:00 p.m.

The Eastern Division final will match a pair of teams who have earned a shot at the championship after falling just short a year ago and are both members of the Mojave River League.

After falling to Palm Springs last year, Oak Hills avenged that loss in the quarterfinals and arrives at the Eastern Final with an 8-5 record. Coach Robert Kistner's Bulldogs ranked 2nd in the Mojave River League and have won 7 in a row. The Bulldogs have a solid team on both sides of the ball led by QB Brandon Porter who has thrown for over 2300 yards and over 24 touchdowns while Joseph Griffin leads a stout defense with 109 tackles. Oak Hills, which opened in 2009 seeks its first CIF-SS title.

After falling on a field goal shot a year ago, Serrano returns to the CIF-SS championship ranked #1 in the Mojave River League and have an 11-2 record. Coach Ray Maholchic's Diamondbacks have a prolific offense led by Sultaan Sullivan who has rushed for over 2660 yards and 43 TDs. The defense has barely allowed 200 points and is led by Andrew Valencia with 4 interceptions and 110 tackles. Serrano plays for its first CIF-SS crown since winning in its last finals appearance in 2004.

Serrano defeated Oak Hills 36-10 on October 9th.

EAST VALLEY DIVISION – Grace Brethren vs. Saddleback Valley Christian, Saturday December 5, 7:00 p.m.

Two undefeated teams will match up in the East Valley finale.

After falling short a year ago, Grace Brethren returns to the championship game. Grace Brethren entered as the top seed in the division along with the Frontier League and has a 13-0 record. Coach Josh Henderson's Lancers have a suffocating defense that has allowed more than ten points only twice this season led by Darrius Vukobradovich who has 8 interceptions while a potent offense is led by QB Nick Jules who has passed for nearly 30 TDs. The Lancers seek their first title since 2004.

After falling in the semifinals a year ago, Saddleback Valley Christian arrives after being the #1 seed out of the San Joaquin League. Coach Brendan Chambers's Warriors have a 13-0 record and are solid on both sides of the ball. The Warriors have a prolific offense led by QB Cade Henjum who has passed for over 1900 yards and nearly 30 touchdowns and RB Dalton Lohman who has rushed for 16 touchdowns while Jonathan Bunnell leads a stout defense with 12.5 sacks. The Warriors seek their first CIF-SS title.

INLAND DIVISION – Citrus Hill vs. Heritage, Friday, December 4, 7:00 p.m.

Offense should be the name of the game in the Inland Division Final.

Heritage arrives at the championship game after nearly missing out last season. This is Heritage's 3rd finals appearance in its short history that includes its only title in 2013. Coach Kraig Broach's team enters at 13-0 and the top team in the bracket along with the Sunbelt League. The Patriots are led by RB Jalen Glover who has rushed for nearly 20 TDs for an offense that has scored more than 530 points and also has a stout defense that has allowed barely 150 points this season led by Quentin Asberry who has 7.5 sacks.

Citrus Hill arrives at the CIF-SS final after falling in the semifinal a year ago. Coach Eric Zomalt's Hawks are 11-2 and ranked #1 in the Mountain Pass league. Citrus Hill prevailed in double overtime in the semifinal against Rancho Verde. The Hawks have a stout defense led by Zack Markworth with over 100 tackles and 7 sacks while RB Devin Floyd has rushed for 25 TDs. The Hawks are back for the first time since winning the East Valley Division in 2007.

MID-VALLEY DIVISION – Sierra Canyon vs. San Dimas, Friday, December 4, 7:00 p.m.

Points should be aplenty in the Mid-Valley Division final.

Sierra Canyon continues a recent run of success by reaching the final after avenging last year's semifinal loss to Pomona. Coach Jon Ellinghouse's team ranked #1 in the Gold Coast League and in this bracket with a 13-0 record. The Trailblazers have scored nearly 700 points and are led by QB Niko Harris who has passed for over 40 TDs while a stout defense is led by Patrick Gonzales has made over 125 tackles. The Trailblazers are back in the final for the first time since 2011 when they won the East Valley and eventually a state championship.

San Dimas returns for the final for the first time since winning it all back in 2013. Under Coach Mark Holman, the Saints have not missed a beat after replacing Bill Zernickow. The Saints entered as the 2nd team out of the Valle Vista League and have a 10-3 record. The Saints are potent on both sides of the ball with an offense led by RB Jarell Sykes who has rushed for 2000 yards for an offense that has scored over 550 points while Steven Ojeda with over 130 tackles leads the defense as the Saints look to add to their recent success.

NORTHERN DIVISION – Thousand Oaks vs. Camarillo, Friday, December 4th, 7:00 p.m.

Offenses should be flying in the Northern Division final.

Camarillo returns to the CIF-SS final for the first time since winning it all in 1996. The Scorpions entered as the top seed in the division along with the top seed in the Camino League and have a 13-0 record. Coach Jack Willard's squad has scored 600 points led by QB Jake Constantine who has thrown for over 3100 yards and 39 touchdowns. Brett Herron with 108 tackles leads a defense that has allowed less than 260 points.

Thousand Oaks makes its first finals appearance since winning CIF-SS in 1987. Coach Mike Leibin's team is 11-2 and was the #2 seed out of the Camino league. The Lancers have posted more than 500 points led by QB Max Gilliam who has passed for more than 2900 yards and more than 35 TDs while RB Perry Martin has rushed for more than 1500 yards and more than 25 TDs. Wade Cookus with 103 tackles leads the Lancers on defense.

NORTHWEST DIVISION – Notre Dame Riverside vs. Linfield Christian, Friday, December 5, 7:00 p.m.

The Northwest Division Final features teams who excel on both sides of the ball.

Notre Dame of Riverside makes its first appearance in a CIF-SS final since winning in 1977. The top seed in the bracket enters with a 13-0 record after being the number 1 seed in the Ambassador League. Coach Derrick Johnson's Titans have scored over 500 points and allowed less than 100. The Titans are led by QB Niles Harrell who has passed for over 1900 yards and over 25 TDs while Isiah Guerrero has made over 100 tackles.

Linfield Christian arrives at the CIF-SS Final with a 12-1 record and the #2 seed out of the Ambassador League. Coach DeChon Burns' Lions have scored over 500 points and have barely allowed 100 points led by RB Zac Archer who has rushed for over 1100 yards and 20 TDs while Greg Holt has 178 tackles. The Lions are back in the final for the first time since winning it all in 2009.

PAC-5 DIVISION – Centennial Corona vs. St. John Bosco at Angel Stadium, Saturday, December 5, at 8:00 p.m.

Two of the best teams in all of Southern California and the country will be on display at Angel Stadium as the PAC 5 Division championship will be decided.

Coming off last year's thrilling win and an appearance in the Open Division state championship Corona Centennial has not lost a beat making its 2nd Pac 5 championship appearance in its 2nd season

PAC-5 DIVISION (Cont.): in the division ranked #1 in the bracket and Big VIII division with a 13-0 record. Coach Matt Logan's Huskies have scored more than 700 points and barely allowed 200. QB Anthony Catalano has thrown for more than 2400 yards and nearly 30 TDs while RB J.J. Taylor has rushed for more than 1500 yards and nearly 40 TDs. The Huskies seek another deep playoff run.

After falling short last year, and two years removed from a CIF-SS and CIF State title, St. John Bosco is back in the championship game after being the #1 seed out of the Trinity league. Coach Jason Negro's Braves are 13-0 with a prolific offense that has scored over 770 points. The Braves are led QB Quintin Davis who has thrown for more than 3300 yards and more than 35 TDs while RB Sean McGrew has rushed for over 1600 yards and 25 TDs. The Braves have forced a running clock in all but one game this season and look to add to their recent success.

Corona Centennial and St. John Bosco meet in a rematch of last year's Pac 5 Division championship won by Corona Centennial 48-41.

SOUTHEAST DIVISION – La Serna vs. La Mirada, Friday, December 4, 7:00 p.m.

Balanced teams headline the Southeast Division final.

La Serna returns to the CIF-SS Title game two years removed from winning it all in 2013. The Lancers entered as the top seed in the bracket and the Del Rio League. Coach Andy George's squad is 11-2 and has a balanced attack. The Lancers have a variety of weapons that make key contributions on both sides of the ball. The Lancers have nearly scored 500 points while the defense has 10 interceptions as they look for their 2nd title in three years.

La Mirada arrives at the final after being the top seed in the Suburban League. The Matadors have won 9 in a row with a 10-3 record. Coach Mike Moschetti's squad scores a lot of points led QB Tristan Meyer who has passed for over 1700 yards and nearly 30 TDs with a lot of weapons for an offense that has scored nearly 600 points. The Matadors are back in the CIF-SS final for the first time since winning the Southern Division in 2009.

SOUTHERN DIVISION –Canyon/Anaheim vs. Brea Olinda, Friday, December 4, at 7:00 p.m.

High scoring could be seen in the Southern Division final.

Brea Olinda arrives after avenging last year's quarterfinal loss to Garden Grove in their best defensive performance of the playoffs. The Wildcats are 8-5 and the top seed out of the North Hills league. Coach Robb Perrance's Wildcats are led on defense by Zach Arnold who has more than 100 tackles. The Wildcats are back in the final for the first time since winning the Division IX championship in 2001.

Canyon of Anaheim entered as an An-Large team and has made it to the CIF-SS Final. The Comanches return to the CIF final for the first time since 1979. The Comanches have won 4 games in a row going into the CIF Final. Coach Mike Ogas' team is 8-5 and balanced on both sides of the ball. QB Jason Harman has thrown for over 2500 yards and nearly 30 TDs as the Comanches seek their first CIF-SS title.

SOUTHWEST DIVISION – La Habra vs. San Clemente, Saturday, December 5.

Familiar names highlight the Southwest Division Final

La Habra enters as the top seed in the bracket and the Freeway League. Coach Frank Mazzotta's squad owns a 12-1 record and have won 10 games in a row leading up to the CIF-SS final. The Highlanders have a potent team that has scored more than 500 points and allowed less than 130. La Habra has scored more than 40 points in each of its playoff games. The Highlanders are back in the final for the first time since 2010 and seek the programs 7th CIF-SS title.

San Clemente returns to the CIF-SS Final after falling in overtime a year ago. The Tritons were the #1 team out of the Sea View League and are 10-2 and own a 7 game winning streak. Coach Jaime Ortiz has an offense that has scored more than 550 points led by QB Jack Sears who has passed for nearly 2600 yards and 35 TDs while Ryan Russell has nearly 100 tackles. The Tritons seek their 1st CIF-SS title.

WEST VALLEY DIVISION – Mission Viejo vs. Vista Murrieta, Friday, December 4,

Traditional powers and high powered offense headlines the West Valley Division final.

Defending West Valley champion Mission Viejo returns to the CIF-SS Finals seeking the programs 6th CIF-SS title. Coach Bob Johnson's squad is 13-0 and the top seed in both the bracket and the South Coast League. The Diablos' feature a powerful offense that features a variety of weapons that has scored over 500 points and a defense has barely allowed 200 points. The Diablos' look to add to its rich history.

Vista Murrieta is back in the CIF-SS final for the 5th year in a row after falling a year ago. Coach Coley Candaele's team is 12-1 and the top seed out of the Southwestern league continuing a recent run of success. The Broncos possess a lot of offensive weapons and have scored over 500 points led by AB Karson Greeley who has thrown for more than 2100 yards and over 20 TDs while Dwayne Johnson has over 100 tackles and 2 picks. The Broncos seek to add to their 2011 CIF-SS title.

Vista Murrieta and Mission Viejo meet in a rematch of last year's final won by Mission Viejo 21-10.

WESTERN DIVISION – Palos Verdes vs. Calabasas, Saturday, December 5th.

Defense could be the name of the game in the Western Division final.

Calabasas arrives at the title game for the first time after being the top seed in the division and the Canyon League. Coach Casey Clausen's squad enters with a 12-1 record. The Coyotes have scored nearly 500 points and allowed less than 200. The team is led by QB Tristan Gebbla who has thrown for more than 3600 yards and nearly 40 touchdowns while Alec Stevenson has made over 100 tackles as the Coyotes chase their first CIF-SS crown.

Palos Verdes returns as the defending division champion and the top seed from the Bay League. Coach Guy Gardner's team is 10-3 on the season and has won 10 games in a row. The Sea Kings feature a balanced attack featuring a variety of weapons on offense while Shane Irwin contributes 12.5 sacks on defense. The Sea Kings have not allowed more than 10 points in their three playoff victories as they seek their 2nd straight CIF-SS title.

CIF-SS FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP BLOGGING POLICY

Each Credential Holder (including television, Internet, new media, and print publications) has the privilege to blog during competition through the Credential Entity.

However, the blog may not produce in any form a “real-time” description of the event. Real-time is defined by the CIF-SS as a continuous play-by-play account or live, extended live/real-time statistics, or detailed description of an event. Live-video/digital images or live audio are not permitted.

Each of the aforementioned descriptions is exclusive to the CIF-SS Web site and/or any other Web site designated by the CIF-SS and its rights holders.

Periodic updates of scores, statistics or other brief descriptions of the competition throughout the event are acceptable.

Credential Holder agrees that the determination of whether a blog is posting a real-time description shall be in the CIF-SS' sole discretion. If the CIF-SS deems that a Credential Holder is producing a real-time description of the contest, the CIF-SS reserves all actions against Credential Holder, including but not limited to the revocation of the credential.

If media intend to blog at a CIF-SS championship event, the media entity must indicate so through the credentialing process.

Any media entity posting a blog during a CIF-SS championship must submit a direct link to the blog to www.cifss.org. In return, all media entities entering a blog must post the CIF-SS logo/link on their site. All blogs must be free of charge to readers. All must adhere to the conditions and limitations of this CIF-SS Blogging Policy.

Video “blogging” of a CIF-SS event may not exceed more than 15 total minutes in duration and cannot include consecutive game action.

The CIF-SS and its designated championship personnel shall be the final authority on whether a Credential Holder or Credential Entity is following the CIF-SS Blogging Policy.
