3. ACTION ITEMS

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposed Recommendations for Change to Bylaws 204, 207, 213 Exec. Cmte. STATE525 Support 23-0

There was a motion and a second to approve STATE525. This proposal provides a better understanding and clarifies the residential eligibility and status of a student who has been declared by the local education agency as "homeless" under the McKinney-Vento Assistance Act. The proposal will limit Section Commissioners to 20 days to render a decision. The motion carried: 82-3-0

B. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposal Recommendation Change to Bylaw 3219 Exec. Cmte. SS522 Support 23-0

There was a motion and a second to approve SS522. This proposal addresses and changes current Blue Book Bylaw 3219 (Playoff Groupings). Individual schools will now be evaluated and placed into playoff divisions on a yearly basis. The criteria for placement will be on the following: regular season record, strength of schedule and Southern Section playoff performance over a two year period. The formula will be applied to each school resulting in the creation of competitive equity power rankings for individual schools. The proposal will affect the following sports: Football, Girls/Boys Tennis, Girls/Boys Volleyball, Girls/Boys' Water Polo, Girls/Boys Soccer, Girls/Boys Basketball, Baseball and Softball. The motion carried: 74-10-1

2. Proposal Recommendation Change to Sports Calendar Exec. Cmte. SS523
Support 21-1-1

There was a motion and a second to approve SS523. This proposal address and changes the current season of sport calendar. The starting and ending dates for the following sports: Girls Tennis, Girls Volleyball, Boys' Water Polo, Baseball, Softball, Boys Tennis and Boys Volleyball will be adjusted to align them closer to the school year starting and ending dates of the member schools. Concern expressed regarding the transition between the winter sport athlete and the spring sport athlete. Decision comes down to taking a week off the spring sport starting date or remaining as is and compressing the season. Question brought forward to "table" the motion until after the CIF State adjusted its sports calendar. Small schools have a concern about daylight savings time, starting of game times, added cost if facilities needed to be rented. Additional concern over the end date of championships and the timing of AP testing and students missing those exams or having to make a choice between the two. Students that have conflicts could be given an alternate test date. Question raised if the proposal doesn't pass today will this end the discussion or allow it to be adjusted. Currently, as presented, this is a completed proposal and while it can be adjusted through the Executive Committee and again brought forward, today's vote will be final for this proposal. Question asked why this is not being looked at for 2017-2018. It was explained that the CIF State is looking to adjust the winter season for 2018-2019. Question asked regarding the SOP date of transfer for students. The SOP date at this time will not be changed as that is a date given out by the CIF State. This will result in a longer SOP for transfer students. Discussion also followed regarding the Winter SOP having a different length that the Spring SOP date. Seasons of sport already have a different SOP date / length currently. All three seasons are not equal at this time. Concern raised that this will only affect a few schools that reach the championship. Response to this is that it's not just the schools in the championships. The playoffs already start in May and there are numerous schools that are already out of school when the playoffs start, so it's not just the teams in the finals. The motion failed: 29-57-1

STATE532 looks to move the National Wrestling Coaches Association Weight Management program into the "Blue Pages" of the CIF State Constitution and Bylaws, which will allow NWCA modifications to the Weight Management Program the ability to adjust without going through a CIF Bylaw change / modification process. Discussion followed of who would be in charge of adjusting the weight management formula. The CIF State is currently in change and that would not change based on this proposal.

B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. CIF Southern Section Executive Committee Nominations

Members who were present today were asked to stand and introduce themselves and what position they are running for the 2016-2017 Executive Committee.

2. Proposed CIF Southern Section Budget 2016-2017

Non-Action

SS527

Mr. Carty presented the proposed 2016-17 Southern Section budget and went through the major items of interest. The majority of the budget showed increased revenue based on continued partnership with a new 5 year ball contract and an increase in broadcast rights fees. Insurance premiums will be projected at a 5% increase due to major medical increases. No increase projected in Southern Section staff salaries this coming year based on a 0% COLA. Member schools should see an increase revenue based on TV/Web broadcast rights.

This proposal is a first reading for an adjustment in official's fees. Six years ago was the last increase. The new proposal will allow for an increase of \$3 for 2016-2017, \$3 for 2017-2018 and a \$2 for 2018-2019 across the board in all sports. This would not include tournament fees. Additional language added that would allow for schools to request 3 officials in basketball and 5 – 7 officials in varsity football. Discussion took place regarding the lack of qualified officials and if basketball increased from 2 to 3 per game would the unit have enough officials to cover all the requests. Discussion regarding some schools official's budgets haven't changed in years but cost have gone up so the increase would put a burden on them. Discussion followed if officials were required to go through a background check before being employed by a unit and before they are sent to work at a school. Discussion concerning how many officials are available and what steps the individual officials associations are doing to raise the number of officials available.

6. REPORT SESSION

A. President's Report

Reggie Thompkins

Mr. Thompkins relayed interesting phone calls he has received while being in his current position. Most of the calls he receives are from parents on how they can transfer schools and his standard answer is to refer them to the Southern Section office. They are there to help students in the process and assist member schools through the process. Mr. Thompkins took a moment to acknowledge Commissioner Wigod for his work and personal skills in relating and knowing everyone by first name in the room. He found this skill to be invaluable.

B. Treasurer's Report

Jeff Jordan

Mr. Jordan presented the Treasurer's Report and informed the members that we are in a positive budget net income thus far with a profit of \$610K. He did remind the Council that this number will decrease as we move through the winter and spring playoffs as most of the revenue is generated during the fall season. CIF-SS exceeded fall sports budget targets by \$85K. As a result of CIF-SS playoff revenue sharing member schools will receive approx. \$691K. The overall message is that the CIF-SS is in a good position at this time of the year and that should continue.

C. Commissioner's Report

Rob Wigod

Commissioner Wigod that we are not sitting still and we continue to progress and push the pace. Mr. Wigod expressed gratitude to Brice Sunderland for working on the official fees committee and presenting a difficult proposal to the members in the room. Mr. Wigod also expressed gratitude and patience to the Council for working with the new electronic voting system. This was our second time using the system and most of the "bugs" have or will be addressed moving forward. Mr. Wigod informed the Council that we have several events and awards programs in full swing. Please review the CIFSS.org web site for additional information on how to participate. Mr. Wigod thanked Mitch Carty for presenting the budget and his work on keeping the organization financially strong. Last, with the passage of the new competitive based playoff system the office will be hard at work gathering the information required to set the playoff divisions correctly.
