## **LOYOLA AND SANTA MARGARITA CLAIM TITLES IN 25TH ANNUAL COMMISSIONER'S CUP**

LOS ALAMITOS – The CIF Southern Section is pleased to announce the top ten girl's and boy's athletic programs in the 25th Annual Commissioner's Cup.

On the girl's side, Santa Margarita took top honors by scoring 17 points in the manner of three championship trophies. The Eagles finished the year with a champion title in the sports of soccer, swimming/diving, and track and field along with a third-place finish in golf. This is the schools' record tying fifth Commissioner's Cup title.

Mira Costa's second place finish, due to a tie breaker, consisted of 15 points credited to a championship in golf, second place finishes in basketball as well as track and field, a semifinal appearance in water polo and a fourth place finish in cross country. Taking third place was Great Oak also with 15 points. The Wolfpack claimed titles in cross country and track and field, along with a semifinal appearance in volleyball and a third place finish in golf.

On the boy's side, Loyola added to their record with their eighth Commissioner's Cup title in the school's history with 25 points. The Cubs did so by winning four championships in golf, soccer, swimming/diving and volleyball along with semifinal appearances in basketball and water polo and a fourth place finish in cross country. The Cubs won consecutive Commissioner Cup titles from 2002--2004 along with five consecutive titles from 2008-2013.

By virtue of a tiebreaker, Great Oak finishes in second place with 15 points. The Wolfpack won three championships in the sports of cross country, golf and track and field. Saddleback Valley Christian finishes in third place also with 15 points. The Warriors won championships in football and volleyball along with a second place finish in soccer and a semifinal appearance in basketball.

The CIF-SS developed this recognition program based upon comprehensive excellence in interscholastic competition. The purpose of this program is to enhance the spirit of competition, sportsmanship, and goodwill among the student athletes and member schools.

The winners are determined by a point system that provides: five points for a divisional championship; three points for a divisional runner-up finish; two points for advancing to the semifinal round or a third place finish in a team-place finish sport (i.e. cross country, golf, swimming and diving, track and field); and one point

**COMMISSIONER'S CUP** (Cont.): for a fourth place finish in a team-place finish sport. In cases where a tie occurs the top ten schools were determined by several tie-breaker methods.

"We at the CIF-SS are very proud of these outstanding programs for their hard work and dedication that has resulted in success on the field and courts," said Rob Wigod, Commissioner of Athletics. "Their determination and teamwork has resulted experiences that will last them a lifetime."
