- The number of individuals advancing from the Freelance Events shall be determined by the size and strength of the field. The number advancing will be reviewed and decided upon by the Golf Management Committee.
- Individuals who advance will be placed as near as possible to a Regional Qualifier closest to their school of attendance.

Monday/Wednesday, October 28 & 30, 2024

CIF-SS Individual Regionals

- The top 24 players from each of the three individual regional events will advance to the CIF-SS Individual Finals.
- There will be a play-off, if possible, in the event of a tie for the 24th spot.

Monday, November 4, 2024

CIF-SS Division Team Championships

There will still be 12 teams advancing to CIF-SS SCGA Qualifier out of the divisions on November 7, 2024. The top
10 finishers in Division 1 will advance to CIF-SS SCGA Qualifier. The other 2 top finishers based on adjusted team

SUBJECT: Mandatory Use of iWanamaker (CIF-SS Golf)

DATE: August, 2024

The CIF Southern Section is beginning its first year of establishing playoff divisions by using current year data in almost all team sports. This includes both Boys and Girls Golf. All schools and individual golfers will be ranked using the data collected by the <u>CIF-SS Golf</u> app provided by iWanamaker. Over the past two years, the Southern Section has encouraged the use of the app during the regular season while making its use mandatory during playoff competition. **Starting this year, it is mandatory that all golfers at all CIF Southern Section Schools use the <u>CIF-SS Golf</u> app (iWanamaker) to keep score during or immediately after matches. This will allow schools and individual golfers to establish their ranking within the Southern Section in preparation for** *Divisional Placement* **at the end of the season. Schools and/or golfers who do not use the <u>CIF-SS Golf</u> app will not be placed into a playoff division and will be ineligible to participate in the CIF Southern Section Championships.**

To get you started, I want to bring a few things to your attention regarding the iWanamaker platform and the CIF-SS Golf app. Registering as a Golf Coach, Athletic Director, golfer, or spectator is done with the CIF-SS Golf app (not the iWanamaker app) from the app store and is free of charge for Athletic Directors, coaches, golfers and media members. Athletic Directors, coaches and golfers are added automatically to their respective schools when they get the CIF-SS Golf app from the app store. Install the app and during the registration process you will be added to your school with the correct role.

Coaches, after signing up using the CIF-SS Golf App, you will go to <u>https://iwanamaker.com</u> to manage your schedule and roster. To navigate to your school, you can click on LEAGUES, then CIF-Southern Section to find your school.

Please confirm all existing registered golfers are using the CIF-SS Golf app and have downloaded the latest version of the app and logged in to make sure they have access to iWanamaker.

You will want to get the events you are hosting created as soon as possible and get your golfers to start scoring their first event so they will have an IWR to be ranked. If you have not created an event yet, please watch the 6-minute tutorial on how to create and set up a match. There are All New Tutorials on the Help page, and we will be offering training on the IWanamaker Platform and the new features that have been added. Look for that to be scheduled in the near future.

Parents can purchase a ticket to follow their golfer and have access to the live leaderboard, stats, rankings and more! to get started they can go to iwanamaker.com on their computer to signup for an account. Once they navigate to their league they can select `Store' from the Menu on the left to purchase a ticket package. To purchase ticket packages from the AiA app, signup for an account, select events and select a specific event. They will then be prompted to purchase a ticket. 

2024 GIRLS STRENGTH OF LEAGUE FOR INDIVIDUAL ENTRIES

Updated 9/3/2024

The number of Individual entries allotted for each league will be determined by using individual and/or team rankings from the CIF-SS Golf (iWanamaker) app as of Friday, October 18, 2024. The formula will be designed in order to enter a total of 330-360 players assigned to the three individual regional sites with a range of 3 - 12 entries per league. The playoff bulletin will be updated by Monday, October 21, 2024, indicating the number of league entries per league and the regional site for which each league is assigned to compete. Every effort will be made to assign leagues geographically, but competitive equity will play a role in the assignment of leagues to the regional sites.

In determining the strength of each league and allotment of individual CIF-SS entries per league, the process will be as follows:

Each participating league will be given three (3) automatic entries into the CIF Southern Section Individual Championship tournaments. Remaining openings will be distributed based upon league strength. League strength is determined by establishing the number of players each league has that are ranked using CIF-SS Golf (iWanamaker) rankings and are in the top 360 players in the CIF-SS. For example, if League "A" has seven (7) players ranked in the top 360, they will be allotted an additional four (4) entries (added to the initial three (3) entries). Please note leagues will be capped at a maximum of 12 entries into the individual tournaments. ***Any remaining open spots will be given to the next highest ranked league with less than 12 entries.

GIRLS TEAM QUALIFYING CRITERIA:

Qualification into CIF-SS Divisionals:

- 1. The recognized league champion from each league will be guaranteed entry in the championship tournament.
- 2. All additional team entries are required to submit their At Large entry consideration.
- 3. Teams will be placed into their appropriate division based on current year rankings through the CIF-SS golf (iWanamaker) app.
- 4. At Large entries will be considered based on their CIF-SS Golf (iWanamaker) rankings, filling divisions to 20 teams (18 for Division 5).
- 5. All scores from throughout the season MUST be in the CIF-SS Golf (iWanamaker) app in order to be eligible for championship competition.
- 6. Teams/Leagues using seven (7) score five (5) in matches need to rank players in the CIF-SS Golf (iWanamaker) app.
- 7. There will be 5 divisions based on competitive equity.

Qualification to CIF-SS SCGA Qualifier

- 1. There will be 12 teams advancing to CIF-SS SCGA Qualifier out of the divisions.
- 2. The top 10 finishers in Division 1 will advance to CIF-SS SCGA Qualifier.
- The other 2 top finishers based on <u>adjusted team handicap</u> from the CIF-SS championships at each divisional will fill the remaining spots. (WINNING THE CHAMPIONSHIP FROM DIVISION 2, 3, 4, and 5 DOES NOT AUTOMATICALLY QUALIFY YOU FOR CIF-SS SCGA Qualifier) All 12 teams could hypothetically advance from Division 1.

On the left column, click on Forms, Tennis Indv/Golf Forms. On the next page, choose Golf Individual/Team then click Add New Entry. On the next page, fill out all the requested information. Once all information is verified and completed, click on submit. Tutorials for completing your entries are located under the "Help" tab at <u>www.cifsshome.org</u>. The CIF Southern Section office requests that you make every effort to get your results in early so we may distribute the entries to the tournament managers in a timely manner.

Note: The Golf Advisory Committee has determined that best scores must follow USGA scoring rules. Therefore, no league amended rules (such as double par scoring, using Model Local Rule E-5, playing out of bounds and lost ball as a lateral hazard, etc) or modified scores will be allowed for best scores.

AT-LARGE ENTRIES

*At-large petitions will be accepted for consideration of entry into a team divisional tournament on a space available basis. At-large entry petitions must be completed, forwarded, and received by the CIF Southern Section office by <u>9:00 a.m.,</u> <u>Friday, October 25, 2024.</u> LATE SUBMISSIONS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.

Teams may submit at-large petitions for consideration. Teams will be selected from submitted petitions **based upon space** availability in a particular division. Selection of teams will be made based on the rankings in the CIF-SS Golf (iWanamaker) app. All scores MUST be in CIF-SS Golf (iWanamaker) in order to be considered for post season play.

Schools will be notified of acceptance and placement by 12:00 p.m. on the day after the entries are due either by email or posting on the cifss.org website sports page.

FREELANCE

Schools that do <u>not</u> belong to a girls' golf league (leagues do <u>not</u> field girls golf and do <u>not</u> hold a girls golf league qualifying tournament) or individuals whose schools do not offer team golf may apply for Freelance status. By the start date of the season, coaches must submit an email stating their intent to participate Freelance, along with the schedule of matches/tournaments for their team. The email should be sent to Commissioner Mike West's office at <u>sharonh@cifss.org</u>.

TEAM Qualifications: A team must submit their best scores for any matches during the season. If a team has met the qualifications and is the only team participating in the Team Freelance Tournament, they will automatically advance to a Team Divisional Tournament. The school will have the ability to enter two individual golfers from their team into the individual Freelance Tournament.

INDIVIDUAL Qualifications: A maximum of two individuals can be entered from one school. For the 2024-25 season, it is recommended that individuals must have an established index of **15** or better or scores of 42 or better on a par 36 for nine consecutive holes. The scores must be VERIFIED and accumulated within the regular season of play.

Freelance entry petitions must be completed, forwarded, and received by the CIF Southern Section office by <u>9:00 a.m.</u>, <u>Friday, October 4, 2024.</u> The committee will review all petitions and selection for the tournament will be made; notification of acceptance into the Freelance Tournament will be made by a committee member.

ALTERNATES FOR CIF-SS INDIVIDUAL FINALS

Each CIF-SS Individual Regional will declare a maximum of two alternates. These alternates may gain entry into the CIF-SS Individual Finals only if a player who qualified for the event from their regional notifies the CIF Southern Section Office in advance that they will not be able to compete.

Players who qualify for the CIF-SS Individual Finals, and are not able to compete, must notify the CIF Southern Section Office by 12:00 p.m. on the day prior to the CIF-SS Individual Finals so that an alternate may be put in their place. For the Fall 2024 Girls Season, the office must be notified by 12:00 p.m. on Wednesday, November 6, 2024.

Alternates are not to show up at the CIF-SS Individual Finals unless they were notified in advance by the CIF Southern Section Office that a spot in the event was awarded to them.

DECLARATION OF ALTERNATES AT THE CIF INDIVIDUAL REGIONALS

The two alternates will be declared using the following procedure:

• If a player was eliminated from a sudden death playoff that was used to determine the final qualifying spots, his/her scores from the sudden death playoff should be considered first when declaring alternate spots.

Examples:

- Players A, B, and C are playing a sudden death playoff for the final qualifying spot. On the first playoff hole, A makes 3, B makes 4, and C makes 5. Player A has earned the automatic qualifying spot, player B is the first alternate, and player C is the second alternate.
- Players A, B, C, and D are playing a sudden death playoff for the final qualifying spot. On the first playoff hole, A makes 3, B makes 4, C makes 4, and D makes 5. Player A has earned the automatic qualifying spot. The sudden death playoff does not continue, and the card-off procedure listed below is used to determine the order of the alternates between players B and C.
- A sudden death playoff will not be conducted or continue for the sole purpose of determining alternates.
- Alternates will be declared using the USGA recommended card-off procedure (holes 10-18, 13-18, 16-18, 18).

ROSTERS AND ELIGIBILITY LISTS

Each <u>GOLF COACH</u> must submit a roster of players in CIFSS Home. The eligibility list is automatically created upon submission of the roster and no further action is needed.

ENTRY FEES

The entry fees must be received by the CIF-SS office <u>before participation in any tournament</u>. This year all fees are to <u>be paid through cifsshome.org</u>. Go to Forms, Golf Tournament. From there you will pick the tournament for which you are paying the fees. Once completed, an invoice will be created. You will have the option to pay by credit card or school check. No fees will be collected at any of the tournament sites. All fees are to come directly to the CIF Southern Section office through cifsshome.org or via check mailed to the attention of Sharon Hodge. Checks are made payable to CIF Southern Section. Fees are charged for every tournament a player/team is entered in. The fees are listed below:

SCORING AND TIES

Teams will consist of **six** players with the best **five** scores counted to determine the winners. Players are reminded to check their scorecards, hole by hole, prior to signing and turning them in at the conclusion of play. Scorecards should be marked with the number of strokes taken per hole.

It is **not** allowed to use alternative scores (i.e. double par pick up or 3-5-7) for qualifying scores.

Scores of the 6th player will be used to break ties for the second and final team qualifying positions at each divisional. If a tie still exists, a playoff, if possible, of those teams will follow immediately. Otherwise, a card off will be used. All six players will participate with all six scores totaled after each hole.

PROCEDURE FOR END OF COMPETITION

- 1. Players are responsible for verifying the hole by hole scores on their score card prior to turning it in to the Official Scorecard Box. Once the score card is turned in, it is deemed official. The player is not responsible for the addition of the total score.
- 2. Each player will turn in their own score card with two (2) signatures to the Official Scorecard Box or as directed in pre-round instructions.
- 3. The competition is officially over when the scores have been posted, the order of finish has been established and the awards have been presented. No inquiries or contesting of results will be considered after that time.

These rules will be in effect for all CIF Southern Section post season play. It is strongly recommended that leagues adopt this policy for the sake of consistency in the conduct of matches by CIF Southern Section member schools.

PULL CARTS AND DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES (Limited Allowance)

All players may use pull carts.

Players may obtain distance information by use of a distance-measuring device. If, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance-measuring device to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g. elevation changes, wind speed, etc.), the player is in breach of Rule 4-3. Any questions about such devices should be resolved before the start of the stipulated round.

The penalty for breach of this rule 4.3 is a two-stroke penalty, any subsequent offense related or unrelated to the first breach is disqualification.

The use of wireless handheld devices (smart phones) on the golf course is prohibited by players for any reason other than updating scoring, acquiring distance from the hole, and can only be used for those purposes between the green and the next tee. Air pods are not allowed. Coaches and Spectators will be allowed to text, email, or view scoring (if available). Talking/texting by players on cell phones while on the course is strictly prohibited.

EFFECTIVE 2019

UNDERSTANDING THE RULES OF DMDs

Beginning on January 1, 2019, distance-measuring devices (DMDs) are allowed under the Rules of Golf. Take a look below to see what types of functions on your DMD are allowed under the Rules.

WHAT'S THE RULE?

Rule 4.3a allows the use of distance-measuring devices so long as the player does not access any information that is prohibited under this Rule (details below). The first breach of this Rule means the player gets a loss of hole penalty in match play or a two-stroke penalty in stroke play. A second breach of Rule 4.3 during the same round results in disqualification. NOTE: A golf course or the Committee in charge of a competition does have the option to prohibit the use of distance-measuring devices by Local Rule.


TYPES OF DEVICES



PLAYER ACTIONS

A player may use a device that is capable of operating a prohibited function, provided these specific functions are not accessed by the player during the round. "Access" is interpreted to mean that the player has viewed or otherwise used the information generated by a prohibited function, or the player uses a device where such output is displayed.

USE ADDITIONAL CARE

If a device is readily viewable by the player (e.g., the player is wearing a multi-functional watch) and information is being displayed that, if accessed, would result in a breach of the Rules, the player is considered to have "used" the information generated by a prohibited function, even if the player has not actually viewed it.





DRESS CODE

Players and coaches must be attired in a collared shirt, slacks, Bermuda-length golf shorts, or appropriate length golf skirts/skorts. No denim of any color is allowed. Leggings may <u>not</u> be worn alone but are acceptable under skirts/skorts/shorts. Any type of cargo or safari shorts with external pockets; tee shirts or tank tops are not permitted. Please be aware that some golf courses have additional dress code guidelines, which can be viewed on the course websites.

It is the responsibility of the coach to ensure that all players and coaches are dressed appropriately. Failure to do so will result in disqualification. Please carefully review the steps below that will be strictly enforced by tournament managers.

- <u>Step #1:</u> At sign in, coaches will acknowledge their players are appropriately dressed and provide a cell phone number.
- <u>Step #2:</u> If a committee member views a dress code violation, they will consult with tournament manager on appropriateness.
- <u>Step #3:</u> The tournament manager will speak directly with the coach, giving the coach an opportunity to have the player become compliant.
- <u>Step #4:</u> If the coach cannot or does not require the player to become compliant, the coach will be notified by the tournament manager that the player is disqualified

ACCOUNTABILITY AND STUDENT/COACH BEHAVIOR (Bylaws 503.M, and 2307)

Coaches and players are expected to exhibit good sportsmanship and fair play, CIF Southern Section wishes to promote appropriate student and coach behavior at all post-season events. See Blue Book Rule 503.M for information on player and coach conduct.

SUPERVISION REQUIREMENT

State and Southern Section Rule 503.E states:

No CIF team or individual shall participate in interscholastic or approved competition with any other team unless the CIF team is under supervision as required by the California Administrative Code 49032 (See also Bylaw 503.F). Additionally, see CIF Southern Section Bylaws 22.B.9, Bylaw 506, and Bylaw 123. **The supervisor must remain in attendance at all times.**

Those persons approved for supervision purposes are:

- 1. certificated personnel
- 2. certified coaches (certified credentialed coaches)
- 3. non-certificated temporary coaches (certified walk-on coaches)

It should be noted that schools representing the same district may send one credentialed or certified supervisor for multiple teams within that same district. These individuals have been recognized and are to continue to be recognized for registration and participation purposes because the district has assigned him/her the supervisory role for all students from its member schools.

This rule applies to those students who are not accompanied by a faculty representative and report to the playoff site by themselves or with a parent. Giving parents the supervision authority, whether in writing or not, <u>does not</u> meet the standards set forth in the above regulations. This also applies to parents who are the student's private coach but are not under contract to the member school.

Any student reporting for competition who is not under direct supervision in accordance with State and Southern Section Bylaw 503.E is to be denied.

A coach would be in violation of the rule if he or she dropped off their team members at the golf course and left the premises. A coach should always be present when student athletes are under his or her care.

SUNDAY PRACTICE RESTRICTIONS (Bylaws 310 and 2112) and COURSE DEADLINES

Course deadlines previously prohibited players and coaches from playing golf courses used for Southern Section post-season competition after a specified date. There are no course deadlines in effect.

Coaches and players must still adhere to the CIF Rule 310 which prohibits organized team practice on Sunday. Exceptions are granted only to religious schools who file the Declaration of Alternate Day of Respite form, which can be found at <u>www.cifss.org</u>.

No practice or instruction from the school coach of any type (team or individual) may be conducted on Sunday. If a coach is transporting players on Sunday to a tournament on Monday, the coach must notify the Southern Section office and advise the Commissioner of his plans.

What constitutes organized practice?

Organized practice shall be interpreted as meaning the association of a coach with team members for the purpose of learning or practicing the skills of golf. It is important to realize that a coach should also conform to the spirit as well as the letter of the rule. For example, a golf coach who is sitting in the clubhouse while his or her team is using the practice facilities or playing the golf course would be in violation of this rule.

COACHING AND ADVICE

Coach to provide instruction, encouragement and information to his/her golfers without interfering with play or the conduct of the event is allowed under the following regulations:

- Between the play of holes, a coach is allowed to communicate advice to his/her players.
 - Between the play of holes is defined as that period when an entire group has completed play of a hole and ends when the individual player hits his or her tee shot on the next hole.
- The communication of advice may not impede the pace of play.
- Coaches are NOT allowed to communicate any advice (verbal or non-verbal) during the play of the hole. A violation of this would result in the player being penalized under Rule 8 of the USGA Rules of Golf.
- Coaches who are in violation of this policy may be subject to one or more of following consequences from a member(s) of the tournament committee:
 - Warning
 - Limited coaching time
 - Removal from the golf course (coach may remain in the clubhouse/practice area)
- Only the golf coach as specified under Bylaw 309 may communicate advice to his/her players.
 - The golf coach is defined as the person who signs in the team at the event and is listed on file at his/her respective high school as the golf coach.
 - Throughout the competition, the golf coach must wear a badge identifying him or her as the golf coach. CIF will provide the badges at each post-season event.
 - Each school is restricted to a maximum of two golf coaches (head coach and assistant coach) who may communicate advice between the play of holes during the stipulated round.
- As a reminder, players are still prohibited from communicating advice, as defined by Rule 8, to other players at any time during their round. Any player who gives or asks for advice will be penalized according to Rule 8 of the USGA Rules of Golf.

Any head coach, assistant coach, or school employee who is found to be in violation of the regulations outlined above may be denied entry at future CIF post-season events and may cause his/her team or individual players to be disqualified from the event. The suspension and disqualification penalties are subject to the judgment of the Commissioner of the CIF Southern Section whose decision is final.

NOTE: Coaching is prohibited during CIF/SCGA Southern Regional and CIF State events.

ADVICE RULE

Please remind all participants of Advice Rule 10-2 (Advice and Assistance) in the Rules of Golf which specifically prohibits players from receiving any counsel or suggestion from anyone including their coaches, teammates, other players, spectators or parents. "Advice" is any counsel or suggestion which could influence a player in determining his play, the choice of club or the method of making a stroke. However, information on the Rules of Golf, matters of public information and/or Local Rules for this tournament is not considered advice.

A player shall not give advice to anyone in the competition. Verbal or non-verbal communication between coaches, players, parents and/or spectators that meets the criteria of the Advice Rule will be considered a violation.

The penalty as described in the Rules of Golf (Rule 8, stroke play) is two strokes. A player who witnesses a violation of the Advice Rule is advised to call the infraction immediately to the attention of the competitor. Event staff who witness infractions are empowered to call the violation and assess the penalty.

SPECTATORS/EVENT MANAGEMENT

If a course permits spectators, spectators should be confined to the cart paths and rough only. They should be well clear of the competitors and observe rules of etiquette when applauding or cheering a stroke or play. Event management reserves the right to remove unruly spectators from the course, or assess penalties against competitors who cause, encourage or promote inappropriate displays. **Spectator cart rentals may or may not be available; availability is based on the SOLE DISCRETION of each golf course.** Refer to schedule on page 6 of this bulletin for course information regarding the allowance of spectators on a particular course.

Rosters & Scores:	 Complete schedules are to be submitted to CIFSSHOME prior to each season. Update scores following every contest direct to CIFSSHOME Additional directions on accessing CIFSSHOME are included in this document.
TV/Web/Radio Rights:	Any TV or streaming webcast (video or audio) or radio transmission of a CIF-SS playoff or championship event requires a contract and rights fees through the CIF-SS office prior to the contest. The only 'exceptions' are: Games broadcast via The NFHS Network, Bally Sports West or Bally Sports SoCal.
'Official' Championship	Souvenirs : The exclusive vendor for CIF Southern Section Championship souvenirs (t-shirts, scarfs, pins, beanies, hats, etc) is our long-time partner <i>CIF T-shirts</i> . These are the official items sold each year per sport. You are likely familiar with their annual shirts at the finals. You can order team and individual items through them at www.ciftshirts.com .
Official Ball Required:	Only the approved official ball in each ball sport may be played by either school during CIF-SS playoff contests. Violation of this rule will result in loss of your next home playoff game. The current Official Ball list for each sport is included and available at www.cifss.org in the "Resources" drop down. This policy has been in effect since 2002.
Gatorade Only:	Only Gatorade jugs, cups, bottles, ice chests may be used or visible during any CIF- SS playoff contest. (No Powerade, Body Armor, etc). The only acceptable alternative is a plain-wrap or Igloo labeled products. This rule does not apply to the actual liquid distributed to athletes. This policy has been in effect since 1995.
CIF-SS on Souvenirs:	The 'CIF Southern Section', 'CIF-SS', 'Southern Section' and 'CIF' marks and logos are registered trademarks with the State of California. Schools may only use the CIF Southern Section marks on rings, patches and banners, by doing business with a CIF-SS licensed vendor. Schools may only use the CIF Southern Section marks on apparel and other souvenir items exclusively through ciftshirts.com. Schools creating items with CIF-SS registered marks from a non-licensed vendor will face sanction and/or will be required to purchase any unsold shirts/items at the Championship Final. A list of the currently licensed vendors for these products is included and regularly updated on www.cifss.org. Please note: The use of only "CIF" is strictly prohibited per the State CIF registered trademark. The "CIF", is not just the CIF Southern Section. Only those teams in State regionals, bowl games and individual sport finals actually qualify to use CIF without Southern Section attached. Any such use must be approved in advance by the CIF State office.

Host Site Requirements:

Playoff Tickets:	(This pertains to revenue sports of basketball, football and volleyball): It is mandatory to sell tickets for admission to all CIF-SS playoffs and championship contests. Through the CIF-SS partnership with GoFan, all playoff tickets will be made available online for digital purchase and presented electronically at the event gate for entry. Patrons can purchase in advance via gofan.co, via private links made available by the participating schools or via QR code at the entry gate of the playoff event. All playoff revenue will be sent directly to CIF-SS. Both the host and visiting schools will be required to submit a financial/expense report following each playoff game in an effort to receive reimbursement for game expenses and revenue share split in the case of a profit game.
CIF-SS/FORD Banner:	It is a requirement of each host school (including off-site) that the CIF-SS/Ford Championship banner be displayed at every playoff home game in football and the gymnasium sports post football season (or on the electronic signage where schools/ venues do not display banners). If you need a banner please contact jackieg@cifss.org
Gatorade:	It is a requirement of each school use only Gatorade product/jugs/cups/squeeze bottles during CIF-SS championship events. No other competitive product shall be used. Water can be placed in Gatorade merchandise.
PA Announcements:	As a host of a CIF-SS playoff contest, the CIF-SS announcements take precedence over the host school's messaging and must be read in entirety at each playoff contest. Home schools are the host of a CIF-SS event in the playoffs. For contractual requirements, please read all the provided PA's each contest. PA's for each sport can be found on cifss.org under the designated sports page.
Media Credential Access	: Accredited working media should be given admission to all playoff games by showing their CIF-SS Media credential.

EXTREME HEAT AND AIR QUALITY POLICY FOR THE CALIFORNIA INTERSCHOLASTIC FEDERATION

As per CA State Law AB 1653 and CIF Bylaw 503 K. Heat Illness and Air Quality Index Protocols, all CIF member schools must adhere to the CIF Heat Illness Prevention and Heat Acclimatization Policies as outlined below.

Extreme Heat Procedures:

The WetBulb Globe Temperature (WBGT) is a measure of the heat stress in direct sunlight, which takes into account: temperature, humidity, wind speed, sun angle, and cloud cover (solar radiation). This differs from the Heat Index, which takes into consideration temperature and humidity and is calculated for shady areas. The WBGT is especially valuable in environments where people are physically active, such as sports, as it provides a better assessment of the risk of heat-related conditions during physical exertion. The CIF requires that schools use the WBGT for the most accurate measurement.

Depending on your Category Region (see map below), it is mandated for the benefit of the health and safety of our student-athletes that practice/games be canceled, or delayed until cooler when WBGT exceeds these levels:


- Region Category 1 >86.2°F
- Region Category 2 >89.9°F
- Region Category 3 >92.0°F

STEP 1

Find your Region Category

Based on the following map, schools should select the category that best fits their region to follow the required guidelines shown below.

The majority of states fall under just one category or two at the most. However, due to its diverse climate across the state, California encompasses all three categories: light gray - Category 1 / medium gray - Category 2 / dark gray - Category 3. (See image below).

CIF Fall Outdoor Sports Acclimatization Policy

Given the extreme heat issues typically experienced at the start of the Fall sports season, heat acclimatization is crucial for high school athletes to help them adapt to hot weather conditions and reduce the risk of heat-related illnesses. The following is a four-step plan for heat acclimatization in outdoor high school sports:

1. Gradual Increase in Activity:

- Start with light workouts in cooler conditions to prepare athletes for increased heat exposure.
- Gradually increase the intensity and duration of practice sessions over 10-14 days.

2. Hydration Education:

- Teach athletes the importance of staying hydrated and recognizing signs of dehydration.
- Encourage regular water breaks during practice and games and always provide access to water.

3. Modify Practice Schedules:

- Schedule outdoor practices during cooler times, like early morning or late evening.
- Allow frequent breaks and shade to help athletes cool down and recover.

4. Monitor Athlete Health:

- Educate coaches, trainers, and athletes on the signs of heat-related illnesses (heat exhaustion and heat stroke).
 - The school will have available a method to institute whole-body cooling to treat a student-athlete with exertional heat illness, especially heat stroke (e.g., ice tub, "taco tarp", ice towels) which is easily accessible at all practice and contest venues.

Safety should always be the top priority when acclimating high school athletes to hot weather conditions. This plan helps athletes adapt while minimizing the risk of heat-related issues.

For All Outdoor Fall Sports

Five-Day Acclimatization Period. Preseason practice shall begin with a five-day acclimatization period for all Fall student-athletes. All student-athletes, including those who arrive at preseason practice after the first day of practice, are required to undergo a five-day acclimatization period. The five-day acclimatization period shall be conducted as follows:

(a) Participants shall not engage in more than one on-field practice per day during the five-day acclimatization period. On-field practices shall last no longer than two hours.

For Football Only

(b) During the first three days of practice or testing activity, helmets shall be the only protective equipment student-athletes may wear. During the next two days of practice or testing activity, helmets, and shoulder pads shall be the only protective equipment student-athletes may wear. Student-athletes may practice in full pads on the sixth day of practice or testing activity.

Air Quality and Sport Participation:

CIF Position Statement Sports Medicine Advisory Committee

Recent catastrophic and historical fires in California continue to raise numerous questions regarding safe participation in sport and practice for young athletes. This position statement serves as a resource to coaches, administrators, parents and students who have questions about participation in outdoor activity during periods of diminished air quality for California high school sport.

Healthy athletes are at increased risk for inhaling pollutants in the air. Physical activity increases ventilation and the number of pollutants that are inhaled are increased compared to periods of rest. During physical activity, air is often inhaled directly into the mouth, bypassing the built-in nasal filtration system. Deep inhalation diffuses pollutants into the bloodstream more quickly during exercise. These risks are increased if an athlete has a pre-existing medical condition such as asthma or a cardiac condition.

A valid and reliable standardized national air quality resource is the National Weather Service (NWS) Air Quality Forecast System. This system provides constant monitoring of ozone, particulate matter and pollutants with accurate and advanced notice to prevent the adverse effects of decreased air quality.

The key component of the standardized air quality resource is the NWS Air Quality Index (AQI). The AQI provides real time monitoring and alerts in response to changing air quality levels. Five different pollutants are tracked in this system including the following: 1) ground level ozone 2) particle pollution 3) carbon monoxide 4) sulfur dioxide 5) nitrogen dioxide. Ground level ozone and particulate matter are the most concerning pollutants for outdoor physical activity. The AQI is reported as a single number based on a scale of 0 to 500 with 0 being completely safe and 500 indicating the most hazardous levels of air pollution.

Consistent with this national reporting system and consistent with the National Collegiate Athletic Association Committee on Competitive Safeguards and Medical Aspect of Sport, the CIF Sports Medicine Advisory Committee offers the following general guidance to institutions seeking to make decisions about the appropriateness of practice or competition in questionable air quality situations. With recent severe fires within the state of California, both regional and statewide authorities have often established alerts to cancelling sport events or practices because of local risk. CIF recommends following these guidelines. If specific guidelines have not yet been provided, the following are useful guidelines consistent with NCAA and NFHS position statements on air quality.

- Monitoring of local AQI and associated air quality alerts, especially during times of extreme environmental conditions is recommended. Advice and monitoring is best done by the primary athletics health care providers (athletic trainers, school nursing staff, team physicians) who have training in such monitoring. Schools may choose to delegate this responsibility to a staff member with knowledge of AQI.
- 2) Member schools should consider shortening or cancelling outdoor athletic events (practices or competition) in accordance with AQI recommendations. Exposure to air should be managed more carefully for students with pre-existing lung or heart conditions. When the AQI rises above 100 schools should consider removing such athletes at risk from practice or competition.
- 3) At AQI values above 150 serious consideration should be given to rescheduling the activity or moving it indoors if possible. Prolonged exposure and heavy exertion should be avoided.
- 4) School Emergency Action Plans may guide the emergency care response in these circumstances and the staff should be made aware of this plan.
- 5) The Preparticipation Physical Examination for Sport will be used as a tool to identify students at risk for smoke inhalation exposure such as asthma, cardiac disease and respiratory disease.
- 6) Emphasize to student athletes that the wearing of masks, such as for protection against COVID-19 does not protect against exposure to hazardous air quality. Consequently, wearing masks will not allow competition or practices when AQI is at hazardous levels.

There are now validated online applications to smart phones which can track not only AQI in a town or city, but also AQI regionally near each neighborhood within each town or city. Consistent with NFHS, California Air Quality Board and California Environmental Protection Agency, the CIF recommends using the <u>www.airnow.gov</u> application for this purpose. The AQI may even be checked periodically during a day of competition or practice in case of changing conditions. The application was created with the collaboration of the Environmental Protection Agency and contains not only air quality data but also current fire conditions, webcams and email notifications consistent with local and regional up to date conditions.
