CIFSSHOME.org REQUIREMENTS

VARSIITY TEAM INFORMATION (ROSTER)

Attention Athletic Directors/Coaches: It is very important that you enter your entire Boys/Girls Track and Field roster into CIFSSHOME.org (no later than **WEDNESDAY, APRIL 29, 2026**).

Log in @ www.cifsshome.org (If you do not have a log in & password as a coach, check with your Athletic Director).

- Click on the “**Teams**” tab, click on “**Teams Manager**”, click on “Track , Boys or Track, Girls”, select “Vr”

You can UPLOAD your roster using the instructions below (1) or you can enter each player one by one (2).

Required roster information for Boys/Girls Track and Field is: First Name, Last Name, Birth date, Year, & Eligibility

(1) To ADD roster players one by one:

- Click on “+Add Players One By One” and complete fields required for Boys/Girls Track and Field.

(2) To Import a Roster using an Excel sample file:

- Download the [sample file](#) **and** delete the “contents only”.

- Copy and paste or type your roster information into the file as the contents and save the file to your computer.

- Only an excel file (**xls**) can be uploaded that is the exact same format as the sample file.

- Columns for information not required for your sport may be left blank, but the **HEADER INFORMATION MUST REMAIN EXACTLY AS THE SAMPLE.**

- Required Columns for Boys/Girls Track and Field are: First Name, Last Name, Birth date, Year, & Eligibility

- Click on “Choose File” to find your file, then click on “Import”

- To confirm the roster has been uploaded, your players’ names will be uploaded in the “**Official Roster**” section

- Click on the “Pencil” edit button next to the player’s name to view each player’s information.

IMPORTANT: Complete process for both Boys and Girls Track Rosters

VARSIITY COACHES

Attention Athletic Directors/Coaches: It is very important that you enter your Boys/Girls Track and Field coaches (Head & Assistants) into CIFSSHome (www.cifsshome.org) no later than **WEDNESDAY, APRIL 29, 2026**.

Log in @ www.cifsshome.org (If you do not have a log in & password as a coach, check with your Athletic Director).

To add additional users (Principal, Assistant Principal, coaches, etc) to your account:

-Click on “**Users**”

-Select “**User Manager**”

-Click the (+) in the upper right hand corner, complete the users basic information and click the **Submit** button at the bottom of the page.

-To give specific access to each user, click on the “**pencil**” **edit symbol** in the user manager for that person, scroll down to the “Jobs” portion and select their Job (Principal, Assistant Principal, Bookkeeper, Head Coach, Assistant Coach, etc.)

-To assign a user/coach to a specific sport, click “**pencil**” **edit symbol**, use the drop downs to select “Sport”, Level” and “Coach Type” as well as click the boxes for permissions that they should have.

QUALIFYING LEAGUE FINALS INTO DIVISIONAL PRELIMINARIES

DIVISIONAL PRELIMINARIES - QUALIFYING STANDARDS

Each league has been allotted 1 automatic entry per event for the Southern Section Divisional Track and Field Preliminaries.

1. The league champion in each event will automatically qualify. The athlete **MUST** have competed in the league finals and attained a time/mark in league finals. A disqualification, DNF, dropped baton, no height, etc. does **NOT** count as a qualifying mark and these athletes/relay teams will **NOT** be allowed to be advanced to Prelims
2. Second and third place finishers will qualify **IF** they meet the minimum standard for their event. That standard can only be achieved in the varsity league finals competition. In leagues with only four schools, there are only two total entries. Qualifying marks are available on the CIF-SS Website: <https://cifss.org/sports/track-field/>
3. Fourth place finishers and higher must meet the At-Large standard, available on the CIF-SS website: <https://cifss.org/sports/track-field/>

League Meet Managers are responsible for uploading results of their league finals to MileSplit by Friday May 1, 2026 at 11:59pm.

“WILD CARD” INCLUSION INTO CIF-SS PRELIMS

To be considered for wild card inclusion into CIFSS Prelims, any athlete or relay competing at their league finals meet will advance into the meet if:

- Athlete whose mark at their league finals meet is in the top twelve (including ties) for their division as published on the CIF-SS Prelims performance list on May 2, 2026 but failed to:
 - achieve a top three result at league finals
 - and/or failed to receive a mark that meets the “at-large” standard for their CIF-SS division at league finals

Coaches with individual athletes or relay teams whose performance at the league finals meet puts them into this situation should confirm their top twelve status on the final CIF-SS Prelim performance list on MileSplit on May 2, 2026 and contact the Prelim Meet Manager for their division with official results from their league finals meet so that their athlete can be included in the CIF-SS Prelim field as a “Wild Card” entry.

The deadline for “Wild Card” entry submission to the Prelim Meet Manager is **10:00am on Monday, May 4, 2026** following the submission of entries by league meet managers. **Anyone who misses the deadline will not be entered after that point.**

FREELANCE ENTRIES INTO CIF-SS PRELIMS STANDARDS

Coaches should consider the average of the last three years 9th place qualifier from the Divisional Prelims when making your freelance entry. An email from a school requesting entry for one or more individuals into the appropriate enrollment division should be sent to the CIFSS office – Jerryd@cifss.org. The email MUST come from the head coach and/or school athletic director include the following data:

No freelance petitions will be accepted after noon on Wednesday, April 29, 2026.

SCRATCHES (League Finals) - Should an entrant be unable, or chooses not to enter an event for which he/she has qualified, the following procedures are to be followed:

LEAGUE FINALS INTO DIVISIONAL PRELIMINARIES - The coach is to inform the CIFSS Divisional Prelim Meet Manager no later than TUESDAY May 5th at 4:00 p.m.

If there is an error in league entries (someone left off, wrong person entered, name misspelled, grade level, etc.), notification must be made to the **prelim meet manager** no later than TUESDAY, May 5th at 4:00 p.m. This notification must come from the league meet manager. League managers are reminded to send league entries to member schools in order to make any corrections prior to the entry deadline.

CIF SOUTHERN SECTION MASTERS MEET 4x800 METER RELAY – NEW FORMAT IN 2026

4x800 meter relay

For 2026, the 4x800 Meter Relay will be contested at the Divisional Prelims meets and will be a scoring event at the Divisional Finals meet.

The qualification and advancement format will be as follows:

- Teams must run the 4x800 relay at CIF-sanctioned meets (invitationals and/or league prelims/finals meets only) to achieve qualification times, which must be submitted via email.
- The verified top twenty-four (24) teams per gender, per division by the deadline date will qualify for their respective Divisional Prelims meet. A maximum of one(1) entry per school per gender is allowed (no “B” teams).
- Two (2) heats of the 4x800 per gender will be contested at each Divisional Prelims meet.
- The two (2) heat winners plus the remaining seven (7) fastest times for a total of nine (9) teams per division at each Divisional Prelims will advance to the Divisional Finals.
- At the Divisional Finals meet, there will be two (2) 18-team races per gender using combined divisions (similar to the combined-divisions format now used for the 3200-meter run).
- The four (4) divisional champions plus the remaining eleven (11) fastest teams by time will qualify for the Masters Meet, which serves as the state championship qualifier. The Masters Meet will feature a single-heat, 15-team final.
- Note: At all CIF-SS postseason meets (Prelims, Finals and Masters), the 4x800m races will be scheduled to occur in between the 200m and the 3200m events.

ENTRY PROCESS TO COMPETE IN THE 4x800 RELAY AT THE MASTERS MEET:

Participate > Submit Time > Qualify > Compete

1. Participate in any CIF-SS sanctioned invitational/meet in the 4x800 event during the 2025-26 CIF Southern Section track and field season of sport.
2. Submit your team's recorded time from that meet found on the CIF-SS 4x800 Leader List on the PrepCalTrack website (<https://prepcaltrack.com/>) for inclusion by sending an email to CIFSS4x800@gmail.com .
Times must be submitted via email no later than **Friday, May 1, 2026.**
3. Coaches for the top 24 verified teams in each gender in each division will be notified via email on Monday, May 4th that they've qualified into the Divisional Prelims; relay pool names (maximum of eight names) will be requested at that time. No additional teams will be added if teams in the top 24 scratch or decide not to run after declaring their times for the meet by the deadline.

FIELD EVENTS

Flights will be formed based on qualifying marks.
Example: Flight 1 - shortest qualifying marks; Flight 2 - next best group of qualifying marks; etc. to last Flight.

There will be a maximum of 6 heats in any event run completely in lanes. If there are more than 54 entrants, those 55 and lower will be listed as alternates. However, every attempt should be made to determine if anyone 55 or lower is a "League Champion" and if so, that person(s) must be placed in a heat automatically and someone else displaced.

There will be a maximum of 4 heats in the 800, 2-3 heats in the 1600, and 2 heats in the 3200. All distance races will be run in 2 alleys for the first turn. The fastest runner shall be placed in outside alley.

SPECIFIC FIELD EVENT INFORMATION

Athletes may be excused for a maximum of thirty (30) minutes to participate in another event. Permission to leave must be granted by the Field Event Official and the time the athlete left the event is to be noted on the Official Event Sheet.

DISCUS, SHOT PUT: (3 trials)

- Report Time: All competitors check in when their flight is called.
- Warm up Time: 15 minutes warm up period immediately prior to each flight's competition.
- Athletes must provide their own implements. Implements must be engraved with the appropriate weight. Implements will be weighed.
- Disqualified if not checked in at least 5 minutes prior to first throw of the athlete's flight.

LONG JUMP, TRIPLE JUMP (3 trials)

- Report Time: All competitors check in when their flight is called.
- Warm up Time: 15 minute warm up period immediately prior to each flight's competition.
- Disqualified if not checked in at least 5 minutes prior to first jump of the athlete's flight.

HIGH JUMP, POLE VAULT

- Report Time: ALL athletes report before the scheduled start time. Warm up will begin at that time.
- Disqualified if not checked in at least 5 minutes prior to first jump of the competition.
- Continuing flights of five alive will be used. Competition will continue until there are 9 remaining. In case of a tie, regular tie breaking procedures will be used. A jump-off will be held in the event determination of qualifiers is necessary.

National Federation Rule 4-3 pertaining to uniforms will be strictly enforced. All athletes competing must wear **THEIR SCHOOL ISSUED/APPROVED UNIFORM AND SWEATS AT ALL TIMES.** No other uniform or clothing may be worn during warm-up, competition, or on the Victory Stand. Hip numbers must be visible at all times.

SEEDING OF EVENTS

The lane assignments for laned events shall be: 5, 6, 4, 7, 3, 8, 2, 9, 1. All Tracks used in the Prelims have an Olympic turn and a common finish line.

Contestants will be divided into flights of approximately equal numbers. There will be a 15 minute warm up between flights. All athletes will have 3 trials with the top 9 athletes advancing to the Division Finals.

DIVISIONAL PRELIMINARIES INTO CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS

The (9) nine competitors with the best marks in each field event will qualify for the finals. In the running events, qualifying will be each heat winner plus the next fastest time to total 9 competitors advancing to the finals.

Note: All ties must be broken either by thousandths in running events or jump offs in field events for 9th place through 11th place.

SCRATCHES AND ALTERNATES (Divisional Prelims)

Should an entrant be unable, or chooses not to enter an event for which he/she has qualified, the following procedures are to be followed:

DIVISIONAL PRELIMS INTO DIVISIONAL (CHAMPIONSHIP) FINALS - Coaches of athletes scratching from an event are to notify Rob Dearborn by e-mail rdearborn@mrpk.org as soon as possible but no later than 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 12, 2026. The next best athlete from that preliminary meet will advance and the coach **WILL** be notified. The two alternates designated at each prelim should be brought to the finals and report to the clerk when that event is called. If there is a scratch, the clerk of course will insert the athlete in the open spot. When reporting to the clerk, the athlete should be prepared to compete.

FIELD EVENTS

The stadium will open at 8:30 am. All field event competitors shall check in by division at the event judge. Division calls will be approximately 1 hour apart to include a 15 minute warm-up. The exception is in the pole vault where the calls will be approximately 1 hour 45 minutes apart with a 30 minute warm-up.

Athletes are disqualified if not checked in at least 15 minutes prior to first attempt of the flight.

POLE VAULT: Two pits will be utilized at Moorpark High School.

ALL athletes must be dressed in a proper, school issued, track uniform.

National Federation Rule 4-3 pertaining to uniforms will be strictly enforced. All athletes competing must wear **THEIR SCHOOL ISSUED/APPROVED UNIFORM AND SWEATS AT ALL TIMES.** No other uniform or clothing may be worn during warm-up, competition, or on the Victory Stand. Hip numbers must be visible at all times.

SEEDING OF EVENTS AND AWARDS

Seeding for the **Divisional Championship Finals** will be based on the athlete's performance in the Divisional Prelims Meet. The fastest to slowest times in each running event will dictate the lane assignment. The formula for lane assignments is: 5, 6, 4, 7, 3, 8, 2, 9, 1. The 800/1600/3200 will be seeded from the outside in with the best times on the outside. The 800 will be run in lanes with a 1 turn stagger. The 1600 and 3200 races will be run in two alleys for the first turn. The 4x400 relay will be run with a 3 turn stagger.

The top 6 athletes in every event will receive a medal. The top two teams in each division will receive a plaque.

DIVISIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS INTO THE MASTERS MEET

DIVISIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS INTO MASTERS MEET - **Coaches of athletes scratching from an event are to report the scratch to the Coaches Corner as soon as possible during the meet. For scratches after the meet, email the Masters Meet manager Rob Dearborn at rdearborn@mrpk.org as soon as possible but no later than 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 19, 2026.**

The Masters Meet will have 18 qualifiers from the Divisional Championship Meets. The 4 Divisional Champions will automatically qualify into the Masters Meet along with the next best performances to get to 18 qualifiers. For field events, the top 18 plus any ties at the 18th mark, will advance to the Masters Meet.

Finishers 19 and 20 are alternates. The events will be filled, and those alternates will be notified during the week. If they are not notified during the week on scratches, they should report to the Clerk's Area when their event is called. Vertical field events will not take alternates if the entries exceed 18.

For track events run entirely in lanes (through 800m), there will be 2 heats for each gender with the fastest heat going first. For track events over 800m, there will be a single heat with 18 athletes.

SEEDING OF EVENTS AND AWARDS

Seeding for the **Masters Meet** will be based on the athlete's performance in the Divisional Championship Finals Meet. The fastest to slowest times in each running event will dictate the heat and lane assignment. The fastest 9 performances will be seeded into the first heat. The formula for lane assignments is: 5, 6, 4, 7, 3, 8, 2, 9, 1. The 800/1600/3200 will be seeded from the outside in with the best times on the outside. All three races will be run in two alleys for the first turn. The 1600 relay will be run with a three (3) turn stagger.

The top 3 athletes in every event will receive a medal. No team awards are presented at the Masters Meet.

The top 6 finishers in the first heat will earn automatic berths into the California State Meet. All other runners will need to achieve the At-Large qualifying mark to advance.

FIELD EVENTS - Warm-ups may begin at 9:30am, except as noted below

GIRLS DISCUS - 10:30 a.m. (Warmups may begin at 9:30 a.m.)

BOYS DISCUS - To follow girls

Note: Discus must be weighed and measured at the Field House prior to competition ALL athletes must be dressed in a proper, school issued, track uniform.

BOYS SHOT PUT - 10:30 a.m. (Warmups may begin at 9:30 a.m.)

GIRLS SHOT PUT - To follow boys

UNIFIED/PARA SHOT PUT – To follow girls

Note: Athletes must provide their own shots. Shots must be engraved with the appropriate weight. ALL athletes must be dressed in a proper, school issued, track uniform.

BOYS LONG JUMP – 10:30 a.m. (Warmups may begin at 9:30 a.m.) - GREEN flag pit

GIRLS LONG JUMP – 10:30 a.m. (Warmups may begin at 9:30 a.m.) – GOLD flag pit

ALL athletes must be dressed in a proper, school issued, track uniform.

BOYS TRIPLE JUMP – To follow long jump (Warmups may begin at 9:30 a.m.)

GIRLS TRIPLE JUMP – To follow long jump (Warmups may begin at 9:30 a.m.)
ALL athletes must be dressed in a proper, school issued, track uniform.

BOYS HIGH JUMP - 10:30 a.m. (Warmups may begin at 9:30 a.m.)

GIRLS HIGH JUMP - To follow boys

ALL athletes must be dressed in a proper, school issued, track uniform.

BOYS POLE VAULT - 10:30 a.m. (Warmups may begin at 9:45 a.m.)

GIRLS POLE VAULT - To follow boys

Note: All pole vaulter's weight and pole must be certified by the COACH at the Field Event Clerk gate prior to the event. ALL athletes must be dressed in a proper, school issued, track uniform.

LONG JUMP, TRIPLE JUMP, SHOT PUT, AND DISCUS

All athletes will have 3 preliminary trials. The top 12 athletes who achieve a fair mark in the prelims will have 3 additional final throws/jumps, to be taken in reverse order of prelim ranking. A time excused rule of 30 minutes will be used for a contestant leaving a field event for another event.

National Federation Rule 4-3 pertaining to uniforms will be strictly enforced. All athletes competing must wear **THEIR SCHOOL ISSUED/APPROVED UNIFORM AND SWEATS AT ALL TIMES.** No other uniform or clothing may be worn during warm-up, competition, or on the Victory Stand. Hip numbers must be visible at all times.

MASTERS MEET INTO THE STATE MEET

The top six (6) finishers in the first heat for each event will advance to the State Meet at Buchanan High School in Clovis on Friday and Saturday, May 30 and 31, 2025. At-Large entries will be accepted into the State Meet based on performances from both heats. See the State Meet Advance Bulletin for marks www.cifstate.org

Note: All ties must be broken either by thousandths in running events or jump offs in field events for 2nd place through 11th place.

SCRATCHES AND ALTERNATES (Masters) - Should an entrant be unable, or chooses not to enter an event for which he/she has qualified, the following procedures are to be followed:

MASTERS MEET INTO THE STATE MEET - Coaches of athletes scratching from an event are to report the scratch to the **Coaches Corner** as soon as possible, the same evening, after the athlete's final event. Once the Southern Section entries are submitted to the State, no additional scratches/additions are permitted. Any athlete entered in more than one event at that point is subject to the penalties outlined under the State "Honest Effort" rule if he/she scratches from an event. After scratches have been received, no openings will be filled in events that have 6 or more entries.

GENERAL INFORMATION (Divisional Finals and Masters Meet)

The Division Preliminary Meets and Championship Meet are considered under National Federation Rules as **ONE** meet. Coaches are reminded of Rule 4-2-1 & 2 limiting participation for each athlete to 4 events (including relays).

All competing athletes must wear a regulation uniform as specified in National Federation rules 4-3. All athletes competing must wear their school uniform at all times. No other non-school uniforms or clothing may be worn during warm up, competition, or in the awards area. **While in the area of competition the athlete must keep their uniform on. Area of competition includes the track and adjacent grass areas.** Jerseys will be required to be tucked into the shorts during competition. (Note: National Federation Rules: Rule 4-3-1 and Rule 3-2-4 (j))

All warmups for running events will take place on the grass field located near the stadium. Access to this area will be limited to athletes and coaches wearing identifying credentials. Members of the press with credentials may also be in this area for interview purposes. These interviews should in no way conflict with an athlete preparing for a later event. No member(s) of the general public will be allowed to enter the warmup field.

Runners must report to the Clerk of Course at least 15 minutes prior to the posted time schedule for their race or they will not be allowed to participate. Alternates should also report to the Clerks area in case of a scratch in that race. A loudspeaker system will keep all athletes informed of when they are to report. Hip numbers that are issued in the clerks' area are to be worn on the side seam of the competitors shorts. All athletes reporting to the Clerk should be in uniform, ready to compete on the track. **Coaches, media, parents ARE NOT PERMITTED IN THE CLERKS AREA. Coaches for Para/Unified athletes are permitted.**

In case of a tie in a running event, the run-off to break the tie will occur 30 minutes after the last running event.

The maximum length of spikes at all sites is 3/16 inch. All other spikes are strictly prohibited. All shoes will be checked at the athlete's entrance gate, the Clerk of Course, and by individual event officials. Suitable spikes will be available for purchase.

FinishLynx timing systems will be used with Hy-Tek results. All results will be made available online. In the Prelims, questions regarding the official results should be directed to the Meet Manager. In all other meets, the Coaches Corner will handle all questions regarding event results. Automatic timing to the thousandths of a second will be used to break ties.

Coaches are reminded that if an athlete must use an inhaler (atomizer) it will **NOT** be considered an illegal aid as long as a physician's statement documenting the need of the athlete to use a prescription during competition is presented to the Clerk of Course prior to the beginning of the meet.

The Referee and a Jury of Appeals will be available to rule on all non-judgement appeals submitted by the head coach of the concerned team. Appeals are to be submitted in writing to the Coaches Corner for Division Finals and Master Meets. Forms for appeals will be available from the Coaches Corner. The appeal **MUST** be lodged no later than 30 minutes after the results have been made available online. The Jury of Appeals will make the final decision regarding any appeal.

Awards will be given in each event in the Championship Meet and Master's Meet. In the **Championship**

Meet there will be medals for the first six place finishers in each of the four divisions and there will be team plaques for the winner and runner-up in each Division. At the Championship meet, the medals will be awarded in the field events at the conclusion of the event; and the medals will be awarded on the field for running events as soon as official results have been determined. At the **Masters Meet** there will be medals for first three place finishers at the conclusion of their event. Team scoring in **all** events for the Championship Meet will be:

1 st = 10 points	3 rd = 6 points	5 th = 4 points	7 th = 2 points	9 th = 0 points
2 nd = 8 points	4 th = 5 points	6 th = 3 points	8 th = 1 point	

No electronic devices will be allowed onto the track or infield areas with the exception of the pole vault coaching box. Any violation of the above rules may result in immediate disqualification and removal from the facility.

All athletes competing in all field events must wear a regulation uniform as specified in the National Federation rule 4-3. All athletes competing must wear their school uniform at all times. No other non-school uniforms or clothing may be worn during warm up, competition, or in the awards area. While in the area of competition the athlete must keep their uniform on. (Area of competition includes the track and adjacent field event areas). See National Federation Rules, page 24.

Implements must be provided by student-athletes. Management will not provide implements. Implements must be engraved with the appropriate weight. Implements need to be weighed and marked at the Master's Meet prior to check-in.

Athletes MUST also check in to the field event judge prior to the start of the competition in their division. Only those in uniform with identification will be permitted to enter the field. No coaches, media, or other personnel will be permitted.

Coaches and athletes are reminded of the National Federation Rule against athletes in field events crossing the track to confer with coaches in the stands. Coaches/athletes may meet only in the warm-up area south of the main stadium. Throwing competitors may confer with coaches only in unrestricted areas. Once an athlete has reported to a field event venue and checked in with event officials, he/she may only leave that venue to compete in another event or to use the restroom. During that excused time, viewing electronic images or video of current competition is not allowed.

The only exception would be where the field event venue/competition is in an unrestricted location. That would include a "coaching box, or off-field mixed area where athletes, coaches and spectators are allowed. Use of cell phones, pagers or other electronic communication devices is also prohibited and will result in immediate disqualification from the meet.

Field event athletes who are also in running events, need to advise the Field Event Judge of the running event and secure a release from the official. The athlete **MUST** report to the Clerk of Course when their event is called **AFTER** securing a release from the Field Event Judge. Competitors will be excused for a maximum of 30 minutes to compete in the running event and return to the field event. If the bar is raised in the High Jump or Pole Vault the athlete must jump at the new height. **The bar will not be lowered.**

The **Coaches Corner** will be located on the East side of the press box. Coaches should take any concerns to the Coaches Corner and express them in writing.

PLAYOFF FACILITY INFORMATION

FACILITY CLOSURES: As of May 3, 2026, no one other than athletes/coaches of the host school will be permitted access to the track and field facilities at any of the sites until the last competition has been held at that site.

INCLEMENT WEATHER - The decision to re-schedule or postpone the scheduled meets will be up to the Games Committee (Meet Managers and CIF-SS Administrators). Information regarding the meet will be distributed as early as possible to avoid conflicts with transportation and athlete preparations.

USE OF DRONES/DRONE VIDEOGRAPHY IS NOT PERMITTED. Drones are not allowed during contests at any level. Although there is not an actual State CIF rule against the use of drones, the FAA (Federal Aviation Administration) in its June 21, 2016, Summary of Small Unmanned Aircraft Rule states “*Small unmanned aircraft may not operate over any persons not directly participating in the operation.*” Based upon this federal ruling the CIF State Office has instructed our section to deem it a safety hazard and to not allow the use of drones.

NO DOGS/PETS ALLOWED INSIDE FACILITIES! Please ask all parents and fans to leave all pets at home.

SUPERVISION OF ATHLETES – Bylaw 503

SPECIAL NOTICE

SUPERVISION OF ATHLETES

The Southern Section Office has experienced a problem which has perpetuated itself over the past few years as it pertains to proper supervision and entry of student-athletes in the post-season playoffs.

The situation relates only to individual sports, i.e. CROSS COUNTRY, INDIVIDUAL TENNIS, TRACK, SWIMMING, etc. and the official recognition and registration of entrants at the respective playoff sites.

State and Southern Section Rule 503 states:

No CIF team (i.e., individual) shall participate in inter-scholastic or approved competition with any other team unless the CIF team is under supervision as required by the California Administrative Code 49032 and CIF By-Law #503 (F). (Additionally, refer to Rule 123.) The supervisor must remain in attendance at all times.

Those persons APPROVED FOR SUPERVISION PURPOSES are limited to:

- A. Certificated personnel**
- B. Certified Coaches (certified credentialed coaches)**
- C. Non-certificated temporary coaches (certified walk-on coaches.)**

(It should be noted that schools representing the same DISTRICT may send one credentialed or certified supervisor for three or four athletes. These individuals have been recognized and are to continue to be recognized for registration and participation purposes in that the district has assigned the supervisory role for all students from its' member schools to this one individual.)

However, the concern is for those students who ARE NOT accompanied by a faculty representative and report to the playoff site by themselves or with a parent. ***GIVING PARENTS THE SUPERVISION AUTHORITY, WHETHER IN WRITING OR NOT, DOES NOT MEET THE STANDARDS SET FORTH IN THE ABOVE REGULATIONS. This also applies to parents who are the student's private coach but are not under contract to the member school.***

PLEASE NOTE, THIS RULE WAS REVIEWED BY BOTH THE STATE CIF OFFICE, ITS GENERAL COUNSEL AND THE SOUTHERN SECTION EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE. IT HAS BEEN REAFFIRMED THAT THE INTERPRETATION STAND AS ABOVE AND THAT ANY STUDENT REPORTING FOR COMPETITION WHO IS NOT UNDER DIRECT SUPERVISION IN ACCORDANCE WITH STATE AND SOUTHERN SECTION RULE 503, IS TO BE DENIED ENTRY FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE COMPETITION.

As pointed out by the Southern Section and State CIF attorney, there are inherent liability problems when an individual competes in violation of said rule. Please review this rule with your staff in that it will be strictly enforced as per the above application.

 - One (1) ticket for each competing athlete. (student will need ticket to enter stadium to watch when not competing on track field)
 - One(1) ticket for relay alternate when alternate identified at league finals and submitted by league meet manager. If no alternate is indicated, there will not be an alternate ticket in packet.
