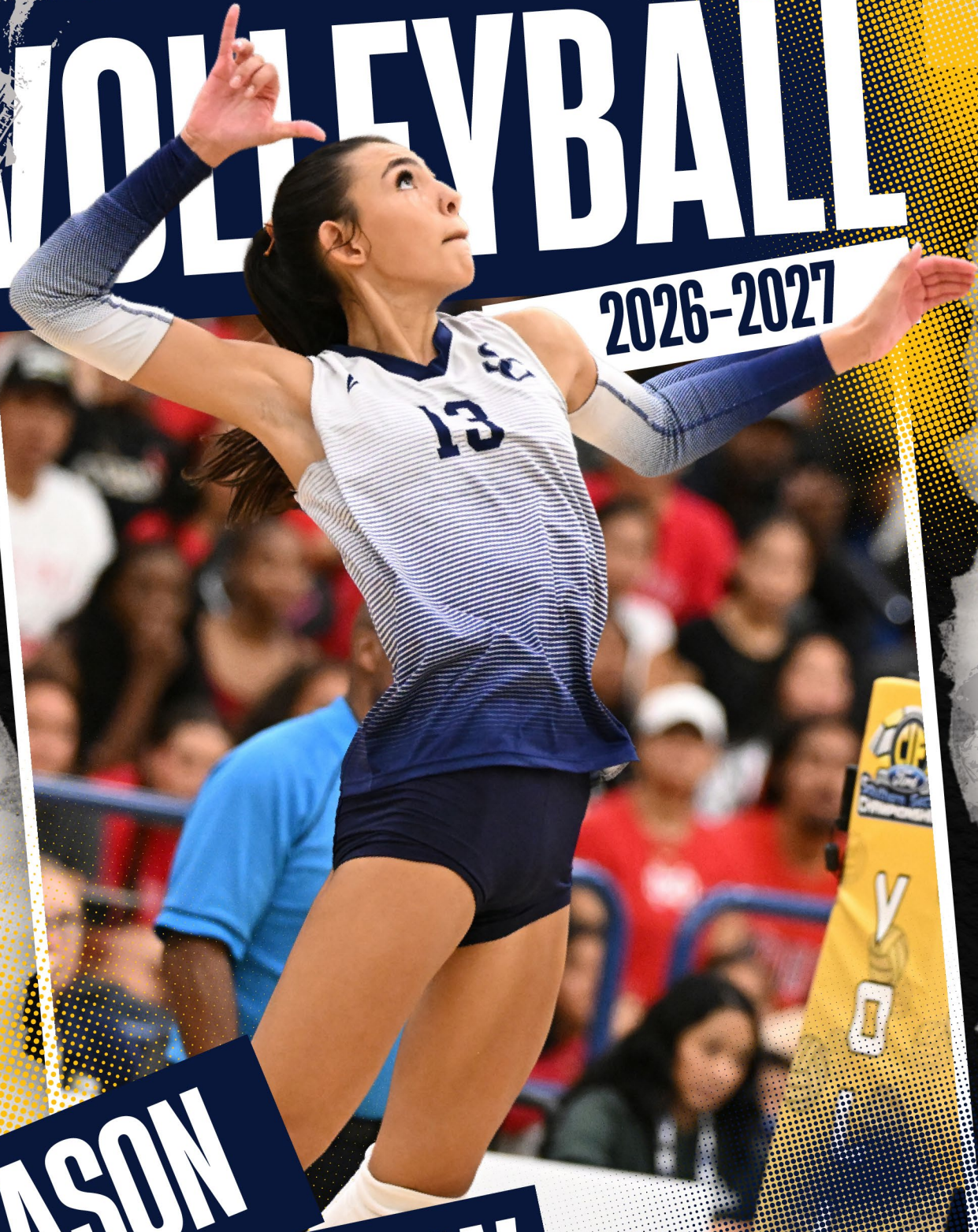

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CALENDAR DATES – GIRLS VOLLEYBALL

FIRST CONTEST	SATURDAY, AUGUST 8, 2026 The initial date on which a school may schedule and conduct an interscholastic contest under all CIF bylaws.
SCRIMMAGES	MAXIMUM 2 SCRIMMAGES ALLOWED Must be played on or after August 8, 2026, and before the first contest. Once the first official contest is played, scrimmages are no longer allowed.
SIT OUT PERIOD	SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 12, 2026 *Note: this date could be adjusted or different for each individual due to the date of enrollment at the new school. Check the “transfer decision” date for accurate information at www.cifss.org.
LAST CONTEST	WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 14, 2026 All competitions (league / non-league) MUST end on or before this date.

IN-SEASON RANKINGS

With the passage of the competitive equity playoff system in January 2024 and the changes to Bylaws 3519 and 3520, a weekly Top 10 poll will no longer be necessary. The playoff divisions will be created at the end of the regular season based on the current year's data.

It is **IMPERATIVE** that COACHES enter their full schedule and record results constantly throughout the season. Member schools that fail to accurately enter complete regular season results into the CIFSSHome system will not be placed into a playoff division and will be **INELIGIBLE** to participate in the Southern Section Championship playoffs.

For this season, the Massey Ratings System will continue to be used to provide our overall team rankings. The Massey Rating System was selected because it “connects” multiple teams via an equation. As more games are played, eventually each team is connected to every other team through some chain of games. These final team rankings will then be used to create our 11 playoff divisions for girls’ volleyball. All matches that are best 2 out of 3 or 3 out of 5 sets will be used to create a team’s final overall rating. The overall team rating is a merit-based quantity, the result of applying a Bayesian win-loss correction to the power ratings.

Final power rankings and divisional placements will be determined and released at the end of the current regular season. Seeding for all playoff brackets in each division will follow the final power rankings in the division, regardless of league affiliation or league finish. For example, in the First Round, the #1 seed, determined by the final power rankings for that division, will play #32, the #2

seed will play #31, etc., in a 32-team bracket. The higher-seeded team will host the First-Round contest, and then CIF Southern Section Bylaw 3504, Host Team After the First Round, will be followed for all subsequent contests.

The size of the bracket will be determined at the end of the regular season.

One Set contests (contacts) should NOT be entered on your schedule. Those types of events are not official matches as defined by NFHS Rule 1, Section 2, Article 1.

Matches that are 2 (two) sets should be entered. Those are entered because in a best-of-3 sets series, we have a winner by a score of 2–0. If there is a tie at 1 set apiece, a tie can be recorded.

At the halfway point of the season and then each week that follows until the end of the regular season on Wednesday, October 14th, we will post in-season rankings of all Southern Section teams participating in girls' volleyball.

Posting dates are:

- Tuesday, September 8
- Tuesday, September 22
- Tuesday, October 6
- Friday, October 16 (final)

CIFSSHOME REQUIREMENTS

To Add a game:

- On the left panel, click on "Events", select "Add Event", choose Game under "Event Type", choose date of game under "Event Date", choose **Volleyball, Girls** under "Sport", choose Varsity under "Level", type the opposing school name in "Add Opponent", choose the type of game under "Select Game Type", click on Home, Away or Neutral under "Location", choose "Start Time" Click on "Save" to add one game or "Save & Duplicate" for multiple games.

To Submit your score:

- On the left panel, click on "Teams", select "Teams Manager", scroll down to **Volleyball, Girls**, and click on VR to add Varsity scores. Click on the "Post Result" button, enter your team's score, and enter the opponent's score; the result should auto-populate with either "W", "L", or "T" based on the correct match score entered. If the game was a forfeit, click on the Yes box and enter the set scores in "Notes".

Make sure that your overall and team records are correct on your team page

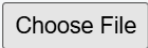

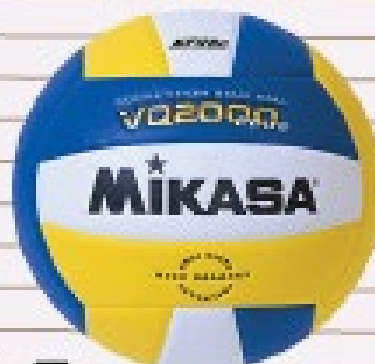

OFFICIAL BALL RULE

SHOULD A SCHOOL FAIL TO PROVIDE THE CORRECT GAME BALL, THE GAME WILL ALWAYS BE PLAYED. TEAMS/SCHOOLS FAILING TO UTILIZE THE CORRECT OFFICIAL BALL IN CIF-SS PLAYOFFS WILL BE REPORTED BY OFFICIALS TO CIF-SS AND WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO HOST THEIR NEXT AVAILABLE HOME PLAYOFF GAME. PENALTY WILL CARRY OVER TO THE NEXT SEASON IF NOT ENFORCEABLE THIS SEASON DUE TO ELIMINATION.



2026-27 VOLLEYBALL RULES CHANGES

4-2-1a, 4-2-1i(3) (NEW), 4-2-2: Libero uniform bottoms may be any color and no longer must match the team uniform bottoms.

Rationale: Allows more flexibility in the libero uniform bottoms while ensuring that the libero uniform top continues to contrast with their teammates.

5-5-3b(21): The second referee will provide a double whistle warning between sets at two minutes, 30 seconds (4:30 when intermission is used) instead of 2 minutes, 45 seconds.

Rationale: Improves pace of play between sets by notifying teams earlier to make their way onto the court for the officials to administer lineup checks before the final audio signal and resumption of play.

6-4-2, 10-4-3a, 10-4-3d: A team may designate up to two liberos, but only one libero can be in the game at a time. When a team designates two liberos and one is injured/ill, a new libero may be re-designated. When a team designates two liberos and one is disqualified; the team must continue with one libero.

Rationale: Allows more student-athletes to participate by creating an additional opportunity for coaches without having to utilize a substitution.

6-4 PENALTIES 1c (NEW), 12-2-8b NOTE (NEW): If non-playing teammate(s) (bench players) enter the court during play it is illegal alignment. It remains a conduct violation if a coach or team attendant (anyone not in uniform) enters the court while the ball is in play.

Rationale: More appropriately assesses illegal alignment (loss of rally/point awarded to the opponent) to non-playing teammates who enter the court while the ball is in play. A player who enters the court during play may still receive a conduct violation if they engage in disconcerting acts, disrespectful language, etc. This penalty realignment allows officials to appropriately penalize teams based on participant actions.

6-5-1: Players on the serving team are not permitted to raise their hands above their heads during service until the ball has passed beyond the net.

Rationale: Discourages player positioning during the serve that prevents the receiving team from viewing service contact and/or the flight of the ball and assists officials when evaluating the existence of screening. This change aligns with all other volleyball rules codes.

9-2-1 NOTE 1 (NEW): Players shall not wear any audio or video devices during the match.

Rationale: Clarifies the prohibition of electronic communication with and by players during the match and aligns with other NFHS rules codes.

12-2-8m (NEW): It is an unsporting conduct violation if coaches, non-playing teammates or team attendants use props on the bench during celebrations.

Rationale: Clarifies appropriate bench conduct for consistent enforcement by eliminating the use of props in bench celebrations while promoting sportsmanship and preventing disruption and potential safety concerns.

Libero Rules Adjusted in High School Volleyball

INDIANAPOLIS, IN (February 5, 2026) — High school volleyball teams will now be permitted to designate up to two libero players during each set, creating additional participation opportunities without needing to use a substitution.

In all, seven rules changes were recommended by the NFHS Volleyball Rules Committee at its annual meeting January 11-13. All rules changes were reviewed and approved by the NFHS Board of Directors.

Rule 6-4-2 was adjusted to allow for multiple liberos to be used by a team; however, only one libero can be in the game at a time. Prior to each set, a team may designate zero, one or two liberos on the lineup sheet.

“We have seen rapid growth in high school volleyball participation over the last several years, which has resulted in more highly skilled student-athletes and larger rosters,” said Lindsey Atkinson, NFHS director of sports and liaison to the Volleyball Rules Committee. “Providing an opportunity for one more student-athlete to participate aligns with the mission of education-based athletics.”

Additionally, Rules 10-4-3a and 10-4-3d now clarify how a libero can be replaced due to injury or disqualification and two liberos have been designated. In 10-4-3a, if a libero is injured, a team may replace the injured player with the player they replace on the court or the second libero. It may also re-designate a new libero.

In 10-4-3d, if a libero is disqualified and two liberos have been designated, the disqualified player may be replaced by the player they replace on the court or the second libero. However, the team must continue to play with one libero.

The libero's uniform was addressed in edits to Rule 4, with added Rule 4-2-1i(3) to note that the libero's uniform bottom may be any color while adhering to all other uniform rules.

The rules committee addressed the actions on non-playing teammates in Rule 12. Rule 12-2-8b was added to more appropriately assess when a non-playing teammate enters the court while the ball is in play as illegal alignment and penalized with a loss of point/rally. A coach or team attendant entering the court while the ball is in play is still considered unsporting conduct, and a non-playing teammate may receive a conduct violation if they engage in disconcerting acts or disrespectful actions.

Rule 12-2-8m was added to prohibit the use of props in bench celebrations by non-playing teammates to promote good sportsmanship while preventing disruptions.

Other rules changes include:

- Rule 5-5-3b(21) – The second referee will now indicate a second warning at two minutes, 30 seconds between sets instead of 2 minutes, 45 seconds to improve pace of play.
- Rule 6-5-1 – Players on the serving team are forbidden to raise their hands above their heads during service until the ball has passed beyond the net.
- Rule 9-2-1 NOTE 1 – No player shall wear any audio (microphone) or video (camera) device during the match, aligning volleyball rules with other NFHS rules codes.

According to the most recent NFHS High School Athletics Participation Survey, volleyball is the second-most popular sport for girls (trailing track and field) with 492,799 participants in 17,027 schools nationwide. In addition, there are 95,972 boys participating in the sport at 4,303 schools.

MEMORANDUM

TO: All-CIF-SS SELECTION COORDINATORS AND CIF-SS STAFF
FROM: THOM SIMMONS, ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER
DATE: JUNE 10, 2024
RE: 2025-2026 ALL-CIF SOUTHERN SECTION TEAMS

Per the previous directive regarding the selection of All-CIF-SS and after consultation with CIF-SS Staff, the following are the mandatory maximums as it regards team selections in all sports. The office will no longer provide certificates beyond the first team in any sport, and each sport will be allotted the following number of player selections for each division represented in that sport:

Girls' Volleyball 12 position players, 1 Libero, **1 MVP***, 1 Coach of the Year (13 w/ Libero; 12 w/o)

*** In each sport, the MVP must be included in the list of position players**

Each sport may alter their lists, except those as designated, as they see fit (i.e. select Co-MVP's) however the total number of players may not exceed the total number of allowable selections.

- Each sport may continue to select and honor a 2nd or 3rd team. However, the CIF Southern Section will not pay for those certificates, nor will the CIF-SS office release those teams to the media. Additionally, 2nd and 3rd teams cannot include the use of "CIF" or any variation of our name in the titling. Thank you for your understanding, and please feel free to contact me should you have any questions on this issue.
- Unless an individual school has co-head coaches on its staff, we will not accept "Co-Coaches of the Year".
- Any sport that does not conform to these guidelines will be asked to resubmit.

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HEALTH AND SAFETY

It is the expectation of the CIF Southern Section that your Athletic Coaches and Administration will take every measure to ensure the health and safety of your student athletes.

The following are key points of emphasis coaches should review with their staff and players in reference to CIF Southern Section rules and regulations in the 2025-2026 CIF Southern Section Blue Book. This list is not all-inclusive but only highlights key areas. For necessary forms and additional information regarding Heat Safety, Hydration and other Sports Medicine resources, please go to www.cifss.org and click on the “Sports Medicine” tab on the blue toolbar.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION

An annual physical examination, or a statement by a medical practitioner, is required for a student to take part in any authorized school practice session and/or pre-season conditioning period. This physical examination will be valid for a period of one year from the date of the examination. A student will be excused from this physical examination only if there is compliance with the Education Code (parent's refusal to consent). CIF Health and Safety Committee strongly recommends schools use the Pre-Participation Examination form that is endorsed by five major medical societies; American Academy of Family Physicians, American Academy of Pediatrics, American Medical Society for Sports Medicine, American orthopedic Sports Medicine and the American osteopathic Academy of Sports Medicine. All CIF schools must have school board approved forms.

CONCUSSION PROTOCOL

A student athlete who is suspected of sustaining a concussion or head injury in a practice or game shall be removed from competition at the time for the remainder of the day. A student-athlete who has been removed from play may not return to play until the athlete is evaluated by a licensed health care provider trained in education and management of concussion and receives written clearance to return to play from that health care provider. If a licensed health care provider, trained in education and management of concussion determines that the athlete sustained a concussion or a head injury, the athlete is required to complete a graduated return to play protocol of no less than seven (7) full days from the time of diagnosis under the supervision of a licensed health care provider. On a yearly basis, a concussion and head injury information sheet shall be signed and returned by all athletes and the athlete's parent/guardian/caregiver before the athlete's initial practice or competition. (Approved May 2010 Federated Council/Revised January 2015 Federated Council)

Question: What is meant by “licensed health care provider?”

Answer: the “scope of practice” for licensed health care providers and medical professionals is defined by California state statutes. This scope of practice will limit the evaluation to a medical doctor (MD) or doctor of osteopathy (DO).

STEROID PROHIBITION

All schools shall adopt policies prohibiting the use and abuse of androgenic/anabolic steroids. All member schools shall have participating students and their parent(s)/guardian(s)/caregiver agree that the athlete will not use steroids without the written prescription of a fully licensed physician (as recognized by the AMA) to treat a medical condition.

NOTE: Article 1-12.N. (Revised May 2005 Federated Council)

SUDDEN CARDIAC ARREST PROTOCOL

A student-athlete who passes out or faints while participating in, or immediately following, an athletic activity or who is known to have passed out or fainted while participating in or immediately following an athletic activity must be removed immediately from participating in a practice or game for the remainder of the day. A student-athlete who has been removed from play after displaying signs and symptoms associated with sudden cardiac arrest may not return to play until the athlete is evaluated by a licensed health care provider and receives written clearance to return to play from that health care provider. On a yearly basis, a Sudden Cardiac Arrest information sheet shall be signed and returned by all athletes and the athlete's parent/guardian/caregiver before the athlete's initial practice or competition.

Answer: The “scope of practice” for licensed health care providers and medical professionals is defined by California state statutes. This scope of practice will limit the evaluation to a medical doctor (MD) or a doctor of osteopathy (DO).



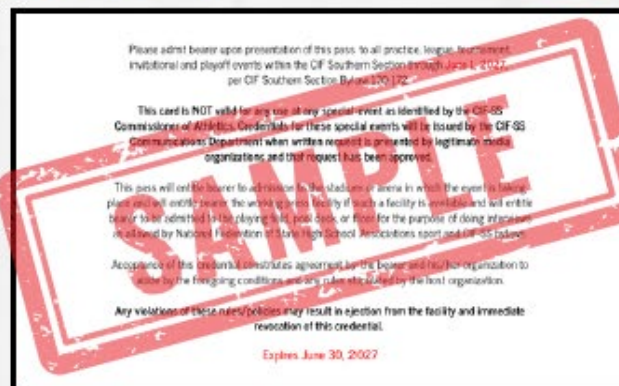

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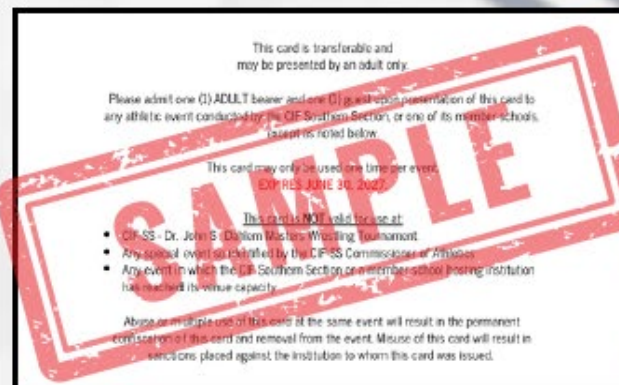
