THE CIF SOUTHERN SECTION LOGOS

The official date of the first CIF-SS logo is not known. The first logo found was 1927 on a medal...which is the same one that appeared on the official CIF-SS letterhead stationary in 1934. The original logo appeared on all the awards given to CIFSS athletes in the 1930's and still appeared in that format until the 1990's. Prior to the inception of the logo, the CIFSS just used the name of the organization for specific sporting. The initial CIF-SS logo was copied from the State CIF logo with SO. SECTION added to the logo.

There have been many different styles of medals, but they all basically used a form of the original design with the mountains, sun, bear, hurdle, high jump bars and discus thrower.



A modernization in 1974 occurred where the logo was now different from that found on medals. The new logo was underwritten by Bruce Hopping of the Kalos Kagathos Foundation. That logo was finally registered with the Federal Trade Commission in October, 1987.

In 1987-1988, a special logo was prepared for the 75th Anniversary of the CIFSS:




EVOLUTION OF THE CIF-SS LOGO



The original CIF Southern Section Logo (left), which depicts the California Bear and a track and field athlete, was first used on office stationary in the mid 1930's. A bronzed medallion of the original logo still appears on all CIF-SS awards. Development of the modern version (center) was underwritten by Mr. Bruce Hopping of the Kalos Kagathos Foundation in 1970. The logo was registered with the Federal Trade Commission in October, 1987. The 75-Year Anniversary version is at right.

In 1998, the CIFSS decided on a new logo:


