Mike West reviewed the proposed budget. There is a $10 \%$ increase in PERS, steps plus $2 \%$ for staff. Overall balanced budget. There was a motion and a second to approve this proposal. There was no discussion. Motion carried 20-0-0.
2. CIF State Executive Committee Nominations

Approved 20-0-0 STATE 585
Mike West reviewed the nominees. Traditionally, the vote is in support of candidates from our section and uninstructed for all others. There was a motion and a second to approve the proposal. There was no discussion. Motion carried 20-0-0.
3. Proposed Bylaw Revision 503.F -

Approved 20-0-0 STATE 586
Coaching Staff Payments
Mike West reviewed the proposal. The Commissioner's Committee is recommending this change. This asks to penalize the coach and not the team for violations of this bylaw. There was a motion and a second to approve this proposal. There was no discussion. Motion carried 20-0-0.
4. Proposed Bylaw Revisions 22.B. 9 \& 503.L -

Approved 20-0-0 STATE 587
Emergency Action Plans and A.E.D.
Mike West reviewed the proposal. This bylaw is required due to passage of a State bill. There was a motion and a second to approve this proposal. Mike West reiterated a story regarding an incident at a baseball game with a baseball umpire. Jeff Williams asked if you have an A.E.D. is there more certification needed for use? Mike West stated anyone can operate an A.E.D. if they follow the instructions on the device but most have this certification. Motion carried 20-$0-0$.
5. Proposed Bylaw Revision 2000.B -

Varsity Football Age Requirement Medical Clearance
Mike West reviewed the proposal. Sports Medicine Advisory Committee supports this update. There was a motion and a second to approve this proposal. Mike West continued that there was discussion at the State level, and this is only removing the one section of this bylaw. Loren Kleinrock asked if this puts the coach at a greater liability for the student. Mike West answered maybe, maybe not, as there is the same liability of any student. Paula Rodas clarified that students must get cleared to participate in athletics in general and the doctor needs to know it is for Football. Motion carried 20-0-0.

Mike West reviewed the proposal. The Commissioner's Committee recommended this proposal go forward for consideration. There was a motion and a second to approve this proposal. Rob Wigod clarified that the Commissioner's Committee is supportive of this concept being considered and moved forward. Mike West said it was sent back asking for clarification of a semester in good standing and other issues, which have now been covered in the Q\&A's. Motion failed 1-19-0.

Monica Colunga reviewed the nominations. There was a motion and a second to forward the slate of candidates to the Southern Section Council. There was no discussion. Motion carried 19-0-1.

Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal. The request is to raise fees $\$ 1$ a year for the next three years plus additional changes which are in the proposal. There was a motion and a second to approve the proposal. There was no discussion. Motion carried 19-1-0.
4. Proposed Bylaw Revision 504.M -

Failed 2-18-0
SS 592
Sunday for Cheer Only
Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal. There was a motion and a second to approve the proposal. Jill Matyuch is in full support of this proposal. Those who have written this proposal and are backing it are the only people it affects, and they will lose their most competitive events if they are unable to compete on Sundays. There is a claim that Cheer did not want to be part of this organization. Mike West clarified that as this is written, they can choose which event per year they will participate on a Sunday. Jill Matyuch reminded everyone that it included CIF Office approval. Monica Colunga added that it is unfortunate that Cheer did not ask to be a sport, but accommodations have already been made for them and that there is a larger audience that needs to be considered. Mike West commented that if the event was an NFHS approved event and this bylaw was just for that one event, he would be more likely to approve the change, but not if individual schools have the option to choose any event throughout the year, including events similar to the Sharps event that are not NFHS regulated. Jill Matyuch added that California is the only state that does not allow cheer on Sundays. This is for Traditional Competitive Cheer. Rob Wigod stated that these competitions do not allow teams to compete if they are not representing a high school. Dana Wilkerson asked if there are any other sports that want to play on Sunday? Rob Wigod answered that is has come up but mostly is the question of travel. Motion failed 2-18-0.

1. Proposed Bylaw Additions 1501 and 2603 -

Baseball and Softball State Championships
Mike West reviewed the proposal. This is a request to establish a State Regional Championship the week following the Section Championships. Not every section is on the same sports calendar. Rob Wigod mentioned this step needs to happen first in order to bring about the details of the events. This is a Central Section proposal. Dick Billingsley voiced concern as Volleyball Championships were after graduation and with schools moving their calendars earlier, it becomes a problem once students have graduated. Mike West agreed as his school's graduation is right after Memorial Day. Jim Perry stated that this proposal would be the same as Water Polo and Soccer with eight team brackets in multiple divisions. More details are needed to see what the Central Section is trying to work toward with this proposal. Carter Paysinger brought up the fact that with some schools being in session and some schools being out that this is an unlevel playing field.

## 5. NEW BUSINESS

A. 2017-2018 CIF Southern Section Audit

Accepted 19-0-1

Monica Colunga stated that the Audit Committee met this morning and accepted the audit. Mitch Carty reviewed aspects of the audit which showed a $\$ 115,000$ profit from the 2017-2018 school year. It was a good year considering where we were with the decline in ticket sales. Staff did a good job in cutting costs. There was a motion and second to accept the audit. The motion carried 19-0-1.
B. Financial Report

Mitch Carty
Mitch Carty distributed a handout that appears at the end of these minutes. He highlighted several items. Dick Billingsley stated that the Football Advisory Committee had a discussion regarding money coming in and may make changes to bring more in next year.
C. Marketing Update

Thom Simmons/Jackie Gibson
Jackie Gibson reviewed a handout that was distributed to the Executive Committee and appears at the end of these minutes. Outfront Media Sports has committed $\$ 1.9 \mathrm{M}$ which is close to the revenue share threshold at $\$ 2.0 \mathrm{M}$. Tik-a-Tap cost the state an opportunity at reaching revenue share when they filed bankruptcy. Thom Simmons commended Rob Wigod for leading the section into the OMS agreement and it is paying off.

Thom Simmons gave the report as Chelsea Heyward was not present. The office is ahead of budget in rights fees this year. There was a deal for Basketball with KDOC and this relationship has now turned into a contract for the 2019-20 school year. Talking with Baller TV to be our number three network. In social media, Instagram is performing better than expected. The playoff brackets garnered 10,200 likes which is ahead of where we wanted to be. Soccer received twice as many views as all other Winter Sports.
E. 2018-19 Southern Section Goals

Rob Wigod
Rob Wigod distributed the section goals and they appear at the end of these minutes. He highlighted several accomplishments to the Executive Committee. Loren Kleinrock mentioned that he appreciated the tone that the Transfer Rules Committee is taking. Rob Wigod continued that it is time to see exactly what we are looking at, for example, the SOP dates at the end of the season instead of at the beginning, a type of first-time transfer rule in an environment where valid change of residence and hardships have been tightened up. Monica Colunga requested that at the Council Meeting, Council members sit in their geographic areas to allow members to meet with their area representative from the Transfer Rules Committee and ask for input.

At Walnut Valley Unified, they are rolling out A.E.D.s throughout the district. It is fun to get to work with school sites.

This has been a difficult time and I appreciate everyone's support. The search for a new Assistant Commissioner will begin April 8, with applications closing on May 3. Interviews will be conducted in the middle of May, with a selection at the end of month and the new person starting on July 1. We will be asking for your involvement in the process. Dana Wilkerson will term out at the end of this school year, so we need a new At-Large Representative to be appointed. Would like to hear from you any nominations you might have for this position at our May meeting and the new person will be appointed at the August meeting. The new school's application deadline is Monday, April 1. Emails were sent to the Probationary schools for their evaluations of this school year and we will be asking you to revisit them. Along with staff, will be attending the CSADA Conference in San Diego next weekend with a session just for Southern Section Athletic Directors and then will be attending the CIF Federated Council Meeting the following Friday in Burlingame. Champions for Character, Hall of Fame, and Distinguished Service Award nominations are due May 1. The Champions for Character Golf Tournament is Monday, June 17, at Alta Vista Country Club in Placentia. Please be part of the day and we will have the In-N-Out truck on site for lunch.

## D. Executive Committee Member Reports

President-Elect, Mike West - AB 1592 is in legislature. For this bill, we are going to ask the schools to send their logo to be placed on one letter to show support. Roger Blake will send out the request to all schools. Glenn Martinez' primary goal was to create the Athletic Trainers Committee and has helped the community to have a voice and be able to provide feedback.
Mt. SAC Area Representative, Paul Lopez - Talked about the impact Glenn Martinez had on the section. His area is in the middle of Releaguing. Asked if 16 games are too many for high school football players.
Girls' Athletic Directors Representative, Jill Matyuch - It was great to be at the Women in Sports conference with the CIF-SS Street Team. There were excellent speakers and Nancy Kelly was great and authentic.

Citrus Belt Area Representative, Ed Kearby - The Citrus Belt Area is in their Releaguing cycle with 88 schools that are all unique in their own way. Attended the Basketball Finals at CBU and the venue was awesome for our kids. I agree with the question, is 16 games too many for these football players?
CIF State Federated Council President, Jim Perry - Thank you to the office staff for the grace they have shown in handling this difficult time. The posting for Roger Blake's position closes tomorrow at 4:00 pm. Screening is April 4, interviews are May 6, with the announcement of a new Executive Director shortly thereafter.

The Northern Area is also in Releaguing, and they are going to do Football only leagues. 8-Man teams will not vote on the 11-Man Releaguing.
Marketing Manager, Jackie Gibson - Have enjoyed seeing you outside of this meeting. Great to see Nancy Kelly and Dana Wilkerson at the Women in Sports conferences and it was so inspiring as they touched so many lives.
Assistant Commissioner, Thom Simmons - Went to all three Women in Sports conferences and they were all great. Sandy Gahring, thank you for honoring Glenn Martinez the way you did at the Girls Got Game event.
Assistant Commissioner, Rainer Wulf - We need to work at better educating our clients. The club influence in Basketball, pulling teams from courts, parents crazy on refs, coaches in flip flops and shorts is working its way down to the high school level. Our standards are what separates us from the club system. We need to continue to educate our schools on how we are different from that culture.
Chief Financial Officer, Mitch Carty - Appreciates everyone's support.
Assistant Commissioner, Kristine Palle - Thank you for the help with the new format for Soccer and presenting awards at the various sites. Teams were excited and it was successful.
Assistant Commissioner, Mike Middlebrook - Boys Soccer had a spike in red cards and six schools are on probation for it. The revenue was positive for the Finals and we sent money back to the schools that hosted as thanks for a job well done.
CSADA Representative, David Reid - Championships were run so well. Our area is Releaguing with 29 proposals to vote down to one, with that vote taking place on April 22. Credit to Ray Plutko as he set the rules that we still follow for Releaguing and they have worked for the past 15 years. The Audit Committee and our CFO do a wonderful job and is always done very well. Auditor says we are well run.
CADA Representative, Geniel Moon - CADA Conference was held a couple weeks ago at the same site as CASSA. CSC is so great, and our coach has brought them to a great level. Activities Directors meeting here on April 11 with Todd Arrowsmith as the chair. We will be discussing leadership building.
Superintendent Representative, Nancy Kelly - Rob Wigod's eulogy for Glen Martinez was perfect. Glad to have spoken at the Women in Sports Conference. Not comfortable doing this but worth it if I can help one person. My brother was there, which was a nice surprise.
Desert Area Representative, Jeff Williams - This group is into doing things the right way, with an emphasis and commitment to education-based athletics. We have an impact on people that will last a lifetime and doing it the right way has its benefits.

Stands were packed and the move to local areas was a good move. We have too many red cards and have taken steps to remedy and not let it happen again. Flying positions next week for full time athletic trainers on all of our high school campuses.
CSADA Representative, Sandy Gahring - Had 773 students at our Girls Got Game event. Baseball coaches donated $\$ 1,000$ for cheerleading mats.
Executive Assistant, Sharon Hodge - Thank you for your continued support.
Past President, Carter Paysinger - Rob Wigod did a great job at Glen Martinez' service. We need to get principals and superintendents involved. You can put rules in place, people will still figure a way to cheat. When many make transfers, need to be involved to better serve the communities and help the kids that have worked their way up.
