Roger Blake

Roger Blake, State CIF Executive Director, presented Dr. Keith Feder with this award. Dr. Feder was honored for his contributions in support of the CIF and the Sports Medicine Foundation. He has helped more than 40-member schools over the past 21 years in the areas of student-athlete treatment, training of doctors and ATC's and supporting schools to bring these professionals onto high school campuses.

The Citrus Belt Area (15 leagues) voted to elect Ed Kearby (14 votes) over Monty Owens (1 vote).

The Desert Area (2 leagues) voted to elect Jeff Williams (1 vote). Jeff Williams ran unopposed. One abstention.

The Foothill Area (9 leagues) voted to elect Ann Fitzgerald (4 votes) over Robin Torres (2 votes). Three abstentions.

The Northern Area (9 leagues) voted to elect Dave Hess (7 votes) over Dick Billingsley (2 votes).

The Parochial Area (6 leagues) voted to elect Steve Miller (6 votes) over Brian Walsh (0 votes).

The Small Schools Area (23 leagues) voted to elect David Parkes (20 votes). David Parkes ran unopposed. Three abstentions.

The Superintendent Area Representative is elected by the entire Council (96 votes). Reggie Thompkins (64 votes) was elected over Grant Bennet (17 votes) and John Garcia (9 votes). Six abstentions.

Discussion: Officials still need to do a better job on working to recruit and retain officials. Bryce Sunderland, Chair of the Officials Fees Committee, addressed the Council and stated that the committee did inform the individual officials groups that more steps had to be taken to provide greater opportunities for new officials to advance within each unit. These opportunities would focus on offering more assignments, higher level assignments and possible playoff assignments.

#### 5. NEW BUSINESS

#### A. 2018-19 Southern Section Goals

Rob Wigod

Mr. Wigod discussed the progress that the Southern Section has made over the course of this year in reaching the stated goals that were established in August, 2018. This included: use of social media as advanced by Chelsea Heyward, Digital Media Coordinator; CIFSSHome mobile version; new championship events (Traditional Cheer, Unified Track and Field); rule changes (sport calendar, number of allowable contests, SOP dates, international student bylaw revision); Administrator Summit Leadership Track; work with CIF Sports Properties; online ticketing; broadcast rights; CIF Transfer bylaws discussion; NFHS Network Pixellot program.

#### B. Transfer Rules Committee Update

Richard Shearer, Chairperson

Mr. Shearer gave an update on the committee's second meeting that took place earlier today. Items discussed were: current SOP Bylaw and any possible adjustments, VCR Check List and the plan to require schools to now upload all collected evidence of a fully executed valid change of residence. This will begin as of June 1, 2019. The committee also discussed current undue influence language and reviewed a new policy implemented by the Arizona Interscholastic Association that has clearly defined a person associated with a program. The question is could this definition be adopted into the current CIF-Southern Section Blue Book? The committee finished after having a brief conversation regarding participating in the same sport at two different schools in the same year and should students that transfer under the condition of a valid change of residence be limited as to how far in distance should the new school be in relation to the new home address.

At the end of his report each area was permitted 15 minutes to meet and discuss with their representatives any additional topics and ask any follow up questions from the report. 1 - 1

#### 6. REPORTS

#### A. Treasurer's Report

Dr. Jeff Jordan

Dr. Jordan announced to the membership that our current profit/loss statement showed a positive of \$705,160. However, the Spring sport months generally are the lowest revenue generating and we should expect this profit balance to be reduced. Projections point to a break-even balance at the end of the current school year. Dr. Jordan did note that \$630,445 in playoff revenue has been returned to member schools to this point. In addition, The Friends of Golf organization has donated \$47,000 to member schools that participate in its program. Finally, Dr. Jordan informed the Council that building maintenance over the next 1-3 years will begin at the section office and some of those items will be a new phone system, computer replacement, roof and HVAC repairs.

#### B. President's Report

Dr. Monica Colunga

Dr. Colunga reported to the membership that schools need to be aware of what outside programs are doing in your area and that how they operate is completely different from how our member schools operate in to student transfers. Students that participate in outside club teams can move from club to club with no penalty and when parents and students attempt this at the high school they are presented with our rules and bylaws. To alleviate this situation an outreach needs to begin at the elementary and middle schools, so parents are aware that the high school education-based athletics programs operate much differently than private outside athletic teams and groups.

#### C. Commissioner's Report

Rob Wigod

Mr. Wigod began by thanking the membership for their support with the passing of Glenn Martinez. Rob continued by thanking Roger Blake for his many years of dedicated service and congratulated him on his retirement and then recognized Sharon Hodge for her 30 years of service to the CIF-Southern Section. Rob thanked the group for passing the 2019-2020 section budget. He thanked the Transfer Rules Committee for today's work and breakout sessions. Mr. Wigod finished with a thank you to Dr. Colunga for her leadership, the Council, Executive Committee and the office staff for the hard work done each day for students. Several upcoming deadlines were mentioned: Champions for Character (due by May 1<sup>st</sup>), Hall of Fame/Distinguished Service Award (due by May 1<sup>st</sup>), CIFSSHome will roll over as of June 1, 2019 for the 2019-2020 school year and finally Spring Sport playoff entries are due coming up the end of April.

**Proposal Summary:** The CIF Central Section is proposing the implementation of a CIF Regional Baseball and Softball Championships to begin in 2020-2021 school year. This proposal follows the approved State Championships Master Schedule timelines for implementation of new events for consideration.

The event would allow the most competitive baseball and softball teams in the state an opportunity to compete at the Regional level. This championship event is proposed as a one-week tournament held immediately after the section finals.

#### ARTICLE 150 BASEBALL

#### 1500. PITCHING LIMITATION RULE - 30 OUTS

Sections shall adopt the following baseball pitching limitation rule: 30 outs and/or three (3) appearances in a calendar week through the season.

- A. The calendar week begins on Monday.
- B. Innings pitched in a no game (i.e., rainout, power failure, etc.) shall count toward the total.
- C. If the 30th out involves a double or triple play, the team will not be penalized.
- D. An appearance is defined as a pitcher pitching at least one (1) pitch. If a pitcher is removed from the mound to another position or to the dugout and later returns to pitch in the same game, the pitcher will be charged with a second appearance.
- E. Any violation constitutes a forfeit of the contest.

#### 1501. PITCHING LIMITATION RULE - PITCH COUNT

In addition to 1500 above, Sections shall adopt the following baseball pitching limitation rule with respect to pitch count and required days of rest:

- A. A pitcher may finish the current batter if the Maximum Contest Pitch Limit is reached during that at-bat.
- B. Pitches thrown and appearances made in a no game (i.e., rainout, power failure, etc.) shall count toward the totals.
- C. At the end of each half inning, the head coaches will confirm and both team score books will record the pitch count for all pitchers who threw a pitch in that half inning. In the case of a discrepancy, the home score book is considered the official score book.
- D. Each school must keep a record of all pitches thrown by each of their players in each game and make this available to their respective Section Office upon request.
- Any violation constitutes a forfeit of the contest.

#### **COMPETITIVE CHEER DEFINITIONS** 1700.

#### **Traditional Competitive Cheer (TCC)** A.

For all CIF Bylaws, Traditional Competitive Cheer (TCC) will be defined as any competition using or following the traditional competitive format. TCC coaches must meet education requirements and safety of Bylaws 22.B.9 and 1702. (Ca. Education Code 35179-35179.7, 49032 and 45125.01-45125.1)

#### B. **Competitive Sport Cheer (CSC)**

For all CIF Bylaws, Competitive Sport Cheer (CSC) will be defined as any cheer competition that consist of four quarters of play with a halftime in between the second and third quarters. CSC coaches must meet education and safety requirements of Bylaws 22.B.9 and 1702. (Ca. Education Code 35179-35179.7, 49032 and 45125.01-45125.1)

C. Competition Cheer (see A. and B. above) shall not be counted towards a school Title IX compliance unless the U.S. Department of Education Office for Civil Rights deems Competition Cheer compliant with its definition of a sport.

#### 1701. **OFFICIAL RULES BOOKS**

As per Bylaw 1201 A., the National Federation of High Schools (NFHS) Spirit Rules Book shall be the official rule book.

#### 1702. SAFETY CERTIFICATION OF COACHES

The initial budget is based on projections of a minimum of 45 teams in attendance. Based on conservative estimates of like events currently being offered by third party organizations, the number is closer to 60 to 75 schools per event. As this would be the first regional event of its kind, future projections would indicate that this invitational event would grow as quickly as the wrestling event grew.

- 6. Is the current CIF State Office staff capable of managing this event? The current CIF State staff can provide more than adequate management for the event. With additional resources available to the State office via third party sponsors, the staffing needs are well within the limits of the State CIF office.
  - 7. Is there capable staff available to support the CIF State Office in the operation of this event?

The CIF State office has a network of additional resources available to assist in the oversight and production of this event.

#### **Philosophical Criteria for New Events:**

1. How does this event contribute to the goals of the CIF (i.e. a new event may enhance gender equity, economic stability and enhance the awareness of values taught through sport)? With the addition of this event, the State CIF will be able to provide opportunities for cheer programs locally, while promoting the sport on a statewide basis. In addition to this, creating a state event will allow more CA schools the opportunity to compete at the highest levels without strain on school budgets, thus saving the schools thousands of dollars in travel and entry fees.

#### **Qualifying Participation Criterion for a Regional Championship:**

1. Do 50% of all CIF schools participate in the sport in the same? Presently, the number of teams competing does not meet the 50% rule, thus the reason for an invitational event and not an official Regional or State Championship.

#### Other Questions:

This event allows for continued growth of TCC, gives the teams an opportunity to compete in state, and gives the TCC sport a culminating championship in multiple divisions. These student athletes will be able to experience what a regional championship event is like and will gain an opportunity to enhance the values of hard work, teamwork, sportsmanship, and perseverance.

This event is scheduled to take place on a Saturday, following the same type of format used in other CIF events. There are currently non-CIF events currently happening throughout the state that teams choose to attend. Therefore, the potential loss of class time is within standards of typical school league play.

Although TCC does not currently have a dedicated CIF season of sport, the vast majority of the sections offering a TCC championship event are conducted in the Winter season of sport. In addition to that, many of the teams participate in the National Championships in February.

In choosing teams or individuals for an event, is there ay criterion such as demonstration of respect, sportsmanship, citizenship, achievement through effort and cooperation, full compliance to CIF code of ethics, rules, regulations, guidelines, etc.?

The event will follow all guidelines that are in place regarding selection and qualifying for the event. All participants are expected to meet all CIF rules and participate using the aspects of "Pursuing Victory with Honor" that has been established by the CIF.

A summer dead period must be declared by the <u>school district and/or</u> school principal for all sports. The dates of the dead period must be forwarded to the Southern Section Commissioner. The dead period must be the same for all <u>sports and</u> levels and must be three (3) two (2) consecutive weeks, <u>fourteen (14) days</u> between the end of school <u>in the Spring</u> or the last Friday in May, whichever is first, and the first day of school <u>in the Fall</u> last Monday in August. No class could be offered which could circumvent the rule. During the dead period, NO weight lifting would be permitted. No running or other type of conditioning would be allowed. There are no exceptions to the summer dead period.

#### **Dead Period Proposal**

- Fourteen (14) day dead period for entire school, all sports, all of CIF-SS Local control gets to "choose" to take their 14 days anywhere during the summer. Dead period would be published by district and/or site

#### **Premise of Proposal** –

- To return to original concept of a dead period in providing a break in the summer for all: students, families, coaches, administration, school, and facilities
- Multisport students would be provided the same rest period granted to single sport athletes
- This allows families to adequately plan and schedule vacation during the dead period
- School/facilities would experience true down time
- In long run, best for coaches/administration and their families
- Fourteen (14) days is two (2) weeks instead of three (3) currently, which logically aligns with the fact that summers are basically two months long now instead of three months, as in years past
- Flexibility of local control to pick your own 14 consecutive days that is during the summer
- With current rule of being able to start last Friday in May, many schools are still in school for a significant portion of their "dead period" so families are not getting 21 days off
- Reality is that most programs can/will take more days if they choose and fourteen (14) days could easily turn into additional days if district/site choose to add weekends on either end of dead period (still flexible)

#### CIF Golf Proposal - Council Meeting

Current Playoff Grouping for Golf –

3320.2 Boys and Girls Golf — Each year, Team Divisionals will be composed of leagues using the factors of competitive equity and geographic locations of leagues for placement into playoff divisions. The competitive equity of each league will be determined

by utilizing a system based on points accumulated by golfers from each league who qualified for Southern Section Team and Individual Golf Championships in the previous year.

Proposed Playoff Grouping for Golf -

Boys and Girls Golf – 3320.2 Boys and Girls Golf – Individual schools will be placed into divisions on a yearly basis utilizing a formula including the following factors (Previous years' team performance in the CIF Southern Section Golf Championships as well as league performance in post-season play). Data will be used from the previous 2 years to help formulate divisions. This formula will allow competitive equity to be the used in establishing playoff divisions. Each league will receive, at minimum, League Champions for automatic entry, with additional playoff spots available per league and division as warranted.

#### Summary

A quick view of the format parameters:

Boys Divisions would remain at 7 divisions, they would be formed utilizing competitive equity.

Girls divisions would remain at 4 divisions, they would be formed utilizing competitive equity.

### Division Ranking System: Teams would be ranked through the following formula

The teams will be placed based on previous finishes in CIF Southern Section Championships over the previous 2 years.

For 18 holes it will be: <u>(Team Total/5)-Course Rating x 113</u> Course Slope
