# CIF-SS COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

## October 1, 2019

### 1. OPENING BUSINESS

- A. Call to order by Dr. Monica Colunga, President of the Council 9:07 am
- B. Pledge of Allegiance

### 2. PUBLIC HEARING SESSION

- A. Recognition of anyone wishing to address the Council - Speakers must limit their remarks to three minutes. There was no one present who wished to address the Council.

### 3. ACTION ITEMS

- A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS - There are no State Federated Council Action Items at this time.

- B. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS - There are no Southern Section Action Items at this time.

### 4. NON-ACTION ITEMS

- A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL NON-ACTION ITEMS

- 1. Proposed Bylaw Additions 1501 and 2603 - Baseball and Softball State Championships. No questions or comments from the floor.

- 2. Proposed Bylaw Revision 1703 - Traditional Competitive Cheer Regional Championships. No questions or comments from the floor.

- 3. Weighted Voting Revision 2019-20 - No questions or comments from the floor.

- B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION ITEMS

- 1. Proposed Bylaw Revision 32.B.4.B - Releaguering Procedures - Matt Howell and Jim Vaughan (authors) members from the Raincross and Arrowhead Conferences addressed the Council with a rationale as to why this proposal was submitted. The proposal would allow schools that are part of a conference configuration the option to re-configure league alignments yearly.

- 2. Proposed Bylaw Revisions Sports Sections - Summer Dead Period - Anthony Soto and Jeff Williams (authors) representing the Miramonte and Golden Leagues addressed the Council with a rationale as to why this proposal was submitted. This proposal would require that schools select two consecutive weeks, a total of 14 days, during which all sports activities would cease, including use of any school facilities (no weight room use). This period of time would begin after the last day of school in the Spring and before the first day of school in the Fall. The decisions on when the Dead Period must be taken would be left up to individual schools to determine.

- 3. Proposed Bylaw Revision 3320.2 – Playoff Divisions for Golf - Kevin LeDuc (author) representing the Golf Advisory

Committee addressed the Council with a rationale as to why this proposal was submitted. Teams would be placed into competitive-equity divisions based on previous finish in CIF Southern Section Championships over the previous two years. Boys divisions would remain at 7, Girls divisions would remain at 4.

- 4. Proposed Bylaw Revisions Article 5, Section 54 - Commissioner Duties - This is an update of the responsibilities of the Southern Section Commissioner of Athletics that allows the Executive Committee to more properly evaluate his/her performance.

### 5. NEW BUSINESS

- A. 2019-20 Southern Section Goals - Southern Section Commissioner Rob Wigod addressed the Council regarding the goals of the section and the commissioner. Several of these goals are yearly while numerous are new for the 2019-2020 school year. All these goals are now posted to the public website and are available for viewing and review.

### 6. REPORTS

- A. Treasurer's Report - Dr. Jeff Jordan - Dr. Jordan announced to the Council that the annual audit will take place at the Section Office in October. For the 2018-2019 school year, playoff revenue was again down 6.3% and over the past three years playoff revenue was down \$502,460. Dr.

Jordan continued by announcing that broadcast rights fees and sport fees have been increased this year while no increase to playoff ticket prices will take place. Finally, 481 schools have paid their membership dues for 2019-2020 while 84 schools have outstanding balances as of today.

- B. President's Report - Dr. Monica Colunga - Dr. Colunga gave the Council a report on her attendance at the NFHS Section 7/8 meeting that took place earlier this month in Seattle, Washington. Dr. Colunga's challenge to the Council was to simply have a discussion on your campus with parents and students about what type of behavior is appropriate when attending sporting events.

- C. Commissioner's Report - Rob Wigod - Southern Section Commissioner Rob Wigod gave an update to the Council on transfer numbers noting that Valid Change of Residence transfers have significantly decreased in comparison to last year at this time and Sit-Out Period transfers have slightly increased. Next, Commissioner Wigod gave an update on the number of ejections that took place last year in all sports and noted that Soccer was the sport with the highest number of ejections. He has challenged the membership to look for ways to reduce this number for the 2019-2020 school year. Finally, Commissioner Wigod gave an update (See **COUNCIL MINUTES** on next page)

This can only be done if all the results are recorded by the end of the regular season. Finally, Mr. Wigod announced that 624 individuals are signed up to attend the Athletic Administrators Summit this coming Monday, Oct. 7, 2019.

# MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

## August 15, 2019

### 1. OPENING BUSINESS

A. Call to order by Dr. Monica Colunga, President of the Council - Meeting was called to order by Dr. Monica Colunga at 1:01 p.m.

#### B. Pledge of Allegiance

C. Roll Call - All members were present except for Nancy Kelly, Jill Matyuch, John Norman, and Jeff Williams. Monica Colunga welcomed all members and reminded them of the protocol of the meeting. She asked for the Executive Committee members to introduce themselves for Roll Call with their name, school, position, and position on the Executive Committee. Monica Colunga asked the Executive Committee to review the new Executive Committee Handbook and reminded them that they represent their constituency as well. Rob Wigod announced that Sandy Gahring, upon her retirement, could no longer serve on our Executive Committee as CSADA Representative to the Federated Council. He then welcomed Assistant Commissioner Rich Shearer to his first meeting and presented Ed Kearby with his MVP AD package.

D. Introduction of Guests - From Lompoc High School, Athletic Director Claudia Terrones.

E. Adopt Agenda - Monica Colunga made a motion to move Items 5A1 and 5A2 to before Item 1F1 of the agenda in order to approve the appointment of two members to the Executive Committee. It was moved and seconded to adopt the revised agenda 17-0-1. Monica Colunga asked for a vote to appoint the following Executive Committee positions: Orange County Area Representative – Mary Jane Hibbard – It was moved and seconded to approve Mary Jane Hibbard, Principal, Rancho Alamitos High School, as Orange County Area Representative to the Executive Committee for the 2019-2020 school year. The motion carried 16 1-1. At-Large Representative – Dr. Nancy Kelly – It was moved and seconded to approve Dr. Nancy Kelly, Superintendent, Upland Unified School District, as the At-Large Area Representative to the Executive Committee for the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 school years. The motion carried 18 0-0. There was a motion and a second to approve the minutes of the May 8, 2019 Executive Committee meeting. The minutes were approved 14-0-4.

### 2. PUBLIC COMMENT

A. Recognition of anyone wishing to address the Executive Committee. Speakers must limit their remarks to three minutes. There was no one present to address the Executive Committee.

### 3. ACTION ITEMS

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS - There are no State Federated Council Action Items at this time.

#### B. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS

##### 1. Releaguings Appeal Hearing

###### A. Northern Area

1. Lompoc HS (Football Only) - Claudia Terrones, Athletic Director from Lompoc High School, presented the case for Lompoc High School's request to change their area releguing for football only. The request was to keep the status quo and to not be moved to the new configuration. After the presentation and several questions from the Executive Committee, it was determined the biggest concern was travel as Lompoc feels they can compete in the new configuration but would lose class time and fan support travelling to away games. Dave Hess, Athletic Director of Ventura High School and Northern Area Releaguings Chairman, distributed additional information regarding the league alignments and fielded questions from the Executive Committee. After the presentations, Monica Colunga called for and received a motion and a second to approve the appeal. There was a discussion regarding clarifying what was being voted on and the steps to follow if the vote was to approve or not approve the appeal. Following discussion, there was a call to vote. The motion failed 1-18-1 and the appeal was denied.

### 4. NON-ACTION ITEMS

#### A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposed Bylaw Additions 1501 and 2603 - Baseball and Softball State Championships - Mike West reviewed the proposal. This is a Central Section proposal for 2020-21 to be held one week after Section Finals. Chris Calderwood reported that no one in his area wants this and Paul Lopez and Todd Arrowsmith agreed. Terry Barnum asked if it would be double elimination, and if so, would this affect Section Championships. Thom Simmons commented that both the Baseball and Softball Advisory Committees are against this proposal as there is no desire to extend the season that was just shortened. Mike Middlebrook added that although it is easier for softball because of the difference in pitching rules from baseball, the advisory committee is still opposed to the proposal. Thom Simmons said that our Baseball Championships are the toughest tournament in the country. Jim Perry stated that this has been on the back burner for 8 to 10 years now.

#### B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposed Bylaw Revision 32.B.4.B - Releaguings Procedures - Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal to reconfigure every year rather than every two years for associations/conferences. The original rules were written when we did playoff groupings every two years. Now playoff divisions are aligned by individual schools rather than by league, so changing every year makes sense. Maybe need to change Blue Book for associations having to be by competitive equity.

2. Proposed Bylaw Revisions Sports Sections - Summer Dead Period - Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal regarding a change in the summer dead period timing and length. Dave Hess stated that we need to protect ourselves from ourselves. This is moving in wrong direction going from three weeks to two weeks. Terry Barnum feels this proposal discourages professionals from having discussions with their staff and puts the onus on the CIF rather than being professional and taking responsibility for the safety of their students. Jim Perry commented that research shows students are more likely to be injured because they are overworked at an early age. Carter Paysinger reminded that the multi-sport athletes are not getting a break if the sports are staggered. There is a need to communicate with our administrators that the coach does not make the final decision. Even professional athletes are taking time out to recover. Dave Hess would be in favor of this proposal if it were for three weeks.

### 5. NEW BUSINESS (5A1 and 5A2 were moved to the top of Item 1F1)

B. 2019-2020 CIF Southern Section Goals - Rob Wigod distributed and reviewed the 2019-2020 Southern Section Goals that appear at the end of these minutes. He highlighted the new officials recruiting program, Scorebook Live replacing Max-Preps, updated features in CIFSSHOME. There will be a new championship event this year with Boys and Girls Lacrosse Championships. There are new rules such as the VCR checklist and the requirement of AED's on campuses. Many opportunities for professional growth including the Administrative Summit, CIFSSHOME and Eligibility Workshops and the MVP AD program. Financially, Rob Wigod pointed out that revenue share under CIF Sports Properties should start this year, online ticket sales opportunities for schools will increase and our special events are using online ticketing as well. Broadcast rights fees have increased, as there is increased demand, including a new agreement that has been reached with KDOC, and that rights fees monies go back to member schools. The Public/Private Committee will be focusing on CIF Bylaw 510.1 as it relates to in-

coming 9th graders, following coaches, etc. State/Section relationships are the best they have been. Kristine Palle is still the chair of the NFHS Water Polo Rules Committee. Monica Colunga asked for a motion to accept the goals as presented and there was a first and second. The motion carried 18-0-0. Monica Colunga thanked Rob Wigod for his work in creating the goals.

C. Financial Report - Mitch Carty reviewed the handouts that he distributed to the Executive Committee and appear at the end of these minutes, highlighting various items. Mike West commended Mitch Carty for a job well done in bringing us to a profitable year. Rob Wigod also thanked Mitch Carty for his hard work and dedication in what was a challenging year. To be where we are, the staff rolled up their sleeves and did an outstanding job.

D. Marketing Report - Thom Simmons/Jackie Gibson - Jackie Gibson gave a PowerPoint presentation that appears at the end of these minutes.

E. Communications Report - Thom Simmons/Chelsea Heyward - Chelsea Heyward gave a PowerPoint presentation that appears at the end of these minutes. Thom Simmons discussed the drop-down menu that will appear on our website regarding how to use Scorebook Live in videos and these videos will be sent out to our member schools.

### 6. REPORTS

A. NFHS Summer Meeting Reports - Dr. Monica Colunga, Carter Paysinger, Mike West - Carter Paysinger relayed information regarding dead periods across other states and student safety and emergency plans, especially for after school programs, with schools practicing these plans. Even though the students and administration are trained, the parents are not, and they need to be educated. If something happens, parents must listen to school personnel. Mike West commented that this was his first one and it was the NFHS Summer Meeting's 100th Anniversary. Our state is so different from the other states. He attended a panel discussing social media rules as they relate to ad hoc committee membership and asked if this is something we should discuss. Another panel discussed the disabled student that wants to play and are they being excluded because of their disability? Can accommodations be made for these students and does it open the school or district up to a lawsuit? 70% of high school sports officials quit after three years due to verbal abuse. ESports is growing, with ten states already having ESports programs. It is exciting as this is bringing in students that are not already involved in athletics. Monica Colunga remarked about Jim Perry presenting a workshop on competitive equity and he did an excellent job. The board members meeting showed that the other states are now taking a look at what we are doing rather than looking at us like we are out on a limb. Issues such as club sports, officials, etc., are not specific to Southern Section or California. Women in leadership is a movement across the nation, but still very slow moving for women to move into leadership positions in athletics. The same is true with minority groups. Jim Perry talked about the successes in California and stated that others are looking to us for ideas and support. With doing the competitive equity presentation, California has opened the door for the rest of the country to see a better way to implement competitive equity.

B. President's Report - Dr. Monica Colunga - Monica Colunga distributed a document containing the duties of the Commissioner from the Blue Book with suggested edits. This would become a Non-Action Item for the September meeting and an Action Item in January for the 2020-2021 school year. Mike West clarified that with these being in the Blue Book, this is what the Commissioner's evaluation should be based on and with making these edits, it will streamline the evaluation process.

C. Treasurer's Report - Dr. Jeff Jordan - The Section is down three schools this year to 567 member schools. Sports Fees are due October 1. The office has done some upgrades with two new copiers, new

# MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

## September 26, 2019

### 1. OPENING BUSINESS

A. Call to order by Dr. Monica Colunga, President of the Council - Meeting was called to order by Dr. Monica Colunga at 1:05 p.m.

B. Pledge of Allegiance

C. Roll Call - All members were present except for Geniel Moon, John Norman, Carter Paysinger, Mike West, and Jackie Gibson.

D. Introduction of Guests - Rob Wigod introduced Sandy Gahring, former Executive Committee member, and brought her forward to present her with a small token of appreciation and to thank her for her service on the Executive Committee.

E. Adopt Agenda - There was a motion and a second to adopt the agenda. Motion was approved and the agenda was adopted 19-0-0. Rob Wigod announced that Marketing Manager Jackie Gibson was not in attendance as she delivered her baby earlier today.

F. Approval of Minutes - There was a motion and a second to approve the minutes of the August 15, 2019 Executive Committee meeting. The minutes were approved 18-0-1.

### 2. PUBLIC COMMENT

A. Recognition of anyone wishing to address the Executive Committee. Speakers must limit their remarks to three minutes. There was no one present to address the Executive Committee.

### 3. ACTION ITEMS

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS - There are no State Federated Council Action Items at this time.

B. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS - There are Southern Section Action Items at this time.

### 4. NON-ACTION ITEMS

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposed Bylaw Additions 1501 and 2603 - Baseball and Softball State Championships - Dr. Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal. The updated version is in the packet indicating dates and that this tournament would be a single elimination, 8-team bracket in five divisions for both Baseball and Softball. Both advisory committees are not in support of this proposal. Chris Calderwood asked why it is a single elimination and not a series. Jim Perry answered that the element of time was a factor and running through pitchers in Baseball. Rob Wigod reported from the Commissioner's Meeting that there are mixed feelings regarding this proposal and the vote will be close. There are concerns regarding the movement of the calendar and the many graduations that take place before the finish of the season.

2. Proposed Bylaw Revision 1703 - Traditional Competitive Cheer Regional Championships - Dr. Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal asking for the inclusion of a State Regional Championship scheduled two weeks following the Southern Section Championships. This is an invitation with costs incurred by the schools who choose to attend. Terry Barnum voiced concerns that paying an entrance fee for a championship event may start a trend to add entrance fees in other sports.

3. Weighted Voting Revision 2019-20 - Dr. Monica Colunga reviewed the information provided by the CIF State regarding weighted voting at the CIF State Federated Council meetings.

B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Proposed Bylaw Revision 32.B.4.B - Releaguement Procedures - Dr. Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal. This proposal is requesting the option for athletic conferences/associations to releague every year if desired. The current rule may be out of date since competitive equity is used yearly for the establishment of playoff divisions.

2. Proposed Bylaw Revisions Sports Sections - Summer Dead Period - Dr. Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal regarding a 14-day, all sports, all levels, Summer Dead Period. Jeff Williams, who co-authored the proposal, spoke how this plan was put together, stating that of the many different proposals forwarded over the years, this one brought together the best parts of all of them. This has everyone at a school off for 14-days so the multi-sport athlete has time away and facilities across the board can be tended to. There would be no weightlifting allowed at that time either. Chris Calderwood clarified that each school still chooses their own dead period and that the goal was to have all schools on the same schedule. Jeff Williams added that since schools start and end at such different times, this was the factor in allowing schools to decide their own dead period. David Parkes commented that some schools' maintenance crews may be too small to be able to reset all facilities during the dead period. Jeff Williams stated that the rationale is to give students time off which is why it is two consecutive weeks. Terry Barnum asked why enact a rule forcing schools to do something they can do right now and does the timing of the forced, all school dead period put the needs of one school sports program ahead of another because of the timing of their dead period. Jim Perry reminded that years ago, there was a 21-day dead period set

for everyone and that everyone set their summer schedules around that 21-day window. Now, there is no more common area. The Dead Period Rule was gone before the Association Rule was voted out in 2008 during the 2008-09 school year. Dr. Monica Colunga stated that this is an ongoing conversation and being a large section, this gives us the opportunity for conversation and allows us to have an agreement for what it should look like. Do all principals understand their role and that it is their responsibility? Dave Reid stated that this needs to be done together because one league doing this will not necessarily move enough leagues to follow suit.

3. Proposed Bylaw Revision 3320.2 - Playoff Divisions for Golf - Dr. Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal. This would move the Golf Playoff Groupings to a competitive equity model instead of geography-based and could have a financial impact due to travel. Chris Calderwood asked if a similar proposal had just been passed for Wrestling and Rob Wigod answered that it had. Because competitive equity was added to the Blue Book and listed other sports that competitive equity did not affect, this must be done to update the language in the Blue Book and give Golf the opportunity to move toward competitive equity. This proposal will be using two years of championship data for playoff divisions.

4. Proposed Bylaw Revisions Article 5, Section 54 - Commissioner Duties - Dr. Monica Colunga reviewed the proposal to clean up the language and update the duties of the Commissioner of Athletics to coincide with the items in the Commissioner's Evaluation.

### 5. NEW BUSINESS

A. Financial Report - Mitch Carty - Mitch Carty distributed a handout that appears at the end of these minutes and highlighted various items contained within.

B. Marketing Report - Thom Simmons/Jackie Gibson - Thom Simmons updated the Executive Committee on the presentation to Ford and Fox for a 4-year renewal with Ford continuing their title sponsorship. Thom Simmons stated that Jackie Gibson knocked the presentation out of the park and the general feeling is that Ford is happy with us and looking to renew. Ford feels the dealers need to be more involved and we helped with that effort with a halftime event at a Santa Margarita High School football game with the local Ford dealer. Ford has a sweepstakes starting up in which they are giving away a car during the football championships. The Athletic Administrator Summit has 624 attendees registered to date and a big thank you to staff for helping with this project. Raising Canes is a huge supporter of the Southern Section with your lunch today being donated by our local store and the new football season signage being displayed at the local stores. They were in attendance at the Champions for Character Dinner and awarded all the student-athlete winners a free Raising Canes for a year gift card. We are close to signing a contract with Champion to be the official Lacrosse ball, providing balls and t-shirts. NFHS Network and ESPN have a real interest in getting more involved with our Section.

C. Communications Report - Thom Simmons/Chelsea Heyward - Chelsea Heyward reported on the success of the new Champions for Character video process by having the awardees do their videos at school and that it was a great event. Videos of the season previews are up on the website. Our section has been successful in having two Coaches of the Week through the Los Angeles Chargers program.

### 6. REPORTS

A. Section 7/8 Reports - Dr. Monica Colunga, Mike West, Carter Paysinger, Jill Matyuch - Dr. Monica Colunga attended several workshops which included the NFHS Report discussing their desire to work more closely with the ten California sections and to have more of a presence across the country. They are developing an official's program and performing a technology audit to enhance what they do. They are taking a look at the sport of Football and the decline in enrollment in that sport and the CIF State is putting together a football committee to align with the NFHS. There was a sportsmanship workshop put on by the associations in Wyoming and Utah who provided information on how they try to respond to educating their students and to holding their parents accountable for their actions. Utah schools are working with their officials who are weighing in on the sportsmanship of the schools. Rob Wigod presented a workshop on our competitive equity playoffs, identified why it came about and gave an excellent presentation. Ron Nocetti talked about eSports, the evolution of that activity and building a foundation for future championships. Thank you to Rob Wigod for the opportunity to attend the conference. Jill Matyuch shared with the committee a yellow card that the Wyoming association uses at their games to give to parents in the stands regarding sportsmanship. Rob Wigod thanked to those that attended the conference. It is important to represent our section and he is proud of the quality of our representatives.

B. President's Report - Dr. Monica Colunga - Attended the

Champions for Character Dinner and thanked Chelsea Heyward for the videos, which were great. The event was very classy and efficient. You are encouraged to go if you can next year. Thank you for lunch. Looking forward to the Athletic Administrator Summit. Mike West, Carter Paysinger, and myself are presenting to Principals that morning.

C. Treasurer's Report - Dr. Jeff Jordan - The annual audit will be conducted in October. As we conclude the first quarter, we have \$1.3M dues revenue and \$1M in expenses. Of the 566 member schools, 473 have paid their dues.

D. Commissioner's Report - Rob Wigod - Tuesday's Message from the Commissioner discussed the reduction in transfer numbers and the monitoring of the number of ejections. The Assistant Commissioners are attending league meetings and at the Council meeting next week we will continue to discuss the goal of reducing the ejection numbers. The official's recruitment program is progressing with 100 new officials already coming through the program. Soccer has the most prospective new officials followed by Basketball and then Football. Thank you to those that were able to attend the Champions for Character Dinner and thank you to Sharon Hodge for her excellent organization of the event. Thank you to Chelsea Heyward for the videos, they were super. Our first Council meeting of the year is on Tuesday and we hope you will attend. Ron Nocetti will be in attendance and it will be his first meeting with us in his new role as CIF State Executive Director. The Athletic Administrator Summit is on October 7 and you have your credentials so we hope you can attend. Playoffs are coming soon, and you are all invited to enjoy the events and/or present awards. Looking at declining numbers in Football and trying to find a way to reverse the trend, perhaps working with youth programs to help feed our high school programs and getting our professional teams involved as they need the high school programs to increase as well.

D. Executive Committee Member Reports - CSADA Representative, Dave Reid reported on the CSADA Conference dates of April 16-20, 2020, at the Peppermill in Reno. Superintendents Representative, Reggie Thompkins reported that he has been given authority to bring together the athletic directors in the Riverside County Office of Education for a conference to discuss what is it that we are focused on and what are the students taking away from our athletic programs. Boys' Athletic Directors Representative, Chris Calderwood commended Rob Wigod on his most recent Commissioner's Message. Why does soccer have the most ejections? Instead of just saying that is the way soccer is, let's find ways to improve and change it. Citrus Belt Area Representative, Ed Kearby commended Chelsea Heyward on her work with the social media stating it is phenomenal and everything you need is available on those platforms.

D. Commissioner's Report - Rob Wigod - Thank you to those that attended the National Federation Summer Meeting. Thank you to the Transfer Rules Committee, some who are in this room, for looking at and opening up the discussion regarding transfer rules and coming to the conclusion the implementing the VCR checklist seems to have addressed the major changes that might have needed to be made. The Transfer Rules Committee will meet again in January. Transfer numbers are down from last year. The annual media interviews have taken place over the last week. Eligibility Workshops are almost done with our office seeing 270 – 300 of our member schools this year. The New Principal/AD Workshops are coming in September.

E. Executive Committee Member Reports - Monica Colunga opened the floor to those that would like to address the Executive Committee rather than going around the table. CSADA Representative, Dave Reid - Talked about a Roosevelt High School football game that had lightning. There was a coaches' conference held in his area and over 200 coaches attended. The Athletic Director at Roosevelt did a great job organizing this two-day event. President Elect, Mike West – Discussed the definition of the heat illness bylaw, emphasizing that heat cramps are a part of heat illness and if an athlete suffers from heat illness, that athlete must be cleared by a doctor to return to play. Perhaps there needs to be a Q&A added to the Blue Book. Heat cramps alone are a symptom of heat illness but are not an issue on their own. CAPSO Representative, Terry Barnum – CIF Executive Director Ron Nocetti recently called Terry asking CAPSO to partner with the CIF State Office. Great to get a call within a month of Ron taking office as the new CIF State Executive Director. There is a need to educate member schools as to who CAPSO is and work toward getting a database for contacts. State Federated Council President, Jim Perry – After 5 ½ years of being in his district, there are now full-time athletic trainers at every high school with six athletic trainers classified with benefits and increased hours. Coast Area Representative, Paula Rodas – Our district now has three full-time athletic trainers for our high schools. Thanks to the work of this body and the information provided that pushed our district to hire full-time athletic trainers to protect our students.
