2021 CIF SOUTHERN SECTION-FORD FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS, ON TAP FRIDAY AND SATURDAY; 15 DIVISIONAL TITLES TO BE AWARDED

LOS ALAMITOS -- Fifteen divisional winners will be crowned champions this weekend in the 2021 CIF Southern Section-Ford Football Championships, scheduled for sites spanning from the desert to the sea. Championship football competition among CIF-SS member schools dates back to 1914. This will be the 107th edition.

The 14 divisional finals are sponsored by The Southern California Ford Dealers Association;

Wilson Sporting Goods Co.; Bally Sports and Prepzone, The NFHS Network; GoFan; JL Custom Jackets and Patches; eTeamSponsor; Gatorade; Los Angeles Chargers; Xenith; Raising Cane's; CA Army National Guard, The California Correctional Peace Officers Association; The Marines; Nike; SB Live; Max Preps; Black Bear Diner; California Canopy; and Old Spaghetti Factory.

DIVISION 1- Mater Dei vs. Servite, Friday November 26th, at Veterans Memorial Stadium, 7:30 pm, Bally Sports West

Two of the top teams in the Southern Section, the state of California and in the United States will face off in the Division 1 Final at Veterans Memorial Stadium.

Nationally top ranked Mater Dei arrives at its fifth final in a row and looks to add to its storied history. The Monarchs are the top seed in the bracket, the champions of the Trinity League and hold a 10-0 record. Coach Bruce Rollinson continues to field a powerful team on both sides of the ball. The Monarchs have scored nearly 500 points and barely allowed 150. QB Elijah Brown has thrown for over 2200 yards, with nearly 30 passing TDs. WR CJ Williams has over 750 receiving yards and 11 TD receptions while Cooper Barkate has 9 TDs. On defense David Bailey leads the way with over 40 tackles, and double-digit sacks while the defense has nearly 30 forced turnovers. The Monarchs look to continue their recent run with their third title in 5 seasons, after falling short in 2019.

Servite makes a long-awaited return to the CIF-SS final. The Friars are 10-2, the third seed in the bracket and the third team from the Trinity League. Coach Troy Thomas returned to Servite and now leads a well-balanced team on both sides of the ball. QB Noah Fifita has thrown for over 2800 yards and 33 TDs while adding 6 rushing TDs. RB Houston Thomas has 16 rushing touchdowns while WR Tetairoa McMillian

DIVISION 1 (Cont.): has over 1200 receiving yards and 17 TDs. Jacob Manu leads the way on defense with 80 tackles while Mason Graham has 13 sacks and McMillian has 7 interceptions as well. The Friars look for the schools first title since 2010 and sixth overall.

DIVISION 2- Orange Lutheran at Alemany, Saturday November 27th, 7:00 p.m., Ballys Sport Prep Zone

Points could be aplenty in the Division 2 final.

Orange Lutheran is back in the championship game for the first time since 2006. The Lancers are the 3rd seed in the bracket, were an At-Large team out of the Trinity League and have a 9-4 record. Coach Rod Sherman in his first year at the helm, has a well-balanced team on both sides of the ball. QB Logan Gonzalez has passed for 2916 yards and 303 TDs. WR Jaylen Lynch has caught 10 of those touchdowns and has over 700 receiving yards. Gabe Morin leads the defense with over 100 tackles and the Lancers have 12 interceptions. Orange Lutheran looks to bring back the programs 3rd CIF-SS title.

Alemany makes its first appearance in the final since 2009. The Warriors are the top seed in the bracket, the champions of the Mission League and have an 8-3 record. Coach Casey Clausen returned to his alma mater and oversees a balanced team on both sides of the ball. The Warriors have scored over 360 points and yet to allow 250. Alemany features a two headed running attack with Floyd Chalk III rushing for over 1400 yards and over 20 TDs while Jaylen Thompson adds 10 rushing TDs. QB Dylan Gebbia has over 1300 passing yards. Niuafe Tuihalamaka Jr. leads the way on defense with nearly 70 tackles this year. Alemany looks to bring home its first title.

DIVISION 3- Serra at Apple Valley, Saturday November 27th, 7:00 p.m., Ballys Sport Prep Zone

The ball could be flying in the Division 3 final.

Serra returns to the final for the first time since 2013. The Cavaliers were the 3rd team out of the Mission League, are 7-4 and beat two seeded teams to advance. Coach Scott Altenburg leads a team that has barely allowed 200 points this season. QB Maalik Murphy has passed for 2341 yards and 17 TDs. RB Cincere Rhaney has rushed for ten TDs on the ground. Tanu SoSa leads the way on defense with 109 tackles and the Cavaliers have 27 sacks on the year. Serra seeks to win the schools 5th championship.

Apple Valley makes its first ever appearance in a CIF-SS final. The Sun Devils are the 2nd team out of the Mojave River League and bring a 11-3 record in to the final. Coach Kyle Godfrey's is in charge of a team that has scored over 450 points and have not allowed 200. QB Jayden Denegal has thrown for over 1500 yards and over 25 TDs and has added 8 TDs on the ground. RB Kaleb Most has rushed for over 900 yards and 7 TDs. Dustin Reynolds leads the way on defense with nearly 100 tackles and 8 sacks while Keenan Eck has 15 sacks. Apple Valley looks to win its first title.

DIVISION 4- Long Beach Poly at St. Francis, Saturday November 27th, 7:00 p.m., Ballys Sports Prep Zone

The running game could be the key in the Division 4 final.

Long Beach Poly adds another finals appearance to its rich history. The Jackrabbits are the champion of the Moore League, are the top team in the bracket and have a 13-3 record. Coach Stephen Barbee leads a high-flying offense and a defense known for big plays. QB Shea Kuykendall has passed for over 2375 yards and 30 TDs, eleven of which have been caught by WR Jason Robinson. RB Devin Samples has run for nearly 1100 yards and 15 TDs. The defense has 10 interceptions and has 34 sacks on the year led by Donovan Poe with 7. The Jackrabbits look to add title number 19 to its trophy case.

St. Francis which has played to honor the memory of former coach Jim Bonds, returns to the final for the first time since 2017. The Golden Knights are 10-2, and the co-champions of the Angelus

RB Max Garrison has run for over 1800 yards and 30 TDs. QB Jack Jacobs also has double-digit rushing TDs and has thrown for over 2000 yards. Milo Orona leads the way on defense with 8 sacks while Preston Jernegen has over 8 tackles. St. Francis looks to win a 3rd championship.

DIVISION 5-Oaks Christian at Valencia, Friday November 26th, 7:00 p.m., Ballys Sports Prep Zone

Defense could be the name of the game in the Division 5 final.

Oaks Christian adds to its two-decade run of success with another finals appearance. The Lions are 7-6 and were the 2nd team out of the Marmonte League. Coach Charles Collins has a balanced team that has stood tall when needed in the playoffs. QB Cole Tannenbaum has passed for over 2000 yards and double-digit TDs. RB Johnny Thompson has run for double digit rushing TDs on the ground. The Lion's defense is paced by Matthew Erhart who has over 120 tackles. The Lions have over 30 total sacks on defense. Oaks Christian looks to add a ninth championship.

Valencia returns to the finals for the first time since 2007. The Vikings are 7-4, were an at-Large team out of the Foothill League and have won five in a row. Coach Larry Muir leads a balanced team with a stout defense that has carried the Vikings in the playoffs. The defense has 23 sacks led by Jack Geiser with 5. Durhan Goodman is a two-way player with 8 touchdown receptions and three interceptions. The Vikings look to bring home the schools' first title in what will be the school's sixth finals appearance.

DIVISION 6- Newport Harbor at Temecula Valley, Saturday November 27th, 7:30 p.m., NFHS Network

A fourth championship awaits the winner of the Division 6 final.

Newport Harbor is back in the finals for the first time since 2015. The Sailors were an at-Large team from the Sunset League, were the 3rd seed in the bracket and have a 6-7 record. Coach Peter Lofthouse is in charge of a team that has scored in bunches during the playoffs. The defense is paced by Carson de Avila who has over 100 tackles on the season. The Sailors took to bring home a fourth championship.

Temecula Valley makes its 2nd straight appearance in a final. The Golden Bears are 10-3, were at at-Large team out of the Southwestern League and were the 3rd seed in the bracket. Coach Bert Esposito has a balanced team that is on a five-game winning streak. QB Ben Botelho has thrown for over 1200 yards and five different Bears have combined for rushing touchdowns. Lucas Valencia leads the way on defense with over 100 tackles while Darius Knight has eight sacks for a team that has almost 30. The Bears also have 17 interceptions. Temecula Valley looks to bring home a fourth trophy.

DIVISION 7- Aquinas at St Pius X-St. Matthias Academy, Saturday November 27th, 7:30 p.m., NFHS Network

A second straight championship is the prize for the winner of the Division 7 final.

Aquinas makes a 2nd straight finals appearance. The Falcons are 8-5, the champions of the Ambassador League and were the fourth seed in the bracket. Coach Jordan Brusig is in charge of a stingy defense that has barely allowed 200 points this year. RB JoJo Solis leads the way of offense with double digit rushing TDs. Aquinas looks to win a second straight title and fifth overall.

St Pius X-St. Mathias Academy makes a 2nd straight finals appearance. The Warriors are 11-2, the 2nd team out of the Camino Real League and are the 2nd seed in the bracket. Coach Devah Thomas leads a high scoring offense and a stout defense. QB Dieter Barr has passed for over 2500 yards and nearly 50 TDs while RB Dejour Meniffee has eight rushing TDs. The Warriors defense has 26 sacks and 12 interception this year. The Warriors look to win a second championship.

Two teams with opposite strengths meet in the Division 9 final.

St. Margaret's returns to the finals for the first time since 2014. The Tartans are 9-4, are a at-Large Freelance team and have won 7 in a row. Coach Kory Minor leads a team that has scored nearly 500 points this year. QB Jack Ruff has thrown for over 2500 yards and 40 TDs. Half of those touchdowns have been caught by WR William Stahl who has 1000 receiving yards. Maki Todd leads the way on defense with over 100 tackles. The Tartans look to claim the school's 6th title.

Colony is back in the final for the first time since 2014. The Titans are 7-6, were an at-Large team out of the Citrus 4 League and is on a 5-game winning streak. Coach Brian Zavala leads a team where defense is the name of the game. Colony looks to bring home a 4th championship.

DIVISION 10- St Anthony vs Northview at Covina District Field, Friday November 26th, 7:30 p.m., NFHS Network

Defense could tell the story in the Division 10 final.

St. Anthony returns to the finals for the first time since 2016. The Saints are 9-4, the second team out of the Del Rey League and are the 4th seed in the bracket. Coach Raul Lara has continued his winning ways at St. Anthony and leads a balanced team whose defense has been stout in the playoffs. The Saints seek a 3rd title.

Northview makes its first finals appearance in over thirty years. The Vikings are 7-6, the co-champions of the Valle Vista League and defeated two seeded teams in the playoffs. Coach Marcel Perez leads a balanced team on both sides of the ball. QB Jimmy Arellanes has thrown 1342 yards and 16 TDs. RB Cheo Medina has run for over 1500 yards and nearly twenty TDs. Lewis Madrigal leads the way on defense with nearly 70 tackles and 8 sacks for a team that has over twenty. Northview looks to bring home a 2nd title.

DIVISION 11- Jordan vs. Northwood at Irvine High School, Friday November 26th, 7:30 p.m., NFHS Network

One team will claim its first ever title in the Division 11 final.

Jordan arrives at its first ever title game. The Panthers are 8-5, were a at-Large team from the Moore League and are the 4th seed in the bracket. Coach Tim Wedlow has a team that is balanced on both sides of the ball. RB Damian Henderson has run for over 900 yards and 9 TDs. Henderson also has three TD receptions. Jeremie Mcgurn leads the way on defense with over 80 tackles and 10 sacks. The Panthers also have 17 interceptions. Jordan seeks its first football championship.
