CROSSROADS DIAMOND STARS, DOUG PITKIN & NOAH ROSEN, NAMED CO-MVPs IN SMALL SCHOOLS BASEBALL

CROSSROADS HIGH SCHOOL WON ITS FIRST SMALL SCHOOLS CIF BASEBALL TITLE IN 1985 AND IN THE DOING PLACED FIVE PLAYERS ON THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION ALL-STAR TEAM, INCLUDING DIVISION CO-PLAYERS OF THE YEAR DOUG PITKIN AND NOAH ROSEN. ANNUAL FOUNDATION ALL-STAR TEAMS WERE SELECTED RECENTLY IN CULVER CITY, AND COACH CHUCK ICE'S CROSSROADS ROADRUNNERS GOT THE MAJORITY OF ATTENTION FROM THE FOUNDATION'S SELECTION BOARD.

A team "capable of blowing people out," as coach Ice repeated several times during the season, figured to place a number of players on this year's all-star nine. Shortstop Doug Pitkin, who batted .429 with 27 rbi's and 23 stollen bases, was voted co-Player of the Year by the selection board. Undefeated pitcher, Noah Rosen, who registered 11 wins against no losses and a 1.81 era, was named to share the honor with Pitkin. Matt Sklamburg was co-MVP in '84.

Finishing its season 25-3-1, the Roadrunners "Iced" the title with a runaway 18-2 victory over Woodcrest Christian, which finished its season, 16-7. Crossroads had won its previous four playoff games by astronomical scores 20-1 over Heritage; 35-2 over Coleville; 15-4 over Chadwick; and 20-3 over Linfield Christian.

All honored players on this year's Small Schools team will receive First Interstate Bank Athletic Foundation awards at the Foundation's 48th annual Baseball Awards Program to be held at Dodgers Stadium on Thursday, Aug. 15th. Awards will be presented on the field prior to the Dodgers - Atlanta Braves game, with Foundation board members, high school administrators and members of the Dodgers team taking part in the presentations.

SAN DIMAS HIGH'S DENNIS WATSON VOTED TOP
PLAYER IN 1-A DIVISION BASEBALL FOR 1985

DENNIS WATSON, SAN DIMAS HIGH SCHOOL PITCHER-CATCHER WHO LED COACH GEORGE KUNTZ'S SAN DIMAS SAINTS TO THE CIF 1-A DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIP OVER BALDWIN PARK (5-4), HAS BEEN VOTED DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS. WATSON WAS NAMED AT UTILITY, THE SELECTION BOARD NOTING HIS CAPABILITIES NOT ONLY ON THE MOUND, BUT ALSO BEHIND THE PLATE.

San Dimas placed three players on the all-star teams, with pitcher-shortstop Bob Rose also being named to the 1-A Division first team. Watson fashioned an 8-1 mound mark and batted .411 with 32 hits. Rose wound up with a .515 batting average and 41 hits.

The Saints, winners of the Montview League with a 13-1 record, finished their 1985 campaign 22-5. In the playoffs San Dimas dispatched San Jacinto, 14-0, Fillmore, 16-1, Elsinore, 23-6, and Whittier Christian, 5-3, before taking the title-decider, 5-4, from the Baldwin Park Braves.

RICHARD GONZALES, DIAMOND BAR HIGH SCHOOL PITCHER-SHORTSTOP, WAS NAMED 2-A DIVISION BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD. GONZALES REGISTERED AN 11-1 MOUND MARK IN '85, INCLUDING A VICTORY IN THE CHAMPIONSHIP GAME AGAINST MISSION VIEJO, 3-2. FOR HAVING BEEN NAMED 2-A DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR, RICHARD GONZALES WILL BE RECIPIENT OF THE ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S TRADITIONAL BRONZE MEDALLION AWARD.

Gonzales batted .423, had 44 hits and knocked in 39 runs during the season. He had 83 strikeouts in 79 1/3 innings with a 1.94 era. The 6-2, 185-pound senior had eight complete games. The Hacienda League champions, Diamond Bar fashioned one of the top season records in the state, finishing with a 27-2 mark and the 2-A Division title. The Brahmas defeated Rosemead, 28-1, Victor Valley, 11-4, Newport Harbor, 3-2, and Norte Vista, 9-8, before winning the crown from the Mission Viejo Diablos.

BOB SHARPNACK AND TEAMMATE DON SNOWDEN, WHO DIRECTED THE FOUNTAIN VALLEY CRIMSON BARONS TO THE 4-A DIVISION BASEBALL TITLE AFTER FINISHING THIRD IN THE SUNSET LEAGUE, WERE BOTH NAMED TO THE FIRST DIVISION TEAM, AS MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION COMMITTEE MADE ANNUAL SELECTIONS RECENTLY IN CULVER CITY. SHARPNACK WAS VOTED MOST VALUABLE PLAYER, AS HE COMPLETED THE SEASON 10-3 ON THE MOUND WITH A 1.05 ERA. NATHAN CALL, THREE-SPORT STAR FROM CAPISTRANO VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL, AND YLEANA CARRASCO, TRACK AND VOLLEYBALL ALL-STAR FROM ANAHEIM HIGH, HAVE BEEN NAMED SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA PREP ATHLETES OF THE YEAR BY THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES. THE ANNUAL SELECTIONS WERE MADE BY ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS, A COMMITTEE OF SOUTHLAND SPORTS JOURNALISTS WHO HAVE SERVED IN THE INTEREST OF HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETES AND ATHLETICS SINCE 1937.

Southland Athlete of the Year selections date back to 1972 for the boys and 1976 for the girls. Dennis Littlejohn of North Torrance High School was the initial selection in the boys division, with Denise Corlett of Marlborough being the first girl selected.

NATHAN CALL CAPISTRANO VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL . . SENIOR 6-0 180

Nathan Call, on his way to Brigham Young University on an athletic scholarship, was an All-Southern Section, CIF selection in three sports during his career at Capistrano Valley High School in Mission Viejo.

In football Nathan was an All-Southern Conference wide receiver on last fall's all-star team. He played this position as a freshman, when his brother, Burt, was the team's quarterback. Nathan was moved to quarterback his junior year, where he performed with flashes of brilliance. This past season, as a senior, he moved back to wide receiver when Scott Stark transferred in and won the QB post.

In basketball, Nathan was All-South Coast League as a guard his junior year and made the 4-A Division All-Southern Section second team. The Cougars advanced to the quarter-finals in the playoffs, losing to Glendale 58-55. Nathan averaged 11.2 points per game.

His senior year, Nathan was named to the 4-A Division first team and averaged 13.0 points per game. "Capo" Valley was South Coast League Champions and advanced to the semi-finals of the playoffs losing to Simi Valley. The Cougars recorded a 27-3 season.

Nathan played left field for coach Bob Zamora's baseball team, which posted a record of 20-8 in 1986. He was named a 2-A Division first team outfielder, as he batted .438 for the season. The Cougars lost to Saugus 2-1 in the second round of the playoffs.

Nathan Call is the only athlete in the history of Orange County's "North-South" All-Star Games to be selected to play in all three sportsfootball, basketball and baseball.

YLEANA CARRASCO ANAHEIM HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR 5-11

Yleana Carrasco, on her way to the University of Southern California on a volleyball scholarship, performed in both track and field and volleyball at Anaheim High School and was All-Southern Section in both sports.

In track and field, Yleana was the California State Meet champion in the high jump at 5-10. She jumped 5-10 twice in '86 and was 2-A Division champion (at 5-6) and Masters Meet champion (at 5-8). The best prep high jumper in Southern California both her sophomore and junior years, Yleana placed third in the California State Meet in both 1984 and 1985, jumping 5-10 both years. She had a best of 6-0 in 1985.

Yleana also performed well in the hurdle events, finishing third in the 2-A Division Championships this year in the 100-meter event (14.67 sec.). She also posted a best time of 46.64 sec. in the 300-meter event. At U.S.C. Yleana will be coached by Fred LaPlante.

A two-time All-Southern Section volleyball all-star selection, Yleana led the Lady Colonists to the 2-A Division playoffs both in 1984 and 1985 as the Orange League runners-up. Last year, Anaheim lost to Royal of Simi Valley in the second round of the playoffs, while the year before Indio eliminated them in the quarter-finals. Yleana will be coached by Chuck Erbe at U.S.C.
